BLUE ROCKS BREAKDOWN

HOME: 19-14 | AWAY: 22-10 STREAK: L2 | LAST 5: 3-2 | LAST 10: 6-4

BACK-TO-BACK: The Lynchburg Hillcats scored three runs in the first inning and three more in the fourth to hand the Wilmington Blue Rocks an 8-4 loss on Wednesday at Frawley Stadium. It marked the first time the first-half champs dropped back to back games since May 9-10.

THEY'RE RUBBER YOU'RE GLUE: Not only did Wilmington lose consecutive games for the first time in a month, but the Blue Crew also lost its first series in 10 tries. Oddly Wednesday marked only the second rubber match of the season for Wilmington and the Rocks fell to 0-2 in such contests.

TOP OF THE STANDINGS TO YOU: Wilmington has sat atop the Carolina League North standings for more than three-quarters of the 2019 season—59 of the campaign's first 69 days. The Rocks have not been out of first place since April 26.

BACK IN THE POSTSEASON: Wilmington clinched its first postseason berth since 2015. That year Wilmington won the first half with a 38-32 record. The Rocks have 40 victories in 2019 and still have seven contests remaining in the first half. The 2015 Blue Crew eventually reached the Mills Cup Championship Series by sweeping Lynchburg in the Northern Division Championship Series. Wilmington is in search of its first Carolina League crown since 1999.

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL STAR: The Blue Rocks had six players named Carolina League All Stars by the league office on Tuesday. Pitchers **Brady Singer**, **Daniel Lynch**, **Jackson Kowar**, **Tyler Zuber** and **Tad Ratliff** along with catcher **MJ Melendez** will represent the CL North on June 18 at Frederick's Nymeo Field.

KILLING IT IN CLOSE CONTESTS: Wilmington continues to excel in close contests this season. The Blue Crew lead the Carolina League with 29 games decided by a single score in 2019 and have played 42 affairs with a margin of victory of two-or-less. Wilmington is an impressive 33-9 in those close calls including 24-5 in one-run decisions. The Rocks are also 24-1 when holding an advantage through seven innings and 27-0 when leading after eight.

FIVE HAS PROVEN ELUSIVE: The Rocks were vying to equal their longest winning streak of the season on in game two of Tuesday's double dip. Wilmington won five straight from April 6-11. Since then the team has won four in a row five times, but have been out-scored by a combined 34-7 in their bid for a fifth straight victory.

NOT LOVING THE LONG BALL: Entering the recent seven-game homestand the Blue Crew had allowed just six home runs all year at Frawley Stadium. Fayetteville and Lynchburg flipped that script, hitting seven dingers over the last week. Wilmington has yielded 29 homers this season—13 of which have come at home. On offense the Rocks have hit 20 of their 24 long balls on the road this year.

WINNING THE COLUMN THAT MATTERS: Wilmington won on Sunday for the 20th time this season when its opponent had more hits. The Rocks did it three straight times over the weekend against Fayetteville.

Tomorrow's Starter for the Blue Crew

Marcelo Martinez will make his 10th start and his 11th appearance for the Blue Rocks. The 22-year-old left-hander started his season in Low-A Lexington, making two relief appearances and not allowing a run over nine innings of work. Martinez replaced Nolan Watson in the Wilmington rotation after the righty was placed on the Injured List in mid-April. A native of Reynosa, Mexico, Martinez was signed by the Royals on March 7 of last year. He split his first season of professional baseball between three levels. He made one start at Low-A Lexington and pitched twice out of the bullpen for Rookie-Idaho Falls. Martinez spent most of the year at Rookie-Burlington, where he was named Burlington's Pitcher of The Year.

