Dayton Dragons (5-8) at Lansing Lugnuts (7-6)

RH Lyon Richardson (0-1, 1.17) vs. RH Sean Wymer (0-0, 3.65)

Today's Game: The Dayton Dragons (affiliate of the Cincinnati Reds) meet the Lansing Lugnuts (affiliate of the Toronto Blue Jays) in the first game of a three-game set. This is the start of a six-game, seven-day road trip for Dayton. **Dragons on Last Home Stand:** 3-2.

Last Game: Wednesday: Dayton 4, Fort Wayne 3. The Dragons collected a season-high six extra base hits including solo home runs from Pabel Manzanero and Jonathan Willems as they came from behind to earn their first one-run victory of the year. Juan Martinez had two doubles and two RBI and Bren Spillane added a double and single. Four Dragons pitchers combined to scatter seven hits. Jesse Stallings pitched a scoreless ninth inning to earn his second save of the series. The victory was credited to Eduardo Salazar, the second of four Dayton pitchers (2.1 IP, 1 R). Dragons pitchers limited Fort Wayne to a 1 for 10 night with men in scoring position.

Team Notes

- Last night's win gave the Dragons their first series win of the 2019 season. They have split three 2-game sets while losing all four games of a 4-game set in Fort Wayne. The Dragons won two-of-three in the series ending last night at home with Fort Wayne.
- The Dragons have hit four home runs over the last two games after connecting on just three homers in their first 11 games. They had 15 extra base hits in the three games vs. Fort Wayne after collecting 18 in their first 10 games.
- The team ERA on the home stand ending Wednesday (five games) was 3.00 (45 IP, 15 ER). Starters on the home stand: 22.2 IP, 9 ER, 3.57 ERA. Bullpen on the home stand: 22.1 IP, 6 ER, 2.42 ERA.
- The Dragons have held the lead in 11 of their 13 games this season. They have lost two games (both in Fort Wayne) in which they took a lead of at least two runs to the eighth inning.
- The Dragons roster includes five players from NCAA Division I programs, one player from an NCAA Division III school, one player from a junior college program, five players drafted and signed out of high school, 11 players originally signed as international free agents, one player acquired in a trade, and one player signed as a Minor League free agent.
- The Dragons roster includes players from five countries. It includes 12 players who make their home within the continental United States, one player from a U.S. territory (Puerto Rico), six players from Venezuela, three players from the Dominican Republic, one player from Mexico, one player from the Bahamas, and one player from the island of Curacao.

Individual Notes

- **Shard Munroe** is batting .344 (11 for 32) over his last nine games to raise his season's average to .314. He is 16th in the MWL in slugging percentage at .514 and leads the league in triples with three. He is also the Dragons top hitter with men on base, batting .400 (6 for 15) with three walks.
- **Jonathan Willems** has a four-game hitting streak, going 6 for 11 (.545) with a home run and a double.
- **Bren Spillane** was 4 for 11 (.364) with a home run and double in the series vs. Fort Wayne.
- Reliever **Jesse Stallings** has made three appearances without allowing a run, notching two saves while working 4.1 innings.
- Seven members of the Dragons are rated among the Reds top 30 prospects (*Baseball America*). They are OF **Michael Siani** (#8); OF **Mariel Bautista** (#16); RHP **Lyon Richardson** (#17); RHP **James Marinan** (#19); 3B **Juan Martinez** (#22), LHP **Jacob Heatherly** (#23) and 1B **Bren Spillane** (#30). Additionally, SS **Miguel Hernandez** is ranked #25 by *Fangraphs.com* and 2B **Jonathan Willems** is ranked #26 by *MLB.com*.
- The Dragons roster includes six players drafted within the first five rounds of the 40-round amateur draft, including RHP **Lyon Richardson**, #2, 2018; 1B **Bren Spillane**, #3, 2018; OF **Michael Siani**, #4, 2018; RHP **Ryan Campbell**, #5, 2018; LHP **Jacob Heatherly**, #3, 2017; RHP **James Marinan**, #4, 2017 (by the Dodgers).
- Three Dragons players were selected to play in the 2018 Pioneer League All-Star Game with Billings. They included RHP **Jared Solomon**, RHP **Eddy Demurias**, and C **Pabel Manzanero**. Solomon and OF **Mariel Bautista** were selected as Pioneer League Full-Season All-Stars.
- 1B **Bren Spillane** was the 2018 Collegiate Baseball Magazine Player of the Year, the Big Ten Conference Player of the Year, and a Triple Crown winner in the Big Ten with the University of Illinois. He batted .407 with 22 home runs in 50 games and produced a .944 slugging percentage that led the nation.
- Five players who have previously played for the Dragons return in 2019. They include pitchers **Jared Solomon**, **Jesse Stallings**, **Adrian Rodriguez**, **Connor Bennett**, and outfielder **Shard Munroe**.

DRAGONS WON-LOSS BREAKDOWN

Dragons Manager/Coaches:

Luis Bolívar returns for his third season as Dragons manager after serving as the Dayton hitting coach in 2014-16. Bolívar played for the Dragons in 2003-'04, representing the club in the Midwest League All-Star Game in 2004. Bolívar played professionally for nine seasons from 2002-2010, spending all but the final year of his career in the Reds organization. He spent all or parts of four seasons at the Triple-A level, but never played in the big leagues. Bolívar resides in the Dayton suburb of Vandalia with his wife and four children. Following his playing career, he served as a coach at Vandalia-Butler High School. Bolívar was selected as the "Best Manager Prospect" in *Baseball America's* 2017 Best Tools survey of Midwest League managers.

Pitching coach **Seth Etherton** returns to the Dragons for his second season in 2019, his fourth year as a coach in the Reds organization. Etherton spent the 2016-17 seasons with the Billings Mustangs. Etherton pitched in the Major Leagues in parts of four seasons with the Angels, Reds, A's, and Royals. He was the Angels first round draft pick in 1998 out of the University of Southern California. Etherton pitched in one game for the Dragons on a Major League rehab assignment in 2002.

Hitting coach **Mike Devereaux** joins the Dragons in 2019, his second year as a coach in the Reds organization. He served as the hitting coach for Double-A Pensacola in 2018. Previously, he was a coach for six years in the Rockies organization after two years in the Orioles system. Devereaux spent 12 years in the Major Leagues with the Orioles, Dodgers, Braves, White Sox, and Rangers. He was the MVP of the 1995 NLCS with Atlanta. In 1992 with Baltimore, he hit 24 home runs and drove in 107 runs, finishing seventh in the AL MVP voting.

Bench coach **Kevin Mahar** returns to the Dragons for his third season and sixth year as a coach in the Reds organization. He spent the 2013-14 seasons at Billings and 2015 at Advanced-A Daytona. He worked in private business in 2016. Mahar played college baseball at Indiana University and reached the Major Leagues with the Texas Rangers in 2007.
