## President/Owner, Bisons Baseball Inc.

As Chairman of Rich Products Corporation, Robert E. Rich Jr. (Bob) has led the company to more than $\$ 3.6$ billion in
worldwide sales revenue. Rich's continues to build business in new markets with cuttingedge management practices, high business ethics, and customer service standards, which have earned Bob distinction as one of the nation's most prominent business leaders.

His dynamic leadership was recognized with an appointment as Chairman of the U.S. based Grocery Manufacturers Association in 1999 and selection as a National Restaurant Association "Diplomat" in May 2000.

Other noteworthy distinctions include his 1996 induction into the Frozen Food Industry Hall of Fame, making his father, Robert E. Rich, and him the first father-and-son team to be so honored. That same year, Refrigerated and Frozen Foods magazine selected Bob as its "Executive of the Year." In 2017, Bob and his father were inducted into the inaugural class of the Western New York Business Hall of Fame and joined a group of Buffalo's finest leaders celebrated for leaving an indelible mark on Buffalo Niagara.

Bob is a member of the Grocery Manufacturers Association Hall of Achievement, the National Frozen Food Hall of Fame, the Prepared Food Hall of Fame and the ENACTUS (Entrepreneurial, Action, Us; formerly known as Students in Free Enterprise [SIFE]) Hall of Fame. Also, the Buffalo Baseball Hall of Fame, the Buffalo Sabres Hall of Fame, the Greater Buffalo Sports Hall of Fame and the National Baseball Congress Hall of Fame. In 1999, he became the second angler ever to be inducted into the South Florida Fishing Hall of Fame.

In addition to his Rich Products leadership, Bob has played an important role in professional baseball in Buffalo, N.Y.
In 1983, Bob purchased the then-struggling Double-A Buffalo Bisons professional franchise, in order to keep professional baseball in the Queen City.

In 1984, he realized another major goal when he purchased baseball's Triple-A Wichita Aeros and moved the American Association franchise to Buffalo.

In 1988, Bob cut the ribbon on Buffalo's new downtown ballpark, celebrating the fulfillment of a dream to build a new home for the Bisons and setting the franchise on a course that has since included two league championships and annual minor league attendance supremacy.

He serves as President and CEO of Bison Baseball Inc., Northwest Arkansas Baseball Inc., and Morgantown Baseball Inc. He is also the past Commissioner of the National Baseball Congress, an organization of amateur and semi-pro baseball leagues operating in the U.S. and Canada

## Career Highlights

Bob's path to success - in business, sports and the community - began at the Nichols School in Buffalo, where he was a football quarterback and a standout goaltender in the prep school's illustrious hockey history.

After Nichols, Bob continued to show his prowess at Williams College, where he earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in 1963 and served as co-captain of the hockey team during his senior year. After graduation from Williams, he returned to Buffalo and broke into professional hockey as a backup goalie for the Buffalo Bisons of the American Hockey League, before a try out for the 1964 U.S. Olympic Team.

After active duty with the U.S. National Guard, Bob joined Rich Products in 1964 and received a complete introduction to the company in the role of President of Rich Products of Canada, a start-up subsidiary. While working, he returned to school to earn his MBA with honors from the prestigious University of Rochester Simon School of Business in 1969. His next position at Rich's was Vice President of Sales and Marketing, a new department for the company that he started and staffed.

Over time, Bob assumed the positions held by his father and mentor, Robert E. Rich. Bob Rich was named President of Rich's in 1978 and Chairman of the company in 2006.

Two years after arriving on the Triple-A baseball scene, Bob was named the 1986 American Association Executive of the Year. In 1988, Sporting News magazine tabbed him Minor League Executive of the Year.

Bob is also a recipient of the Peter Medaille Medal from Medaille College and six honorary doctorates - from St. Bonaventure University, Niagara University, D’Youville College, Johnson and Wales University, Hilbert College and Canisius College. In addition, he received a Distinguished Alumni Award from the University of Rochester.

On June 8, 2014, Bob delivered the commencement address at the University of Rochester's William E. Simon Graduate School of Business Administration graduation ceremony. He addressed graduates after receiving the Charles Force Hutchison and Marjorie Smith Hutchison Medal, the university's highest recognition of personal achievement, for his contributions for more than 45 years after graduating from the Simon School's MBA program.

