### **BLUE ROCKS BREAKDOWN**

#### HOME: 30-28 | AWAY: 30-32 | STREAK: L3 | LAST 5: 1-4 | LAST 10: 4-6

BLUE ROCKS SUFFER SHUTOUT LOSS TO HILLCATS: The Wilmington Blue Rocks lost the second game of the crucial three-game series against the Lynchburg Hillcats, this time, by a score of 4-0 on Wednesday night at Frawley Stadium. Wilmington was shutout for just the ninth time this season as Lynchburg starter Sam Hentges worked six-plus innings of scoreless baseball. Lefty Daniel Tillo turned in a quality start for the Blue Rocks as well and allowed two runs in six innings of work. With the loss, the Rocks are now a game-and-a-half out of first lace. out of first place.

FIRST TIME IN A LONG TIME: Wednesday night's setback marked the first time in the second half the Blue Rocks have lost three straight games. -In the first half, the Rocks lost three or more games in a row six times. -The Blue Rocks have yet been below .500 at any point this half. (Have been at .500 mark four times. -Overall, the Blue Rocks' longest losing streak of the season is just four games which was from May 29 through lune 1

-Wilmington will also look to avoid being swept in a series for the first time since May 29-31 at home against Frederick.

**NO LONGER ON TOP:** With Tuesday's loss, the Blue Rocks find themselves looking up in the Northern Division for the first time since July 16. -The Blue Rocks held sole possession of first place in the Northern Division from July 18 through August 13, the longest stretch of the season.

-Wilmington has been hovering near the top spot of the five-team division for the majority of the second half and have been either atop of the division or out of the top spot by two games or less since July 11.

**SILENT 'O':** The Blue Crew have found themselves in another scoreless drought entering the series finale against the Hillcats. -Wilmington started the series off strong with a run in the first inning of the series opener on Tuesday. -However, the Rocks offense has been held of the scoreboard over the last 18.1 innings. -The longest scoreless drought of the season is 22 innings which was from August 5 through August 8.

**CRUCIAL SERIES AGAINST THE HILLCATS:** The three-game series between Wilmington and Lynchburg is a vital set as each team is vying for the final playoff spot in the Carolina League playoffs. -Wilmington looks to salvage the series win a win in the finale Thursday night. -The Blue Rocks trail the Hillcats by a game-and-a-half in the Northern Division. -The Blue Crew have had success against their divisional foes, winning 7 of the last 12 meetings and 14 of the first 22 games of the series.

- The Blue Crew have had success against their divisional locs, withing 7 of the fast 12 meeting of the first 22 games of the series.
-However, the Hillcats enter the series winners of their last five games and 9 of their last 12.
-Wilmington has hit .248 against Lynchburg while posting a solid 3.45 ERA during the stretch.
-Lynchburg also has hit to the tune of .254 but has a team ERA of 4.09.

HATE TO SEE JULY GO: The Blue Rocks continue to play some of their best baseball in the second half with their performance in July being a vital reason for their recent success. -Wilmington closed out the month of July with a 19-9 record which was the best record of any team in the

-The Rocks as a team hit .277, the highest batting average of any month this season and also scored more runs (155) then they did in any previous month.

Walk OR RUN THIS WAY: The Blue Rocks have led the Carolina League in walks for the majority of the season and also lead the league in stolen bases.
Wilmington has racked up 468 walks this season.
The Rocks have swiped 154 bags through 120 games this year, which paces the league.
The Blue Crew also have been stealing bases at a rapid clip in the second half and have stolen 77 bases through 50 games of the second half.
Wilmington has four different active players with double-digit stolen bases including D.J. Burt who is the active team-leader and third in the CL with 28, Blake Perkins ranks fourth in the CL with 24 between Potomac and Wilmington, Rudy Martin has 21 stolen bases on the year and Travis Jones has 14.
The Blue Crew set a new, single-game, season-high with six stolen bases Saturday night at Myrtle Beach.
Oliver Nunez stole three bases while Brewer Hicklen swiped two and Angelo Castellano stole one.
It marked the seventh time this season Wilmington has stolen at least five bases in a game this season.
Wilmington is the only team in the Carolina League to steal 20 or more bases in each month of the season.
(37 in April, 20 in May, 37 in June, 38 in July and have 21 in August)
They also have an impressive 74% success rate stealing bases this season (154 out of 210).

CAN COUNT ON CANCEL: Infielder Gabriel Cancel has been a major run producer for the Blue Rocks, especially in the second half. -Cancel has driven in 50 runs over his last 56 games and has also put together 14 multi-RBI games during the stretch and leads the team with 18 games driving in multiple runs. -He currently is the team leader, second amongst Royals' farmhands and has the most RBI amongst active rule runs with 70 cm

players in the Carolina League with 70. -Cancel drove in 26 runs in 27 games in the month of July.

