**TODAY'S GAME:** Welcome to LoanMart Field here in the opening series of 2018. Today is the last game of this four-game home stand as your Rancho Cucamonga Quakes take on the Inland Empire 66ers (Angels' affiliate) in the final game of this four-game set. Today is U.S. Bank youth clinic day. With the purchase of a ticket to the game, local kids receive free baseball instruction from Quakes players and coaches, all thanks to U.S. Bank. After the completion of this series, the Quakes will head back out on the road, as they travel to Lancaster for three games against the JetHawks.

**VS INLAND EMPIRE:** This is the fourth of 30 overall meetings between the two clubs and the fourth of 16 here at home. Rancho's game three win over the Sixers has given them the early season series lead 2-1. In 2017 the Quakes went 15-12 against Inland Empire, 8-5 here at home.

**LAST TIME OUT:** The Quakes extended their winning streak to a season-high two games with a 7-6 walkoff win over the 66ers in game three of the series. Cristian Santana's sacrifice fly in the bottom of the fourth inning would give the Quakes a mid-game 5-4 lead. With the Quakes on top 6-5 in the top of the ninth, Inland Empire's Jared Walsh smashed a leadoff home run to tie the game at 6-6. Rancho would prevent extra innings however, as Logan Landon, who led off the bottom of the ninth with a double, scored on a Hamlet Marte RBI fielder's choice to give the Quakes a 7-6 walkoff win. On the hill, Sven Schueller (1-0) received the win and Tyler Stevens (1-1) was hit with the loss.

**D-LUX:** Gavin Lux is starting to pick up the pace offensively. After collecting just one hit in his first five games, Lux now has two multi-hit performances over his last four games. He has gone 7-for-16 over the last four games with four runs scored, raising his average from .050 to .222. The former first-rounder out of Kenosha, Wisconsin hit .244 over 111 games last year with Great Lakes, with seven homers with 39 RBIs.

**FAMILIAR FACES ON THE FARM:** A total of 16 former Quakes have returned to Rancho Cucamonga to start the 2018 campaign, including 12 of the 14 pitchers on the roster. Jordan Sheffield and Tony Gonsolin, ranked 18th and 24th in the Dodgers' system, respectively by MLB Pipeline.com, return to the Quakes to help anchor the rotation. Former Quakes Dean Kremer, Chris Mathewson and Andrew Sopko will also pitch out of the rotation. The bullpen is made up entirely of former Quakes, with Stetson Allie, Isaac Anderson, Parker Curry, Andrew Istler, Nolan Long, Ryan Moseley and Jason Richman making up the relief core. California League 2017 All-Star Ibandel Isabel, who mashed 28 home runs for last year's club, returns to the Quakes for a second year. He'll be joined by returning infielder Omar Estevez and outfielder Logan Landon.

**RECENT ROSTER MOVES:** Today RHP Isaac Anderson was transferred to extended Spring Training in Arizona, Evy Ruibal is transferred from Extended Spring Training to Rancho Cucamonga. Ruibal spent last season at Great Lakes (1-2, 4.61 ERA, 9G, 0GS). Saturday, Leo Crawford was optioned back to extended Spring training. Filling his spot is RHP Sven Schuller transferred from extended Spring Training in Arizona.

**SAME SKIPPER, NEW STAFF:** Back to skipper the Quakes for a third consecutive year will be Manager Drew Saylor, who has led the team to the Cal League Playoffs in each of the last two seasons. Saylor, whose team went 76-64 last season, is now 155-125 in his first two seasons and will be just the third manager in team history to lead the team for three seasons (Mike Basso 1996-1998, Bobby Meacham 2002-2004). The hitting coach will be Justin Viele, a Fullerton native who will enter his second year with the Dodgers. In 2017, the former Santa Clara Bronco was the hitting coach for the Ogden Raptors of the Pioneer League. Taking over pitching coach duties will be Connor McGuinness who also enters his second year in the Dodgers' system. Last season, the Arlington, Virginia native worked in the same role for the Great Lakes Loons of the Midwest League, after spending three of the four previous years working for his alma mater, Emory University. The final member of Saylor's staff will be assistant coach Petie Montero, another second-year member of the Dodgers' system. Montero joins the Quakes after one year of coaching with the Dodgers Dominican Summer League Team.

**DODGERS WITH 15 QUAKES ON OPENING DAY ROSTER:** The Dodgers' season is well underway and a total of 15 players named to the 2018 Los Angeles Dodgers opening day roster have sported a Quakes uniform in years past. The list includes Dodgers starting pitchers Clayton Kershaw, Rich Hill, Kenta Maeda and Hyun-jin Ryu along with bullpen arms Kenley Jansen, Ross Stripling and Pedro Baez. Position players Corey Seager, Cody Bellinger, Mike Moustakas, Matt Kemp, Yasiel Puig, Joc Pederson, Logan Forsythe and Kyle Farmer have all made previous stops in Rancho Cucamonga as well.

**KREMER DAY:** Dean Kremer (0-1) will make his third start of the year for Rancho and his first against Inland Empire on the season. In his last start, Kremer was locked in, throwing five scoreless innings allowing three hits, walking one and striking out six at Stockton on 4/10. Kremer, a Stockton, CA native was drafted by the Dodgers in the 14th round out of UNLV in the 2016 MLB draft. A dual American and Israeli citizen, Kremer became the first ever Israeli citizen to be drafted, when picked by the Padres in 2015.

**OPPOSING PITCHER:** Erik Manoah (0-1) makes his second start of the year and first against the Quakes. In his only other start, he allowed four hits over three innings in a loss against Modesto on 4/10. Last season, he split time between Burlington of the Midwest League (5-8, 3.81 ERA, 23 G, 20 GS) and Inland Empire (1-2, 9.75 ERA, 3 G, 3 GS).
