BLUE ROCKS BREAKDOWN

HOME: 38-29 | AWAY: 27-43 | STREAK: W 2 | LAST 5: 2-3 | LAST 10: 6-4

SERIES SUCCESS: The Blue Rocks never trailed on Sunday as they cruised to a 4-1 win over the Frederick Keys, guaranteeing a series victory. This afternoon, the Blue Rocks bid for their first sweep of Frederick in a three-game set in over four years. It last occurred from June 21-23, 2007, also at Frawley Stadium.

SCARY SCENE: Sunday's scariest moment came on **Tim Ferguson's** solo home run in the eighth. On a high fly ball toward the Frederick bullpen in left, Keys' outfielder Kipp Schutz backpedaled to the fence and made a leaping attempt to rob Ferguson of the dinger. Schutz's jump carried him over the four-foot wall and he fell in a prone position into the Frederick bullpen. Keys manager Orlando Gomez said after the game that Schutz slammed his head against the ground and that he thought his player would be okay. The outfielder was taken off the field on a stretcher and was transported to the hospital as a precaution.

MIGHTY MELVILLE: After leading the 2010 squad with 12 losses, **Tim Melville (11-10)** tossed a season-high-tying seven innings to become the first Wilmington starter with 11 wins since 2007. That year **Julio Pimentel** won a dozen contests while the Carolina League Pitcher of the Year and eventual 2010 Moniker Madness champion **Rowdy Hardy** set the franchise's single-season record with 15 victories. Melville struck out six and allowed just one run.

COMING THROUGH IN THE CLUTCH: The Blue Crew succeeded with men in scoring position for the first time on the homestand. The team entered Sunday 7-for-41 (.171) in such situations through the prior four games, leaving 35 men on the bases. Yesterday's win saw the team go 4-for-12 with men at second and/or third, leaving just seven men on in the process. Three of the team's four runs came on two-out hits.

MR. AUGUST: **Carlo Testa** has picked up in September right where he left off in August. Last month the outfielder hit .378 with three doubles, five of his seven home runs and 14 RBIs, Yesterday he doubled twice in a 3-for-4 effort. His 32 multi-hit showings on the season rank second on the squad. The reigning Carolina League Player of the Week has reached base safely via hit and/or walk in 42 of his last 44 games. He enters this afternoon on an 11-game hitting streak, connecting at a .442 clip (19-for-43) over that time with three doubles, three homers, nine RBIs and eight runs scored. His hot hitting has lifted his season-long contact clip to .293, good for second in the CL, while his .365 OBP is tied for third.

DOWNWARD SPIRAL: **Nick Van Stratten** went 0-for-4 with two strikeouts in the win. Over his last seven games, he has hit just .143 (3-for-21) with six whiffs. The cold spell has dropped his season-long batting average by 19 points (.289-.270).

IT FEELS LIKE THE FIRST TIME: Serving as the Blue Crew's designated hitter for the fifth time on the season, **Deivy Batista** notched his first hit in that role. His single, which drove in a run in the fourth, makes him 1-for-20 as the DH.

BREAKING THROUGH: **Joey Lewis'** run-scoring single in the fourth ended an 0-for-20 drought at the plate for the infielder. He added a double in the sixth as he finished the afternoon 2-for-4.

LOOK OUT BELOW: For the second consecutive day, the bottom of the order came through for the Blue Crew. Wilmington's seven, eight and nine-hole hitters went 7-for-12 in Saturday's win. On Sunday the trio of **Adrian Morales**, **Joey Lewis** and **Deivy Batista** combined to go 4-for-11 with two RBIs and a run scored.

WE'RE NO. 3!: With a Wilmington win and a Lynchburg loss at home against Winston-Salem, the Blue Rocks would finish the second half out of the CL North's cellar. The Hillcats own a half-game advantage on the Blue Crew in the standings. **Brian Rupp's** bunch has sat in fourth place every day since an 11-0 loss at Winston-Salem on Aug. 4. The team is guaranteed of finishing sixth among all eight Carolina League clubs in the full-season standings.