**BURT PROVIDING THE HURT:** Second-year Blue Rock **D.J. Burt** is not suffering from a sophomore slump in the Carolina League and was named a Carolina League All-Star. -He is second in the CL in on-base percentage (.384), third in the Carolina League in stolen bases (28), and tied for fifth in batting average (.298) -He picked up a hit in 20 of 24 games in July to help him post a .330 batting average (31-for-94) with two homers, 18 RBI and a .404 OBP. -Ted for first on the team with 29 multi-hit games (Had 20 all of last season)

-Tied for first on the team with 29 multi-hit games. (Had 20 all of last season) -The 22-year-old has served as the Rocks' utility man this season, making 33 starts at third base, 27 at second base, 13 at shortstop and 11 in left field.

# **TONIGHT'S BLUE ROCKS STARTING PITCHER**

## #27 RHP Nolan Watson

Acquired: Drafted in the 1st round in MLB Draft in 2015 out of Lawrence North High School (IN)

Born: Indianapolis, IN Resides: Indianapolis, IN College: N/A Age: 21 (Jan 25, 1997) Ht: 6'2 Wt: 195 Bats/Throws: R/R

#### Pitch Repertoire: Fastball, Slider, Curveball and Changeup

THE BOOK ON NOLAN WATSON: Watson was the 33rd overall pick in the 2015 Draft by the Royals as Kansas City received the pick as compensation when James Shields signed with the San Diego Padres that offseason. Was a highly-touted high school prep pitcher and went 6-1 with an impressive 0.68 ERA in 51.2 innings of work while striking out 81 batters during his senior year. He was committed to Vanderbilt University before signing with the Royals for a reported \$1.8 million. Joins former prep arms in Ashe Russell, who was selected 21st overall in 2015, Foster Griffin (2014) and Scott Blewett (2014) as other top two round picks by the Royals during the 2014-15 MLB Drafts. Played against Russell in high school as Watson's North Lawrence High School team beat Russell's Cathedral High School in the state tournament.

LAST TIME OUT: Watson is coming off just his second losing effort since joining the Blue Rocks after his last start on August 10 at Myrtle Beach. The righty worked three innings, allowed five runs (all earned) on four hits, walked two and struck out one. He allowed three home runs in the third inning which ultimately chased him out of the game.

WATSON HAS BEEN IMPRESSIVE AS OF LATE: Leading up to his last start, Watson was 5-0 with an impressive 1.97 ERA over 32 innings of work over his last five outings. He has lasted five innings or more in each start and tossed seven frames in three of the five outings. He had a solid 22 to 5 strikeout to walk ratio. The five straight wins is tied for the longest streak by a Blue Rock pitcher this season.

**ROCK SOLID AT HOME:** Watson has taken advantage of the pitcher friendly confines of Frawley Stadium and is an impressive 4-0 with a 1.46 ERA in four starts. (2-2, 6.15 ERA in five road starts). Watson has allowed just four earned runs over 24.2 innings at home while holding opponents to a .195 batting average. (.343 BAA on the road)

ADJUSTING TO NEW ROUTINE: Like many players who get drafted in the MLB Draft, Watson was a talented player on his high school team and played multiple positions, listing playing shortstop and being a designated hitter as his two favorite positions aside from pitching. However, Watson has realized that the schedule and preparation from being a high-school athlete to a professional athlete has major differences. "Just the preparation throughout the week," Watson said. "In high school, I played every position and hit and everything. I wasn't really focused on taking care of my arm because I had a whole six days of rest to recover but here, I have to do the most with my time, the little time that I have to prepare throughout the whole week. I'd say just judging how you feel each day, doing what you need to do that day is probably the hardest part."

BETTER COMPETITION IN CAROLINA LEAGUE: In addition to his routine to get himself ready for each start, Watson also has realized quickly how advanced the approach is at the plate for hitters in Advanced-A. "The approach. I can't just go out there and throw two fastballs on the corner and then throw a curveball in the dirt to get a strikeout. I've had problems getting strikeouts since I've been here because I have to get used to the way hitters approach their at-bats now. I'm not too worried about it. It's just an adjustment I need to make in the bullpen. But I'm 2015/Burlington confident I won't have a problem with that much longer."

**NAMED AFTER THE RYAN EXPRESS:** Watson's parents named him after an all-time pitching great in Nolan 2016/Lexington Ryan. "There was a poster on my brother's wall when he was real young, and it was a poster of Nolan Ryan and it said, "Read More Books". My mom told me she just looked at that poster every day and said "If we have another 2017/Burlington boy we're naming him Nolan." So it happened. I have no idea when I figured out who Nolan Ryan was, but I guess 2017/Lexington the day that I did, I fell in love."

A FAN OF MULTIPLE PLAYERS GROWING UP: Along with listing Nolan Ryan as one of his favorite players, Watson also had two other players he grew up watching. "I also really liked Jose Reyes and Alfonso Soriano." When 2018/Wilmington asked why he liked Alfonso Soriano Watson said, "I think my parents gave me one of those little Macfarlane figures and I had that in my room and I just liked him ever since. I had his Cubs jersey, I had a Cubs hat. I started liking Jose Reyes because he was my brother's favorite player. Anything my brother did, I wanted to do as well because he was older. I just wanted to look up to him, if he did something or liked somebody, I liked him too."

GOALS FOR THE REST OF THE SEASON: Happy to be in Wilmington, Watson wants to put together a strong finish to the 2018 season. "I want to continue what I'm doing now, get better with my command and my delivery. Just working on getting everything together and staying healthy."
