## Burlington Bees (16-30, 51-64) at Dayton Dragons (20-26, 59-57)

RH Michael Bolasky (8-8, 4.07) vs. RH Wyatt Strahan (6-9, 2.86)

**Today's Game:** The Dayton Dragons (affiliate of the Cincinnati Reds) meet the Burlington Bees (affiliate of the Los Angeles Angels) in the first game of a three-game set. **Dragons-Bees Season Series:** First meeting.

**Streaks:** Dayton is 4-12 over its last 16 games. Burlington has lost six of their last seven and they are also 4-12 over the last 16 games.

**Last Game:** Dayton 6, Peoria 1. **Highlights:** The Dragons avoided a sweep of the three-game series, collected 12 hits...Argenis Aldazoro's two-run triple in the sixth broke a scoreless tie and ended a 19-inning scoreless drought for the Dragons...Mike Sullivan earned the win with four perfect innings of relief, striking out six of the 12 batters he faced...Aldazoro, Shed Long, Luis Gonzalez, and Paul Kronenfeld all had two hits for Dayton.

**Today's Dragons Starting Pitcher:** **Wyatt Strahan** is a 22-year-old native of Villa Park, California. Strahan was the Reds third round draft pick in 2014 out of the University of Southern California. He was rated as the #23 prospect in the Reds organization and #8 prospect in the Pioneer League by *Baseball America* after the 2014 season. Strahan went 0-3, 2.76 as a starter at Billings in 2014. He spent three seasons at USC, posting a career record with Trojans of 13-11 with 2.73 ERA in 51 appearances (27 starts). As a junior in 2014, he went 6-5, 3.28 in 15 starts to earn All Pac 12 honors. **Last Start:** *Saturday at Quad Cities:* Loss, 6 IP, 3 H, 2 R, 1 ER, 1 BB, 3 SO. **Notes:** Over Strahan's last nine starts, he has posted a 2.33 ERA, allowing a total of 15 earned runs in 58 innings. His record over those seven starts is 1-5. Two of the losses were 1-0 games.

### Individual Notes

- Dragons right fielder **Aristides Aquino** had an outfield assist in each of the three games in the series with Peoria.
- **Shed Long** had two hits in each game of the Peoria series, going 6 for 14.
- **Avain Rachal** has a seven-game hitting streak, going 12 for 25 (.480) with a home run.
- **Jimmy Pickens** is batting .304 over his last six games, going 7 for 23.
- **Tyler Mahle** over his last nine starts: 5-1, 1.38 ERA, 52 IP, 8 ER. Mahle was Midwest League Pitcher of the Month for July (4-0, 0.58, 5 GS).
- **Wyatt Strahan** over his last nine starts: 58 IP, 18 R, 15 ER, 2.33 ERA, but with a 1-5 record (two 1-0 losses).
- **Mike Sullivan** over his last six relief appearances: 12.1 IP, 1 R, 1 BB, 17 SO.
- **Brennan Bernardino** over his last four relief appearances: 6.1 IP, 0 R.
- **Jeremy Kivel** over his last three relief appearances: 6.1 IP, 0 R.

### Team Notes

- The Dragons are 36-22 (.621) at home but 23-35 (.397) on the road.
- The Dragons had scored just five runs over their last five games (two shutouts, two games with one run, one game with three runs) before scoring six runs last night (all scored in their final three offensive innings).
- The Dragons are batting .259 at home; .235 on the road. The team ERA at home is 2.87. It is 3.91 on the road.
- The Dragons finished the first half with a team ERA of 3.00. The Dragons second half ERA stands at 3.92. The Dragons averaged 4.3 runs per game in the first half. They are averaging 3.6 runs per game in the second half.
- The Dragons bullpen posted an ERA in the first half of 2.89. The bullpen ERA in the second half is 4.72 (145 IP, 76 ER).
- The Dragons are 19-10 in one-run games at home; 6-13 on the road.
- The Dragons are 7-0 in extra inning games at home this season; 1-4 in extras on the road.
- The Dragons are 40-23 when allowing no unearned runs; 12-11 when allowing one unearned run; 7-23 when allowing two or more U-ER.
- The Dragons have 11 walk-off wins this season. They had nine walk-off wins over the 2013-'14 seasons combined.
- The Dragons have hit only 17 homers on the road all season. The club record for fewest home runs on the road in a season is 29.
- The Dragons have lost only one game this season in which they held a lead of three runs or more at any point in the game (June 30).

