About 2014: The Gwinnett Braves went 65-77 (.458) in 2014, the club's sixth season of play in Lawrenceville, GA. That record qualified for 12th in the 14-team International League and second in the IL South Division. The G-Braves finished 9.0 games behind division champion Durham (75-69), 1.0 game ahead of third place Norfolk (65-79) and 3.0 games ahead of fourth place Charlotte (63-81). Despite finishing with their most wins since 2011, Gwinnett failed to make the IL playoffs for the fifth straight season and fifth time in six seasons overall.

- The G-Braves started strong, going 26-19 (.578) over their first 45 games to open a 0.5-game lead in the IL South. The club then cooled, going 29-54 (.349) over their next 83 games to fall to fourth place. Gwinnett went 10-5 (.667) in their final 15 games, moving up two spots to finish second.
- GWN's best record of 2014 was 25-17 (.595) on 5/19, their worst record was 55-72 (.433) on 8/16.

Thank You, 303,959 Times: A total of 303,959 fans passed through the Coolray Field gates in 2014, raising Gwinnett's all-time attendance past the two million mark to 2,067,703. GWN hosted 10,145 fans for Independence Day on 7/4, the sixth largest crowd in team history (2009-current).

Snitker at the Helm: Former Atlanta Braves third base coach **Brian Snitker** managed Gwinnett in 2014, his first season with the club. After spending the previous seven seasons (2007-13) on the Major League staff, he was named the third skipper in G-Braves' history on 10/14/13. In his first year as a manager since 2006 with Triple-A Richmond, he guided Gwinnett to a 65-74 record (.468).

- On 7/13, Snitker served as an assistant coach to former Minnesota Twins manager **Tom Kelly** on the U.S. Team for the 2014 Sirius/XM All-Star Futures Game at Target Field in Minneapolis, MN. Gwinnett went 0-3 under hitting coach **Garey Ingram** during his two-day absence from 7/12 to 7/13.
- Including 2014, Snitker holds a career managerial record of 1,205-1,222 (.496) in 18 seasons.

The 2014 Staff: Pitching coach **Marty Reed** (4th season), hitting coach **Garey Ingram** (1st season), coach **Billy Nicholson** (5th season), athletic trainer **Mike Graus** (6th season) and strength and conditioning coach **Jason Curry** (1st season) all served on the Gwinnett staff in 2014.

- On 7/29, Ingram was named the hitting coach for the Peoria Javelinas of the Arizona Fall League. He will begin his third AFL coaching stint when league play starts on 10/7/14.

Gosselin Named IL Postseason All-Star: Former Gwinnett Braves INF and current Atlanta Brave **Phil Gosselin** was selected to the 2014 International League Postseason All-Star Team on 8/26. He was named as the All-Star Utility Player after receiving votes at second base, shortstop, third base, outfield and designated hitter. Gosselin is the first Braves' farmhand to earn the league's Utility selection since Richmond's **Randall Simon** did so in 1997.

- Gosselin was also a midseason IL All-Star, participating in the Triple-A All-Star Game on 7/16 in Durham, NC. He started at third base and went 1-for-4 with a run scored in a 7-3 win over the PCL.
- Though he last played for Gwinnett on 7/25, Gosselin finished second in the IL in batting with a .344 average. He trailed only IL Batting Champion Steven Souza, Jr. of Syracuse (.350).
- At the time of his call-up to Atlanta on 7/26, he also ranked among IL leaders in hits (1st, 130), total bases (2nd, 184), doubles (T-2nd, 29), triples (T-3rd, 5), OPS (4th, .866), runs (T-4th, 58), extra-base hits (T-4th, 39), on-base percentage (5th, .379) and slugging percentage (7th, .487).

Team Awards Announced: Prior to the home finale on 8/30, manager **Brian Snitker** and GM **North Johnson** announced the Gwinnett Braves' Team Awards for 2014. INF **Phil Gosselin** (Most Valuable Player), RHP **Cody Martin** (Most Outstanding Pitcher), RHP **Juan Jaime** (Most Outstanding Relief Pitcher), INF **Sean Kazmar** (Most Competitive Player), OF **Todd Cunningham** (Community Service Award) and 1B **Joey Terdoslavich** (Fan Favorite Player) all took home awards. Masterful Martin: RHP **Cody Martin** enjoyed a successful sophomore season with Gwinnett in 2014, going 7-8 with a 3.52 ERA (61 ER in 156.0 IP), one CG and one save in 27 games, 26 starts. He made a team-high 13 quality starts, including a pair of season-long 7.2-inning outings on 7/21 vs. Scranton/Wilkes-Barre (ND, 7.2 IP, 7 H, 1 R, 1 ER, 0 BB, 6 SO) and 8/17 at Norfolk (ND, 7.2 IP, 6 H, 2 R, 1 ER, 0 BB, 5 SO).

