Today's Game

The Clippers will send RHP **Cole Cook** to the mound today, looking to give **Mike Sarbaugh** his 242nd win as Columbus manager (would tie him with **Rick Down** for 3rd most all-time). Toledo will counter with RHP **Brooks Brown**. Columbus is 51-46 (.526) against right handers this season. Brown is 4-1 with a 7.17ERA all-time against Columbus (8G, 37.2IP, 36H, 31R, 30ER, 16BB, 20K).

Cole Cook

Cole Cook will be making his third start of the season, second for Columbus today. Combined between Lake County, Carolina, Akron and Columbus, he is 2-4 with five saves and a 2.82ERA in 42 games (73.1IP, 68H, 35R, 23ER, 25BB, 59K).

vs. the Mud Hens

The Clippers are just 8-13 against the Hens this year, despite outscoring them 126-125. Individually against Toledo, **Tim Fedroff** has hit .343 (23x67) with 4HR and 14RBI in 21 games in his career.

And Then There Were Three

Russ Canzler was promoted to Cleveland on Saturday leaving **Matt Pagnozzi**, **Gregorio Petit** and **Cord Phelps** as the only three Clippers to remain active for every game this season. In addition to those three, **Luke Carlin** and **Lonnie Chisenhall** are the only other active Clippers from the opening day roster (eight guys are with Cleveland).

Out Like a Lamb

Today's season finale will mark the seventh straight season in which the Clippers and Mud Hens have ended with each other. The Clippers are 2-4 in the previous six games, having lost four in a row. The average time of game in each of the past six seasons is 2:15, ranging from 1:59 in 2006 to 2:30 in 2007.

Fedroff Back On

Tim Fedroff has collected a hit in 16 consecutive games (longest active streak in the IL), batting .319 (22x69) since 8/16. That comes on the heels of an 11 game stretch from 8/3-8/15 in which he hit just .152 (7x42), including .063 (1x16) over the last four games (8/11-8/15). Prior to that rare run of futility, he had hit .491 (26x53) in 13 games from 7/19-8/2.

Huge Gains For Petit

Gregorio Petit has increased his batting average 48 points to .262 over his last 52 games, batting .315 (57x181) since 7/3. In those 52 games, he has posted a .380OBP (going from .264 to .322) and slugged .456 (went from .359 to .406). He has reached base in 31 of his last 33 games (11 game streak from 7/26-8/8, 15 game streak from 8/10-8/27).

In Need of Relief

The Clipper bullpen has posted a 4.23ERA (151.0IP, 71ER) since the All-Star Break, as the relievers have given up at least 5ER in a game six times in the last 52 games (only once in the first 90 games; had a 2.99ERA, 268.1IP, 89ER). The relief corps has given up 16HR in that time (18HR prior) and allowed 22 of 59 inherited runners to score (25 of 87 prior).

Columbus Clippers Game Information

This Date in Clipper History

9/3/1987

Columbus hammered Rochester 15-3 in game two of the Governors' Cup semis. The Clipper offense pounded out 23 hits (four doubles), with **Roberto Kelly** collecting six of them and **Pete Dalena** five. Columbus swept Rochester, outscoring them 34-9, before sweeping the Tidewater Tides in the Championship (all 1-run games). The win was the franchise's fourth of nine Governors' Cups.

Close, But Not As Many Cigars

Close games have been a problem for the Clippers in 2012, as they own a 20-17 (.541) record in 1-run contests (lost nine of 11 from 5/5-6/7, won 12 of 18 from 6/8-present), but a 30-34 (.469) mark in games decided by two or less. They rank 12th in wins of two or less and their winning percentage is 9th. Last season, they were 28-14 (.667) in 1-run games, ranking 1st in the IL in both wins and winning percentage. In games decided by two or less, they were 43-22 (.662), leading the league in winning percentage and placing 2nd in wins.

Lacking Comebacks

This year the Clippers have posted a .309 winning percentage when they let the opponents score first (21-47), a steep dropoff from each of the previous two seasons, in which they turned in identical .403 marks (27-40 in 2011 and 31-46 in 2010). When scoring first, the Clippers are 53-22 (.707), leading to middle of the pack rankings in wins (4th) and percentage (6th). Last season they led the IL in both categories, going 61-16 (.792) when they plated the first run of the game.

Back to Normal

When out-hitting the opposition, the Clippers have put together a 58-13 (.817) record in 2012. That percentage is down from last season's .899 (62-7), but ahead of the percentage from 2008-10 of .767 (148-45 over those three seasons, with at least 13 losses in each). Dating back to 8/17/11 at Pawtucket, the Clippers are 63-17 (.788) in their last 80 games with more hits (64-3, .955 in previous 67 games with more hits, from 8/22/10-8/16/11).