## Boards \& Leadership

Today, Bob is active with several corporate boards and organizations. He also serves as Chairman of the Board of Directors and Trustees of the Cleveland Clinic and Emeritus Trustee of the International Game Fish Association.

Bob is a member of the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation Leadership Council. He co-founded and chaired Western New York United Against Drug and Alcohol Abuse and the annual Greater Niagara BassEye Celebrity Challenge with his wife, Mindy. As a signature event in Buffalo, it has raised more than $\$ 1.3$ million for cystic fibrosis research. He is also a member of the Outdoor Writers Association of America, United States Squash Association, Billfish Foundation and the United States Masters Swimming - Florida Gold Coast Chapter. Additionally, he is a life member of Distinguished Order of Zerocrats and National Frozen \& Refrigerated Foods Association Honorable Order of Golden Penguins.

Bob is a past Chairman of the Uniform Code Council, past Vice Chairman of the International Game Fish Association, the Cleveland Clinic Foundation Development Committee and ENACTUS. He is also a past Chairman of the National Frozen Food Association (NFFA), being one of the youngest ever to head the NFFA leadership group, which represents more than 1,600 distributors, brokers and manufacturers.

Bob is a trustee and director of the Cleveland Clinic Foundation, on the Trustees Council for the University of Rochester and Director of the following: the 100 Club of Buffalo, Inc., the International League of Professional Baseball and the Police Athletic League. Bob has served as a co-producer to several theatrical productions on Broadway with Mindy as part of the Rich Entertainment Group.

In March 2019, Mike was named the President of Rich Baseball Operations, overseeing the overall operations of not only the Bisons, but also the Northwest Arkansas Naturals, a Double-A affiliate of the Kansas City Royals, and the West Virginia Black Bears, a Single-A affiliate of the Pittsburgh Pirates.

During Mike's tenure as Bisons General Manager, the club has led their league in attendance seven times, including the International League's all-time attendance record set in 1998. In December 2001, Mike accepted the prestigious Bob Freitas Award from Baseball America on behalf of the Bisons, becoming the first Triple-A team to win the award twice (also in 1991). The award is presented annually to a franchise for overall operational excellence. Mike is responsible for the strategic planning of the Bisons organization and manages all day-to-day operations of the front office staff. He is also responsible for the coordination of the player development contract with the Bisons'Major League parent clubs, including the Pittsburgh Pirates (1994), Cleveland Indians (1995-2008), the New York Mets (2009-2012) and the Toronto Blue Jays (2013-present).

Mike began with the Bisons in 1987 as a Public Relations Assistant during the team's final season at War Memorial Stadium. Coinciding with the club's move to Pilot Field in 1988, Mike was promoted to Public Relations Coordinator and then to Public Relations Manager in 1989. During the 1992 season, he was promoted to Assistant General Manager and was named General Manager on December 17, 1993. He became Vice President of Bisons Baseball in 1999.

A native Buffalonian, Mike graduated in 1982 from Bishop Timon High School where he played three years of varsity baseball and hockey, earning All-Catholic honors as a hockey player. Mike was inducted into the Bishop Timon High School Sports Hall of Fame in 2010. He graduated from Canisius College with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Communications in 1986. While at Canisius College, Mike was the captain of the hockey team.

He is a board member for Western New York United Against Drug \& Alcohol Abuse Foundation, the Greater Buffalo Sports Hall of Fame and the Buffalo Bisons Charitable Foundation. ## Buffalo Bisons Retired Numbers



## Ollie Carnegie

Carnegie was the most popular player and greatest offensive performer in the history of professional baseball in Buffalo. He played 12 years with the Bisons (1931-1941, 1945) and is Buffalo's all-time leader with 258 home runs (2nd in International League behind only Mike Hessman) and 1,044 RBI. Carnegie led the Bisons in home runs and RBI seven times (1932-1935, 1937-1939) and the IL twice (1938, 1939). His 45 home runs in 1938 remain a club record. A lifetime .308 hitter, Carnegie also owns the Bisons records for games $(1,273)$, hits $(1,362)$ and doubles (249) even though he didn't join the team until he was 32 years old. Carnegie was in the inaugural class for both the International League (1947) and Buffalo Baseball Hall of Fame.


