**Ducks host Baysox:** The RubberDucks and Baysox are playing the third of six scheduled series this season, with 10 games scheduled at Canal Park and 11 at Prince George's Stadium. Akron leads the series, 7-2, and since 2005, leads 164-128. Last season, Akron went 13-8 against Bowie, including 5-5 at Canal Park. Bowie won the last series of the season, 3-1, in Akron. In 2018, Bowie finished fourth in the Western Division, at 67-71.

**Tuesday Recap: Lowther, Baysox shut out Ducks (Bowie 2, Akron 0):**

After losing his first two starts against Akron this season, Bowie left-hander Zac Lowther (3-3) scattered six hits over 7 2/3 scoreless innings (the second-longest scoreless start in the Eastern League this season, behind Erie's Casey Mize's nine-inning no-hitter in Altoona April 29) of a 2-0 Baysox win in front of 4,955 at Canal Park on Tuesday. RubberDucks right-hander **Jake Paulson** pitched six innings, allowing two earned runs but Akron was shut out for the sixth time this season. The RubberDucks had 13 home runs and 35 runs over the previous four games (2-2).

**Ducks flying out of the park:** The RubberDucks had their four straight multi-homer games May 9-13 and have eight this season. Of Akron's 30 home runs (third in the Eastern League), 24 have come in eight games, including 13 in the past four games:

April 5 vs. Altoona (4 – T. Krieger, W. Garcia, M. Longo, D. Johnson)

April 13 (2) at Altoona (3 – Daniel Johnson, Tyler Krieger, Ka'ai Tom)

April 28 at Bowie (2 – Daniel Salters, Tyler Krieger)

May 2 vs. Reading (2 – Wilson Garcia, Logan Ice)

May 9 at Erie (2 – Ernie Clement, Daniel Johnson)

May 10 at Reading (3 – Wilson Garcia, Daniel Johnson-2)

May 11 at Reading (6 – Marabell, Tom-2, Ice, Garcia, N. Rodriguez)

May 13 vs. Bowie (2 – Ka'ai Tom, Daniel Johnson)

The six home runs on Saturday were the most for Akron since hitting seven on July 2, 2008, in a 10-6 win at Erie.

**Tom joins back-to-back club:** After homering twice in Reading on Saturday and once on Monday, **Ka'ai Tom** became the third RubberDuck to homer in back-to-back games this season, joining **Daniel Johnson** (May 9-10) and **Wilson Garcia** (May 10-11). After no RubberDuck homered in consecutive games through the first 33 games this season, a player accomplished the feat in three straight games Akron played.

**Garcia finds a groove in Double-A:** In his first season with the Indians organization and first in Double-A, first baseman **Wilson Garcia** is tied for the RubberDucks team lead with 32 hits and eight doubles. He is second on the team with five home runs, 23 RBI and 55 total bases. Garcia homered on Friday and Saturday in Reading, joining **Daniel Johnson** as RubberDucks to homer in consecutive games this season. On May 3, he matched a career high with four hits - his first four-hit game since May 23, 2018, while with the Frederick (A-Adv) Keys. He began the season with 28 straight error-free games at first base. In the first six games against his former organization, the Philadelphia Phillies Double-A affiliate, Reading, Garcia was 8-for-23 (.348) with four runs, three home runs and six RBI.

**Johnson's hot bat:** Outfielder **Daniel Johnson** has a season-long seven-game hitting streak (9-for-29, double, four home runs). Before Akron was shut out Tuesday, he had four home runs in four games May 9-13 (two on May 10), and drove in a run in five straight games May 8-13 (10 RBI in that span). His seven home runs, 58 total bases and 25 RBI this season all lead the team. He finished April 19-for-69 (.275) with five doubles and three home runs, leading Akron with 35 total bases, 11 walks, a .507 slugging percentage and .885 OPS. He had back-to-back four-RBI games April 13 and 15. He leads the team with six stolen bases. In 2018, Johnson played 89 games with the Washington Nationals' Eastern League affiliate, Harrisburg. He was on the injured list June 6-July 23, due to a broken right hamate bone that required surgery. Part of the Nov. 30 trade (along with IF **Andruw Monasterio** and RHP **Jeffrey Rodriguez**) that sent Yan Gomes from Cleveland to Washington, Johnson is the Indians' No. 14 (*Baseball America*)/No. 22 (MLB.com) prospect.

