2010 WEST DIVISION CHAMPION CLINTON LUMBERKINGS – FINAL REPORT & BIOS

First Half: 37-32 (T-4th, 6.5 GB) ■ **Second Half:** 37-33 (4th, 6.5 GB) ■ **Season:** 74-65 (3rd, 9.5 GB)

A “Wild” Season: The Clinton LumberKings returned to the Midwest League Playoffs after a one-year absence, locking up the second-half West Division Wild Card despite dropping their final four games of the regular season. Once in the postseason, the Kings survived 1-0 series’ deficits against Cedar Rapids (winning two on the road to eliminate the Kernels in the Quarterfinals) and Kane County (winning two at home to oust the Cougars in the MWLWDCS). The league’s oldest franchise then met one of the newest, the Lake County Captains in the best-of-five Championship Series. **John Tamargo’s** club fell 9-6 despite a 6-3 lead in game one, but pulled off a stunning 8-7 walk-off win in game two, an 18-inning, 5:37 battle that is considered to be the longest Championship Series game in league history. The Captains took a 2-1 series lead as things shifted to Classic Park in Eastlake, OH, but the Kings improved to 5-0 when facing elimination with a comeback 3-2 win in game four. Pushed to a deciding game five, Lake County prevailed and took the title with a 3-1 win, capturing their first league title in franchise history dating back to 2003. The title drought for the Clinton franchise is now 19 seasons...the last club to win it all was the 1991 Clinton Giants. Still, the LumberKings are 19-24 in postseason play since 1998 and finished the 2010 playoffs with a 6-5 record.

How the West Was Won: The LumberKings captured the franchise’s first division title since 1993 on 9/13 at Alliant Energy Field with a 4-1 victory over the Kane County Cougars. Right-hander **Tom Wilhelmson** kept the Kane County bats off the board for seven innings and **Mickey Wiswall** broke a scoreless game in the sixth with a mammoth two-run homer to right field to provide the offense. Wilhelmson (W, 1-0) was spectacular as he scattered six hits, walked none and struck out six over 7.0 innings, yet the game remained tied until the sixth. **Kevin Mailloux** reached on a dropped pop-up by second-baseman Conner Crumbliss, and two batters later, Wiswall stepped up. The slugging DH took right-hander Murphy Smith’s (L, 0-1) 1-0 pitch completely out of the park over the Lumber Lounge in right for his first playoff blast, giving the Kings a 2-0 lead. **Blake Ochoa** was then hit by a pitch and scored on a triple by **Tim Morris** for a 3-0 advantage. Right-hander **Forrest Snow** allowed an unearned run in the eighth as Rashun Dixon cut the lead to 3-1 with a two-out single to center, but Morris singled, moved around the bases and scored on a sacrifice fly by **Gabriel Noriega** to put Clinton back ahead by three. Snow (S, 1) yielded two hits in the ninth inning but preserved the victory by striking out Crumbliss and inducing Jose Crisotomo into a 3-1 groundout.

Success Off the Field: The 2010 season was just as successful in the front office as it was on the diamond. **A grand total of 123,553 fans flocked to Alliant Energy Field this season, the second-largest single-season attendance in the 73-year history of the franchise.** Only the 1988 Clinton Giants drew more fans through the turnstiles (127,251) than this year’s club. In early September, the LumberKings announced an extension of their Player Development Contract with Seattle, signing on to be the low-A affiliate of the Mariners for another two seasons. After the playoffs, Clinton General Manager **Ted Tornow** was named the **MWL Executive of the Year** by his peers, his first such MWL award in 12 seasons with the Kings.

49 years (1961-2010) until Franklin tied him with a solo shot on 8/31 in Peoria. Seattle’s first-round pick (27th overall) out of Lake Brantley High School (FL) in 2009, Franklin finished amidst league leaders in total bases (3rd with 249), runs scored (T-4th with 89), at-bats per HR ratio (4th at 22.30 AB/HR), slugging percentage (9th at .485) and OPS (10th at .837). **Franklin** was one of only three players in the minors to record a 20 HR-20 SB season (also Washington’s Dan Espinosa - 22 HR, 25 SB and San Francisco’s Brandon Belt - 23 HR, 22 SB). Franklin hit .281 (144-for-513) with 89 runs scored, 22 doubles, seven triples, 23 HR, 65 RBI and 25 steals. He was named Clinton’s Offensive MVP by the Mariners and the MLB’s best shortstop by *Baseball America*.

