RAILRIDERS BREAKDOWN

HOME: 29-14 | AWAY: 26-19 | STREAK: W 1 | LAST 5: 4-1 | LAST 10: 7-3

LAST TIME OUT: The SWB RailRiders walloped the Lehigh Valley IronPigs 8-1 on Saturday night at PNC Field behind a strong showing from **Jack Cave**. The RailRiders improved to 7-6 against the IronPigs this season and secured sole possession of first place in the International League North heading into the All-Star Break. SWB has won 18 of their last 25.

I'M JUST A CAVE MAN: Cave finished 3-for-3 and recorded his first career two-homer game. He also tallied a career-best five RBIs. The MVP of the Governors' Cup Championship Series in 2016, Cave has gone 27-for-82 with 13 extra-base hits (seven home runs), 14 RBIs and 16 runs scored, slashing .329/.382/.671/1.053. Cave entered 2017 with 19 career round-trippers. He has 12 between Double-A Trenton (5) and SWB this year.

PITCHING LINES: **Nick Rumbelow** (2-0) took home the win in relief. The right-hander blanked the IronPigs for 2.2 innings. He walked two and struck out a pair. The RailRiders started **Brady Lail**, who went four frames. He yielded a solo homer as part of three hits while walking two with four strikeouts. **Tyler Jones** finished the game with a scoreless 2.1 innings and five strikeouts.

SOL MAN: **Donovan Solano** finished 0-for-5 Saturday and snapped his hitting streak at 12 games. He ended May hitting .164 overall. Since the start of June, he has reached safely in 30 of his 33 games played and owns a .339/.378/.427/.805 line in that time. During the spurt he has eight doubles, 14 RBIs.

NEW BLOOD: **Billy McKinney** went 3-for-4 in the win. In his nine Triple-A affairs, he has gone 14-for-34 with five extra-base hits, seven RBIs, eight runs scored and an outfield assist, slashing .412/.459/.765/1.224. McKinney has more three-hit games (3) than hitless games (2) at Triple-A.

SWIPER, NO SWIPING!: SWB leads the IL in caught-stealing efficiency at 44% (31 of 71 caught). **Eddy Rodriguez** stands as the IL's top catcher in the category. With Rodriguez behind the plate SWB has nabbed 18 men in 35 attempts (51%). The IL's average caught-stealing efficiency minus SWB stands at 31%.

OFF THE RAILS: **Matt Holliday** finished 2-for-4 as the DH in first rehab appearance on Saturday. The RailRiders have used 16 different starting pitchers...The 2015 RailRiders tied the IL single-season record by using 24 different starters...This year's RailRiders have used 56 total players this season (28 position players, 28 pitchers)...The 2015 unit tied the IL record by using 75 different players, a mark originally set by the 2012 Norfolk Tides...SWB's offense ranks among the IL's best in: R/G (1st, 4.97), AVG (1st, .275), OBP (1st, .342), SLG (1st, .448), OPS (1st, .791), 2B (1st, 185), 3B (1st, 25), HR (3rd, 93) and SB (3rd, 76)...SWB pitching ranks among the IL's best in ERA (T-2nd, 3.51), WHIP (1st, 1.21) and K/9IP (2nd, 9.1)...SWB is undefeated in extra-inning games (6-0)...Only Columbus (7-0) has a better mark in the IL...At 15-6 (.714), the RailRiders boast the IL's best record in one-run games...**Al Pedrique's** team improved to 4-28 when trailing after eight innings, tying it with Rochester for the most such victories in the IL.

HEY NOW!: The RailRiders will send two representatives to the Triple-A All-Star Game in Tacoma, Wash. next week. Manager **Al Pedrique** will manage the IL squad against the PCL. Left-hander **Caleb Smith** will join his skipper out west. Smith is tied for the second most wins (8) and ranks towards the top in several league categories: 2.07 ERA (3rd), 1.00 WHIP (3rd) and a .196 BAA (1st). The All-Star Game, presented by CHI Franciscan Health, originates from Cheney Stadium, home of the Tacoma Rainiers (Seattle Mariners) this year and will be televised by MLB Network. 1400 The Game, NEPA's FOX Sports Radio, your home for RailRiders baseball, will carry the event. First pitch is set for 9:05 p.m.

CATCH IT HERE: PNC Field will host the 2017 Gildan Triple-A National Championship Game on Sept. 19 at 7:07 p.m. For tickets or more information, please call 570-969-BALL (2255) or visit swbrailriders.com. The RailRiders claimed the franchise's second-ever Governors' Cup as IL champs and the team's first-ever Triple-A national title with a win over El Paso in 2016.

