STORYLINES

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: ADALBERTO FLORES

Last start: September 4 vs. Midland: W, 5.0 IP, 3-R/2-ER, 5-H, 1-BB, 1-K

Flores, a 2011 Texas League Midseason All-Star, starts Game 4 of the Texas League South Divisional Series tonight from Dr Pepper Ballpark. The right-hander makes his 186th career appearance, his fourth ever start. Flores started once in 2005 at the age of 18 with the Gulf Coast League Marlins. Now 24-years-old, the Puerto Rico native has made two straight starts for the 'Riders. Flores joined the rotation when righty **Derek Hankins** was promoted to Triple-A Round Rock on August 30th. That move was made as a result of former 'Rider **Mark Hamburger's** promotion from Round Rock to Arlington.

LAST GAME

The RoughRiders could never pull ahead of the Missions as they fell in Game 3 of the Divisional Series 5-3 from Dr Pepper Ballpark Friday night. Mitch Hilligoss finished the night 3-for-5 with two RBIs while the Missions' **Cody Decker** connected on two solo home runs.

AGAINST SAN ANTONIO IN 2011

The RoughRiders and Missions met 32 times during the regular season with San Antonio winning the season-series 19-13. The 'Riders went 5-11 against the Missions in San Antonio and overall hit .240 against the club.

THE 'RIDERS BIG THREE

Tommy Mendonca, **Mike Bianucci**, and **Jonathan Greene** combined for 73 home runs and 251 runs batted in during the regular season. In the two games the 'Riders have lost to the Missions in the Divisional Series, the trio have combined to go 0-for-18 with three walks and nine strikeouts. In the one game Frisco won, the three went a combined 5-for-12 with one RBI and both runs scored.

CLOSE CONTESTS

The average margin of victory in the first three games of this series is a mere two runs. Each of the last two games have ended with the tying run either on base or at the plate.

BIANUCCI FINISHES NEAR THE TOP

In his first season in Frisco, **Mike Bianucci** finished the regular season with 30 home runs and 89 runs batted in. Both pace the team, and also finish among the best in franchise history. His home runs are the second-most in a single season (**Nate Gold**, 34, 2006), and his RBIs are the fourth most (**Chad Tracy**, 107, 2009).

70-WIN SEASON

The RoughRiders reached the 70-win mark for the eighth time in nine seasons as a franchise. The only year the 'Riders failed to win 70 or more games was in 2005 when the club went 58-82. The RoughRiders are the only team in the Texas League with 70 or more wins every year since 2006.

FRISCO FACTS ...

- San Antonio's offense has forced Frisco's pitching staff to work in this series. Through the first three games, the 'Riders have had to throw 445 pitches, or 17.1 per inning. Compare that to San Antonio, a unit that has needed only 353 pitches. This calculates to 13.1 per frame.
- In particular, Frisco's starters have labored through their outings. The trio of Robbie Ross (6IP, 1R, 107 pitches), Ben Snyder (6IP, 0R, 100 pitches) and Carlos Pimentel (4IP, 2R, 80 pitches) have ultimately been successful. They have a combined earned run average of 1.69. However, the bullpen has been taxed because the Missions have elevated the pitch counts quickly.
- Mitch Hilligoss has been the best hitter not only on the RoughRiders, but in the Texas League this postseason. Hilligoss paces all Texas Leaguers with a .385 batting average (5-for-13). The next highest batting average on the 'Riders is Renny Osuna's .250 mark.
- Offense has been tough to come by in both divisional series here in 2011. Hilligoss is one of only three men to hover above .300. San Antonio's Cody Decker (.364) and Blake Tekotte (.333) are the others.
- The Arkansas-Northwest Arkansas series, which is now 2-1 in favor of the Travs after the Naturals stayed alive with a 3-1 win last night, has only featured eight runs. Through three games, Roberto Lopez's .273 average is the best in that set.
- Low-A Hickory's season is done after a 2-0 loss at home to Greensboro last night. The Grasshoppers swept the 'Dads 2-0. High-A Myrtle Beach will face elimination tonight after losing at Kinston 7-0 Friday. Triple-A Round Rock barely avoided a sweep in a 9-8, 11-inning win over Omaha. The Storm Chasers still lead the set 2-1.

STEVE BUCHELE - MANAGER

2011 marks Buechele's second season at the helm of the RoughRiders after leading High-A Bakersfield to the playoffs in his managerial debut in 2009. Under his watch, the Blaze tallied a record of 75-65.

The Fullerton, CA native is no stranger to the Texas Rangers organization as he was drafted in the fifth round of the 1982 draft by the club. He played for three different organizations in 11 major league seasons, manning third base for the Pittsburgh Pirates and Chicago Cubs in addition to Texas. However, eight of his seasons were spent with the Rangers, with whom he set the MLB record for fielding percentage by a third baseman (.991) in 1991. No player has bested that mark since then.

Buechele finished his career with a .245 average and 137 home runs. He and his wife currently reside in Arlington, TX. A father of five, his son Garrett was drafted this year by San Francisco.



BRANT BROWN - HITTING COACH

Brown begins his third season as Frisco's hitting coach in 2011 and his fifth season within the Texas organization. He has spent the previous two seasons serving in the same capacity at Single-A Bakersfield after making his professional coaching debut in 2007.

The former big league outfielder played professionally from 1992-2000 with the Chicago (NL), Pittsburgh and Florida organizations. Brown played one season with Schaumburg in the independent Northern League before retiring in 2003. He has been an instructor for many Bakersfield area high schools and several California colleges, including LMU, Cal Poly and Fresno State. From 2003-06, he operated Bakersfield Swing, a baseball and softball instructional center.

Originally selected by Chicago-NL in the third round of the 1992 June draft, Brown compiled a career .247 average (261-1056) with 45 home runs in 424 career major league games. Brown graduated from Monache (CA) High School in 1989, where he played baseball and basketball. He was also a three-year starter at Fresno State University, where he helped lead the Bulldogs to a fifth-place finish in the 1991 College World Series. In 1992, he was first team All-Big West and a second-team All-America selection after winning the conference Triple Crown. Brown has one daughter named Hanna (10/29/03).



JEFF ANDREWS - PITCHING COACH

Andrews begins his third season as Frisco's pitching coach and is in his second stint with the Rangers organization Prior to coming back to Texas, Andrews spent the past six years in the Pittsburgh Pirates organization, most recently as pitching coach on the Pirates major league staff. His current position marks Andrews' fifth coaching stop at the Double-A level with past experience with Altoona (Pittsburgh, 3 seasons, 2003-05), Portland (Florida, 1 season, 2001), Jacksonville (Seattle, three seasons, 1992-94), and Tulsa (Texas, three seasons, 1988-90). Andrews began his professional coaching career with the Rangers' organization in '86.

A right-handed pitcher during his playing days, Andrews was originally selected by the Chicago Cubs in the 26th round of the 1981 draft. He pitched two years in the Cubs farm system, compiling a 10-6 record with Geneva (1981) and Salinas (1982). Andrews is a 1977 graduate of Rapid City, South Dakota Stevens High School, where he played football and basketball. He played American Legion baseball since his high school team did not have a baseball program. He was also a pitcher on the Ohio Valley Conference Championship team as a freshman at East Tennessee State University in 1978. he led that squad to a Southern Conference title and into NCAA Regional playoffs as a junior in 1980.