**Jorma continues hitting:** Infielder **Jorma Rodriguez** has hit safely in nine consecutive games May 1-11, going 12-for-34 (.353) with a double, three runs, four RBI, three walks, 10 strikeouts and a .405 OBP. It is the longest hitting streak by a RubberDuck since **Tyler Krieger** had a 2018 Eastern League-best 24-game hitting streak July 2-31 last season.

**Marabell is a mainstay:** Third-year RubberDuck **Connor Marabell** has a season-long six-game hitting streak (7-for-24, 2B, HR, 4 RBI). He has played in each of Akron's first 37 games (starting each of the last 33) this season. He leads the team in at-bats (139) and plate appearances (153) and is second in runs scored (19). He has made four starts at first base, 11 in left field, four in center field, 13 in right field, and four as designated hitter. He hit safely in seven of eight games April 22-29 (10-for-32, 3 doubles, 7 runs, 3 RBI). In 2018, he had 64 RBI in 89 games with Akron.

**Clement's return:** Infielder **Ernie Clement**, who was on the Injured List with a right adductor strain April 16-May 8, had an outstanding return to the lineup on Thursday, May 9. Batting leadoff as the designated hitter, Clement reached base on a first-inning error, then drove in a run each of his next three plate appearances, with a sacrifice fly, RBI single and solo home run – his first in Double-A. His three RBI were the first three of his season. In six games prior to going on the IL, the Indians No. 15 (MLB.com)/No. 18 (*Baseball America*) prospect was 3-for-25.

**Pantoja steps up:** Infielder **Alexis Pantoja** stabilized Akron's shortstop position, after injuries to **Ernie Clement** (IL since April 16, right adductor strain) and **Andruw Monasterio** (IL since April 23, left oblique strain). After mostly playing at second and third base in the season's first two and a half weeks, he started 16 straight games at shortstop April 23-May 8, collecting five multi-hit games and 15 total hits (four doubles) in that span. Overall, his 10 multi-hit games, 21 runs and .269 batting average lead all qualifying RubberDucks. His 32 hits and eight doubles are tied for the team lead. In 2018, he played a career-high 100 games over three stints with Akron and four with Lynchburg (A-Adv).

### LAST START (Thursday, May 9, at Erie, L in 13-8 Loss)

After the RubberDucks took a 2-0 lead in the top of the first inning, Erie scored three runs in each of the first two innings (one earned because of two Akron errors) to take a 6-3 lead. Hentges allowed one run over the next four innings, pitching six innings for a second straight start. Although Akron trimmed the deficit to one run three times, it never tied Erie again, and the bullpen allowed six runs in a 13-8 loss.

### Season Highlights

- Entered the season ranked as the No. 6 prospect in the Indians system by *Baseball America* and No. 10 by MLB.com (both as top left-handed pitcher).
- Made his first two career major league spring training appearances, with two scoreless, hitless starts for the Indians – Feb. 26 at Colorado (W, 1.0 IP, 0 BB, 0 K) and March 3 vs. Kansas City (2.0 IP, 1 BB, 3 K).

### 2018:

- Posted the second-lowest ERA (3.27) and third-most strikeouts (122) in the Carolina League. Was a Mid-Season Carolina League All-Star and *MiLB.com* organizational All-Star.
- Did not pitch after August 15 due to a left shoulder strain, but his final start was his best, Aug. 15 at Wilmington (6.1IP, 2H, 0R, 2BB, 7SO).
- Over his final 12 starts of the season he posted an ERA of 2.69 (19ER/63.2IP).
- Recorded four starts of at least 6.0 innings and zero runs allowed and fanned 10 on April 17 vs. Frederick.
- Allowed only four homers in 118.1 innings, while batters hit .230 (46-for-200) off him with runners on and .231 (27-for-117) with RISP.
- Added to the 40-man roster on Nov. 20.

### 2017:

- Season did not begin until 7/8 due to elbow surgery the previous July.
- Made six rehab starts in the Arizona League before being activated at Mahoning Valley on 8/9, finishing the season with five starts (2.04 ERA).

**2016:** Limited to 14 starts for Lake County (A) due to a left elbow strain, and did not pitch after June 23...had left elbow reconstruction in July.

