2012 GWINNETT BRAVES FINAL REPORT

(62-82, 4th in IL South, 21.0 GB / 12th Overall in International League)

About 2012: The Gwinnett Braves, behind fourth-year manager **Dave Brundage**, fourth-year hitting coach **Jamie Dismuke**, second-year pitching coach **Marty Reed**, trainer **Mike Graus** and strength and conditioning coordinator **Matt Parvis**, finished 62-82 in 2012, the franchise's fourth season of play. That record qualified for fourth in the International League's South Division and 12th overall among the 14 IL

teams. The G-Braves held the IL South's first place spot for 55-straight days (4/12 to 6/4) and second place for 20-straight days (6/5 to 6/23), but fell to either third or fourth for the remainder of the season (6/24 to 9/3). The 2012 season marked Gwinnett's first losing campaign since the franchise moved to Lawrenceville in 2009 and the third-straight year without an IL Playoff berth.

Mejia Makes Rookie History: **Ernesto Mejia** was named the **International League's Rookie of the Year and the league's Postseason All-Star at first base on 8/28**. He joins **Freddie Freeman** (2010) and **Julio Teheran** (2011) as G-Braves to win the Rookie of the Year award in the franchise's four-year history, marking the first time one team has had three-straight IL Rookie of the Year winners since Columbus (1984-1986). Mejia finished atop the IL in RBI (92), hits (152), total bases (258) and at-bats (514) while ranking among leaders in slugging percentage (3rd, .502), extra-base hits (3rd, 57), home runs (T-3rd, 24), games (T-3rd, 133), runs scored (5th, 73), doubles (6th, 32), OPS (6th, .849) and batting average (9th, .296). He broke **Stefan Gartrell's** single-season Gwinnett record for RBI (91 in 2011), but fell one homer short of matching Gartrell's single-season record (25 in 2011)...Mejia fell two hits shy of matching **Mauro Gomez's** G-Braves' record 154 hits (2011) and three doubles shy of **Freddie Freeman's** G-Braves' record 35 doubles (2010). Mejia was named the club's Most Valuable Player on 8/30.

Constanza Claims IL Batting Title: **Jose Constanza** hit .314 (108-for-344) in 88 games for Gwinnett this season, capturing the International League Batting Title by four points over IL MVP **Mauro Gomez** of Pawtucket (.310). Constanza is the second G-Brave to win a Batting Title, joining **Barbaro Canizares** (.341 in 2010). The speedy outfielder vaulted to the top of the league in hitting thanks to a **Gwinnett franchise record 22-game hitting streak** (6/22 to 7/19) and an **IL-best 38-game on-base streak** (6/20 to 8/21)...he hit .396 (38-for-96) on the hitting streak, the longest in the IL since **Brandon Watson's** league record 43-game streak with Columbus in 2007. Constanza hit .346 (53-for-153) with a .416 on-base percentage during his 38-game on-base streak, the IL's longest since 2009 and the second longest in club history (**Wes Timmons**, 48-game streak, 2009). The 29-year-old Constanza also posted a .380 on-base percentage (4th in IL) and was named the club's "Most Competitive Player" on 8/30.

Geared for Success: Right-hander **Cory Gearrin** was named the club's Most Outstanding Pitcher on 8/30, becoming the first reliever to do so since **Stephen Marek** and **Craig Kimbrel** split the award in 2010. Gearrin finished 3-3 with a 2.30 ERA (14 ER in 54.2 IP) and a team-high nine saves in 10 opportunities across 39 relief appearances for Gwinnett in 2012. Until allowing six earned runs over his final two outings, **he posted a bullpen-best 1.34 ERA over his first 37 outings**. He ended the season on a seven-game saves streak, having converted every save chance since 5/20. IL opponents hit just .215 (43-for-200) against Gearrin in 2012...he walked 22 while striking out 66 and did not allow a single home run in the IL.

Need for Speed: **Luis Durango** stole 46 bases in 62 attempts (74.2% success rate) in 2012, breaking **Matt Young's** Gwinnett franchise record for steals (39 in 2010) and **leading all of affiliated Triple-A Baseball in thefts**. He stole multiple bases in a game eight times on the year, including a season-high three steals on 5/9 vs. Buffalo. In addition to success on the basepaths, Durango was often successful at the plate...he finished among IL leaders sacrifice hits (1st, 14), hits (2nd, 144), at-bats (4th, 499), games (T-5th, 132) and triples (T-9th, 5). **Felix Pie** legged out a Gwinnett single-season record seven triples (T-3rd in the IL), surpassing **Reid Gorecki's** six triples in 2009...Pie was also a perfect 16-for-16 in stolen base attempts, ranking second on the team in steals. **Gwinnett finished second in the IL in team steals** (141 in 190 attempts, 74.2% success rate), trailing only Toledo (154 steals in 210 attempts, 73.3% success rate)...the club's **29 triples finished tied for second in the IL**, trailing only Indianapolis (44).

