On December 8, 2017, the Gwinnett Baseball Club unveiled its new name, logos and uniforms to the public. Following nine seasons as the Gwinnett Braves, the Triple-A International League team announced it would now be known as the Gwinnett Stripers.

The Stripers are the very first unique team identity for an Atlanta Braves-owned Minor League Baseball franchise. The name honors the outdoor traditions of Gwinnett County, including year-round striped bass fishing on nearby Lake Lanier.

The Stripers name was chosen following a six-month creative process that included input from the Atlanta Braves, sports marketing firm Brandiose, and submissions from the fans. A total of 4,024 submissions and over 900 different names were sent in by fans during a "Name the Team" contest in May 2017, and a selection committee narrowed the entries down to six finalists in July 2017: Big Mouths, Buttons, Gobblers, Hush Puppies, Lambchops and Sweet Teas.

With help from a public online vote, the selection committee initially decided on Big Mouths. In the process of developing the logos and uniforms, however, it was determined that the Big Mouths moniker was not fitting with the ultimate vision of the team. Further discussion and development resulted in a change to the Stripers, a name that was included in the fan submissions but was not one of the six finalists.

With Big Mouths and Stripers both considered winners of the "Name the Team" contest, and each name submitted by multiple fans, the team randomly selected one fan from each group to receive two 2018 season tickets. Patrick Kelly of Decatur, GA (Big Mouths) and Jay Andrews of Sugar Hill, GA (Stripers) were each selected.

The Stripers logos are both fresh and traditional, featuring the team's new main color of "Striper Green" paired alongside the familiar Braves Navy and Red. The Stripers are the first professional sports team to use this color combination.

Adam English enters his first season as the Vice President and General Manager for the Gwinnett Stripers in 2019. He was named to the position in November of 2018. This year will be his 15th in professional baseball.

English joined the Stripers following six seasons leading the ticket sales department for the Sacramento River Cats (Triple-A, San Francisco Giants). Hired as Sacramento's Director of Ticket Sales in 2013, he advanced to Senior Director of Ticket Sales and Service in 2015 and spent the last two seasons as the Vice President of Ticket Sales and Service.

During his tenure, the River Cats drew 3,598,210 fans to Raley Field for an average of 8,466 per game. Sacramento ranked in the top five in Pacific Coast League in attendance in each of his six seasons, and led the 16-team circuit in total attendance in 2013, 2014 and 2015. In 2016, the River Cats were named by Forbes as the most valuable franchise in Minor League Baseball.

Native has also spent three seasons as the Director of Ticket Sales (2010-11) and Assistant General Manager (2011-13) for the Lexington Legends (Class-A, Kansas City Royals) and four seasons as a Ticket Sales Manager for Ripken Baseball (2006-10). Originally known as Gwinnett Stadium, Coolray Field has been the home of the Gwinnett Braves/Stripers since the start of the 2009 season. The state-of-the-art facility was completed in a mere nine months following its groundbreaking ceremony in June 2008. The Gwinnett Braves welcomed a sellout crowd of 10,427 for the first game in the stadium's history, April 17, 2009 vs. the Norfolk Tides.
Renamed "Coolray Field" thanks to a partnership with Coolray Heating \& Cooling in 2010, the ballpark is known for combining the amenities of a Major League stadium alongside the family-friendly conveniences and up-close action of a Minor League stadium.

The Home Plate Club and 18 Luxury Suites offer a first-class experience each and every night, while chairback seating complete with cupholders throughout the stadium ensures that every seat is truly the best in the house. Coolray Field can entertain large groups in several areas, including "The Cove" (1st Base Picnic Area), the "1st Base Dock" and "3rd Base Dock" (Party Decks), the "Left Field Landing" and the "Team of the Night/Birthday Zone." A 30-foot-by-40-foot video board in right-center field and a 6-foot-by-42-foot LED board along the left-field wall keep fans informed and entertained throughout the game.

## COOLRAY FIELD GROUND RULES

1. Any ball that hits above the yellow line at the top of the outfield fence will be considered a home run.
2. The tarp resting on the first base warning track is in play unless a ball becomes lodged between the tarp and the stadium wall. At that point, the ball will be considered dead.
3. Any ball batted or thrown into either dugout will be considered dead.
4. All other official baseball rules apply.


## THE MAGNOLIA TREE

Coolray Field features a unique homage to the history of Minor League Baseball in Atlanta. A Magnolia Tree (pictured left), planted prior to the park's opening in 2009, stands next to the center field concession stand behind the batter's eye.

The tree continues a tradition started by the Atlanta Crackers Atlanta's first professional baseball team - in 1924. The team's home, Spiller Field (later renamed Ponce de Leon Park) was constructed around a Magnolia Tree that remained in the outfield. The tree stood in playable ground (balls landing in the tree remained in play) until the outfield wall was moved in roughly 50 feet in 1947.

## THE VIEWS AT COOLRAY FIELD

The 2015 season saw the completion of The Views at Coolray Field, a luxury apartment complex located just beyond the right field fence.

## RECORD ATTENDANCE SET AT 2012 FUTURE STARS GAME

For the first time ever, Coolray Field hosted the Atlanta Braves Major League club in an exhibition game on April 3, 2012. The "Braves All-Stars vs. Future Stars Game" showcased the big league club against a group of organizational stars headed by Hall of Fame manager Bobby Cox (pictured left). A rain-shortened eight-inning game saw the Braves clip the prospects $4-3$ in front of a Coolray Field record crowd of 10,568. Among the highlights of the game were a towering solo home run by Dan Uggla and a game-winning pinch-hit RBI double by Duluth, GA's own Brian McCann (pictured right).