**Current Dragons Past Accomplishments:** **Aristides Aquino** led the Pioneer League in RBI, extra base hits, doubles, and total bases in 2014 with Billings. He finished second in the league in home runs, stolen bases, and slugging percentage. He was selected by *Baseball America* as the league's top prospect...**Brennan Bernardino** was the top relief pitcher in the Pioneer League in 2014 with Billings, posting a 1.01 ERA and nine saves...**Argenis Aldazoro** finished third in the Pioneer League in slugging percentage (.525) at Billings in 2014 and was Reds Minor League Batter/Month for August, 2014...**Gavin LaValley** led his high school team to three straight state championships in Oklahoma, belting 54 home runs in high school...**Wyatt Strahan** was First Team All-PAC 12 at USC...**Jimmy Pickens** was First Team All-Big Ten at Michigan State...**Garrett Boulware** was 2nd Team All-ACC at Clemson...**Jake Ehret** was a member of the 2013 college baseball national championship team at UCLA...**Narciso Crook** hit four home runs in one game in 2013 in junior college, leading his team to the national NJCAA D3 World Series title.

- Four members of the Dragons are rated among the Reds top 30 prospects according to *Baseball America*: **3B Gavin LaValley** (#17), RHP **Wyatt Strahan** (#23), RHP **Tyler Mahle** (#26), and RHP **Jeremy Kivel** (#29).

## The Dragons MVP Program

The Dragons have expanded their elementary school MVP Program into two additional counties, taking the program to more than 1,100 classrooms in 2015. A total of 274 classrooms in 34 schools in Miami and Warren counties have been added to the program, which already included 842 classrooms in Montgomery, Greene, and Clark counties. In 2015, the program includes 1,116 fourth and fifth grade classrooms in 183 schools over 48 school districts. About 34,000 children will participate (up from 26,000 in 2014). The program is in its 10th year in 2015. Due to the support of the participating sponsors, the program is completely free of charge to the schools.

**How does the Dragons School MVP Program work?** The teacher in each of the 1,116 classrooms over the five-county area will select five MVP's based on the teacher's judgment of performance, effort, citizenship, and improvement. The five MVPs selected by their teacher in each classroom will get four tickets to a Dragons game, tickets to a special Field Day event at the stadium during the season, an MVP certificate and a Dragons MVP hat. Dragons players and mascots visit selected classrooms over the course of the season. Additionally, 12 Dragons games during the season are designated as "MVP Game Nights." On those nights, one MVP gets to throw out the ceremonial first pitch to the game, another does an on-air interview during the Dragons game broadcast on Fox Sports 980, and another participates in an entertainment skit during the Dragons game. Two times each season, all classroom MVP's are invited to attend the Dragons MVP Field Day at Fifth Third Field and interact with Dragons players. The Dragons MVP Program presented by Bob Evans is also made possible by the generous support of Sinclair Community College, WDTN TV and Dayton's CW Television.

## New HD Video Board

The Dragons have installed a new 2,050 square foot, high-definition video board at Fifth Third Field. The video board features the newest and latest high definition technology, and provides the clearest picture quality of any board ever utilized in a Minor League Baseball venue. The new addition is one of the first "13HD" video boards in a Minor League ballpark. Notably, only three of the 30 Major League Baseball stadiums have 13HD video boards. No Minor League ballpark featured a 13HD video board in 2014 or beforehand. The video board will be 35 feet high by 65 feet wide, making it the tallest and widest in all of Single-A baseball and among the top five tallest and widest in any Minor League stadium. It will have five times more display area than the previous video board at Fifth Third Field. It is twice the height and two and one-half times the width as the previous board.