Kings of Clout: The LumberKings finished atop the Midwest League in team home runs with 134 in 139 games, seven more than the second-place Great Lakes Loons (127 HR in 139 games). The total is believed to be the single-season franchise record, eclipsing the 115 blasts recorded by the talented 2008 club in 137 games...last year’s team combined to hit just 77 HR in 137 games. LumberKings’ shortstop **Nick Franklin** finished with the league lead in HR with 23, one ahead of Quad Cities’ Matt Adams and Wisconsin’s Kris Davis (both with 22). **Vinnie Catricala** finished tied for seventh with 17 clouts.

Smokin’ Aces: The LumberKings’ pitching staff finished the year with a 3.66 ERA (488 ER in 1,199.1 IP), second-best in the Midwest League...only Great Lakes had a better team ERA of 3.44. Two of the top 10 pitchers in ERA were Kings this year...current West Tenn lefty **Jimmy Gillheaney** ended up second with a 2.83 ERA in 117.2 innings, trailing only ERA champion **Ian Krol** of Kane County (2.65 ERA). 20-year-old right-hander **Erasmus Ramirez**, named the league’s best right-handed starter on the MWL Post-Season All-Star list, finished fifth with a 2.97 ERA. Ramirez also cracked the league leaderboard in WHIP (2nd at 1.07), innings pitched (3rd with 151.2 IP), fewest walks per 9.0 IP for starters (3rd at 1.34) and fewest baserunners per 9.0 IP for starters (3rd at 10.60). Right-hander **Taylor Stanton** finished in a four-way tie for most wins with 12.

Franklin, Ramirez Named Post-Season All-Stars: Shortstop **Nick Franklin** and right-hander **Erasmus Ramirez** were officially announced as Midwest League Post-Season All-Stars on 8/24 by the league office. The 19-year-old Franklin was voted the league’s top shortstop and the 20-year-old Ramirez earned the top right-handed starting pitcher nomination from the 16 managers of the MWL. Their selections mark the first time two Kings have been on the post-season All-Star list since first-baseman **Mitch Moreland** (.324, 18 HR, 99 RBI) and DH **Ian Gac** (.310, 19 HR, 60 RBI) accomplished the feat in 2008. **Franklin and Ramirez were also named Clinton’s Players of the Year by the Seattle Mariners at the end of the year.**

Keeping Up with Jones: Right-fielder **James Jones** was named the **Offensive Player of the Postseason for the Midwest League** thanks to a .356 average, a league playoff-best three homers and nine steals in 10 attempts in 11 games...he also ranked first in total hits (16), second in extra-base hits (5) and second in runs scored (9). Seattle's fourth-round pick out of Long Island University in 2009, Jones hit .269 (132-for-491) with 24 doubles, a team-high 10 triples, 12 HR, 87 runs scored, 65 RBI and 24 steals in 34 attempts during the regular-season for the Kings. His best work came following the All-Star Break...after hitting .205 (45-for-220) at the season's midway point, Jones compiled a .321 average in the second half (87-for-271), including 15 doubles, six triples, six HR, 51 runs scored and 40 RBI. He also finished atop the club in walks (62).

My Sluggin' Vinnie: OF/INF **Vinnie Catricala** went 2-for-4 with his team-leading 41st double and 79th RBI on 9/5 in Burlington, his team-best 41st multi-hit game this season. Clinton's only winner of a MWL Offensive Player of the Week award in 2010 (.467, 5 doubles, 2 HR, 10 RBI during the week ending 9/30), Catricala saw his 31-game on-base streak snapped on 9/3 vs. Beloit...the on-base streak was tied for the fifth-longest in the league this season...he hit .426 (52-for-122) with 13 doubles, seven HR and 27 RBI during the stretch. Seattle's 10th round pick out of the University of Hawaii in 2009, Catricala finished amongst MWL leaders in runs scored (3rd with 90), OPS (4th at .874), extra-base hits (4th with 37), total bases (5th with 242), RBI (T-7th with 79), slugging percentage (7th at .488), on-base percentage (10th at .386) and average (12th at .302).

