RAILRIDERS BREAKDOWN

HOME: 10-5 | AWAY: 8-11 | STREAK: W 2 | LAST 5: 3-2 | LAST 10: 5-5

LAST TIME OUT: The RailRiders defeated the host Syracuse Chiefs (Washington Nationals) on Sunday, 6-2. The RailRiders split the four-game series and went 3-4 on their road trip. The Chiefs (12-20) lost for the 13th time in 17 games.

TAKE A CHANCE ON ME: In his Triple-A debut, right-hander **Chance Adams (1-0)** tossed five scoreless innings of two-hit ball en route to the win. He struck out six and walked three.

INTERNATIONAL LEAGUE MAN OF MYSTERY: SWB posted single scores in the fifth and sixth against starter Austin Voth (1-4). **Tyler Wade** doubled **Ruben Tejada** home in the fifth, but **Cito Culver** was out at the plate on the same play 7-6-2. An inning later, **Mason Williams'** single pushed **Clint Frazier** across the plate and chased Voth.

PULLING AWAY: Up 2-1 in the ninth, SWB hung four runs on the board with run-scoring hits from Frazier and **Kyle Higashioka**.

SIMPLY THE BEST: Before his one-day stint as the Yankees' 26th man for Sunday's doubleheader, **Rob Refsnyder** extended the league's best active hitting streak to 15 games with a 3-for-4 day. During his run, Refsnyder has gone 20-for-58 (.345) with a .415 OBP.

T-WADE: Wade's 11 steals stand tied with Gwinnett's Ozzie Albies for tops in all of Triple-A. He is on pace to swipe 46 bags this season. The franchise's single-season record of 44 was set by **Tommy Barrett** in 1989. Since the start of May, Wade has gone 20-for-55 over 12 games, slashing .364/.417/.582/.998. He made his first career start in center field one week ago at Pawtucket. He had no outfield experience and just one start at third base in regular-season play entering 2017. On April 29, May 6 and May 14, he drew starts at the hot corner and first tasted the outfield with an April 30 nod in left. His first-ever outfield time came in the 2016 Arizona Fall League when 16 of his 18 games played saw him start in the outfield (5-RF, 4-LF, 7-CF).

TRIPLE THREAT: Fowler shares the MiLB lead with six triples and stands on pace to post 25 triples this season. The single-season franchise record is 16, set by **Shane Victorino** during his 2005 IL MVP campaign.

STOP, THIEVES!: SWB leads the IL in caught-stealing efficiency at 47% (14 of 30 caught). **Eddy Rodriguez** stands as the IL's top catcher in the category. He has nabbed seven men in 13 attempts (54%).

YOUNG GUNS: Wade, Fowler and Frazier, the RailRiders' usual 1-2-3 hitters early this season, are all 22 years old. The IL's mean-average age for position players early this season stands a shade under 27. SWB boasts the IL's third-youngest group of position players (LHV-24.4, DUR-24.8, SWB-25.0).

THE OFFENSIVE: SWB's offense ranks among the IL's best in: R/G (2nd, 4.8), AVG (1st, .272), OBP (2nd, .339), SLG (1st, .429), OPS (1st, .768), 2B (1st, 81), 3B (1st, 10) and SB (3rd, 27).

OFF THE RAILS: **Colten Brewer** hurled the final two frames to post a save in his Triple-A debut...Six different RailRiders have recorded a save this season... SWB won for the first time in Higashioka's six starts behind the plate.

CATCH IT HERE: PNC Field will host the 2017 Gildan Triple-A National Championship Game on Sept. 19 at 7:07 p.m. For tickets or more information, please call 570-969-BALL (2255) or visit swbrailriders.com. The RailRiders claimed the franchise's second-ever Governors' Cup as IL champs and the team's first-ever Triple-A national title with a win over El Paso in 2016.

The rest of '15 at AA: 25G/24GS, 10-7, 3.38, 3.5BB/9IP, 7HB, 5WP. On the AA DL 2x in '15 (May 5-10, L. Hand); May 19-24, he left Sam Houston St. No. 5 on its all-time K list (204), tops among 3-yr careers. As a FR he set the prog's single-gm K record vs D1 foe (13 vs. Lamar). A '14 Low-A and MiLB.com NYY org AS, he spent '16 (27G/7GS, 3-5, 3/5SV, 3.96, 2.8BB/9IP). He comes off a Wed. win at PAW (5IP, 3H, 1R, 2BB, 4K, 2HB).

Brian Johnson posted an AS '15 w/PAW (18GS, 9-6, 2.53, 1.10 WHIP, 8.4K/9IP, 2.8K:BB). He lost his MLB debut at HOU July 21, '15 (4.1IP, 3H, 4R, 4BB, 3K) w/watered-down FB. In Aug. '15, velocity/command woes diagnosed as ulnar nerve irritation numbed his hand/ended his yr. A '12 1st-rd'er (31st o'all) from Univ. of Fla., he suffered inj. in his first pro yr. While pitching SS-A Lowell in Futures at Fenway gm, a Joey Rickard comebacker off his face broke mult. bones. On May 21 '16, he hit the temp inactive list (anxiety treatment) and DNP until July 4. THEY WERE THE CHAMPIONS: Wildcard entrants to the 2014 IL playoffs, the PawSox took down IL North champion Syracuse and IL South champ Durham to win their fourth Governors' Cup. That added to crowns claimed in 1973, 1984 and 2012.

BOLES' BIO: At 42, **Kevin Boles** is the IL's second-youngest manager. Before he arrived and hoisted the Governors' Cup in his first season, the now-third-year IL skipper spent three seasons managing Double-A Portland. He came to Boston in 2008 when he mentored Adv.-A Salem after stops with the Marlins, Royals and Twins. The son of former Marlins manager John Boles is a University of South Florida alumnus and was a Cubs' 42nd-rounder in 1998. Announced as Pawtucket's fifth manager in seven years, he followed Ron Johnson (2005-09), Torey Lovullo (2010), Arnie Beyeler (2011-12), and Gary DiSarcina (2013). Those four all hit the bigs directly from Pawtucket. Johnson-Boston 1B coach in 2010; Lovullo-Toronto 1B coach in 2011; Beyeler-Boston 1B coach in 2013; and DiSarcina-Angels 3B coach in 2014.

THE LONGEST GAME: Pawtucket shares a record that has stood since 1981. On April 18 that year, the PawSox and Rochester Red Wings started the longest game in pro baseball history. The 33-inning contest took eight hours and 25 minutes over three different days. It was not suspended until a little after 4 a.m. on April 19 due to the umpires not having a curfew rule in their rule book. IL president Harold Cooper called for the suspension. The game resumed June 23 and took 18 minutes to finish with Pawtucket's Dave Koza driving in the winner. Two future HOF players saw action in Rochester's **Cal Ripken, Jr.** (2-for-13) and Pawtucket's **Wade Boggs** (4-for-12) who tied the game in the 21st off of **Steve Luebber**.
