## Binghamton Rumble Ponies ((Mets)) vs. Trenton Thunder ((Yankees))

### LAST GAME:

The Thunder and SeaWolves were rained out on Monday night. The game will be made up on Thursday, July 25<sup>th</sup> at UPMC Park.

Trevor Stephan delivered five scoreless innings and Rashad Crawford's solo homer accounted for the lone run in Trenton's 1-0 win over the Erie SeaWolves on Sunday afternoon.

Crawford solo shot off Kyle Funkhouser was the lone blemish on the SeaWolves pitcher lines. Funkhouser had struck out five straight batters until Crawford's blast in the bottom of the third inning.

Brady Lail and Will Carter finished off the victory for the Thunder with four scoreless innings on the mound. Carter worked around a single, a hit batsman and a walk in the ninth inning to record his first career save.

### THUNDER CLAPS

**SPLITSVILLE:** The Thunder and Rumble Ponies have split each of their last four series against one another: the clubs have split both four-game series this season and did the same in their last two head-to-head series in June and July of 2018. The last time either team won a series against the other was June 19-21, 2018, when the Thunder took the first two of three games from Binghamton at ARM & HAMMER Park.

**RIDE THE PONIES:** Thunder pitching has held Binghamton hitters to a .211 batting average in eight head-to-head matchups this season, the lowest opposing average for any team the Thunder have played in 2019.

**GOOD TO SEE YOU:** The Thunder entertained the 19<sup>th</sup> largest crowd in franchise history on Saturday night when 7,998 fans entered through the gates at ARM & HAMMER Park. The 2018 season saw two attendance records set: July 11<sup>th</sup> - 8,296 (9<sup>th</sup> largest) and June 9 - 8,014 (18<sup>th</sup> largest).

**KELLIN TIME:** Catcher **Kellin Deglan** has wielded the hottest bat in the order lately, batting .421 over his last six games. The stretch includes three doubles, and home run, and five RBI. Prior to this stretch, Deglan had gone just 4-for-29 (.138) across his first nine games with the Thunder this season.

**FOUR'S A CROWD:** Sunday's win, along with a Hartford win over Binghamton, kept the Thunder in second place in the East, a half-game behind the Yard Goats. With eight days remaining in the first half of the season, Reading and Binghamton remain within the hunt for first place in the division, just one and two games out of first place, respectively. Of their eight remaining games in the first half, Trenton's only games against a division rival are in this current series with Binghamton.

**LEFT HANGING:** Over the past three games, the Thunder are 1-for-26 with runners in scoring position. This has contributed greatly to the team's recent offensive struggles, as Trenton has scored two or fewer runs in seven of their last nine games (beginning with a 2-0 win at Harrisburg on May 31).

**WHATEVER IT TAKES:** The Thunder are one of just two teams in the Eastern League (along with Binghamton) simultaneously owning an overall winning record and a sub-.500 record at home or on the road (22-8 home, 12-16 road). Trenton is also a half-game away from joining four other teams in Minor League Baseball who lead their division in spite of a losing home or road split: the Columbus Clippers, Iowa Cubs, Sacramento River Cats, and Frisco RoughRiders.

**WHO THEY ARE:** Of the 25 players on the Thunder roster, 14 were drafted by the Yankees, eight were signed as minor league or international free agents, two were acquired via trade, and one was claimed off waivers. Sixteen of the 25 played under Patrick Osborn at High-A Tampa at some point in 2018.

Ranked as #4 prospect in NYY system by MLB.com (#6 by Baseball America)... Features a fastball, curveball, slider (added this season) and change-up... Has struck out 79 batters in 48.0 IP this season, 54.9% of outs recorded this season have been via K (79-of-144), 14.8 K/9

2019: Made four starts with High-A Tampa to begin the season, fanning an FSL-best 33 batters in 17.2 IP and recording a 3.06 ERA... Transferred to the Thunder on April 30 when Garrett Whitlock went on IL (broken fingernail)... Was one of two teenagers (Harrisburg's Luis Garcia, 18) on an active roster in Double-A baseball at the time of his call-up, turned 20 after his 3<sup>rd</sup> start with TT... Each of his first three starts were getaway day games: 10:30am, 12:00pm, 10:30am... Finished six innings for the first time on 5/20 against Portland... Did not walk a batter for the first time in a start on 5/25 at Binghamton, did not issue a walk in 4 of 14 starts in 2018... Struck out 4 in 4.1 IP at Hartford on June 5, the third time in 31 starts since coming State-side that he struck out fewer than 5 batters in a start...

2018: Began season in Extended Spring Training before heading to Charleston for 8 starts and went 2-4 with a 3.76 ERA (40.2 IP, 31 H, 10 BB, 63 K)... Made five starts with High-A Tampa going 2-0, with a 1.57 ERA, struck out 35 batters in 28.1 IP... Struck out a career-high 12 batters on 7/25 vs. Augusta and matched it in his first start with Tampa on 8/6 as part of a perfect 21-up, 21-down performance in a 7-inning game against Clearwater (A game they would lose in extra innings)... It marked the first time in nearly 26 years a team threw a no-hitter but lost in the Florida State League. Scott Backum of Winter Haven did so -- also against Clearwater -- on Aug. 23, 1992.... Has struck out 7+ batters in 11-of-14 starts... **Made Thunder debut in 3-0 Division Clinching victory over Reading throwing 5 no-hit innings, combined no-hit bid lasted 7.1 IP...**

2017: Combined with the DSL Yankees, the GCL Yankees West and Rookie-level Pulaski to go 6-2 with a 3.30 ERA (60.0IP, 42H, 23R/22ER, 19BB, 85K, 7HR) in 13 games (10 starts)...posted a 12.75 K/9.0IP ratio, the second-highest among Yankees farmhands (min. 50.0IP)...recorded at least 7K in seven of his 13 appearances...held opponents to a .202 (42-for-208) BA...started the season with the DSL Yankees, going 1-1 with a 1.17 ERA (15.1IP, 10H, 3R/2ER, 2BB, 18K, 1HR) in three starts...was transferred to the GCL Yankees West on 6/26 and went 3-0 with a 3.24 ERA (16.2IP, 9H, 6ER, 4BB, 24K, 3HR) in four games (two starts)...was promoted to Pulaski on 7/24 and went 2-1 with a 4.50 ERA (28.0IP, 23H, 14ER, 13BB, 43K, 3HR) in six games (five starts)...

2016: Made his professional debut with the DSL Yankees 2, going 1-5 with a 2.61 ERA (48.1IP, 23H, 17R/14ER, 32BB, 61K, 1HR) in 12 starts...opponents batted .149 (23-for-154); LH .163 (7-for-43), RH .144 (16-for-111)...led DSL starters (min. 10GS) with an 11.36 K/9.0IP ratio...recorded a career-high 10K in 4.1IP (2H, 1ER, 3BB) on 8/8 vs. the DSL Rockies.

PERSONAL: Watches the same 5-minute clip of his idol Pedro Martinez from the 1999 All-Star Game before each of his starts... Credits his Father for a lot of his success, he was the first one to teach him a curveball and made countless sacrifices for him to attend tryouts... Grew up wanting to play shortstop, began pitching when he went to tryouts as a 15-year-old and scouts had him work out on the mound...
