A constant in Rochester throughout the 1930's was Estel Crabtree, a fine defensive outfielder who was versatile enough to also play first and third base. Crabtree emerged as Rochester's alltime leader in hits (1,041), RBI (525), and games (934). He clubbed 91 home runs, none more famous than a 9th inning three-run shot that propelled the Red Wings past Newark in the 1939 Governors' Cup Finals. Crabtree also served briefly as manager in 1940. In 1989 he was an inaugural inductee into the Rochester Red Wings Hall of Fame.