Luke Easter
Luscious Easter was a slugging first baseman whose long home runs and colorful style of play captured the hearts of Bisons fans from 1956 through 1959. Easter, who was the first black player to play for Buffalo since 1888, hit over 35 homers and drove more than 100 runs for three consecutive seasons in Buffalo. He led the International League in home runs at RBI in both 1956 ( 35 homers, 106 RBI ) and 1957 ( 40 home runs, 128 RBI). All told, Easter hit 114 home runs and drove in 353 runs with the Bisons. Of his many memorable games, Easter will always be remembered as the first player ever to hit a home run over the scoreboard at Offermann Stadium. Easter is also a member of the International League Hall of Fame and the Buffalo Baseball Hall of Fame.


## Jeff Manto

One of the most well-known players of the Bisons modern era, Manto played for the Bisons during parts of four seasons (1997-2000). He is the Bisons modern era Home Run King with his 79 home runs. Manto joined the Bisons in June of 1997 and hit 20 homers and had 54 RBI in just 54 games. He was named American Association Batter-of-the-Week an unprecedented four times in six weeks. On July 12, 1997 against the Iowa Cubs, he became the first player to hit three home runs in one game at Sahlen Field. Manto added 23 homers in 1998, helping propel the Bisons to a Governors' Cup Championship. In the inaugural Triple-A World Series, Manto led all batters with a .533 batting average. He's a member of the International League Hall of Fame and the Buffalo Baseball Hall of Fame.

## Buftalo Baseball HallotFame

The Buffalo Baseball Hall of Fame represents such persons who have made a significant contribution to Buffalo professional baseball, or such Western New Yorkers who have made a meaningful contribution to professional baseball generally. The Buffalo Baseball Hall of Fame was established in 1985 in conjunction with Buffalo Baseball's 100th anniversary celebration. Each year the Hall of Fame Committee nominates names for suggested induction onto the preliminary ballot. Finalists are selected by a secret ballot, where a three-quarters vote of the committee is required for induction.

## Buffalo Baseball Hall of Fame Committee

The Buffalo Bisons Hall of Fame Committee is comprised of Mike Buczkowski, Tom Burns, Mike Buczkowski, Bob Dicesare, Mike Harrington, Kevin Lester, Duke McGuire, Bob Miske, and Pete Weber. Phil Ranallo, who died in 1986; Joe Alli, who died in 1996; Joe Overfield, who died in 2000, Vince McNamara, who died in 2000, Cy Kritzer, who died in 2004, Dan Carnevale, who died in 2005, Cy Williams, who died in 2006, and George Daddario, who died in 2007, were also members of the committee. Ralph Hubbell retired from the committee in 1998 prior to his death in 2000.

The Buffalo Bisons are well represented in the National Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown, New York. Since 1937, a total of 21 former Bisons players, managers or coaches have been forever enshrined among baseball's elite. In fact, in eight of the nine decades from the 1880s to the 1960s, Bisons fans have been able to watch a future member of the National

## Buffalo Bisons in the International League Hall of Fame (31 members)

In 1947, the International League started its Hall of Fame by inducting a group of nine former players, managers and League officials. Over the next 16 years, 51 individuals were honored with induction. Following 1963, the IL Hall of Fame would be dormant for more than four decades. Then in 2007, in preparation for the League's 125th anniversary season, the IL Hall of Fame was formally revived with the induction of two former League presidents.
In 2008, a historic class of 27 individuals, including six former Buffalo Bisons players, were inducted into the International League Hall of Fame. The Bisons had four more inductions in 2009 and two in 2010 as the IL concluded a three-year revitalization plan for its Hall of Fame.
In 2018, former Bisons slugger and minor league baseball home run king Mike Hess-
 man will become the 31 st former Bison to be inducted into the IL Hall of Fame.

## The Triple-A All-Star Game



The first ever Triple-A All-Star Game was played on July 13, 1988 before a sold out crowd at Buffalo's Pilot Field. The American League defeated the National League, 2-1.
Twenty-five years later, Coca-Cola Field once again hosted the annual event that included an All-Star Home Run Derby won by Bisons' DH Valentino Pascucci two days before the Pacific Coast League's $3-0$ win over the International League in the 2012 TripleA All-Star Game. Once again, the game was played in front of a sold-out crowd.