ON THE BUMP: Signed by MIA as an Int'l FA in '09, **Domingo German** was selected to play in the All-Star Futures Game in '14 while dominating w/Low-A Greensboro (25GS, 9-3, 2.48, 113K, 25BB). After that season, Baseball America named him MIA's 6th-best prospect. In Dec. '14 he was traded to NYY w/Nathan Eovaldi and Garrett Jones for Martin Prado and David Phelps. He missed '15 after TJ. In Nov. '16, BA's JJ Cooper named German among the select group of MiLB hurlers that throw 100+ mph. That same month, NYY added him to its 40-man roster. He began '17 AA (6GS, 1-4, 3.00, .248, 1.27).

In '16, **Zach Eflin** claimed IL POTW honors (April 11-17) after his first 2GS w/LHV (2-0, 0.64 ERA, 0.64 WHIP, 159 BAA, 14IP, 7H, 1R, 2BB, 8K). Twice traded Dec. '14: first LAD Matt Kemp deal, then PHI Jimmy Rollins trade. He spent '15 as a AA AS w/REA (23GS, 8-6, 3.69), but DNP in ASG (silver-medal run w/Team USA at Pan-Am Games). He dominated the EL playoffs (2GS, 2-0, 1.38) and inc. playoffs 10-0, 2.78 over 17GS from Aug. 2 '15-May 24 '16. He faced SWB twice in '16, both at PNC Field: Apr. 27 win (6.1IP, 4H, 0R, 1BB, 6K, 2HB); May 7 ND (5.1IP, 7H, 5R, 2BB, 6K, 1HR). After 11GS, 5-2, 2.90, .199, 0.89 w/LHV, he ended '16 w/PHI (11GS, 3-5, 5.54, .269, 1.33). He had surgery on his right (Aug. 19, '16) and left (Sept. 30, '16) knees and DNP in spring training '17. Won vs SWB on April 11 (5.0IP, 5H, 0R, 3BB, 4K).

Bacon Bits

CANADIAN TO AMERICAN: The Lehigh Valley franchise began as the Ottawa Lynx in 1993 and played in the province of Ontario until 2007. It was affiliated with the Montreal Expos (1993-2002) and Baltimore Orioles (2003-2006) before switching to the Philadelphia Phillies (2007-Present) when SWB became the Yankees' top satellite. The club became known as the IronPigs when it moved to Coca-Cola Park in Allentown prior to the 2008 season. Coca-Cola Park seats 10,000 and required \$50.25 million to complete. The IronPigs drew 602,033 fans in their first season (8,479 per game). Lehigh Valley led all of stateide minor league baseball in attendance for three straight years until 2013 when Columbus won the per-game race (9,212 to 9,016). The "IronPigs" name is in reference to pig iron - a component in the manufacturing of steel.

THE SKIPPER: First-year manager **Dusty Wathan** skipped Double-A Reading for the last five seasons, including an Eastern League-best 89 wins last season before a first-round playoff exit at the hands of the Trenton Thunder. The Fightin Phils finished with full-season MiLB's second-best record, trailing only SWB (91-52). Reading's all-time winningest manager (373-335) claimed EL Manager of the Year honors in each of the last two seasons. He has also skippered SS-A Williamsport, Low-A Lakewood and Adv.-A Clearwater for the Phillies. He entered 2017 with a 631-565 career record. He played two seasons on Philly's farm, including time in 2006 as part of the final SWB Red Barons. In 80 games played that year with SWB, he slashed .239/.320/.345/.664 with 10 doubles, five homers and 27 RBIs. Wathan's father, John, played for the Kansas City Royals (1976-85) and was a member of the 1985 World Series champs. John later managed both K.C. (1987-91) and the Angels (1992), going 326-320 (.505).

 •Selected by the Oakland Athletics in the first round (24th overall) of the 2013 First-Year Player Draft out of Plano West Senior High School, Texas
 •Drafted the same year as Clint Frazier (1st rd, CLE) and Aaron Judge (1st rd, NYY)
 •On July 4, 2014, the Athletics traded McKinney to the Chicago Cubs with shortstop prospect Addison Russell and P Dan Straily, in exchange for Jeff Samardzija and Jason Hammel

 •Selected by the Yankees in the fourth round of the 2010 First-Year Player Draft from West Orange High School, Fla.

 •His grandfather's brother, Walt Williams, played Major League baseball as an OF from 1964-1975 with the Houston Colt .45s, White Sox, Indians and Yankees