Gartrell Named "Fan Favorite": Second-year G-Braves' slugger **Stefan Gartrell** earned the club's "Fan Favorite" award on 8/30. An IL Postseason All-Star for Gwinnett a year ago, Gartrell hit .251 (105-for-418) with 22 doubles, 20 home runs, 67 runs scored, 55 RBI and a .787 OPS in 122 games this season. He reached the 20-homer plateau for the fourth-straight year, launching nine blasts over the final two months. His best month was easily May, **when he was named the Topps IL Player of the Month** after hitting .333 (35-for-105) with six doubles, 10 home runs, 23 runs scored, 23 RBI and a 1.102 OPS.

Getting the Call: Seven Gwinnett players received September call-ups to Atlanta this season, including catcher **J.C. Boscan** and outfielder **Jose Constanza** (recalled on 9/1), right-hander **Peter Moylan** and first baseman **Lyle Overbay** (contracts purchased on 9/1), right-hander **Randall Delgado** (recalled on 9/3) and right-handers **Cory Gearrin** and **Julio Teheran** (recalled on 9/4). All but Moylan and Overbay had already played in Atlanta this year.

Young Guns: The Gwinnett starting rotation featured **three of the top five prospects in the Atlanta Braves' system as ranked by Baseball America**, all were under the age of 23. Right-handers **Julio Teheran** (No. 1) and **Randall Delgado** (No. 3) and left-hander **Sean Gilmartin** (No. 5) all made impacts at different times during the season. Teheran, the 2011 International League Rookie of the Year and Most Valuable Pitcher, made 26 starts in an inconsistent season for the G-Braves...after going an IL-best 15-3 with a 2.55 ERA en route to the Braves' Pitcher of the Year award last year, the 21-year-old Teheran went 7-9 with a 5.08 ERA (74 ER in 131.0 IP). He did have several bright spots, including his **first career complete game on 6/3 at Charlotte** (9.0 IP, 7 H, 1 ER, 6 K in 5-1 win) and two season-high nine strikeout performances among his last four starts, 8/14 at Norfolk (8.0 IP, 5 H, 1 ER, 9 K in 3-1 win) and 8/25 vs. Syracuse (8.0 IP, 2 H, 1 ER, 9 K in 1-0 loss). Delgado was optioned to Gwinnett by Atlanta on 7/15 and went 4-3 with a 4.06 ERA (20 ER in 44.1 IP) in eight starts. The 22-year-old's best outings included a **10-strikeout game** (most by a G-Brave in 2012) on 7/31 at Charlotte (6.0 IP, 5 H, 1 ER in 7-2 win) and a complete-game loss on 8/30 vs. Pawtucket (7.0 IP, 7 H, 1 ER, 5 K), his first CG since 6/30/11 with Double-A Mississippi. Gilmartin, Atlanta's first-round pick in 2011 out of Florida State University, was called to Gwinnett on 7/27 after going 5-8 with a 3.54 ERA in 20 starts for Double-A Mississippi. The 22-year-old went 1-2 with a 4.78 ERA (20 ER in 37.2 IP) in seven starts, **earning his first career Triple-A victory on 8/11 vs. Louisville** (6.2 IP, 7 H, 2 ER in 8-2 win).

Don't Mess with the Yohan: Left-hander **Yohan Flande** finished at or near the top of most statistical categories for Gwinnett pitchers this year, including starts (1st, 27), innings pitched (1st, 147.2 IP), ERA (1st, 4.21), strikeouts (1st, 106), quality starts (1st, 11) and wins (T-2nd, 6). **Flande went 1-0 with an IL-best 0.91 ERA (2 ER in 20.0 IP) over five outings, four starts in April**, including the longest scoreless streak posted by a G-Brave this season...he did not allow a run of any kind over 18.2 IP from 4/9 to 4/27, seeing the streak end with two ER over 4.1 IP in a no-decision at Toledo. **Of Gwinnett's nine shutout wins this year, Flande started four times**, including a 1-0 win at Norfolk on 4/9 (no-decision, 3.0 IP, 0 H, 4 K), a 5-0 win vs. Durham on 4/14 (win, 5.0 IP, 3 H, 4 K), a 3-0 win at Charlotte on 4/20 (no-decision, 6.2 IP, 2 H, 8 K) and a 4-0 win against Lehigh Valley on 5/29 (win, 7.0 IP, 3 H, 5 K).

Best for Last: The G-Braves went **16-13 in games decided in the last at-bat** in 2012, including 9-6 in games decided in "walk-off" fashion. In all, 12 different Gwinnett hitters tallied winning RBI in the 16 last at-bat victories (see table), with **Jose Constanza** achieving the feat a team-high three times and both **Jose Yepez** and **Josh Wilson** each doing it twice. **Stefan Gartrell** and **Lance Zawadzki** provided Gwinnett's only two "walk-off" homers this season...Gartrell blasted a two-run shot to beat Buffalo in the 10th inning on 5/10, while Zawadzki lifted a three-run clout to cap a six-run ninth inning in Gwinnett's stunning 9-8 comeback win over Lehigh Valley on 5/28. Constanza's "walk-off" single on 7/3 actually occurred on 7/5 at Knights Stadium in Fort Mill, SC as the game was suspended by rain at Coolray Field and completed two days later at Charlotte's home park...thus, the G-Braves walked off in a road stadium despite the game being credited as a home victory.