- He ranked among IL leaders in strikeouts (3rd, 142), SO/9.0 IP ratio for starters (5th, 8.12 SO/9.0 IP), starts (T-5th, 26), innings (6th, 156.0) and ERA (6th, 3.52).

Constanza, the Catalyst: OF **Jose Constanza** batted .293 (131-for-447) with 10 doubles, two triples, 65 runs scored, 36 RBI and 30 stolen bases in 111 games with Gwinnett in 2014, his fourth season with the club. He set Triple-A career highs in hits and RBI while posting his most runs and steals since 2011 with Columbus (69 R, 34 SB). He ranked among IL leaders in lowest TPA/SO ratio (3rd, 1 SO/10.14 TPA), stolen bases (T-3rd, 30-for-40, 75.0%) and batting average (11th, .293).

- Constanza leads the Gwinnett Braves franchise in games played (368), at-bats (1,465), hits (437), triples (13), runs scored (205) and stolen bases (88).

A Cunning Display: OF **Todd Cunningham** had an impressive second season with GWN, batting .287 (135-for-470) with 28 doubles, two triples, eight HR, 59 runs scored, 58 RBI and 19 stolen bases in 120 games. He led the club in hits (T-8th in IL) and ranked second in games, at-bats, doubles, RBI, total bases (191) and steals.

- Cunningham led all G-Braves' outfielders with 11 assists...he posted a .991 fielding percentage (3 errors in 333 total chances) in 119 games in center field.
- He belted Gwinnett's only leadoff homer of the season (8/13 vs. Pawtucket) and one of the club's two grand slams of 2014 (4/21 vs. Charlotte).

Joltin' Joey: 1B/OF **Joey Terdoslavich** rode a hot month of August (.261, 29-for-111, 7 HR, 20 RBI in 29 games) to the top of the team leaderboard in home runs, RBI and total bases (195) for 2014. He batted .256 (130-for-507) with 18 doubles, one triple, 15 HR, 62 runs scored, 61 RBI and one stolen base in 136 games.

- Terdoslavich ranked among IL leaders in games played (T-1st), at-bats (T-6th) and walks (T-7th, 61)...he was also tied for first in intentional walks drawn (5).
- **His 14-game hitting streak from 4/20 to 5/4 was the longest by a G-Brave in 2014...** he batted .421 (24-for-57, 5 2B, HR, 13 R, 5 RBI) on the streak (T-13th in IL).
- **He set a new Gwinnett Braves record with homers in five straight games from 8/17 to 8/21**, breaking the previous club record established by 1B **Ernesto Mejia** (4-game HR streak, 4/9/13 to 4/13/13). He went on to homer six times in seven games from 8/17 to 8/23, batting .444 (12-for-27, 6 HR, 11 RBI) in that span.
- Terdoslavich, an IL midseason and postseason All-Star in 2013, **was named IL Batter of the Week twice in 2014**. He claimed the first two IL weekly awards of his career on 4/28 (.500, 13-for-26, HR, 4 RBI from 4/21-4/27) and 8/26 (.385, 10-for-26, 5 HR, 9 RBI from 8/18-8/25).

Jaime Time: RHP **Juan Jaime** had an outstanding Triple-A debut with Gwinnett, going 1-0 with a 3.51 ERA (16 ER in 41.0 IP), a .181 BAA (27-for-149, 1 HR), one hold and a team-high 18 saves (18-for-19) in 43 outings. He finished the season ranked among IL relief leaders in games finished (2nd, 37) and saves (T-4th).

- **Jaime was named to the Triple-A All-Star Game on 7/2** after going 1-0 with a 2.30 ERA and 13 saves in his first 28 games. He participated in the game on 7/16 in Durham, NC, striking out two of the three batters he faced (Tacoma's Nick Franklin and Round Rock's Jared Hoyer) in a perfect seventh inning.
- In addition to earning Gwinnett's Relief Pitcher of the Year award on 8/30 (new award created in 2014), **he was also named the Gwinnett Pitcher of the Year by the Atlanta Braves following the season**.

BethanCLOUT: C **Christian Bethancourt** entered 2014 rated the No. 2 prospect in the Atlanta Braves' organization by *Baseball America*. He built upon that prospect status with a solid Triple-A debut in Gwinnett, batting .283 (97-for-343) with 17 doubles, one triple, eight HR, 33 runs scored, 48 RBI and seven stolen bases in 91 games.

