Durham Bulls RHP Zach Lee (3-3, 3.86) vs. Pawtucket Hot Wieners LHP Josh D. Smith (7-5, 3.16)


#### Abstract

Hot Name for a Hot Night - The Pawtucket Hot Wieners - winners of 5 of their last 7 games (while known as the Pawtucket Red Sox that is) - and the IL South-leading Durham Bulls (AAA-Tampa Bay) open a 4-game series at McCoy Stadium tonight at 7:05 pm (Live on NESN). To commemorate the one-night name change, the PawSox (or Pawtucket Hot Wieners) will wear an on-field cap and game jersey featuring the Hot Wiener logo. Hot Wieners Night will be a tribute and celebration of Rhode Island's most popular latenight food item. A hot wiener is a staple of the food culture of Rhode Island where it is primarily sold at "New York System" restaurants. The wiener is made with a small, thin hot dog consisting of veal and pork, giving it a different taste than a traditional beef hot dog. It is served in a steamed bun and topped with yellow mustard, celery salt, chopped onions, and a seasoned meat sauce. A preparation including all of the above is often ordered by true Rhode Island patrons as "All The Way"!


In addition to the team wearing Hot Wieners caps and jerseys, the PawSox have invited a number of local food trucks to sell their delicious hot wieners. The Dog House Dog cart on Mondor Way will be serving hot wieners. The first 50 fans to enter the stadium wearing their Hot Wieners merchandise will have the option to enter a Hot Wiener eating contest. The winner will receive a Pawtucket Hot Wieners Prize Pack. Other fun features tonight will include fans with Dachshunds being invited for a hot wiener (dog) parade before the game, and local wienie joint owners being honored in pregame ceremonies.

Durham Dry at McCoy - Pawtucket and Durham play tonight \& tomorrow both at 7:05 pm, Saturday at 6:15 pm, and Sunday at 1:35 pm in the series and homestand finale. Pawtucket has won each of their last 7 meetings with Durham here at McCoy...finishing 4-0 last season and going 3-0 in 2016. The last Durham win at McCoy came more than three years ago in the final meeting of the 2015 season on May 3 by an 8-2 score.

This Homestand - This 7-game homestand (1-2 thus far) is Pawtucket's longest remaining homestand of the season. When this stand is complete after this weekend, the PawSox will have just a 3-game homestand (August 28-30 vs. Lehigh Valley) and a 2-game homestand to end the regular-season on September $2 \& 3$ (vs. Scranton/Wilkes-Barre). As mentioned, tonight is the much-anticipated debut of the Pawtucket Hot Wieners (as the PawSox change their name and wear Hot Wiener caps and uniforms in honor of one of Rhode Island's most iconic foods...the hot wiener), tomorrow (Friday) will be Mo Vaughn Bobblehead Night, Saturday will be the penultimate post-game fireworks show of the season (to Springsteen Music), and Sunday will be Baseball Card Set Day along with the final pre-game Catch on the field and post-game Run the Bases at McCoy in 2018.

Durham Dynasty - Durham, the defending Governors' Cup Champions, has a $41 / 2$-game lead on Norfolk atop the IL South as they close in on their $9^{\text {th }}$ division title in the last 12 years. Only IL North-leading Lehigh Valley has a better record than the Bulls in the entire IL. Durham has made 14 post-season appearances in 20 seasons since joining the International League and they appear poised to make that 15 times in 21 years this September. Durham joined the IL in 1998 and has since made 11 trips to the Cup Finals (and 7 times in the last 11 years)...losing six times in 1998, 1999, 2007, 2008, 2010, and 2014 (to the PawSox) and winning on five occasions in 2002, 2003 (over Pawtucket), 2009, 2013 (over the PawSox again), and 2017.