## Buffalo Bisons in the Triple-A All-Star Game

From 1988-1997, the All-Star teams were comprised of players from the American Association, International League and Pacific Coast League with players playing on the team represented by their Major League affiliation (AL vs. NL). In 1998, after the American Association dissolved, the teams were divided by International League vs. Pacific Coast League membership.

## Most Inspirational Player

The Bisons Most Inpirational Player award is named after Joe De Sa , who was a slick-fielding, power-hitting player who loved his family, friends and the city of Buffalo. Joe DeSa will long be remembered as part of Bisons' baseball history.

De Sa, a first baseman with the Bisons in 1985 and 1986, died in a car accident December 20, 1986 following a winter league game in Ponce, Puerto Rico. In two Bisons seasons, De Sa hit 34 home runs and 149 RBI.

The 20' x 40 ' state-of-the-art video board is "turned on" with a giant remote control by Buffalo Mayor Anthony Masiello and Erie County Executive Dennis Gorski...May 8: Jeff Manto hits his 53rd career home run in a Bisons uniform off Richmond hurler Derrin Ebert surpassing teammate Alex Ramirez for the Bisons modern day home run record...July 3: The Bisons defeat the Toledo Mud Hens 2-1. Following the game 17,271 fans are treated to the annual Independence Eve Fireworks Celebration with the BPO...September 5: The Bisons'Fan Appreciation Night crowd of 19,910 outdraws 6 MLB teams that day: Philadelphia (18,839), Pittsburgh (17,901), Tampa Bay (17,480), Florida ( 15,875 ), Kansas City $(15,315)$ and Montreal $(8,302)$.

## 2000 Season

July 3: A crowd of 19,729 fills the seats for the Independence Eve Celebration with the BPO...September 9: The Bisons drop a 10-1 decision vs. Scranton in the fourth and final game of a five-game series in the first round of the IL playoffs. That night's attendance pushes Buffalo's per-game average over 10,000/game, to lead all International League teams.

April: The Bisons, under new skipper Eric Wedge, opened the season by winning all 6 games of the Opening Homestand...May: Bisons set a record for most wins in a month with 22 wins and just 6 losses...June 25: Bisons play their 1000th game at Dunn Tire Park...July 3: 20,050 fans filled the stands to celebrate the country's birthday with the Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra and fireworks...August 17: The Bisons retire Jeff Manto's \#30 (left). Manto's number joins Ollie Carnegie's and Luke Easter's as the team's retired numbers...August 27: A fan wins $\$ 10,000$ as part of the Bisons Mega Money Monday. This was the second time this season a fan won $\$ 10,000$. September 2: Annual Fan Appreciation, over 16,000 fans watched the Bisons beat the Red Wings to finish the season with a 91-51 record. ## 2007 Season

April 9: The Bisons finally start their 20th season at Dunn Tire Park with an 8-3 win over Ottawa. All four games scheduled against Richmond, April 5-8, are postponed due to snow and icy conditions... May 5: Buffalo and Pawtucket restart a suspended game form April 23 with the Red Sox leading 3-0 in the first inning. Pawtucket builds a 14-6, but the Bisons storm back with nine runs in the bottom of the ninth for a 15-14 win. Infielder Trent Durrington, inserted as the pitcher in the top of the inning to save the bullpen, gets the win. Buffalo wins a second game that night, 5-0...June 4: The Bisons beat Toledo, 9-3, in front of 14,378 on School Kids Day...June 20: Buffalo sweeps a doubleheader from Louisville. Aaron Laffey throws a complete-game two-hitter in game one. The southpaw needs just one hour and 21 minutes and 71 pitches to defeat Syracuse, 2-0, in the second game of a doubleheader...September 1: The Bisons turn just the second triple play in Coca-Cola Field history. SS Argenis Reyes makes a diving grab on Rochester's Steve Tolleson's liner. Reyes then throws to 2B Luis Rivera who inturn relays to 1B Mike Lamb to catch two runners off base. The play is \#5 of ESPN's Top 10 Plays later that night.

