**Last Game:** The Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp (2-1) defeated the Mississippi Braves (1-2) by a 6-1 score in the third game of the five-game series at Trustmark Park on Saturday night. Jacksonville starter Omar Bencomo (1-0) earned the win with five scoreless innings of work where he allowed three hits, walked a batter, and struck out four in his Marlins organization debut. Mississippi starter Kolby Allard (0-1) took the loss in his Double-A debut, going five innings where he allowed two runs on six hits with no walks and five strikeouts. After the Jumbo Shrimp scored a run in the fourth inning, Austin Dean provided a spark in the top of the fifth when he hit the first Jumbo Shrimp homer of the year, a solo shot to the left-center field berm to put Jacksonville in front 2-0. The Jumbo Shrimp added to the lead with a Brian Anderson RBI single in the seventh inning that made it 3-0, and then later in the inning Yefri Perez scored on a Michael Mader wild pitch to make it 4-0 Jacksonville. Alex Yarbrough added to the lead an inning later with a two-run triple to grow the lead to 6-0. After Bencomo's five scoreless innings to start the game, left-hander James Buckelew provided three scoreless innings of relief work. Buckelew also collected an infield single in his first professional at-bat in the seventh inning. Mississippi added a run in the ninth with Reed Harper bringing in a run on a sacrifice fly off Shrimp reliever Tyler Kinley to put the score at 6-1. Tyler Bremer came in to get the final out and did as Stephen Gaylor flew out to centerfield to end the game in a 6-1 Jacksonville victory. Anderson and Dean both went 3-for-5 in the game in the first three-hit performances for any Jumbo Shrimp in 2017.

## NEWS AND NOTES

**Dean First Jumbo Shrimp Homer:** Austin Dean made history on Saturday night by hitting the first home run in Jumbo Shrimp history, a solo shot off Kolby Allard in the top of the fifth inning. Last year Dean led Jacksonville by hitting 11 home runs, including eight blasts in the first half of the season as he was named a 2016 Southern League All-Star. Dean is listed by Baseball America as the No. 8 prospect in the Marlins system for this season.

**Everyone's Involved:** In the first three games of the season, manager Randy Ready has used all 12 position players on the Jumbo Shrimp roster in a starting role. This was a priority for Ready heading into the season, especially with National League style baseball for this series between the Shrimp and M-Braves. Also all but two of Jacksonville's relief pitchers have appeared in a game, with the exception of Hunter Adkins and Tayron Guerrero.

**Ready to Manage:** Randy Ready is in his first season as the Jumbo Shrimp manager in 2017. Last year was Ready's first in the Miami Marlins organization, and he led High-A Jupiter to a 68-69 record overall and a 37-32 mark in the second half of the Florida State League season. Ready's field staff features all newcomers to Jacksonville in hitting coach Jesus Merchan, pitching coach Storm Davis, and coach Jose Ceballos. A sixth-round draft pick in 1980 by the Milwaukee Brewers, Ready appeared in 777 big league games over parts of 13 Major League seasons with Milwaukee (1983-86), San Diego (1986-89), Philadelphia (1989-91, 1994-95), Oakland (1992) and Montreal (1993) while batting .259 with 40 home runs and 239 RBI.

**Shrimp Have Prospects:** On the Opening Day roster, the Jumbo Shrimp have seven players that are considered among the Top 30 Marlins prospects for this season according to both Baseball America and MLB.com. Top 30 Marlins Prospects include: third baseman Brian Anderson (No. 3 MLB, No. 4 BA), left-handed pitcher Jarlin Garcia (No. 4 MLB, No. 6 BA), left-handed pitcher Dillon Peters (No. 5 MLB, No. 5 BA), left fielder Austin Dean (No. 13 MLB, No. 8 BA), right-handed pitcher Tayron Guerrero (No. 19 MLB, No. 16 BA), outfielder John Norwood (No. 27 MLB, No. 29 BA), and infielder Yefri Perez (No. 30 both MLB & BA). Additionally, Baseball America regards Anderson as being the "Best Hitter for Average, Best Strike-Zone Discipline, Best Defensive Infielder, Best Infield Arm," in the organization, while Garcia has the "Best Changeup," Perez is the "Fastest Baserunner," and Peters has the "Best Control."