THE BOOK ON JACKSON KOWAR: Jackson Kowar will make his 12th start as a Blue Rock. The 33rd overall pick in the 2018 Draft out of the University of Florida signed with the Royals for \$2.14 million last summer. The righty entered 2019 as the seventh-ranked prospect in the Royals system. He spent his first professional season at Low-A Lexington where he helped the Legends win a South Atlantic League Championship. Kowar went 0-1 with a 3.42 ERA in nine total regular season starts, but posted a 1.06 ERA and a scant .125 batting average against over his final five outings, and then earned victories in both of his playoff starts. He was one of five Wilmington pitchers to be named a Carolina League All Star.

LAST TIME OUT: Kowar allowed three runs on eight hits in a no-decision against Fayetteville.

VERSUS TODAY'S OPPONENT: Kowar is making his first start against Lynchburg.

GROWTH SPURT CERTAINLY HELPED: Kowar always had the pedigree and passion necessary to succeed in baseball. His father Frank pitched at UNC-Charlotte before playing a year of rookie ball in the Blue Jays' system. Jackson lived to play the game growing up, but growing was the only thing holding him back. He stood just 5-foot-8 after his freshman year of high school, but then hit a growth spurt that summer and was up six inches to 6-foot-2 by his sophomore season. Kowar said it did not take long to harness his new frame and suddenly college recruiters were a constant presence at each of his starts.

FUN TIMES IN FLORIDA: Kowar ended up at Florida after his initial lean, Clemson, fired its coach following the 2014 season. Kowar joined the Gators' weekend rotation as a sophomore, starting behind Singer on Sundays. He enjoyed quite a run in college, winning a national championship in 2017 when he led the SEC with 12 wins and was 12-0 until losing to TCU in his final start at the College World Series (despite a then-career-high 11 strikeouts in that game). Then he and Gators got back to the College World Series as a junior. Kowar struck out 13 vs. Texas in a 6-1 elimination game win in Omaha. It was the most strikeouts in a CWS game since 2010.

FIRST-ROUND TRIO BUILDING A BOND: Last June, the Kansas City front office spent more than \$8 million on three college pitchers among the first 34 picks of the draft, selecting Brady Singer 18th, Kowar 33rd and Daniel Lynch at No. 34. Fortunately for the Royals, the trio gets along great. Singer and Kowar lived together for three years at the University of Florida. Lynch and Kowar roomed together last season in Lexington, and all three got an apartment together this season in Wilmington. "We understand that we're all in this thing kind of together," Lynch says. "The Royals have done a great job of expressing that to us. It's not about who's going to be the ace, it's about being teammates, having success as a team and about us moving up together."

WHAT A CHANGE OF PACE: The Royals told The Athletic this spring that one of the things that enticed them most about Kowar was his changeup, which has left scouts drooling for years. J.J. Picollo was quoted as saying: "It looks like a splitter and can disappear at times." He also called it a "70 or 80" pitch—a high compliment from a baseball man of Picollo's stature.

UNDERSTANDING THE PROCESS: Kowar understands the game and so he knows better than most pitchers at this level exactly what he needs to do to take the next step. "For me, I've always been a really good fastball/change-up guy," Kowar says. "But going into this season I really want to develop a third pitch and start throwing my breaking ball more consistently. As a starter, you turn lineups over three or four times and get really deep into games and eating up a bunch of innings is something that I'm really trying to focus on this year. Just be able to pitch deep into games and save the bullpen. So, developing a third pitch is going to be very important for that."

FAVORITE TEAM AND PLAYER GROWING UP: "My Dad is from Chicago and was a White Sox fan, so that was my team. And I really liked Jake Peavy growing up. When he went from the Padres to the White Sox I used to watch all their games. He was my guy."

So when I'm in the cages, I have to split my batting practice rounds to make sure I stay balanced working on each side." **On outgoing personality:** "That's helped me a lot with my game. Trying to stay relaxed, smiling and enjoying the game. Everyone can see that on and off the field. I always like to talk in the dugout, joke with my teammates. If you take the game too seriously, it becomes no fun anymore." **On signing with the Royals:** "When I signed, in my mind, I knew I was young, but to sign for that money, it just made me so happy. I knew I could help my family and I worked very hard to make it and just very proud of that moment and happy I can support my family."