Extra, Extra: Nine of the 16 last at-bat wins came in extra innings, giving Gwinnett a 9-4 record in free baseball. The G-Braves' .692 winning percentage in extra frames ranked second in the IL, trailing only Lehigh Valley (10-3, .769).

Bullpen Briefs: Including the club's Most Outstanding Pitcher **Cory Gearrin**, the Gwinnett bullpen featured many bright arms in 2012. Right-hander **Anthony Varvaro** led the bullpen in ERA with a 2.23 mark (11 ER in 44.1 IP)...he went 0-2, but converted six of eight save chances. Varvaro allowed just two ER in 11 outings from 5/15 to 7/26 and one ER over his final 13 outings from 7/31 to 9/1...he held IL opponents to a .231 average (39-for-169) and just one home run in 33 games. **Andy Russell**, a side-arming right-hander from Australia, went 1-1 with a paltry 1.75 ERA (5 ER in 25.2 IP) and two saves in four chances over 20 games...that included his first career save on 8/14 at Norfolk. Left-hander **Dusty Hughes** led the bullpen in holds with seven, going 3-2 with a 3.31 ERA (24 ER in 65.1 IP) and four saves in five chances over a team-high 54 appearances (T-2nd in IL). Hughes allowed just three ER over his final 15 outings, winning twice in that span. Veteran right-hander **Buddy Carlyle** thrived in long relief, going 5-4 with a 3.43 ERA (29 ER in 76.0 IP) in 33 games, including one start...he struck out a bullpen-best 73 batters while walking only 14, ranking second among IL relievers in fewest walks per 9.0 IP (1.50). Carlyle put together a Gwinnett bullpen-best **14.2-inning scoreless streak** from 4/6 to 4/25 before finally giving up his first earned runs in his sixth appearance.

Braves on Rehab: Six members of the Atlanta Braves' 25-man roster made rehab assignments with Gwinnett this season, including pitchers **Tommy Hanson**, **Tim Hudson**, **Jair Jurrjens**, **Anthony Varvaro** and **Johnny Venters** and shortstop **Jack Wilson**. Hudson was first, making two starts at Coolray Field on 4/18 vs. Norfolk and 4/24 vs. Charlotte...he won both outings, going 2-0 with a 0.84 ERA (1 ER in 10.2 IP) before returning to Atlanta. Varvaro pitched on MLB rehab for his first four outings before joining the regular roster on 4/25, while Jurrjens was the opposite, making 10 starts with Gwinnett from 4/29 to 6/19 before being added back to the club on MLB rehab on 8/10...Jurrjens went a combined 4-6 with a 4.98 ERA (40 ER in 72.1 IP) in 14 starts. Hanson won in his rehab outing on 8/12 vs. Louisville (5.0 IP, 3 H, 0 ER, 5 K in 5-2 win), while Venters threw just one inning on 7/20 vs. Scranton/Wilkes-Barre. Wilson played two rehab assignments with the G-Braves from 7/23 until his release on 9/1...he hit .188 with four doubles and six RBI in 19 games. Fellow Atlanta Braves **Miguel Batista**, **Randall Delgado**, **Kris Medlen**, **Lyle Overbay** and **Tyler Pastornicky** were also G-Braves for a time, but were not on rehab assignments.

Late Additions: A variety of trades and signings brought several new players to the Gwinnett offense in the final months of the season, including **Brian Friday** (trade with Pittsburgh), **Josh Kroeger** (free agent), **Rusty Ryal** (free agent) and **Terry Tiffee** (purchased from Independent Lancaster). Friday made starts at second, third and short but hit just .170 (15-for-88) in 30 games...however, both of his 2012 homers came with Gwinnett. Kroeger hit .323 (31-for-96) in 31 games, including seven doubles, two homers and 12 RBI...he put together a seven-game hitting streak from 8/13 to 8/20, batting .452 with a homer and five RBI. Ryal hit .287 (29-for-101) in 28 games with Gwinnett, including eight doubles, two homers and 12 RBI...he had a pair of four-hit games, 8/19 at Durham (4-for-6, 2 RBI) and 8/23 vs. Syracuse (4-for-5, 2 RBI). Tiffee also enjoyed offensive success, hitting .299 (35-for-117) in 34 games with nine doubles, two homers and 21 RBI...Tiffee logged a team-best five-straight multi-hit games from 7/18 to 7/28, batting .611 (11-for-18) with two homers and seven RBI.

Award Winners: **Ernesto Mejia** and **Cory Gearrin** were the lone Gwinnett representatives for the 2012 Triple-A All-Star Game in Buffalo, NY on 7/11, though Gearrin did not participate. Here's a look at all awards given to G-Braves in 2012 (as of 9/5):
