Clevinger makes rehab start: Cleveland Indians right-hander **Mike Clevinger** is starting Tuesday for Akron – his first appearance in a RubberDucks uniform since 2015, when he made 27 appearances (26 starts) and went 9-8 with a 2.73 ERA. He has been on the injured list since April 8 with a right upper back/Teres major muscle strain. Before the injury, he made two scoreless starts with 22 strikeouts, four walks and two hits in 12 innings. He made one rehab start for Triple-A Columbus last Tuesday, when he threw 58 pitches (36 strikes) over two innings, allowing four earned runs on three hits and two walks with four strikeouts.

Garcia finds a groove in Double-A: After having his 13-game hitting and 18-game on-base streaks snapped Thursday, first baseman and designated hitter **Wilson Garcia** had his first two-home run game of the season and seventh of his career on Friday to take over the Eastern League lead in RBI (44) and extra-base hits (31). In his first season with the Indians organization and first in Double-A, Garcia also leads the Eastern League with 22 doubles (league-high 11 in May), is second with 112 total bases and is tied for second with 63 hits – all of which lead Akron. He is second on the club with a .273 average and is third on the team with nine home runs, a .485 SLG, and .795 OPS. Originally signed by the Phillies in 2010, he was traded to the Orioles May 1, 2018, before the Indians acquired him in the December 2018 Rule 5 Draft.

Tom named Eastern League Player of the Month: Outfielder **Ka'ai Tom** was named on June 4 as the Eastern League's Player of the Month for May 2019, becoming the first Akron player to earn the honor since Tim Fedroff won in May 2011. Tom led the league in May with a .434 OBP, .635 SLG, and 1.069 OPS, and tied for the lead with 21 runs. He was second in hits (32) and total bases (61), and tied for second in average (.333). After hitting .177 with one home run in 23 April games, Tom hit .333 (32-for-96) with seven home runs (tied for the team high and third in the league) in 26 May games. Tom was also named Eastern League Player of the Week for May 20-26, when he went 9-for-20, with two doubles, two home runs (May 25 and 26), five runs and four RBI, with a league-best .850 SLG and 1.392 OPS. He is the first RubberDuck this season to win a weekly award. In 2018, he hit .286 in May (his highest monthly average) after hitting .183 in April.

Tom's hot stretch: Currently, outfielder **Ka'ai Tom** has a 20-game on-base streak (began May 21) that is the Eastern League's longest active streak, the longest by a RubberDuck this season, and the second-longest overall (longest was 27) in the Eastern League this season. During the streak, he is 28-for-69 (.406) with seven doubles, six home runs, 16 RBI, 16 runs and 14 walks for a .512 on-base percentage. Since May 10, he has hit safely in 24 of 28 games (38-for-99, .384 average, nine home runs, 23 runs, 20 RBI), raising his average from .191 to a team-best .282.

League leaders: Offensively, the RubberDucks lead the Eastern League in at-bats (2072), runs (274), hits (500), total bases (783), and RBI (254) and is tied for the lead in home runs (53).

Ducks host Yard Goats: The RubberDucks and Yard Goats are playing the first of two scheduled series this season, with three games at Canal Park and four at Dunkin' Donuts Park. Last season, Akron won the series, 4-3, including 2-1 at Canal Park. Hartford finished in third place in the Eastern Division, at 65-72, last season. Since 2005, Akron leads the series, 50-38, and is 10-9 against the Hartford-based club.

Sunday Recap: Curve seal series win over Ducks with finale triumph (Altoona 4, Akron 2): Altoona right-hander Pedro Vasquez (5-1) held the Akron RubberDucks to one hit in six scoreless innings, and the Curve scored three fourth-inning runs to earn a 4-2 win that clinched a series victory in the finale of a four-game set at Peoples Natural Gas Field on Sunday night. Akron has lost three straight games for the first time since May 5-7 and is at .500 for the fourth time this season (all since April 29).

First-half races: The first half will conclude with games on Tuesday, June 18, leaving Akron with seven to play. The second-place RubberDucks trail the Harrisburg Senators by seven games in the Western Division. Hartford enters the series leading the Eastern Division by one-half game over Trenton, one game over Reading and two over Binghamton. The first-place team in each division in each half qualifies for the playoffs. If the same team wins both halves, the team with the second-base overall record in the division receives the second playoff spot.

Clement's return: Infielder **Ernie Clement** had his first three-hit game of the season on Friday. After he was on the Injured List with a right adductor strain April 16-May 8, Clement has played 25 games since coming off the IL, going 29-for-95 (.305) with eight multi-hit games, four doubles, a triple, a home run, 15 runs, six RBI, 10 walks, and a .380 OBP. In six games prior to going on the IL, the Indians No. 15 (MLB.com)/No. 18 (*Baseball America*) prospect was 3-for-25 (.120).

Call begins his season: Outfielder **Alex Call** joined the RubberDucks on May 30 to begin his first season in the Indians organization. In his debut May 31, Call singled in his first at bat against Erie's Casey Mize and finished 3-for-4 with a ninth-inning solo home run. Call has begun 9-for-29 (.310) with two doubles in his first eight Eastern League games. Call was traded from the White Sox to the Indians in exchange for **Yonder Alonso** on Dec. 14. In his first Double-A time with Birmingham in 2018, Call played 67 games and hit .242 with seven home runs and 30 RBI.

