TODAY: The Ports and Visalia Rawhide open the best-of-five North Division Championship Series at Banner Island Ballpark. Games 1 and 2 will be at Banner Island Ballpark, with Games 3 and 4 (if necessary) at Recreation Ballpark in Visalia. Game 5 (if necessary) would be played on Sunday at Banner Island Ballpark. The winner of this series will take on the winner of the South Division Championship Series between the Lancaster JetHawks and Rancho Cucamonga Quakes in the California League Championship Series.

STARTERS: **Matt Milburn** starts Game 1 of the North Division Championship Series for Stockton...last pitched on Wednesday at San Jose and did not factor into the decision, going six innings and allowing two runs on six hits while striking out two...made three starts during the regular season versus Visalia and went 1-0 with a 3.50 ERA against the Rawhide...finished the regular season second in the league in ERA (3.49)...threw his second complete-game shutout of the season and set down 27 of 28 batters on August 23 versus Modesto at Banner Island Ballpark, retiring the first 17 batters he faced before allowing a double to **Beau Branton**, then setting down the final 10 batters in succession...saw his stretch of 18.1 consecutive scoreless innings come to an end in his start at Inland Empire on July 6...threw a complete-game shutout at San Jose on June 26, Stockton's first since 2007 and just the second one since the franchise became an A's affiliate in 2005...made two spot-starts with Triple-A Nashville and went 1-0 with a 2.61 ERA in 10.1 innings pitched (5/20, 5/26)...spent all of 2017 with Low-A Beloit and made 28 appearances (22 starts) and posted a 7-11 record with a 4.34 ERA...after being drafted in 2016, split time between the AZL A's and Short-Season Vermont and combined to go 1-2 with a 4.66 ERA in 36.2 total innings...selected by the A's in the

29th round of the 2016 draft out of Wofford College. **Riley Smith** starts Game 1 of the North Division Championship Series for Visalia...last pitched on August 28 at Modesto and suffered the loss, going six innings and allowing five runs on seven hits...made three starts versus Stockton during the regular season and went 1-0 with a 2.95 ERA against the Ports...finished the regular season third in the league in ERA (3.57)...split time in 2017 with Short-Season Hillsboro and Low-A Kane County, going a combined 7-4 with a 3.07 ERA in 22 appearances (16 starts)...drafted by the Diamondbacks in the 24th round of the 2016 draft out of Louisiana State.

LAST GAME: The Ports scored three runs in the seventh inning to tie the game at 4-4, but Visalia scored three runs over the final two innings to earn a 7-4 win over the Ports to close out the regular season on Sunday. **Daulton Varsho** hit a two-run homer and drove in three runs for the Rawhide. **Edwin Diaz** homered for Stockton.

THE OPPONENT: The Visalia Rawhide clinched a playoff berth with a Modesto loss Saturday night in San Jose. The Rawhide finished the second half tied atop the North Division standings with Stockton and, because of owning the head-to-head tiebreaker, was crowned the Second Half champion. Visalia led the league in team ERA (3.73) and finished fifth in the league in team batting average (.255).

PLAYOFF HISTORY: Stockton is tied with San Jose for the most California League championships won by a franchise in league history (11). Stockton's last league title came in 2008 when they defeated the Lancaster JetHawks (Red Sox) in four games. The Ports appeared in the playoffs last season and were swept in the North Division Championship Series by the Modesto Nuts, the eventual Cal-League champions. Prior to that, their last playoff appearance was in 2015 when they lost in the third and final game of the best-of-three Mini Series to the San Jose Giants. The Ports and Rawhide last played in the postseason in 2014 when Visalia swept the best-of-three North Division Mini Series. The Ports are 117-111 all-time in the Cal-League playoffs. This is the ninth time they've qualified for the post-season since the franchise became an Oakland A's affiliate in 2005.

MARVELOUS MILBURN: Ports RHP **Matt Milburn** was near-perfect on August 23 versus Modesto. Milburn retired 27 of 28 batters in a 2-0 Ports victory over Modesto. It marked Milburn's second complete-game shutout of the season as he threw one in San Jose on June 26. Milburn is the only pitcher in the Cal-League to throw a complete game this season and just the second Ports player to do it since the franchise became an Oakland A's affiliate in 2005 (**Kevin Deaton**-2007).

FIRST HALF CHAMPIONS: With their victory on June 11, Stockton won the First Half championship in the North Division for the first time since 2003 and the first time as an Oakland A's affiliate. The title assures them a berth in the California League playoffs in September.

