

# TRENTON THUNDER GAME NOTES

## Harrisburg Senators ((Nationals)) vs. Trenton Thunder ((Yankees))

### LAST GAME:

Albert Abreu delivered a brilliant six-inning outing, however, the Senators scored five times in the bottom of the eighth to take a 6-4 decision on Tuesday night.

Abreu allowed a first inning run then proceeded to retire 16-of-the-next-19 batters faced and struck out a season-high eight in the win.

The Thunder held a 3-1 lead for much of the game following a fourth inning rally against Tyler Mapes. Kyle Holder cleared the bases with a double off the wall in right to take the 3-1 advantage.

In the eighth, the Senators plated five unearned runs in total, beginning with an RBI 1B from Ian Sagdal. Trevor Lane entered to try to get the final out of the inning, however, he allowed a pair of two-run doubles to make it 6-3.

### THUNDER CLAPS

**THE MATCHUP:** After this series, the Thunder will have played the Senators seven times over a 14-day span (the two will meet again May 31-June 2 in Trenton for a total of 10 matchups over 32 days). The Senators took two of three games from the Thunder on the previous road trip before rain washed out the four-game series finale. Trenton dropped two of three in their lone visit to FNB Field last season (August 10-12) and last won a series in Harrisburg in 2017, when they won two of three games August 18-20. With the loss of the current four-game set, the winless series streak in Harrisburg will continue for the Thunder.

**A BUMPY ROAD:** The Thunder are 9-11 on the road this season, with all four of their series losses taking place on the road (Erie, New Hampshire, Harrisburg [twice]). Trenton pitching has been significantly less effective on the road (4.67 ERA, .269 BAA) than at home (2.36 ERA, .192 BAA), and the Thunder are one of just two teams in the Eastern League (along with Erie) with both an overall winning record and a sub-.500 road record.

**RUNNING ON EMPTY:** Monday's losses were just the fourth and fifth games this season in which the Thunder scored just one run. Trenton is tied for third in the Eastern League in runs scored (162), is averaging 4.9 runs per game and has not yet been shut out this season.

**RAIN, RAIN, GO AWAY:** Rain washed out all but one Eastern League game on Sunday (a 14-4 Erie win in Altoona) while all five other scheduled games were rained out. Drizzles continued Monday, knocking out a Fisher Cats-Fightin Phils doubleheader in New Hampshire and an Altoona-Binghamton contest at NYSEG Stadium. For the Thunder this season, rain has caused five postponements, two delays, one suspension, and one early completion.

**RED-HOT RUTA:** West Windsor, New Jersey native **Ben Ruta** leads the league with a .356 average and a .450 OBP, is tied for the league lead with 4 triples, second with 42 hits, and tied for second with 9 stolen bases. Ruta also owns the team's longest on-base streak this season (13 games between April 17 and May 6) and leads the Thunder with 13 multi-hit games.

**GITTEN' AFTER IT:** First baseman **Chris Gittens** also ranks among league leaders in numerous offensive categories. The Texas native leads the E.L. with a 1.066 OPS and is near the top with a .449 OBP (2<sup>nd</sup>), 27 RBI (T-2<sup>nd</sup>), .617 SLG (3<sup>rd</sup>), 7 home runs (T-3<sup>rd</sup>), and 23 walks (T-3<sup>rd</sup>).

**WHO THEY ARE:** Of the 25 players on the Thunder roster, 14 were drafted by the Yankees, seven were signed as minor league or international free agents, three were acquired via trade, and one was claimed off waivers. Fifteen of the 25 played under Patrick Osborn at High-A Tampa at some point in 2018.

**2019:** Made four starts with High-A Tampa to begin the season, fanning an FSL-best 33 batters in 17.2 IP and recording a 3.06 ERA... Transferred to the Thunder on April 30 when Garrett Whitlock went on IL (broken fingernail)... Each of his first three starts with the Thunder had a 10:30am first pitch...

**2018:** Began season in Extended Spring Training before heading to Charleston for 8 starts and went 2-4 with a 3.76 ERA (40.2 IP, 31 H, 10 BB, 63 K)... Made five starts with High-A Tampa going 2-0, with a 1.57 ERA, struck out 35 batters in 28.1 IP... Struck out a career-high 12 batters on 7/25 vs. Augusta and matched it in his first start with Tampa on 8/6 as part of a perfect 21-up, 21-down performance in a 7-inning game against Clearwater (A game they would lose in extra innings)... It marked the first time in nearly 26 years a team threw a no-hitter but lost in the Florida State League. Scott Backum of Winter Haven did so -- also against Clearwater -- on Aug. 23, 1992.... Struck out 7+ batters in 11-of-14 starts... **Made Thunder debut in 3-0 Division Clinching victory over Reading throwing 5 no-hit innings, combined no-hit bid lasted 7.1 IP...**

**2017:** Combined with the DSL Yankees, the GCL Yankees West and Rookie-level Pulaski to go 6-2 with a 3.30 ERA (60.0IP, 42H, 23R/22ER, 19BB, 85K, 7HR) in 13 games (10 starts)...posted a 12.75 K/9.0IP ratio, the second-highest among Yankees farmhands (min. 50.0IP)...recorded at least 7K in seven of his 13 appearances...held opponents to a .202 (42-for-208) BA...was transferred to the GCL Yankees West on 6/26 and went 3-0 with a 3.24 ERA (16.2IP, 9H, 6ER, 4BB, 24K, 3HR) in four games (two starts)...was promoted to Pulaski on 7/24 and went 2-1 with a 4.50 ERA (28.0IP, 23H, 14ER, 13BB, 43K, 3HR) in six games (five starts)...