ON THE MARKS: Former Univ. of Louisville star **Justin Marks** got the nod in the 2011 home opener vs. POT (6.0 IP, 7H, 4R, 2BB, 5K, 1HR). The 2009 Big East Pitcher of the Year has had multiple dominant nods since including at KIN on May 31 (8.0 IP, 2H, 1R, 2BB, 7K) and a career-best 12K vs. W-S on June 18. A third-round pick by Oakland in '09, he came to K.C. in the Nov. trade of former Rock **David DeJesus**. He comes off a solid start vs. MB on Wed. (6.0 IP, 5H, 0R, 2BB, 2K - ND). In Aug. - 6GS, 2-0, 2.45 ERA.

Nate Moreau burst into the CL on June 30, 2010. Prepping the night before to start for Low-A Delmarva, he got the call for his Adv.-A debut instead. All he did was toss a no-no at SAL (9.0 IP, 0H, 0R, 0BB, 6K). He lost a perfecto in the sixth on his own error. An 11th-rounder out of the Univ. of Georgia, he played college ball with WIL's **Joey Lewis** who caught him in Athens. He ranks among the CL's best in wins (T-2nd), but went 0-3 in 4GS (6.85 ERA) after beating WIL on July 15. The skid stalled vs. WIL on Aug. 15 (6.0 IP, 5H, 0R, 0BB, 6K - Win). Career vs. WIL - 6GS, 4-1, 2.41 ERA.

They're The Frederick Keys

FIRST-HALF CHAMPS: The Keys dropped a walk-off rubber match at Frawley Stadium on May 25. Thereafter, the first-place Blue Rocks dropped 11 of 13 while the second-place Keys won 13 of 14 to grab the division lead en route to the first-half title and a playoff spot. Frederick won a league-best 41 games in the first half despite ending the stanza on a four-game skid. The Keys have won 13 of the 17 clashes with Wilmington in 2011, including nine of the 10 at Harry Grove. After starting August 2-6, the Keys have gone 13-12 (.520).

LEADERBOARD: **Steve Bumbry** ranks 6th in OBP (.364) thanks to the 5th-most walks (67) in the CL. The first cousin of former Rock **Mario Santiago**, **Miguel Abreu** is T-4th in steals (31) and 3rd in TPA/K ratio (9.97). The team trails only Winston-Salem in homers (101) and leads the loop in team ERA (3.21).

CALLING THE SHOTS: Frederick manager **Orlando Gomez** led the club to a division-best 72-68 overall record in 2010. That included a runaway first-half crown at 41-29, 9.0 games better than second-place Wilmington. That half title clinched Frederick's first playoff trip since 2007. A product of Juan Diaz, Puerto Rico, Gomez is the 18th manager in the team history. He played 13 minor league seasons in the New York Yankees and Oakland A's systems. His first managerial job came in 1977 with Medicine Hat in the Pioneer League.

EXAMINING THE KEYS

LIKE FATHER LIKE SON?: In the Bumbry family, getting drafted by the Baltimore Orioles is just par for the course. Al Bumbry was selected by the O's in the 11th round of the 1968 draft, and 31 years later his son Steve was picked in the 12th round by the same organization. The younger Bumbry can only hope his career is as successful as that of his father. "Al was named the American League Rookie of the Year in 1973 and spent 14 years in the big leagues, 13 with the Orioles. Bumbry ranks second all-time among Baltimore base stealers behind Brady Anderson and is widely considered the fastest player in Orioles history. Steve was not born until two years after his father retired as a player, but that did not keep him from taking advantage of his dad's connections. Bumbry is a baseball lifer, learning the game not only from his father, but his father's co-workers as well. After retiring as a player, Al worked as a coach and roving instructor for the Red Sox, Orioles and Indians. As a kid Steve got batting tips in the cage from Manny Ramirez and played video games with C.C. Sabathia. Mostly he just soaked up as much knowledge as he could. It has seemed to work, as his father described to the *Roanoke Times* during his final year at Virginia Tech how his son had developed faster than he did. "He's about 5-10. I'm 5-8," Al Bumbry said. "He's a lot more developed than I was at his age, and he's a lot stronger than I was at his age. People ask me all the time, 'Does he run like you?' And I say, 'No he doesn't run as fast as I did, but at his age, he's further along in other aspects of his game than myself.'" Not bad praise from someone who knows a little something about baseball.