- **He belted his first career "walk-off" home run on 5/17 vs. Indianapolis**, snapping a 5-5 tie in the bottom of the ninth with a solo shot (#2) off RHP Tyler Waldron.
- Bethancourt was named to the World Team for the 16th annual SiriusXM MLB All-Star Futures Game on 6/24, but did not participate due to MLB call-up on 6/28.
- He batted .304 (34-for-112, 5 2B, 5 HR, 15 R, 16 RBI) in the second half, including a season-best .342 (26-for-76, 3 2B, 3 HR, 11 R, 10 RBI) in 19 games in August.

Rotation Recap: Eighteen pitchers made starts for Gwinnett in 2014, combining to go 34-54 with a 4.31 ERA (350 ER in 730.2 IP) and 55 quality starts in 142 games.

- RHP **Cody Martin** led the starting rotation in wins (7), ERA (3.53), innings (153.0 IP), strikeouts (138), starts (26) and quality starts (13). **He turned in the club's only complete game effort on 6/25 vs. Toledo**, a 7-1 win in game one of a doubleheader (7.0 IP, 3 H, 1 R, 1 ER, 1 HR, 2 BB, 2 SO).
- LHP **Daniel Rodriguez** went 6-13 with a 4.75 ERA (58 ER in 110.0 IP) in 21 starts, ranking third in the IL in losses. He did, however, rank second on the club in quality starts (9) and tied for 10th in the IL in strikeouts (111). **Rodriguez posted the longest scoreless streak by a GWN starter this season, 16.1 IP from 7/20 to 7/31**.
- RHP **Gus Schlosser** made 15 starts with the G-Braves, going 6-6 with a 4.35 ERA (40 ER in 82.2 IP) and six quality starts. He posted the longest winning streak by a Gwinnett starter in 2014, winning three consecutive starts from 5/16 to 5/27...he produced a 4.58 ERA (9 ER in 17.2 IP) in that span.
- RHP **Zach Stewart** went 4-3 with a 4.77 ERA (44 ER in 83.0 IP) and eight quality starts in 14 total starts with Gwinnett. He went 1-0 with a 2.08 ERA (3 ER in 13.0 IP) and two quality starts in his last two outings, **earning the IL Pitcher of the Week award for 8/25 to 9/1**...he's the first G-Brave to win since LHP **Yohan Flande** (8/6/13).
- RHP **Terry Doyle** (3-3, 2.97 ERA in 7 starts) and RHP **Yunesky Maya** (3-3, 2.65 ERA in 14 starts) also made contributions to the G-Braves' rotation this year.

Bullpen Trends: G-Braves' relief pitchers combined to go 31-23 with a 4.37 ERA (244 ER in 502.0 IP), 42 holds and 35 saves (35-for-52) in 141 outings this season.

- LHP **Ryan Buchter** went 3-3 with a 3.29 ERA (23 ER in 63.0 IP), a .229 BAA, seven holds and one save (1-for-5) in a team-high 49 relief appearances (5th in IL). **He posted the longest scoreless streak by a G-Braves reliever in 2014, a 14.1-inning streak spanning 13 outings from 6/29 to 8/3**.
- RHP **Pedro Beato** went 2-0 with a 3.88 ERA (20 ER in 46.1 IP), a .220 BAA, eight holds (T-6th in IL) and six saves (6-for-8) in 40 relief appearances.
- RHP **Carlos Fisher**, signed by Atlanta as a minor league free agent out of the independent Atlantic Association on 6/21, went 3-1 with a 3.00 ERA (11 ER in 33.0 IP), a .217 BAA, one hold and two saves (2-for-3) in 23 relief appearances. He posted a 0.56 ERA (1 ER in 16.0 IP) over his first 10 outings from 6/22 to 7/21.
- LHP **Atahualpa Severino** led the bullpen with five wins, going 5-3 with a 3.22 ERA (16 ER in 44.2 IP), a .205 BAA, eight holds (T-6th in IL) and two saves (2-for-3) in 40 relief appearances. Prior to the All-Star Break, he went 3-2 with a 2.65 ERA (11 ER in 37.1 IP), a .182 BAA and two saves (2-for-3) in 33 outings.

A-Braves on Rehab: Seven members of the Atlanta Braves' 40-man roster spent minor league injury rehab assignments with the Gwinnett Braves in 2014. The list includes pitchers **Pedro Beato**, **David Carpenter**, **Gavin Floyd**, **Mike Minor**, **Shae Simmons** and **Jordan Walden** catcher **Evan Gattis**.