Two of the Best This Decade - Two of the most successful franchises in recent times in the International League are meeting this weekend in Pawtucket. Pawtucket went to the Championship Series three years in a row from 2012-14, won two Governors' Cups (2012 \& 2014), and had been to the post-season four straight years (2011-14) until missing the playoffs each of the last three seasons. Durham went to back-to-back Championship Series in 2013 (defeating the PawSox) and 2014 (losing to the PawSox) and then last year defeated Scranton/WB, 3 games to 1 to win yet another Governors' Cup.

Series Run Over - Pawtucket had won three consecutive series for the first time this season and the first time since July of 2017 before dropping 2 of 3 to Norfolk to begin this homestand. Thus, the Sox could not post 4 series wins in a row for the first time in nearly five years since they won 6 straight series to end the 2013 season from August 13 - September 2 (when they won 19 of their last 23 games of the regular-season). Pawtucket is coming off a 5-1 roadtrip that began by taking 2 of 3 at Louisville last week and then sweeping a 3 -game series at IL West-leading Indianapolis over the weekend. The successful trip followed a series victory at home vs. Rochester about a week and a half ago when the PawSox took 2 of 3 from the Red Wings. Pawtucket has still won 4 of their last 6 series dating back to the end of July when they won 2 of 3 vs. Charlotte (interrupted by losing 3 of 4 in Syracuse from July 30 August 2 and dropping 2 of 3 vs. Norfolk from August 13-15). The PawSox are 15-20-4 in their 39 series this season (15 wins, 20 losses, and 4 splits) pending today's result.

Night Owls - The PawSox are 6-games under . 500 this season and that is exactly their mark in day games thus far (14-20). Pawtucket is playing .500 ball at night (43-43). The Sox have just three day games remaining...this Sunday vs. Durham ( $1: 35 \mathrm{pm}$ ), the following Sunday in Buffalo (1:05 pm), and Labor Day Monday, September 3 ${ }^{\text {rd }}$ vs. Scranton/WB (1:35 pm) in the season-finale.

Four, Three, Two - Pawtucket has 19 games remaining this season (9 at home and 10 on the road). At home they have these 4 vs. Durham through the weekend, 3 vs. Lehigh Valley from August 28-30, and then 2 vs. Scranton/WB on September 2 \& 3. The PawSox - who have won 8 of their last 12 games - are 7 -games behind wild card-leading Columbus ( 6 in the loss column), but the Sox will have to jump over five teams to get to the top of the wild card standings.

The Drive for Five Comes up Just Short - The PawSox had won 4 straight from August 9-12 for the third different time this season...June 10-13 and June 19-22 the others. Pawtucket's longest winning streak of the season is 5-games from May 27-31.

August Moon - Pawtucket has posted some fine numbers as they pass the midpoint in August batting .302 in the first 14 games this month (150-for-497) with 7 HR \& 67 runs scored. The PawSox hit .233 in April, .227 in May, 258 in June, and .251 in July. Their current .250 team batting average is their highest of the season. Sox pitchers in August are 9-5 with a 2.85 ERA (39 ER in 123.1 IP). Pawtucket will wind up playing 30 games in 31 days in August with two scheduled off-days (August $6 \& 20$ ) along with two games on August 21 in Rochester (including the completion of a suspended game from July 5).

Pitching vs. Hitting - Pawtucket leads the International League lead in Team Pitching with their 3.44 ERA while PawSox batters are up to $9^{\text {th }}$ in the IL with their .250 average. The PawSox have out-hit their opponents on the season (1002 hits to 978 ) and are very close with the opposition in runs scored (Sox have 463 runs compared to 468 for the opposition). Despite that, the PawSox are 6games under. 500 at 57-63 on the year.

Home Has Been Sweet, But Road Was Bumpy - The PawSox have won 8 of their last 14 games at home dating back to July 14. Pawtucket was a season-high 5-games over . 500 on August 4 but they are now 32-29 at McCoy. The Sox are 25-35 on the road (they had the worst away mark in the league until winning their last 4 road games). They had dropped 15 of their previous 20 on the road between June 26 - August 8.