Clutch Arms: The late-season additions of right-handers **Yoervis Medina** and **Tom Wilhelmson** proved to be pivotal to Clinton's success down the stretch of 2010. The two hurlers came up from short-A Everett (Medina by way of triple-A Tacoma after one spot start) and combined to go 11-1 in 13 games, 12 starts for the LumberKings. Medina went 5-0 with a 2.50 ERA (10 ER in 36.0 IP), walked just 12 and struck out 42 over six starts...he limited MWL opponents to a .221 average. Wilhelmson, returning to professional baseball after a six-season hiatus (drafted by Milwaukee in the 7th round in 2002, went 5-5, 2.76 and was a MWL All-Star in 2003 with Beloit), went 6-1 with a 2.23 ERA (11 ER in 44.1 IP) in seven games, six starts...**he won back-to-back MWL Pitcher of the Week awards** (8/2-8/9, 8/9-8/16) and pitched 6.2 innings of perfect baseball on 8/12 vs. Burlington, finishing with one hit over 7.0 IP and 6 strikeouts in a 3-0 victory.

Hey, Mickey: 1B/DH **Mickey Wiswall** joined the LumberKings in early August and was the lone position player from the 2010 June draft to reach Clinton (7th round out of Boston College). He proceeded to hit .301 with 14 doubles, four HR and 18 RBI in just 33 games during the regular-season, but enjoyed his greatest success in the playoffs. Wiswall hit in a team-best nine-straight postseason games from 9/9 to 9/19. The Stoneham, Mass native hit .273 (12-for-44) with four doubles, two HR and five RBI in the playoffs, ranking first in the MWL in doubles and extra-base hits (6).

Forecast Calls for Snow: Right-hander **Forrest Snow** took over the role of closer late in the season and was impressive. Seattle's 36th round pick out of the University of Washington in 2010, Snow went a combined 0-1 with a 0.59 ERA (3 ER in 45.1 IP) over his 25 relief appearances between short-A Everett (0-0, 0.00, 3 saves) and Clinton (0-1, 1.35, 6 saves) in 2010. In the playoffs, the Seattle native went 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER in 7.1 IP), a save, two walks, 12 strikeouts and a .172 opponent average.

Nice-Cerione: Center-fielder **Matt Cerione** ended a tremendous second half by **reaching base in his final 35 games, the third-longest on-base streak in the Midwest League this season...** he hit .390 (41-for-105) with 10 doubles, 9 HR, 32 runs scored and 26 RBI during streak. Seattle's 13th round pick out of Georgia in 2009, Cerione hit .383 (36-for-94) in the second half, including nine doubles, eight HR and 25 RBI...that raised his average from .238 to .287. Cerione hit just .159 (7-for-44) in the playoffs.

Cardiac Kings: The LumberKings won 15 times in their last at-bat during the regular-season including six times in walk-off fashion. **Kalian Sams** twice lifted walk-off home runs at Alliant Energy Field, sending Peoria to a 5-4 defeat with a 9th inning blast on 4/9 and capping a career-best three-homer night with a solo clout to center in the bottom of the 11th on 4/16 vs. Quad Cities (an 11-10 win)...he'd also deliver a walk-off single in the 9th of a 3-2 win over Wisconsin on 6/17. **Nick Franklin** hit a walk-off shot of his own to beat Burlington 4-3 on 4/20 and downed Cedar Rapids with a 10th-inning walk-off double on 5/16 in another 4-3 win. Dennis Raben (4/24 vs. Kane County), Vinnie Catricala (5/2 @ Peoria, 8/4 @ Quad Cities), Gabriel Noriega (5/23 vs. Kane County), Daniel Carroll (5/27 vs. Burlington), Hawkins Gebbers (5/29 @ Kane County), Brandon Bantz (7/4 @ Peoria), James Jones (7/8 vs. Quad Cities) and Matt Cerione (9/2 vs. Beloit) all had game-winning RBI in last at-bat wins this year. Clinton won once in walk-off fashion in the playoffs, downing Lake County 8-7 in 18 innings on 9/16...**Mario Martinez's** sharp ground ball went through the legs of third-baseman Adam Abraham to score **Blake Ochoa** from second base in the longest-ever MWLCS game.