QUICK HITS:

- Stockton's First Half title in 2018 is their first since becoming an Oakland A's affiliate in 2005 and their first since 2003.
- The Ports won the Second Half title in 2017, finishing with an overall record of 71-69. They were swept by Modesto in the best-of-five North Division Finals.
- 2016 marked the fifth time the Ports missed the post-season as an A's affiliate as they finished the season with a record of 60-80, tied for last in the North Division
- Stockton finished the 2015 season with a record of 74-66 which garnered them the No. 2 seed in the North Division in the playoffs. The Ports went on to drop the third game of the best-of-three Mini-Series to the San Jose Giants in the California League playoffs.
- The Ports finished the 2014 season with the best overall record in the California League at 85-55, their best record since becoming an A's affiliate in 2005, including a 48-22 mark in the second half. They were swept in two games by Visalia in the North Division Mini-Series
- The Ports finished the 2012 season with a record of 56-84, their worst record since becoming an A's affiliate in 2005
- Stockton suffered a 16-game losing streak from April 29-May 15, 2012, their longest losing streak as an A's affiliate
- The Ports finished the 2011 season at an overall mark of 75-65, riding a 17-game winning streak from June 12 through July 1
- The Ports have made the playoffs eight times since becoming an A's affiliate in 2005, missing out in 2007, 2009, 2012, 2013 and 2016
- This is the 69th year of professional baseball in Stockton
- This is the 40th consecutive year of professional baseball in Stockton
- This is the 14th year for Stockton as an affiliate of the Oakland A's

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – STOCKTON PORTS

RHP MATT MILBURN (9-5, 3.49 ERA)

RHP **Matt Milburn (9-5, 3.49 ERA)** starts Game 1 of the North Division Championship Series for the Ports tonight.

2018: Sent to Triple-A Nashville on May 20 and made two spot-starts (5/21, 5/26) and went 1-0 with a 2.61 ERA in 10.1 innings pitched...added back to the Stockton roster on June 1...threw a complete-game shutout in 90 pitches at San Jose on June 26, Stockton's first since **Kevin Deaton** accomplished the feat on August 7, 2007 (the only other time a Ports pitcher has thrown one since the franchise became an A's affiliate in 2005)...saw his stretch of 18.1 consecutive scoreless innings come to an end on July 6 at Inland Empire, the longest consecutive scoreless inning stretch for Ports pitcher this season...threw a second complete-game shutout on August 23 versus Modesto and faced just one over the minimum, setting down 27 of 28 batters he faced as he retired 17 straight to open his start, allowed a double to **Beau Branton**, and then proceeded to retire the next 10 batters in succession to finish the outing in 96 pitches.

2017: Spent all season with Low-A Beloit and made 28 appearances (22 starts), going 7-11 with a 4.34 ERA over 141 innings worked...allowed just one run on three hits while striking out a career-best 12 at Clinton on June 23...first professional season where he worked predominantly as a starter.

2016: After being drafted, made nine appearances (two starts) with the AZL A's and posted a 3.42 ERA in 23.2 innings pitched before being promoted to Short-Season Vermont to finish the season...made five relief appearances with the Lake Monsters totalling 13 innings, allowing 11 runs (10 earned) on 22 hits while striking out 14 and not issuing a walk.

Misc.: Drafted by the A's in the 29th round of the 2016 draft out of Wofford College...led the Southern Conference in strikeouts with 103 and was fourth in the league in innings pitched (98.2) in his senior season...earned All-Southern Conference second team honors in 2015 and 2016...was tabbed the 2016 SoCon Preseason Pitcher of the Year.

STOCKTON PORTS POSITION PLAYERS

Calabuig, Chase (1st Season, 22 years old, 27th Round of 2018 Draft)

- Added to the Stockton roster on July 8 from the AZL A's where he'd played in 16 games and hit .406 with 5 RBI
- Drafted by the A's in the 27th round of the 2018 draft out of San Diego State
- Named First Team All-Mountain West in his senior season...reached base in 51 consecutive home games, the longest on-base streak in Tony Gwynn Stadium history
- Hit .305 his senior season with the Aztecs with 5 HR and 46 RBI...posted a .300 career batting average in 238 career games played at San Diego State
- Was signed by former A's farmhand and former Ports first baseman **Anthony Aliotti** who now works as an A's scout

Chavez, Santiago (7th Season, 22 years old, International Free Agent, 2012)