What Have You Done for Me Lately - The PawSox are 9-5 since August 1 after going 3-11 in their previous 14 games between July 17-31. Included during that stretch was a season-high 6-game losing streak from July 17-22. Their recent 4-game winning streak (August 9-12) marked the first time they had been able to win more than two in a row since a 3-game winning streak from July 14-16.

2018 Season-Series vs. Durham - The PawSox faced the Bulls about two and a half months ago in Durham in their only previous meeting prior to this week/weekend at McCoy. The Bulls won 2 of those 3 games at Durham Bulls Athletic Park in a well-pitched and well-played series. Durham won 3-1 and 5-3 on June $1 \& 2$ before the Sox salvaged the finale on June 3, 4-2.

Stats vs. the Bulls This Season - The PawSox have received strong pitching vs. Durham thus far this season going 1-2 despite a 2.52 ERA ( 7 ER in 25 IP). PawSox batters are hitting just .200 ( 20 -for-100) vs. Bulls pitching but they do have 4 HR ( 2 by Sturgeon and 1 from Castillo \& Ohlman). Durham has out-scored Pawtucket, 10-8 thus far.

2017 Season-Series vs. Durham - The PawSox won the season-series over Durham by a 5-2 count in 2017. Pawtucket swept a 4game series at McCoy from May 26-29 of 2017...beating the Bulls 5-4 (in 12 innings), 6-2, 7-1, and 3-1 during that 4-game set.

PawSox Bullish on Durham - The PawSox hold the lead in the all-time series between these two clubs since Durham arrived in the International League in 1998. Pawtucket is 93-66 all-time vs. the Bulls during the regular-season going 46-30 at McCoy Stadium in Pawtucket and 47-36 in Durham. The PawSox are 4-8 in the post-season vs. Durham as the Sox lost in the Governors' Cup Finals to the Bulls in both 2003 (0-3) and 2013 (1-3) but won the 2014 Cup Finals (3-2).

Trending - The PawSox (now at 57-63) were a season-low 10-games below .500 on July 31 and August 2 (49-59) for the first time in almost three years since they ended the 2015 season with a $59-85$ record. At 5 -game under on Tuesday they were the closest they had been to .500 since July 19 at 45-50.

One is a Lonely Number - The Sox posted back-to-back 3-2 victories at Indianapolis last Friday and Saturday. Pawtucket had lost 10 of their prior dozen 1-run decisions between July 6 - August 8 . They were 16-9 in 1-run games on July 4 which was the best winning pct. in the league, but they are now 20-19 in 1-run games this season.

Sad Endings - The PawSox have lost a game in the opponent's final at-bat 10 times since July 17 (in their last 28 games). Pawtucket had suffered just 5 losses in the final at-bat of a game previously during their first 92 games of the season. Furthermore, the PawSox have dropped 10 road games since July 17 and 8 of those 10 defeats occurred during the opposition's last AB of the game. During this span the Sox have lost games in the bottom of the $11^{\text {th }}$-inning, bottom of the $9^{\text {th }}$, bottom of the $8^{\text {th }}$, bottom of the $9^{\text {th }}$, bottom of the $10^{\text {th }}$, top of the $10^{\text {th }}$, bottom of the $13^{\text {th }}$, bottom of the $12^{\text {th }}$, top of the $9^{\text {th }}$, and bottom of the $8^{\text {th }}$. Overall this season, the Sox have lost 15 games during the opposition's last AB while winning 11 times during their own last AB ( 6 walk-offs).

Left at the Altar - The PawSox lead the league with 879 runners left on base this season for an average of 7.3 LOB per game. The club-record is 1121 LOB in 2005 in 144 games (or an average of 7.8 per game).