- **Beato**, on the Atlanta DL with a sore right elbow from 6/19 to 7/10, went 0-0 with a 9.00 ERA (2 ER in 2.0 IP) in two rehab starts, 7/8 vs. Syracuse and 7/11 at Norfolk.
- **Carpenter**, on the Atlanta DL with a strained right biceps from 6/17 to 7/1, went 0-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER in 2.0 IP) in two rehab starts, 6/28 at CHA and 6/30 vs. CHA.
- **Floyd**, on the Atlanta DL following 2013 "Tommy John" surgery, went 1-1 with a 3.26 ERA (7 ER in 19.1 IP) in five rehab starts from 4/3 to 4/29.
- **Gattis**, on the Atlanta DL with a bulging thoracic disc from 6/29 to 7/20, batted .188 (3-for-16) with two runs scored and two RBI in four rehab games from 7/17 to 7/20.
- **Minor**, on the Atlanta DL with left shoulder tendinitis from 3/21 to 5/1, went 2-0 with a 3.24 ERA (3 ER in 8.1 IP) in two rehab games, one start from 4/8 to 4/19.
- **Simmons**, on the Atlanta DL with a right shoulder strain from 7/27 to the end of 2014, went 0-1 with a 36.00 ERA (4 ER in 1.0 IP) in two rehab starts from 8/16 to 8/19.
- **Walden**, on the Atlanta DL with a left hamstring strain from 5/10 to 6/9, went 0-1 with a 10.80 ERA (2 ER in 1.2 IP) in two rehab starts from 6/5 to 6/8.

G-Braves in the Bigs: Including injury rehab assignments, **21 players** spent time with both Gwinnett and Atlanta in 2014. Three players, LHP Ryan Buchter, RHP Juan Jaime and 2B Tommy La Stella, made their Major League debuts with the Braves after playing for the G-Braves this year.

- LHP Luis Avilan went 4-1 with a 4.57 ERA (22 ER in 43.1 IP), 8 holds and 0 saves (0-for-2) in 62 relief appearances with Atlanta.
- RHP Pedro Beato went 0-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER in 4.1 IP) in 3 outings.
- C Christian Bethancourt batted .248 (28-for-113) with 3 doubles, 7 runs scored, 9 RBI and 1 stolen base in 31 games with Atlanta.
- LHP Ryan Buchter went 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER in 1.0 IP) in 1 outing.
- RHP David Carpenter went 6-4 with a 3.54 ERA (24 ER in 61.0 IP), 19 holds and 3 saves (3-for-6) in 65 relief appearances.
- OF Jose Constanza batted .000 (0-for-4) with a run scored in 12 games.

La Stella in the Limelight: Prior to his purchase by the Atlanta Braves on 5/28, 2B Tommy La Stella enjoyed a solid Triple-A debut with Gwinnett. **He hit .293 (49-for-167, 6 2B, 3B, HR, 18 R, 23 RBI, SB) in 47 games as a G-Brave.** In his final game with the club on 5/27 at Pawtucket, he belted his first Triple-A home run, a two-run shot off RHP Matt Barnes.

- As of his call-up, he ranked among IL leaders in lowest TPA/SO ratio (2nd, 1 SO/14.21 TPA), walks (T-8th, 25) and on-base percentage (10th, .384).
- La Stella posted a team-best 21-game on-base streak from 4/10 to 5/2, batting .325 (27-for-83, 2B, 9 R, 14 RBI) in that span.

By the Month: The G-Braves went 15-10 (.600, 3rd in IL) in April, the club's first winning month since April 2012 (17-7, 1st in IL South). After snapping the streak of 11 consecutive months without a winning record, Gwinnett did not finish above .500 in any full month the rest of 2014. GWN went 14-15 in May, 11-19 in June, 10-18 in July, 14-15 in August and 1-0 in September.

Best for Last: Gwinnett went 15-16 in games decided in the last at-bat in 2014, including 3-4 in games decided in walk-off fashion. Nine different players recorded last at-bat GWRBI for the G-Braves this season, including Christian Bethancourt (3x), Tyler Pastornicky (2x), Joey Terdoslavich (2x), Todd Cunningham (1x), Brandon Boggs (1x), Jose Constanza (1x), Elmer Reyes (1x), Edward Salcedo (1x) and Jose Yezpez (1x).

- Bethancourt blasted Gwinnett's lone walk-off homer of 2014, becoming the first player to do so since Joey Terdoslavich on 6/22/13 vs. Syracuse.