- Added to the Stockton roster on July 10 from Double-A Midland...hit .209 with 4 RBI in 28 games with the RockHounds
- Played in 52 games with the Ports in 2017 and hit .192 with 2 HR and 11 RBI
- Played in 80 games with Low-A Beloit in 2016 and hit .207 with 15 RBI
- Split 2015 between Stockton and Beloit and played in 65 total games, posting a combined .132 average
- Saw time and Midland, Beloit and Vermont in 2014 and appeared in 65 games, batting a combined .172
- Played with the A's Dominican Summer League team in 2012 and 2013
- Signed by the A's as an international free agent from Mexico in 2011

Deichmann, Greg (2nd Season, 22 years old, 2nd Round of 2017 Draft)

- Began the season with Stockton appeared in 15 games before being placed on the DL on April 24 with a wrist injury...activated from the DL on July 28
- After being drafted, played in 46 games with Short-Season Vermont and hit .274 with 8 HR and 30 RBI
- Was named a 2017 New York-Penn League Mid-Season All-Star and a 2017 *Baseball America* Short-Season All-Star
- Drafted by the A's in the second round (43rd overall) of the 2017 draft out of Louisiana State following his junior season
- Played shortstop in high school and corner infield through his sophomore season at LSU before moving to right field in his junior season
- Hit 19 HR his junior season and earned All-America honors
- Ranked the No. 11 prospect in the A's organization by *Baseball America* entering the 2017 season

Diaz, Edwin (6th Season, 22 years old, 15th Round of 2013 Draft)

- Began the season with Stockton and was with Double-A Midland from June 8-July 15, appearing in 24 games and hitting .149 with 8 RBI before being re-added to the Stockton roster
- Spent 13 games with Stockton in 2017 (7/12-8/1) and went 4-for-45 (.089) before being reassigned to Beloit to finish the campaign

STAFF BIOS

MANAGER: RICK MAGNANTE

Rick Magnante enters his fourth season as the manager of the Stockton Ports after previously serving as manager of Low-A Beloit in 2014. Prior to the 2014 campaign, Magnante spent eight consecutive seasons managing the A's short-season affiliates in Vermont (2011-13) and Vancouver (2006-10). This season will be his 14th overall as a minor league manager, having previously managed three seasons in the Detroit Tigers organization. He also served as the manager of the South African national team in the 2006 World Baseball Classic.

In addition, Magnante served as an area scout for the A's from 1996-2013. He is credited with signing Barry Zito and Bobby Crosby, among other players. He was the recipient of the Southern California Scouts Association scout of the year award and the A's Dick Bogard Memorial Award in 2001 and 2003, respectively.

Magnante, who began his career in professional baseball with the Cleveland Indians in 1969, has also held managerial positions in the Detroit Tigers minor league system (1987-89) as well as with the Novara Serie A team of the Italian Professional League (1990).

Magnante resides in Encino, Calif. and has two sons, Bobby and Daniel.

PITCHING COACH: BRYAN COREY

Bryan Corey enters his first year as Stockton's pitching coach after spending one season serving in the same capacity with Short-Season Vermont. Prior to that, he served as a Four Corners scout for the Milwaukee Brewers (2015-16) and a Major League advance scout for the Cleveland Indians (2013-14).

Originally drafted as a shortstop by the Detroit Tigers in the 12th round of the 1993 draft, Corey was converted to a pitcher after two professional seasons. He spent the next 18 seasons on the mound, including five years in the majors with the Arizona Diamondbacks, Los Angeles Dodgers, Texas Rangers, Boston Red Sox and San Diego Padres, winning a World Series with the Red Sox in 2007.

He also played two seasons in Japan (2004, 2010), winning the Japan Series with Chiba Lotte during his second stint. Additionally, he pitched in both Korea and Taiwan before retiring after the 2012 season.

A native of Thousand Oaks, Calif., he currently resides in Mesa, Ariz., and has two daughters, Brooke (14) and Blair (9).

HITTING COACH: BRIAN MCARN

Brian McArn returns to Stockton for a third stint as the Ports' hitting coach after spending the last two seasons serving in the same capacity for Double-A Midland. 2018 marks his 21st season as a hitting coach in the A's system, having previously coached for Stockton (2011-12, 2014-15), Sacramento (2005-10), and the A's former High-A affiliate in Modesto (1998-2003).

Prior to joining the A's organization, McArn spent one season as the hitting coach for the Single-A Vermont Expos of the New York-Penn League. McArn began his coaching career at American River Junior College in Sacramento, where he served as an assistant coach.

Selected in the 26th round of the 1991 June draft, McArn spent two seasons in the A's organization before injuries ended his career in 1992.

He makes his off-season home in Elk Grove, Calif. with his wife, Cancy, and four children: Brian, Bryson, Brevon and Braydon.