Ducks winning the home run margin: The RubberDucks have hit 53 home runs – tied with Harrisburg and Hartford for the Eastern League lead – while allowing only 32 home runs – the second-fewest of any EL club – for a league-best +21 home run differential. At home, Akron has hit 20 home runs, allowing 15 (+5 differential). Of the RubberDucks' 53 home runs this season, 36 have come in 13 multi-homer games, including 13 in four straight games May 9-13. Akron's six home runs on May 11 were the most for the club since hitting seven on July 2, 2008, in a 10-6 win at Erie.

2019 RUBBERDUCKS FIELD STAFF

#24 Rouglas Odor, *Manager (First Season)* – Odor, 51, is the 18th manager in club history. He follows Tony Mansolino, who was promoted to Triple-A Columbus after guiding Akron to a 78-62 record and finish as runner-up in the 2018 Eastern League Championship Series against the New Hampshire Fisher Cats. Last season, Odor managed the Class-A Advanced Lynchburg Hillcats to their fourth consecutive postseason. After posting the Carolina League's worst first-half record of 29-38, the Hillcats rebounded to go 42-28 in the second half, claiming the Northern Division title. They fell to Potomac in the semifinals, three games to two. Odor has a 361-363 (.499) career managing record in 11 seasons.

When Odor was the RubberDucks hitting coach in 2014, he became the first person to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros, and Akron RubberDucks. He played 197 games for Canton-Akron during the 1991, 1993-94 seasons, and he was the hitting coach for the Aeros' 2012 Eastern League Championship squad.

The 2019 season is Odor's 32nd in the Cleveland organization as a player or coach (19th as a coach). The former shortstop was a 32nd-round draft pick by the Indians in 1988 and played in the minor leagues for the Indians from 1988-94 and for the Milwaukee Brewers organization in 1995. Last season was Odor's first as a manager since 2008. He managed San Felipe in the Venezuelan Summer League for two seasons in 1999-2000, the Burlington Indians for four seasons from 2001-04, the Mahoning Valley Scrappers for two seasons in 2005-06, and the Gulf Coast League Indians for two seasons in 2007-08. Since then, Odor has moved up the ranks as a hitting coach, starting with Class-A Kinston in 2009-10, Akron in 2011-12 and 2014, the High-A Carolina Mudcats in 2013, and Triple-A Columbus in 2015-17.

The Maracaibo, Venezuela, native resides in Winter Haven, Florida, with his wife, Milagros. He has three sons and is the uncle of Texas Rangers infielder Rougned Odor.

#27 Tony Arnold, *Pitching Coach (10th Season, not consecutive)* — Arnold, 59, rejoins the RubberDucks for his fifth time in Akron after spending last season with Lynchburg. In 2018, the Hillcats pitching staff finished fifth in the Carolina League with a 3.76 ERA, ranked second with 1,190 strikeouts and the 12 team shutouts ranked fourth. Arnold last was with the RubberDucks in 2016-17, helping lead the 2016 team to an Eastern League championship. He previously served in the same capacity in Akron from 1996-99, 2008, and 2011-12. Arnold's 2012 Akron Aeros staff crafted a franchise-record 3.03 ERA and went on to claim the EL championship. In 2016, Arnold became the second man to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros and Akron RubberDucks, joining Rouglas Odor in that exclusive group.

In 2015, Arnold began as the pitching coach at Lynchburg and finished at Triple-A Columbus, helping the Clippers to the International League title. A former All-American at the University of Texas, Arnold pitched in the major leagues with the Baltimore Orioles in 1986 and 1987.

#2 Justin Toole, *Hitting Coach (First Season)* — Toole, 32, spent the 2018 season as Lynchburg's hitting coach. This is fourth season coaching in the Indians' organization, serving as the hitting coach for Mahoning Valley in 2016, Lake County in 2017, and Lynchburg. Toole was signed as a minor league free agent by the Indians in 2009 and spent parts of seven seasons with Cleveland from 2009-15. He spent parts of 2010, 2012-15 with Akron, hitting .259 in 180 games, including .275 in 77 games under Odor's hitting-coach tutelage in 2014. The Council Bluffs, Iowa, native played at the University of Iowa and has authored a children's book called "9 in 9," chronicling the lessons he learned while playing all nine positions in a game for the Carolina Mudcats on Aug. 25, 2012. **Twitter: @Tooleyj24, Instagram: @tooleyj24**

#28 Juan De La Cruz, *Bench Coach (First Season)* — De La Cruz, 25, is in his second season coaching with the Indians after serving as the hitting coach for the rookie-level Arizona League Indians in 2018. Primarily a catcher in his playing days, De La Cruz was signed as a free agent by the Indians in 2009 and spent eight seasons in the system, reaching as high as Akron in 2017, when he played 12 games as a catcher and first baseman. He was a .216 career hitter in 281 games.

Bobby Ruiz, *Athletic Trainer (First Season)* — Ruiz spent the past four seasons (2015-18) with Lynchburg. This is his ninth with the Indians.

Paul Synenkyj, *Strength and Conditioning Coach (Third Season)* — Synenkyj is the lone returning field staff member from 2018. He is in his ninth season in the Indians organization. He holds degrees in physical education from Cleveland State and the University of Akron. **Twitter: @PaulSynenkyj**

On October 29, 2013, team owner **Ken Bobby** stood before a capacity audience at the Akron Civic Theater and announced that the team would be known henceforth as the **Akron RubberDucks**. In addition to being symbolic of the fun, family-friendly brand of entertainment offered by minor league baseball, the name also honors Akron's long history as the "**Rubber Capital of the World**." Brandiose Marketing of San Diego, California designed the team logo, colors, and various marks and insignias. Please note that for print coverage, *RubberDucks* is spelled as one word with a capital "D." In broadcast coverage, referring to the team as "*the Ducks*" is an acceptable variation of the team's nickname.
