RAILRIDERS BREAKDOWN

YESTERDAY: The RailRiders dropped a 10-2 decision to the Buffalo Bisons on Saturday afternoon at PNC Field. The RailRiders have dropped all five of their meetings with the Bisons on the young year.

R&R: SWB's scores both saw **Rob Refsnyder** touch the plate. He doubled to begin the home seventh and later scored on **Mason Williams'** sac fly to center. In the ninth, Refsnyder and **Donovan Solano** combined on back-to-back doubles to round out the game's scoring.

THE STAMPEDE: Single scores in the second, fourth, sixth and seventh staked Buffalo to a 4-0 lead. Alex Monsalve's infield single plated Dwight Smith for an unearned run in the second. Smith had reached on an error. Mike Ohlman and Monsalve began the fourth and seventh respectively with home runs. In between, Jason Leblebajian singled Rowdy Tellez home in the sixth. Buffalo ballooned its lead with three-run homers in the eighth and ninth by Leblebajian and Smith.

T-WADE: Tyler Wade went 0-for-4 as his season-opening hitting streak stalled at seven. He went 13-for-27 (.481) with a walk during his hot start to the 2017 campaign. Wade owns four of the team's seven total steals and has scored five runs.

YOUNG GUNS: Wade, **Clint Frazier** and **Dustin Fowler**, the RailRiders' usual 1-2-3 hitters early this season, are all 22 years old. The IL's mean-average age for position players early this season is 26.8. Frazier went 1-for-3 with a double, a walk and a hard line out to shortstop yesterday. Four of his six hits on the year have been doubles and his five walks make for a .364 OBP. In his first tour of duty with the RailRiders in 2016, Frazier drew seven total walks and posted a .278 OBP over 25 games played with 101 at-bats.

LOOK OUT BELOW: The Portland Sea Dogs (Boston Red Sox) used four unearned runs in the seventh inning to take the series finale over the Double-A Trenton Thunder, 4-2, on Saturday afternoon...**Miguel Andujar** went 2-for-4 and knocked in a pair of runs...He leads the Eastern League with 13 RBIs...**Mike Ford** extended his hitting streak to eight games with a third-inning single...**Abiatal Avelino** and **Trey Amburgey** combined to drive in all three runs as the Advanced-A Tampa Yankees (7-4) defeated the Bradenton Marauders (Pittsburgh Pirates), 3-2, on Saturday night at "The Boss"...Tampa won the series over Bradenton, 3-1...Bradenton entered the series as MiLB's last undefeated team...Tampa's **Jorge Mateo** went 2-for-4 with a triple and two runs scored as the leadoff man...**Estevan Florial** went 3-for-4 including a double and a home run to drive in two and the Low-A Charleston bullpen tossed 3.1 shutout frames as the RiverDogs (7-3) scored four unanswered runs to top Rome Braves, 4-2, on Saturday night...The win pulled Charleston even with Rome first place in the Southern Division.

ON THE BUMP: SWB's Opening Day man '16, IL AS **Chad Green** was received along w/RHP **Luis Cessa** from DET for LHP **Justin Wilson** Dec. 9, '15. A TOR 37th-rd'er in '10 out of Effingham HS (Ill.), he chose Univ. of Louisville. DET made him an 11th-rd'er in '13 He leapt Rookie GCL to A+ in '13, mostly relieving. A FT Low-A starter in '14 (23GS, 6-4, 3.11, 8.6K/9IP, 4.5K:1BB), he spent '15 AA (27GS, 5-14, 3.93, 8.3K/9IP, 3.2K:1BB) and ranked 3rd in the EL in K (137), K/9IP and losses. His MLB debut came May 16, '16 at ARI. He has a QS in 10 of his last 13 at AAA. He has allowed 6R in his last 35 IP at AAA. He lost his '17 SWB debut vs. LHV on Tue. (5IP, 7H, 4R/3ER, 1BB, 8K, 95P/63S).

An ATL 8th-rd'er in '08 from William Penn HS (Del.), **Brett Oberholtzer** rose to AA AS in '11 before trade to HOU that July in Michael Bourn deal. He got his first AAA time in '12 and made his MLB debut Apr. 21, '13. On Dec. 12, '15, HOU traded him to PHI in Ken Giles deal. PHI DFA'd him Aug. 6, '16 and LAA claimed him off waivers Aug. 9, '16. SOUTH OF THE BORDER: Buffalo has fielded a Triple-A baseball team since 1985. It was the top satellite of the White Sox from 1985-86, the Indians in 1987 and the Pirates from 1988-94 before it switched back to the Indians (1995-08). In 2009, the Bisons claimed an Empire State squad as their parent club in the Mets. But change came calling again as 2013 marked the first season that the closest Major League city sent its top minor leaguers to Buffalo. In April 2016, the Blue Jays renewed their PDC with the Bisons through the 2018 season. Rogers Centre, home of the Blue Jays, is just a 90-minute drive from Coca-Cola Field (not including customs-related delays).

CALLING THE SHOTS: First-year Buffalo skipper **Bobby Meacham** spent his entire six-year playing career in the bigs with the New York Yankees (1983-88). He slashed .236/.313/.308/.621 over 457 career games and 1,591 plate appearances. His lone season with over 400 at-bats came in 1985 when he slashed .218/.302/.266/.568 as the team's primary shortstop and by far led the bigs with 23 sacrifice hits. His teammate, **Don Mattingly**, claimed A.L. MVP honors as the Yankees won 97 games for the junior circuit's second-best record, but fell 2.0 games shy of the first-place Toronto Blue Jays for the A.L. East crown. It made for Toronto's first division title. The Yankees hadn't won a division crown since 1981 and would not win another until 1996. Two big pieces of that 1996 team spent time with those 1985 Blue Jays, **Cecil Fielder** and **Jimmy Key**. Also, one of Toronto's catchers that season, who saw time in just 14 games in his final season as a big league player? Meacham's predecessor as Buffalo manager, **Gary Allenson**.