**Facing the Braves:** Last season Jacksonville went 9-11 against the Mississippi Braves. The then-Suns were 5-5 against the M-Braves at Trustmark Park, where tonight's series begins. Jacksonville took the first series in Mississippi in late May, winning three out of five games, before a series loss to the M-Braves in late June, where Mississippi won three out of five games. In Jacksonville, the club had a losing mark against Mississippi, going 4-6 against the M-Braves. Yefri Perez was one of the best Jacksonville players against the M-Braves, hitting .294 with seven RBI and nine stolen bases in 14 games. Dillon Peters also won his start against the M-Braves last year, and Matt Tomshaw turned in six innings where he only allowed a run on three hits against Mississippi last season.

**TONIGHT – 2017 & MARLINS ORG. DEBUT:** Today left-hander Mike Kickham makes his Jacksonville and Marlins organization debut. Kickham was signed as a minor league free agent in the offseason, after previously spending seven seasons pitching in the San Francisco Giants, Seattle Mariners, and Texas Rangers organization.

**2016 with RICHMOND:** Kickham's time in affiliated baseball last season was spent with the Double-A Richmond Flying Squirrels in the Eastern League. There he went 0-1 with a 6.75 ERA in six relief appearances before he was released by the Giants on May 20, 2016.

**2016 with KANSAS CITY T-BONES:** Kickham spent time in independent baseball last year with the Kansas City T-Bones in the American Association. There he went 3-5 with a 2.83 ERA in 14 starts to close out the season.

**BIG LEAGUE TIME:** Kickham pitched in the major leagues with the San Francisco Giants in 2013 and 2014. He made his big league debut on May 28, 2013 in Oakland against the Athletics, where he allowed four runs on four hits in his two and a third innings of work, taking the loss in the game. He had more call-ups to the big leagues in June, July, August, and then finished September in a Giants uniform. All together, in 2013 he was 0-3 with a 10.16 ERA in his 12 appearances and three starts. In 2014 he was a September call-up to the Giants, and had no wins or losses and a 22.50 ERA in two relief appearances for a club that went on to win the World Series. In parts of two big league seasons, Kickham is 0-3 with a 10.98 ERA in 14 games and three starts.

**2016 Highlights:** Kickham's time in affiliated baseball last season was spent with the Double-A Richmond Flying Squirrels in the Eastern League. There he went 0-1 with a 6.75 ERA in six relief appearances before he was released by the Giants on May 20, 2016. Kickham spent time in independent baseball last year with the Kansas City T-Bones in the American Association. There he went 3-5 with a 2.83 ERA in 14 starts to close out the season.

**2015 Highlights:** Kickham split the 2015 season between the Seattle Mariners and Texas Rangers organizations, pitching exclusively in the Triple-A Pacific Coast League. He started the year with Triple-A Tacoma, where he was 0-2 with a 7.29 ERA in five starts before he was designated for assignment by the Mariners on May 4. He then was claimed off waivers by the Texas Rangers a day later, and then pitched for Triple-A Round Rock where he was 1-0 with a 6.00 ERA in seven relief appearances before he was released on June 11.

**2014 Highlights:** Kickham spent most of 2014 with Triple-A Fresno where he was 8-8 with a 4.43 ERA in 27 starts in the Pacific Coast League. In 2014 he was a September call-up to the Giants, and had no wins or losses and a 22.50 ERA in two relief appearances for a club that went on to win the World Series

**2013 Highlights:** Kickham split the 2013 season between Triple-A Fresno and the major leagues with the Giants. With Fresno he was 7-7 with a 4.31 ERA in 20 starts. He made his big league debut on May 28, 2013 in Oakland against the Athletics, where he allowed four runs on four hits in his two and a third innings of work, taking the loss in the game. He had more call-ups to the big leagues in June, July, August, and then finished September in a Giants uniform. All together, in 2013 he was 0-3 with a 10.16 ERA in his 12 appearances and three starts.

**2012 Highlights:** Kickham spent all of 2012 in Double-A with the Richmond Flying Squirrels in the Eastern League. There he was 11-10 with a 3.05 ERA in 28 appearances and 27 starts.

**2011 Highlights:** Kickham spent all of 2011 with the Single-A Augusta Greenjackets in the South Atlantic League. There he was 5-10 with a 4.11 ERA in 21 starts.

**2010 Highlights:** After he was drafted by the Giants, he made three relief appearances with the AZL Giants where he had no wins or losses and an 11.57 ERA.

**Personal:** Originally selected by the Giants in the sixth round of the 2010 draft out of Missouri State. Kickham played for Missouri State in 2010. He struck out 103 batters in 96.0 innings and won MSU's Dave Dickensheet Outstanding Pitcher Award.