Four Kings Participate in All-Star Game at Fort Wayne: Starting designated-hitter **Vinnie Catricala**, reserve shortstop **Nick Franklin**, left-hander **Brian Moran** and right-hander **Erasmio Ramirez** all suited up for the West Division All-Stars on Tuesday, June 22, representing Clinton in the 2010 Midwest League All-Star Game at Parkview Field in Fort Wayne, Indiana. Catricala hit seventh in manager **Jim Gabella's** lineup and went 0-for-2 with a pair of strikeouts, while Franklin went 1-for-2 with an infield single and a strikeout after entering half-way through the game to hit leadoff. Ramirez came on in the midst of a two-on, two-out jam in the second inning and stranded both baserunners, getting Fort Wayne's own **Nate Freiman** to fly out to center...he then went on to fire a scoreless third inning including a strikeout of Lake County's **Chun Chen**. Moran came on in the seventh and allowed a run as Lake County's **Bo Greenwell** singled and scored on a fielder's choice by Great Lakes' **Rafael Ynoa**. The East went on to win, 6-2 thanks to a 1-for-2 performance by "Star of Stars" **Jerry Sands** of the Great Lakes Loons...he blasted a two-run HR in the first inning.

See You Next Year: The LumberKings open the 2011 season, the 75th in Clinton baseball history on Thursday, April 7 as they host Burlington at Alliant Energy Field.

COACH BIOS

Manager **John Tamargo** guided the LumberKings to a 74-65 overall record in his first managerial post in the Midwest League, tied for the second-highest win total ever posted by a LumberKings club (since the name change in 1994)...only **Mike Micucci's** 2008 LumberKings had a higher win total, finishing with the league's best record of 78-59. Tamargo's Kings finished with the third-best record in the West Division, marking the ninth time in his 18-year managerial career that his club has finished third or higher. The trip to the Midwest League Championship Series was Clinton's first since 1993 and the first time a Seattle Mariners' affiliate has reached the final round since the 2005 Wisconsin Timber Rattlers...it was also Tamargo's first trip to a league finals since 2007 when he led the Brevard County Manatees to the Florida State League Championship Series, losing 3-1 in a best-of-five to the Clearwater Threshers. "JT" finished his 19th season as a Minor League manager with a 1,163-1,025 record, giving him a career winning percentage of .531. The biggest personal highlight for Tamargo came on 7/24 when he managed against his son, **John Tamargo Jr.** in a battle against the Lansing Lugnuts at Cooley Law School Stadium...JT Jr.'s Lugnuts prevailed with a 12-7 win in his final action as interim manager.

Hitting Coach **Terry Pollreis** enjoyed great success in his first season with Clinton as his offense finished atop the league in home runs (134), third in total bases (1,912) and slugging percentage (.414) and fifth in runs scored (700) and RBI (628). Despite a league-high 1,272 strikeouts, Pollreis's offense finished seventh amongst the 16 Midwest League teams in team average, hitting a collective .259. "Polls" also helped continue the development of prospects like **Nick Franklin**, **James Jones**, **Vinnie Catricala** and **Matt Cerione**, all part of one of the most exciting crops to come through Clinton in years.

Pitching Coach **Dwight Bernard** handled a young Clinton staff after four previous seasons at triple-A Tacoma and his experience shined through. Under his tutelage, the LumberKings finished second in the Midwest League in ERA with a 3.66 ERA, the second-straight season the Clinton staff has ranked within the top two in ERA (finished first with a 3.35 ERA in 2009). Bernard helped develop young arms like post-season All-Star and LumberKings' Pitcher of the Year **Erasmio Ramirez** and fellow mid-season All-Star lefty **Brian Moran**...by season's end, three of his pitchers would reach the double-A West Tenn Diamond Jaxx including Moran and left-handers **Anthony Vasquez** and **Jimmy Gillheaney**. Gillheaney finished the season second in the league in ERA (2.83), while Ramirez ranked fifth with a 2.97 mark. Right-hander **Taylor Stanton** was one of four pitchers tied for the league wins lead with 12.