**2015:** Led AZL Indians with 59 strikeouts, third-most in the league.

# 2019 RUBBERDUCKS FIELD STAFF

**#24 Rouglas Odor, *Manager (First Season)*** – Odor, 51, is the 18th manager in club history. He follows Tony Mansolino, who was promoted to Triple-A Columbus after guiding Akron to a 78-62 record and finish as runner-up in the 2018 Eastern League Championship Series against the New Hampshire Fisher Cats. Last season, Odor managed the Class-A Advanced Lynchburg Hillcats to their fourth consecutive postseason. After posting the Carolina League's worst first-half record of 29-38, the Hillcats rebounded to go 42-28 in the second half, claiming the Northern Division title. They fell to Potomac in the semifinals, three games to two. Odor has a 361-363 (.499) career managing record in 11 seasons.

When Odor was the RubberDucks hitting coach in 2014, he became the first person to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros, and Akron RubberDucks. He played 197 games for Canton-Akron during the 1991, 1993-94 seasons, and he was the hitting coach for the Aeros' 2012 Eastern League Championship squad.

The 2019 season is Odor's 32nd in the Cleveland organization as a player or coach (19th as a coach). The former shortstop was a 32nd-round draft pick by the Indians in 1988 and played in the minor leagues for the Indians from 1988-94 and for the Milwaukee Brewers organization in 1995. Last season was Odor's first as a manager since 2008. He managed San Felipe in the Venezuelan Summer League for two seasons in 1999-2000, the Burlington Indians for four seasons from 2001-04, the Mahoning Valley Scrappers for two seasons in 2005-06, and the Gulf Coast League Indians for two seasons in 2007-08. Since then, Odor has moved up the ranks as a hitting coach, starting with Class-A Kinston in 2009-10, Akron in 2011-12 and 2014, the High-A Carolina Mudcats in 2013, and Triple-A Columbus in 2015-17.

The Maracaibo, Venezuela, native resides in Winter Haven, Florida, with his wife, Milagros. He has three sons and is the uncle of Texas Rangers infielder Rougned Odor.

**#27 Tony Arnold, *Pitching Coach (10th Season, not consecutive)*** — Arnold, 59, rejoins the RubberDucks for his fifth time in Akron after spending last season with Lynchburg. In 2018, the Hillcats pitching staff finished fifth in the Carolina League with a 3.76 ERA, ranked second with 1,190 strikeouts and the 12 team shutouts ranked fourth. Arnold last was with the RubberDucks in 2016-17, helping lead the 2016 team to an Eastern League championship. He previously served in the same capacity in Akron from 1996-99, 2008, and 2011-12. Arnold's 2012 Akron Aeros staff crafted a franchise-record 3.03 ERA and went on to claim the EL championship. In 2016, Arnold became the second man to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros and Akron RubberDucks, joining Rouglas Odor in that exclusive group.

In 2015, Arnold began as the pitching coach at Lynchburg and finished at Triple-A Columbus, helping the Clippers to the International League title. A former All-American at the University of Texas, Arnold pitched in the major leagues with the Baltimore Orioles in 1986 and 1987.

**#2 Justin Toole, *Hitting Coach (First Season)*** — Toole, 32, spent the 2018 season as Lynchburg's hitting coach. This is fourth season coaching in the Indians' organization, serving as the hitting coach for Mahoning Valley in 2016, Lake County in 2017, and Lynchburg. Toole was signed as a minor league free agent by the Indians in 2009 and spent parts of seven seasons with Cleveland from 2009-15. He spent parts of 2010, 2012-15 with Akron, hitting .259 in 180 games, including .275 in 77 games under Odor's hitting-coach tutelage in 2014. The Council Bluffs, Iowa, native played at the University of Iowa and has authored a children's book called "9 in 9," chronicling the lessons he learned while playing all nine positions in a game for the Carolina Mudcats on Aug. 25, 2012. **Twitter: @Tooleyj24, Instagram: @tooleyj24**

**#28 Juan De La Cruz, *Bench Coach (First Season)*** — De La Cruz, 25, is in his second season coaching with the Indians after serving as the hitting coach for the rookie-level Arizona League Indians in 2018. Primarily a catcher in his playing days, De La Cruz was signed as a free agent by the Indians in 2009 and spent eight seasons in the system, reaching as high as Akron in 2017, when he played 12 games as a catcher and first baseman. He was a .216 career hitter in 281 games.

**Bobby Ruiz, *Athletic Trainer (First Season)*** — Ruiz spent the past four seasons (2015-18) with Lynchburg. This is his ninth with the Indians.

**Paul Synenkyj, *Strength and Conditioning Coach (Third Season)*** — Synenkyj is the lone returning field staff member from 2018. He is in his ninth season in the Indians organization. He holds degrees in physical education from Cleveland State and the University of Akron.
