Giants Conclude Series in Modesto... The San Jose Giants conclude their four-game series against the Modesto Nuts this evening at John Thurman Field. Modesto has won the first three games of the series earning victories of 13-7 on Friday, 5-1 on Saturday and 7-5 yesterday. John Gavin (1-2, 4.82 ERA) is slated to make the start on the mound for San Jose tonight. The Giants are 11-14 against the Nuts this season.

Final Road Trip... The Giants are in the midst of their final road trip of the season. San Jose has posted a 2-4 record thus far on the trip. The Giants took two of three games in Visalia to open the trip – their first road series win of the second half – before falling to Modesto the last three nights. San Jose is only 11-23 on the road in the second half. The Giants own the worst road record in the league at 27-42.

Eliminated From Playoff Contention... Last night's loss eliminated the Giants (22-40 second half) from postseason contention. San Jose will miss the playoffs in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 2002-03. Prior to the current two-year drought (2017-18), the Giants reached the playoffs 12 times in 13 seasons from 2004-2016.

League Leaderboard... Several Giants hitters currently rank among the California League leaders. Heath Quinn is fourth in the league in batting average (.309), fourth in slugging (.508) and fourth in OPS (.894). Jalen Miller is tied for fifth in doubles (34) and sixth in hits (134). Wander Franco is tied for first in doubles (38) and seventh in hits (133). Gio Brusa is tied for fourth in home runs (19) and tied for eighth in RBI's (68). Johneshwy Fargas leads the league in stolen bases (43) while Bryce Johnson is fourth (29).

Miller Named Postseason All-Star... Jalen Miller was named to the postseason California League All-Star team last week. Miller was San Jose's lone selection to the team. The former third round draft pick is batting .279 with 34 doubles, two triples, 13 home runs, 61 RBI's and 11 stolen bases in 116 games. Miller is currently rated the #23 prospect in the San Francisco organization by *MLB.com* and was also a midseason California League All-Star. Miller entered 2018 with a career .224 batting average over his first three professional seasons.

The Long Ball... San Jose leads all North Division clubs and ranks third in the California League with 111 home runs this season. The Giants have hit 60 home runs in 62 second half games. Conversely, San Jose has already allowed 77 home runs in the second half – more than twice as many as their 36 homers surrendered in the entire first half.

Climbing The Charts... Gio Brusa has hit 36 career home runs with the San Jose Giants, which is tied for fourth in team-history (Travis Ishikawa, Angel Villalona) and the most ever by a switch hitter. His 36 homers have come over 216 games with San Jose the last two seasons (17 HR in 2017, 19 HR in 2018). Next on the SJ Giants career home run list is Benji Simonton in third place with 38 HR. Wander Franco's 38 doubles this year rank tied for fifth on the SJ Giants single-season list. Only four players in club history have hit 40+ doubles in a season (Mark Leonard 50, Eddy Martinez-Esteve 44, Thomas Neal 41, Devin Harris 40).

Inside The Record... The Giants are 17-35 (.327) since July 1 and 27-51 (.346) since the beginning of June. At 56-76, San Jose has clinched a sub-.500 overall record this year. It marks the first time in team history (1988-2018) that the San Jose Giants have posted three straight losing seasons (62-78 in 2017, 68-72 in 2016). The Giants are currently two games behind Modesto (58-74) for the worst overall record in the league. San Jose has had the worst record in the league only twice in their 30-year history (1997, 2017).

On Deck... The Giants return to Municipal Stadium tomorrow to begin a seven-game homestand against the Stockton Ports (three games) and Modesto Nuts (four games) that will close out the 2018 season.

* Was added to San Jose's roster from Augusta (A) on August 4 ... Tonight marks his fifth start with the Giants ... Has allowed only two earned runs in nine innings over his last two starts (1 HR) after giving up eight earned runs in 9 2/3 innings over his first two starts (5 HR) ... Has allowed six home runs in 18 2/3 innings with San Jose after surrendering just eight homers in 111 career innings prior to joining the Giants.

* Is second in the San Francisco Giants minor league system with 131 strikeouts this season (in 113 2/3 innings).

* Most recent start came on August 22 at Visalia ... Picked-up his first California League win after limiting the Rawhide to two runs (one earned) over five innings ... Gave up four hits, walked none and struck out seven ... Giants won the game 13-3 ... Surrendered just one run over four innings in his previous start on August 15 at Inland Empire.

* Has struck out 20 batters over 18 2/3 innings with the Giants ... Limiting the opposition to a .233 batting average ... Six of his 17 hits allowed have been home runs.

* Was 5-5 with a 2.08 ERA in 20 starts for Augusta ... Earned midseason South Atlantic League All-Star honors ... Allowed only 54 hits in 95 innings (.167 opponents batting average) ... Walked 37 and struck out 111 ... Ranked fourth in the South Atlantic League in ERA at the time of his promotion.

* Allowed one or no earned runs in 14 out of his 20 starts with the GreenJackets ... Month-by-month ERA's: April 1.37, May 1.42, June 2.83, July 2.28 ... Limited right-handed hitters to a .150 batting average (.211 vs. left) ... Had four starts with nine strikeouts.

* Threw seven no-hit innings on June 23 versus Rome ... Walked one and matched a career-high with nine strikeouts.

* Pitched for the AZL Giants (Rookie) in 2017 ... Worked 16 innings with no earned runs allowed over 12 relief appearances ... Struck out 22 batters and had a .151 opponents batting average.

* Attended Cal State Fullerton ... Was 21-8 with a 2.80 ERA over 53 appearances (48 starts) during three-year collegiate career ... Helped the Titans reach the College World Series in 2015 and 2017 ... Was a *Louisville Slugger* Freshman All-American in 2015.

* Is from San Jose ... Attended St. Francis High School in Mountain View ... Pitched at Municipal Stadium while in high school during the Central Coast Section playoffs ... Was the winning pitcher for St. Francis HS in the 2013 CCS championship game at Muni ... Was the CCS Pitcher of the Year and West Catholic Athletic League Pitcher of the Year as a senior in 2014 (8-1, 0.71 ERA, 100 strikeouts in 78 2/3 innings).

* Originally selected by the Milwaukee Brewers in 39th round of the 2014 draft out of high school, but did not sign.

* Favorite team growing up was the San Francisco Giants ... Has two younger brothers.

- * Joined San Jose from Extended Spring Training on June 7 ... Suffered fractured leg from a foul ball during spring training.

- * Spent the last two seasons with Augusta (A) ... Batted .253 with 6 HR, 37 RBI's and 15 SB in 118 games last year.
- * Was a second baseman last year after playing primarily third base in 2016 ... Began pro career as a shortstop.
