Today's Game at a Glance

Last night's 7-2 win over the New Hampshire Fisher Cats not only broke the team's seven-game losing streak and clinched the season series with New Hampshire, but it kept the Thunder alive in the Eastern League playoff race. Now, the Thunder have a chance to salvage a split in the four-game series tonight at Waterfront Park in the final home game of the 2011 season. Accompanied with losses by New Britain and Reading last night, the Thunder enter play on Thursday night 3.5 games back of the Wild Card spot with six games to go and an elimination number of three.

LHP Shaeffer Hall gets the ball for what will likely be his final regular season start in the 2011 season. The lefty from Lee's Summit, MO enters the outing tied for Craig Heyer for the team in lead in starts (23) and wins (10). Hall last worked on Friday against New Britain when he received a no decision, allowing just one run in 6.2 innings. In four appearances against the Fisher Cats this season, Hall is 1-1 with a save.

RHP Dustin McGowan will appear on a Major League rehab and start against the Thunder tonight at Waterfront Park. The 29-year-old righty has not pitched in the Majors since 2008 when he went 6-7, 4.37 with the Blue Jays. The 33rd-overall pick in the 2000 Draft is a career 20-22 with a 4.71 ERA in the Big Leagues, all with Toronto. In four starts with New Hampshire this year, McGowan has fared 0-2 with a 3.38 ERA.

On Deck

After the season's final home game on Thursday night, the team will head to New Britain, CT to take on the Rock Cats in a pivotal five-game series. The Thunder are currently in a stretch of playing the final 15 games of the season with New Hampshire and New Britain.

Garrison's Gritty Win Keeps Thunder Alive

(Trenton, NJ) - Austin Krum drove in three runs and the rehabbing Ramiro Pena drove in another to lead the Trenton Thunder (65-70) past the first-place New Hampshire Fisher Cats (73-64) 7-2 on Monday night at Waterfront Park. The Thunder offense used a pair of three-run innings to back Steve Garrison, who threw 5.2 strong frames to grab his fourth win of the season. The win in the third game of the four-game set breaks a seven-game losing streak for the Thunder and keeps the team's faint playoff hope alive in the Eastern League Eastern Division.

Mini Bolts...

ERRONEOUS PLAY: The Thunder broke their seven-game winning streak on Wednesday night when the team did not commit an error in a 7-2 win. In the team's seven-game losing streak, Trenton committed 16 errors to move into first place in the Eastern League with 153 errors. New Hampshire has committed the fewest errors in the league: 89.

UNCHARTED TERRITORY: The Thunder are in severe danger of missing the Eastern League playoffs for just the second time in seven years. After making the playoffs just three times ('95, '96, '99) in the first 11 seasons in Trenton, the Thunder qualified for the postseason in 2005, 2006, 2007, 2008, and 2010, winning the E.L. title in '07 and '08.

A "SERIOUS" DROUGHT: New Hampshire's win Tuesday night clinched the tenth straight series that the Thunder have failed to win. The Thunder are just 8-21 in the stretch that dates back to a three-game sweep over the Akron Aeros at Canal Park on July 25-27.

THE SUB-.500 CLUB: Entering Tuesday's action at six below the .500 mark, the Thunder could become just the fourth Eastern League team since 1980 to appear in the postseason with a sub-.500 record. The '86 Glens Falls Tigers (67-71) and the '89 Reading Phillies (68-71) both appeared in the postseason. Most recently, the '07 Portland Sea Dogs won a one game playoff with New Hampshire to make the playoffs after finishing the regular season 70-72.

LEADER OF THE PACK: Tony Franklin returns to Trenton for his fifth season as the leader of the Thunder. In his four previous seasons, Franklin has won two Eastern League titles and has compiled a 327-250 record, making him the most successful manager in Thunder history.