Series Business - Pawtucket is 15-20-4 in their 39 series this season ( 15 wins, 20 losses, and 4 splits). They have posted four 3-game sweeps this season along with a 2-game sweep and a 1-game sweep (in Rochester on July 4). The PawSox have been swept in a series four times this season (suffering three 3-game sweeps and a 2-game sweep).

Nice While it Lasted - After winning on June 25, the PawSox went over the .500 mark at 38-37 for the first time since May 8. On May 6 the Sox had matched their season-high of 3-games over the .500 mark (15-12) from April 28 when they were 11-8. They also (for one night anyway on June 25) moved into sole possession of $2^{\text {nd }}$-place in the IL North for the first time since they were alone in $1^{\text {st }}$-place on May 11. Pawtucket is now alone in $3^{\text {rd }}$-place in the IL North as they trail Lehigh Valley by 15-games after being a season-high -18 GB on August 5 (the IronPigs own the best record in the league).

North Face - From June 11 July 15 the PawSox played 31 straight games against IL North rivals. The Sox had been playing outside their division from July 16 through July 29 before returning to IL North foes on July 30 at Syracuse. Pawtucket is $33-41$ vs. their IL North rivals. They are 13-11 vs. the IL West and 11-11 vs. the IL South including a 6-3 mark at home vs. Southern foes. The Sox are back outside the North from August 7-19 having played Louisville \& Indianapolis of the IL West last week and now Norfolk \& Durham of the IL South this week.

Bye to July - The PawSox concluded July with a 10-16 record in which they battled in a wave of close games. Pawtucket finished the month 2-9 in one-run games, 1-4 in extra innings, and lost 7 games in the opponents' final at-bat in July. It marked their third consecutive losing month...they went 11-10 in April, but then 13-17 in May, 14-15 in June, and 10-16 in July. The Sox batted . 251 in July with 15 HR in 26 games while posting a 3.54 ERA.

Last Tune in June - The PawSox - due to a 5-game losing skid to end the month of June - finished with a losing record in June at 1415. They hit .258 with 27 HR in 29 games during the month along with a 3.41 ERA. They had their best month of last season in June going 17-14.

A Hectic May - The PawSox finished an extremely busy May with a 13-17 record for the month. The topsy-turvy travel month included four different homestands and four different roadtrips. Pitchers posted a 3.60 ERA in May while batters hit .227 with 22 HR and 97 runs in 30 May games (for an average of 3.2 runs per game). The Sox played 30 games in 31 days in May with just one scheduled off-day (May 17) during the entire month.

April Comes up a Winner - The PawSox posted a winning April for the $6^{\text {th }}$ time in the last 8 years as they finished the month with an 11-10 record and in $2^{\text {nd }}$-place in the IL North ( -2 GB of front-running Syracuse at the time). Pawtucket has had just one losing month of April since 2010 and that came last year (10-12). The Sox hit .233 in April with 16 HR in 21 games while pitchers were 11-10 with a 3.51 ERA along with a league-leading 230 strikeouts in 190 innings.

Throwing Strikes - Pawtucket pitchers are $2^{\text {nd }}$ in the International League with 1065 strikeouts. Durham leads with 1092 SO. Sox hurlers have posted strikeout games of 20 (April 9), 18 (April $20 \&$ July 8), 15 (three times), 14 (three times), 13 (four times), 12 (eight times), 11 (five times), and 10 ( 16 times) this season.

Pitching In - Sox hurlers are $1^{\text {st }}$ in the International League with their 3.44 ERA.
Hit or Miss - PawSox batters are up to $9^{\text {th }}$ with their .250 average... which is their highest since they ended last year with a .258 team batting average.

Defensive - The PawSox have made just 22 errors in their last 42 games. Last year the PawSox led the International League with a .987 fielding pct. while making a league-low 64 errors on the season (both new franchise-records). This season the Sox are $12^{\text {th }}$ in the league with a .980 fielding pct. ( 86 errors in 4212 total chances).

