#### LAST GAME:

Brandon Wagner played hero in the completion of a suspended game and in a 1-0 win in a 7-inning game on Saturday against Portland.

Wagner's sacrifice fly in the 10<sup>th</sup> inning gave the Thunder a 3-2 win in game one of the twin bill. Albert Abreu went four innings in a starting role as the game re-started in the middle of the 3<sup>rd</sup> inning. Kaleb Ort and Daniel Alvarez struck out seven in three innings out of the bullpen.

Garrett Whitlock fired six scoreless innings in the 7-inning game to earn the victory. Brandon Wagner's homer in the 5<sup>th</sup> proved to be the difference. Trevor Lane delivered a scoreless 7<sup>th</sup> to earn his first save of the season.

#### THUNDER CLAPS

**THE RIVALRY LIVES ON:** This series marks the first three of 20 scheduled matchups for the Thunder against the Sea Dogs this season. The Thunder went 8-8 against Portland in 2018, including 5-2 at ARM & HAMMER Park. The Thunder have the all-time head-to-head edge with a 230-203 record.

**CUTTING IT CLOSE:** Four of the Thunder's five wins have come by one-run margins; the only exception came in last Tuesday's 7-2 win in Akron. Trenton's 5-3 record comes in spite of being outscored by opponents 41-26, skewed by two lopsided losses (11-1 and 16-5) to Erie in the season-opening series.

**RED-HOT RUTA:** Ben Ruta has been the most productive Thunder hitter so far this season. The West Windsor, New Jersey native leads the team with a .357 average, 10 hits, and 3 doubles, and is tied for the team lead with five walks and two stolen bases. Ruta went 0-for-2 in the second game of Saturday's twinbill, ending a team-high seven-game on-base streak.

**WHAT A RELIEF:** After surrendering 23 runs during the opening series in Erie, the Thunder bullpen has held opponents to just three runs over its last five games (a 1.33 ERA over 20.1 IP). During this stretch, Trenton relievers have struck out 31 batters, walked six, and allowed only 11 hits.

**THE OZ-MAN COMETH:** In addition to marking the Thunder's first win of 2019, Saturday's victory was also win number 300 for Patrick Osborn as a manager in the Yankees system. Osborn, the twelfth manager in franchise history, compiled a 299-247 (.548) record over his first five seasons as a manager in the Yankees organization. The California native previously managed in the rookie-level Gulf Coast League (2014), short-season Staten Island (2015), Single-A Charleston (2017), and High-A Tampa (2016, 2018). The 2016 season saw Osborn pilot Tampa to a runner-up finish, earning him Florida State League Manager of the Year honors.

**THREE IN A ROW:** Having made the Eastern League playoffs in each of their last three seasons, the Thunder look to match a franchise record with a fourth consecutive postseason appearance. The team previously achieved this from 2005 to 2008, the final two years of which saw the Thunder win their first two Eastern League championships.

**WHO THEY ARE:** Of the 25 players on the Thunder roster, 13 were drafted by the Yankees, seven were signed as minor league or international free agents, four were acquired via trade, and one was claimed off waivers. Seventeen of the 25 played under Patrick Osborn at high-A Tampa at some point in 2018.

**STAR-STUDDED STAFF:** The Thunder are opening the season with a pitching staff that boasts five players who rank within MLB Pipeline's Top 30 Yankees prospects: Albert Abreu (#3), Trevor Stephan (#8), Nick Nelson (#11), Garrett Whitlock (#16), and Domingo Acevedo (#23).

**2018:** Began season by making 5 starts with Charleston going 1-1 with a 3.65 ERA (24.2 IP, 18 H, 7 BB, 35 K)... Promoted to Tampa on 5/5 and went 7-5 with a 3.36 ERA in 18 appearances, 17 starts (88.1 IP, 69 H, 47 BB, 99 K)... Made spot start for Thunder on 7/22 @ Binghamton, returned to Tampa on 7/23... Went 2-2 with a 3.16 ERA (9 ER / 26.2 IP) with 35 K and 13 BB... Returned to Thunder on 8/26 and made spot start against Hartford in game to clinch Eastern League Playoff Spot... Started Game 3 of Eastern League Division Series against New Hampshire and suffered the loss, allowing three runs in five innings pitched...