2010 Season
April 14: After starting the season on the road, the Bisons defeat Pawtucket 8-2 in front of 13,323 fans at the club's Home Opener...April 29: After allowing a leadoff single to Durham's Fernando Perez on an 0-2 pitch, Bisons pitcher R.A. Dickey retires a modern era record 27 batters in a $4-0$ win over the Bulls. The game lasts just one hour, 45 minutes, the shortest nine-inning game in Coca-Cola Field history... May 27: Longtime IL slugger Mike Hessman hits his first ever walk-off home run to lead the Bisons to an 8-7 win in 10 innings over Toledo on School Kids Day... June 3: A crowd of 14,774 attend a Bisons' $7-1$ loss to Syracuse in a game featuring Washington Nationals' mega-prospect, RHP Stephen Strasburg. The VERSUS Network carries the game live to a national audience, the network's first ever broadcast of a professional baseball game...June 14: Trailing 6-3 in the 9th inning, Fernando Martinez hits the second ever walk-off grand slam in Coca-Cola Field history...June 18: Valentino Pascucci becomes just the third Bisons player to hit three home runs in a game at Coca-Cola Field. April 3: Bisons win 6-3 victory over the Rochester Red Wings on Opening Day in front of a crowd of 11,052...June 7: Star Wars Night sells out once again as a crowd of 18,025 watch the Bisons fall to the Syracuse Chiefs, $6-3 \ldots$ July 3: The Bisons annual Independence Eve Celebration with the Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra and Chorus reaches its 20th season. A crowd of 16,505 see the Herd fall to the RailRiders, 4-1...August 11: Outfielder Darin Mastroianni collects a straight steal of home in a 5-0 shutout win over Norfolk...August 12: Blue Jays All-Star slugger Edwin Encarnacion joins the Bisons on an MLB injury rehab assignment and hits the Bisons first grand slam in almost two years in a $7-5$ win over the Tides... August 22: The Bisons announce that after the 2014 season, the City of Buffalo will install new seats in the 'special reserved' section of the ballpark. When completed in the off-season, the ballpark's new seating capacity is reduced to 17,600...August 24: First baseman Brett Wallace hits three home runs, including a walk-off grand slam in the bottom of the 12th inning, in a 10-6 victory over the Pawtucket Red Sox.

## 2017 Season

April 8: After back-to-back postponements to begin the year, the Bisons finally get the 30th Season at Coca-Cola Field underway with a 4-2 victory over the defending champion Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RailRiders...May 19: A crowd of 12,380 watch a marathon Bisons' $7-5$ win over the Red Sox that goes 13 innings and takes four hours and 29 minutes to complete. The game is started by rehabbing Boston ace David Price and ends with two position players earning the decision. Outfielder Ian Parmley earns the win for Buffalo while Rowdy Tellez hits the walk-off two-run homer off PawSox infielder, Mike Miller... June 2: Another sold out crowd enjoys the 10th annual Star Wars Night and a $4-0$ victory over the Knights. At 16,907, it is the largest-attended minor league game of the year...July 3: The Bisons get a very symbolic spot start as former Army First Lieutenant Chris Rowley takes the ball for the 23rd annual KeyBank Independence Eve Celebration and leads the Herd to a 6-2 victory over
 Syracuse. In his first Triple-A start, Rowley strikes out six and allows just one run over five innings for the win...August 30: In one of the most-anticipated off-the-field events in the ballpark history, the racing mascot 'Celery' earns its first victory in 450 attempts in the nightly WCC (Wing, Cheese \& Celery) Race. June 2: A crowd of 16,593 , the largest of the season, sees the Herd defeat the Charlotte Knights 9-2 on Star Wars Night. June 14: The team begins a four-game series against the Rochester Red Wings, re-branded as the Buffalo Wings. It is the first time in the club's history that they used a nickname other than Bisons. June 27: The Herd recorded its 2500th franchise win in the modern era with a 3-1 defeat of the Pawtucket Red Sox. Right hander Chris Rowley picked up the historic win for the Herd in front of 7,134 fans. ## 'The Voice of the Bisons,' Media Relations