Blanketed - The PawSox have been shutout 11 times this season (Rochester leads with 13 followed by Scranton/WB and Buffalo with 12 times shutout). Pawtucket was blanked 9 times total in 2017. They went 18-9 in shuout games last year. They are 8-11 in shutout games thus far in 2018.

A Look Back Before We Go Forth - Pawtucket finished 67-75 last year and in $4^{\text {th }}$-place in the IL North for the second straight season. They dropped to a season-low 9-games under . 500 on August 26 at 62-71. On July 18, 2017 the PawSox were a season-best 6-games over . 500 at 50-44. Pawtucket finished 34-36 in games played at McCoy Stadium last season. Thus they finished with just their second losing season at McCoy in the last 8 years. The Sox went $33-39$ on the road.

## BOSTON RED SOX DEVELOPMENT SYSTEM -

Portland (51-68) - The Portland Sea Dogs (AA) beat Trenton, 6-5 last night. Deiner Lopez had 2 hits and 3 RBI including the goahead RBI in the bottom of the $8^{\text {th }}$. Brian Dalbec (RBI double) and Chad De La Guerra (2-run double) also had key hits. Dedgar Jimenez fired 5 hitless innings but was not involved in the decision - $5 \mathrm{IP}, 0 \mathrm{H}, 0 \mathrm{R}, 4 \mathrm{BB}, 6 \mathrm{SO}$. The win went to Trey Ball (3-3) who allowed an unearned run in the top of the $8^{\text {th }}$ that tied the game. Josh Taylor worked the $9^{\text {th }}$ for his $5^{\text {th }}$ save.
Salem (24-27)/(56-63) - The Salem Red Sox (A) were blanked at Frederick, 4-0 last night. The Sox were held to 2 hits. Kevin McAvoy (1-3) suffered the loss - 6 IP, 5 H, 2 R, 3 BB, 3 SO.

Greenville (29-23)/(54-67) - The Greenville Drive (A) held off Greensboro, 9-6 last night. Everlouis Lozada, Marino Campana, and Pedro Castellanos all had 3 hits apiece. Angel Padron (5-5) was nearly perfect over 6 scoreless innings for the victory - 6 IP, $1 \mathrm{H}, 0$ R, $0 \mathrm{BB}, 5 \mathrm{SO}$.

Lowell (29-26) - The Lowell Spinners (short-A) were 5-2 losers at Aberdeen last night. Taylor Ahearn took the loss - 1.1 IP, $5 \mathrm{H}, 5$ R, $5 \mathrm{ER}, 2 \mathrm{BB}, 0 \mathrm{SO}$.

This Saturday the PawSox will stage their next Saturday Night Fireworks Show after they host Durham at 6:15 pm at McCoy Stadium. After the game, fans will be treated to a spectacular Fireworks Show set to Springsteen Music thanks to Samaritans of Rhode Island and B101 Radio.

SUNDAY PAWSOX CARD SET 1:35 pmvs. Durham
The first 5,000 fans coming to McCoy Stadium on Sunday when the PawSox play Durham at $1: 35 \mathrm{pm}$ will receive a collector's edition PawSox Baseball Card Set. Always one of the most popular items of the season, this limited edition 2018 PawSox Card Set features full color action photos of all your favorite Sox players including: Rusney Castillo, Tzu-Wei Lin, Bobby Poyner, Robby Scott, and Sam Travis just to name a few. Sponsored by Dunkin' Donuts and NESN, that's PawSox Team Card Set Day at McCoy on Sunday at $1: 35 \mathrm{pm}$.