One Man Show

The Clippers have attempted just 12 steals (7SB) in the 30 games since **Ezequiel Carrera** was recalled to Cleveland on 8/3 (accounted for 43% of the team's steals before call up, 26 of 61). He did most of the work on the basepaths for Columbus in 2011 as well, swiping a team-high 35 bags (43% of the team total), despite not playing a game after the All-Star Break (rest of team had 30SB at the time of his promotion to Cleveland on 7/14). Carrera has 72SB as a Clipper, a number that ranks 6th in franchise history (two from joining a tie for 4th place). He has been successful on 84% of his chances with Columbus (caught 14 times, five were the result of pickoffs), including snatching 24 straight, from 6/16/11-4/21/12.

Power Brokers

Through 143 games, the Clippers rank 1st in HR (150) as they attempt to lead the International League in long balls for the second year in a row (never been done in franchise history). So far, 21 of 29 Clippers have hit one out, with **Russ Canzler** leading the way (21HR, ranks 6th in the IL). Last season, they sat atop the league (152HR) for the first time since 1992 and the sixth time since their inception in 1977. Columbus had 24 different players (out of 31) homer last season with six collecting at least a dozen (only **Jerad Head** cracked the top 15 in the league, 24HR tied for 3rd).

Strikeout City

After a year in which the Columbus pitching staff set the club record for strikeouts in a season (1,142), the 2012 version is looking to break that record. Currently, the Clippers rank 10th in the IL with 1,034K in 143 games, putting them on pace for 1,041. **Corey Kluber** ranks 6th in the league individually (128K in 125.1IP), after placing 3rd in 2011 with 143K (7th highest total in Clipper history). Prior to the 2001 season, no Clipper staff had ever struck out more than 1,000 batters in a season, but in the past 11 years, they have accomplished the feat four times (2001, 2008, 2010 and 2011).

Three-Peat

For the third consecutive year, the Clippers won the International League Shutout Survivor Contest, as they were the last team to get blanked this season (54th game, 6/2 at Rochester). That ended a streak of 97 straight games with a run, dating to 7/30/11 (including 2011 postseason). In 2011, the Clippers did not get shutout until the team's 58th game and in 2010 it came in game #45.

Unloading the Bases

The Clippers rank 1st in the IL when it comes to driving in runs with the bases loaded (122) and are 3rd in batting average in such situations (.339, 43x127). In each of the last two championship seasons, the Clippers have been amazing with the bases full, leading the IL in RBI both times (139 in 2011, 142 in 2010). Last year they hit six grand slams (2nd in the IL), to compensate for a .298 (45x151) average (5th). In 2010, they did it with the IL's best average, .354 (51x144), hitting only two grand slams.

Launching Pad

Balls flew out of Huntington Park at a record pace in 2012, as the Clippers' home park saw 179HR through 71 games (old record was 177 in 2011). That averages out to an IL-high, 2.52HR per game, as Huntington Park led the league for a second consecutive season (2.46, 177HR in 2011; 100HR for Columbus). In each of Huntington Park's first two seasons, it ranked 2nd in HR per game (2.40, 173HR in 2010 and 1.83, 130HR in 2009).

International Accolades

Mike Sarbaugh became the first-ever manager to skipper the IL All-Star Team two years in a row when he took the field in Buffalo on 7/11 (lost, 3-0). He was joined on the team by **Russ Canzler**, **Matt LaPorta** and **Cord Phelps**. LaPorta, the IL's leading vote getter for the All-Star Game, was the first recipient of a weekly award from the league, getting named Player of the Week for 4/23-4/29. Canzler added a second POW for Columbus for the week of 6/11-6/17, **Ezequiel Carrera** was honored for 7/23-7/29, **Cord Phelps** won for 8/13-8/19 and **Jeanmar Gomez** earned the first Pitcher of the Week this season, taking home the honor for 7/9-7/15.

Manager Profile

Mike Sarbaugh is managing the Clippers for a third straight season in 2012, becoming the first person to manage the Clippers for three consecutive seasons since **Bucky Dent** from 2003-05 (had four skippers in the four years between Dent and Sarbaugh). As the manager for Columbus, he has compiled a 241-190 (.559) record, while going 14-3 (.824) in the postseason. The 2011 IL Manager of the Year (2nd in franchise history, **Joe Altobelli** in 1980), Sarbaugh ranks 4th on the all-time Columbus list for wins (**Rick Down** is 3rd with 242). He has finished above .500 in each of his eight seasons, going 696-511 (.577), while making the playoffs seven times, posting a 34-10 (.773) record and winning five league championships (New York-Penn '04, Carolina '06, Eastern '09 and International '10 & '11).