Pat Malacaro begins his second season as 'The Voice of the Bisons' and his tenth year as a member of the Bisons Baseball Network. The 2019 season also marks his 16th season as a member of the Bisons' staff.
The South Buffalo native joined the Herd as a broadcaster in 2010 after spending three seasons with the Batavia Muckdogs, the short season Single-A affiliate of the St. Louis Cardinals. His three-year stint in the New York-Penn League included the team's first league championship in 45 years.
During the off-season Pat works for WGR Sports Radio 550 as part of the Sabres Radio Network. His various roles have included reporter, game host, and producer since joining the radio station in 2006. In 2009, WGR was recognized by the National Association of Broadcasters with the Marconi Award for Sports Radio Station of the year.
Malacaro began working for the Bisons as a bat boy from 1999-2002. He attended the Newhouse School at Syracuse University, where he received a Bachelor of Arts degree in Broadcast Journalism in 2005.

Pat was a radio intern for the Bisons during the 2004 and 2005 seasons, which included a Governors' Cup Championship in 2004. He was also a radio host for WERW-AM and a member of the sports talk show staff for WAER-FM during his time at Syracuse University.

He currently resides in South Buffalo.


## Duke McGuire

## Color Analyst

Buffalo Baseball Hall of Famer, Duke McGuire will once again serve as the lead color analysis for the Bisons in 2019. He has been with the Bisons in various capacities for 40 years.

McGuire first covered the Herd with International Cable in 1980 and worked alongside Pete Weber on the Cable Sports Network from 1983-84. He also covered games for WKBW-TV from 1986-87. During the 1988-90 seasons, Duke filled in for radio broadcasts on WGR55 before joining the Empire Sports Network in 1991. He served as public address announcer for the Bisons from 1981-1995. Aside from his broadcasting duties, he has been involved with the Bisons youth baseball program for nearly three decades.

In 2010, Duke McGuire was inducted into the Buffalo Baseball Hall of Fame.
After graduating from Amherst High School he was drafted three times. The New York Mets selected him in 1970 while Pittsburgh selected him in January of 1972 and finally he was selected and signed by Detroit in June 1972. McGuire played for then-manager Jim Leyland at Clinton in the Midwest League during the 1973 season. A few seasons later, McGuire was named MVP of the 1978 Niagara Falls Pirates, for whom he served as playermanager.

An attendance officer at Amherst High School, McGuire has also coached football, basketball and baseball at Amherst, Williamsville South, Canisius and the former Bishop Neumann High School.
A native of Snyder, N.Y., he lives with his wife, Mary, and their daughters, Shannon Lee and Casey Marie.

If necessary, photographers who have to leave to meet deadlines before the game ends should leave between innings only and exit through the tunnel located directly behind home plate.

Press Box is located on the Club level directly behind home plate. Each work space is equipped with an electrical outlet. The Press Box can be accessed via the elevators located on the first base side. The Press Box has complimentary WiFi access. Complimentary meal service will begin one hour before game time to accredited working members of the media.

Bisons Clubhouse is located on the Service level directly behind the first base dugout (visitor located directly behind third base dugout). The Bisons clubhouse is open prior to batting practice ( $9 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$. for afternoon games at 1:05 p.m., 5 hours prior to first pitch all other games) until 65 minutes prior to game time (All interviews must be concluded by 65 minutes prior to game time). The clubhouse is open following the game at the manager's approval (usually immediately). The Bisons' clubhouse is closed during rain delays and between games of a doubleheader. The visiting team clubhouse is governed by the visiting team.

Training Rooms and Player's Lounge are strictly off limits to everyone except Bisons' players and staff. If there is a problem reaching someone in these areas, please see Pat Malacaro or a member of the Bisons media relations staff.

Dugouts must be clear of all media representatives 65 minutes prior to game time. Photographers must take their assigned positions at that time. All media members entering the playing field must do so from the tunnel located directly behind home plate on the Service level.

Interview periods are arranged prior to and following Bisons games. The coaching staff and players can be made available on the field or in the clubhouse during batting practice by special request only. The interview must not interrupt the coaches or players pre-game routine (stretching, running, hitting, etc.). All interviews should be completed 65 minutes prior to game time.