PAWSOX PLAYER MOVES - The PawSox today placed catcher Mike Ohlman on the 7-day disabled list (retroactive to August 15) with a left calf strain and placed OF Kyle Wren on the 7 -day DL (retro to August 15) with a right knee contusion. The PawSox reinstated INF Ivan De Jesus, Jr. from the disabled list... he has been on the DL since August 6 with left wrist inflammation. And the PawSox today added catcher Dan Butler following his designation for assignment by Boston on Tuesday. Butler was selected to Boston on August 3 and made 2 starts for the Red Sox while catcher Blake Swihart was on the DL. Butler is hitting . 202 in 58 games for the PawSox this season with $5 \mathrm{HR} \& 22$ RBI.

The PawSox have been involved in 48 player moves since July 22 ( 26 days). The Sox are at the roster limit with 25 active players. Pawtucket has used 55 different players this season ( 26 position players \& 29 pitchers) - the same amount they employed last year (28 pitchers \& 27 position players). The club-record is 70 players used in both 1995 and 2006.

Infielder Tzu-Wei Lin became the first player promoted from Pawtucket to Boston this season (not including rehabbing players) on April 10 before rejoining Pawtucket on May 8, returning to Boston on June 23, back with Pawtucket (July 2), again in Boston (July 12), back with the PawSox (July 25), to Boston again on July 29, and back with Pawtucket on August 1. Marcus Walden was \#2 following his quick recall on April 12 and then another recall on May 2 (he came off the PawSox DL on July 25). Bobby Poyner became the third call-up on May 4 - he later returned to Pawtucket, went back to Boston (May 15), back again with the PawSox, to Boston (June 2), returned to Pawtucket (June 7), back to Boston (July 14), and now with the PawSox (July 22). 1B/OF Sam Travis became the fourth call-up on June 2, returned to the the PawSox on June 12, back to Boston on July 13 and now back to Pawtucket on July 16. RHP Brandon Workman was next on June 5 and spent almost two months with the Red Sox before being optioned on July 26, then recalled on July 31, and optioned on August 12 (added Aug. 14). LHP Jalen Beeks followed on June 6 (returned to Pawtucket on June 8, recalled to Boston on July 10, back with the PawSox on July 11, and traded to Tampa Bay on July 25). RHP Justin Haley was the next call-up to Boston on June 8, was optioned on June 19, recalled to Boston again on June 26, and optioned back to Pawtucket on July 2. LHP Robby Scott was promoted to Boston on June 19 but was optioned to Pawtucket on June 23 before another promotion to Boston on July 11, and now optioned to Pawtucket on July 16. RHP William Cuevas was promoted to Boston on July 2, optioned back on July 4, recalled again on July 8, optioned on July 10 , recalled as the Red Sox $26^{\text {th }}$ man for their August 11 doubleheader, and optioned on August 12 (added on August 15). Reliever Ryan Brasier was selected to Boston on July 8. On August 3 catcher Dan Butler was selected to the Red Sox roster and was added to the PawSox roster on August 16. On August 4 INF Tony Renda became the $12^{\text {th }}$ different player promoted from Pawtucket to Boston (and the next night he scored the winning run in the bottom of the $10^{\text {th }}$-inning as a pinch runner to cap the Red Sox 4 -game sweep of the Yankees at Fenway). Renda returned to Pawtucket on August 9 .

The PawSox have employed 9 different Red Sox players on a rehab assignment already this season...LHP Drew Pomeranz (twice but now back with Boston), RHP Steven Wright (twice but back in Boston), LHP Bobby Poyner (optioned to Pawtucket, recalled again to Boston, and now back with the PawSox), INF Xander Bogaerts (returned to Boston), RHP Tyler Thornburg (three times but now in Boston), INF/OF Brock Holt (back with Boston), 2B Dustin Pedroia (back with the Red Sox), RHP Austin Maddox (returned to Boston but remains on Red Sox DL), and RHP Hector Velazquez (returned to Boston).

It was another busy player movement year in 2017. The PawSox were involved in 221 player transactions during the 2017 season. Pawtucket employed 55 different players last season ( 28 pitchers \& 27 position players). They had 18 different players promoted to Boston during the 2017 season (not including rehabbing players).