FLACCO FAMILY PRIDE: It is a last name that is incredibly familiar to First State sports fans. Mike Flacco's brother, Joe, helped lead the University of Delaware football team to the national championship game in 2007, and then became the first Hen ever to get drafted in the first round the following April. Flacco has since led the Ravens to three playoff appearances in as many years in the NFL. His younger brother is trying to have the same type of meteoric rise that Joe enjoyed. The Orioles selected the younger Flacco in the 31st round of the 2009 draft and he began his professional career with the Bluefield Orioles as unheralded rookie later that year. He enjoyed a strong finish to his first season, batting .324 with nine extra-base hits in the month of August. That led him to opening 2010 in Aberdeen before getting the call to finish the campaign with the Low-A Delmarva Shorebirds. That is where Flacco began this season, but after driving in 41 runs in 72 games he received a promotion to Frederick, where he has continued to produce at the plate. His older brother came to see his second Advanced-A game at Frawley Stadium in July.

MACHADO AND SCHOOP HIT THE BIG STAGE: Manny Machado and Jonathan Schoop are two young guns on a Frederick Keys team that has been made up of mostly veterans in 2011. Schoop was promoted from Low-A Delmarva on June 5, while Machado arrived in Frederick 17 days later. Schoop is having his best season in professional baseball. He credits his success to Delmarva hitting coach Jose Hernandez, who taught him a lesson many young sluggers have to learn in pro ball. Schoop no longer tries to pull every pitch and focuses instead on driving the ball to all fields. In his first full season of pro ball Machado's numbers are not as good, but the plays he can make with his athleticism more than make up for it. That potential earned Machado top-prospect billing in the Baltimore system and also provided him with a spot on the American roster in the 2011 Futures Game. It was a satisfying accomplishment for the young prodigy. "Once I got drafted in 2010, I said, 'That's my goal. I want to play in the Futures Game [in my first full season of professional baseball]," he told MLB.com. "I didn't think I was going to make it after I got injured. I bounced back from the injury. I did well for a week and a half. I'm grateful for that." Machado also got to experience what it is like to play against Schoop, who was on the world team. The duo combined to go 1-for-3 at the plate in the nationally-televised exhibition. Machado was injured the last time these two teams met at Frawley, and sat out the series finale. He did not go on the disabled list, but has struggled since. The shortstop batted just .224 in 107 at-bats during the month of August but doubled and homered when the squads met at Harry Grove Stadium from Aug. 15-17.

INJURY PLAGUED: The injury bug has been biting at the heels of Frederick Keys infielder and Lewes, DE native Tyler Townsend throughout his entire career. The first baseman was a third-round selection out of Florida International in the 2009 draft. His stock rose after an MVP performance in the Shenandoah Valley Summer Collegiate League the previous year. A lingering wrist injury limited him to just 31 games with SS-A Aberdeen after being drafted, and then a hamstring pull suffered in spring training last year proved a problem all season long. He played in just 52 games at three different levels including 19 contests with the Keys that saw him hit .284 with 10 extra-base knocks and 14 RBIs. He went to the Arizona Fall League, but lasted just one game there due to a cyst that needed to be removed from his hand. His biggest goal in 2011 is to stay healthy so he can show off his smooth left-handed stroke at the plate. Another hamstring injury just before the All-Star break sent him to the disabled list, causing him to miss the All-Star bash in Modesto. He was placed on the DL during his last trip to Frawley and did not return for more than a month from July 13-Aug. 24, before another hamstring injury.