## ATLANTACBACLERS

Following a sporadic existence from 1884-1902, the Atlanta Crackers played in the Double-A Southern Association from 1903-1961, winning a league record 18 championships in that span. The Crackers joined the International League in 1962 and won the Governors' Cup in their inaugural Triple-A season. After playing in Ponce de Leon Park from 1906-1923, Spiller Field (later renamed Ponce de Leon Park) from 1924-1964 and Atlanta-Fulton County Stadium in 1965, the Crackers moved to Richmond, VA in 1966 to make way for the Milwaukee Braves to relocate to Atlanta.

## 23-TOMMIE AARON

The only man in International League history to earn league MVP honors and manage a Governors' Cup champion, Tommie Aaron played for Richmond for four seasons (1966-67, 1971-72) and managed the club for two seasons (1977-78). He hit . 309 as the IL MVP in 1967, helping the Braves capture the IL pennant. Ten seasons later, he became the league's first African-American manager, and in just his second season at the helm, led Richmond to the Governors' Cup Championship in 1978. Aaron's number 23 was originally retired at "The Diamond" in Richmond in 1985, shortly after his passing in 1984.


## 42-JACHIE ROBINSON

Retired by all of professional baseball in 1997, the number 42 worn by trailblazer and Baseball Hall-of-Famer Jackie Robinson was added to the Coolray Field outfield wall on April 15, 2012 to honor "Jackie Robinson Day."

CREDENTIAL REQUESTS: Season and single-game credentials must be requested through the Gwinnett Stripers Media Relations Department at least 24 hours prior to the date your outlet is planning to attend. Only legitimate news-gathering outlets, at the discretion of the Gwinnett Stripers, will receive credentials. All credentials are non-transferable and should be visible at all times. Credentials will not be issued to anyone under 18 years of age. The Gwinnett Stripers reserve the right to revoke credentials at any time. Anyone seeking autographs, player memorabilia, personal photos, etc. will have their credentials revoked immediately.

ACCESS TO COOLRAY FIELD: All media members are required to enter Coolray Field through the Main Gate, located behind home plate next to the Ticket Office. Entry via the Player Parking and Player Entrance area will not be permitted. You must present a 2019 Gwinnett Stripers Credential to gain access to the ballpark. Single-game credentials can be obtained with valid photo ID at the Coolray Field Will-Call Window. Free parking for media is available in Lot A (based on availability) or the Gravel Lot area adjacent to the third-base side of the ballpark.

PREGAME INTERVIEWS: Gwinnett Stripers' players and coaches will be made available (upon request) for pregame interviews either on the field or in front of the Media Backdrop (located outside the Home Clubhouse) following the conclusion of batting practice. Interviews may not interfere with pregame routines (stretching, hitting, throwing, running, fielding, etc.) and must conclude one (1) hour prior to game time. Starting pitchers will not be made available for pregame interviews on days they are scheduled to start.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS: Following a 10-minute "cool down" period, a member of the Gwinnett Stripers' Media Relations staff will escort media members into the Home Clubhouse area for a brief post-game interview session. Players and coaches will be obtained upon request. Video interviews will be shot in front of the Media Backdrop (located outside the Home Clubhouse). The training room, weight room and player lounge areas of the clubhouse are off limits to media members at all times. There is no still photography permitted in the clubhouse unless authorized by a member of the Media Relations staff. The Home Clubhouse is CLOSED during rain delays and in between games of a doubleheader.

ATLANTA BRAVES REHAB ASSIGNMENTS: Players on injury rehab assignments for the Atlanta Braves will be made available to the media when possible with their schedule. All interview requests with rehabbing players must be authorized by a member of the Gwinnett Stripers' Media Relations staff. In accordance with Atlanta Braves' Major League Clubhouse Policy, no starting pitchers will be made available for pregame interviews on days that they are starting. Starting pitchers on rehab assignments will be made available for interviews following the conclusion of their outing (subject to availability).

VISITOR'S CLUBHOUSE INTERVIEW REQUESTS: The Visitor's Clubhouse is to be considered CLOSED at all times (prior to and after the game) unless a specific request has been authorized by a member of the Gwinnett Stripers' Media Relations staff. No media members shall access the Visitor's Clubhouse without permission from the Gwinnett Stripers' Media Relations staff, who will work in conjunction with that team's Media/Public Relations department to handle the request. There is no still photography permitted in the Visitor's Clubhouse, unless authorized by a member of the Media Relations staff.

FIELD/DUGOUTS: Media members holding credentials that grant field access may be present in the foul territory/dugout areas up to one (1) hour prior to the scheduled game time. At no time are media members allowed to cross the foul lines into the field of play. PRESS BOX: Limited space in the Coolray Field Press Box is available for WORKING MEDIA ONLY. A wireless internet connection will be provided to you. A light pre-game meal is also offered approximately 90 minutes prior to game time in the Executive Offices Cafeteria area. There will be no cheering or rooting for either team at any point during the game. Individuals who violate Press Box rules will be removed and credentials revoked upon the discretion of the Gwinnett Stripers Media Relations Department.
