Tonight's Game... The San Jose Giants look for a series victory against the Visalia Rawhide when the teams conclude their three-game set this evening at Recreation Park. Visalia posted an 8-1 win in the series opener on Tuesday before the Giants bounced back with a 7-5 victory last night. Mac Marshall (0-2, 3.69 ERA) is slated to make the start on the mound for San Jose tonight.

The Giants... San Jose is attempting to win back-to-back games for the first time since taking three straight from July 13-15. The Giants are just 4-11 in their last 15 games overall. San Jose has won only one series in the second half (3-1 vs. Visalia, July 13-16). The Giants have lost their last four series' overall.

Rec Park Series Win Drought... The Giants haven't won a series at Visalia's Recreation Park since the opening weekend of the 2013 season (won three of four games April 4-7, 2013). Since that series victory, San Jose is 21-48 (.304) at Rec Park during the regular season with 15 series losses and four series splits. The Giants are 4-6 in Visalia this season. San Jose still has one series remaining in Visalia this year (August 21-23).

Brusa Bash... Gio Brusa hit his team-leading 17th home run of the season in last night's victory. 15 of his 17 homers have come on the road. Brusa has equaled his 2017 home run total with San Jose. He hit 17 homers in 113 games with the Giants last year and needed only 83 games to reach 17 home runs this season. With 34 career homers, Brusa is just two home runs away from cracking the San Jose Giants career top five list (Travis Ishikawa and Angel Villalona are tied for fourth in club history with 36 HR each).

The Long Ball... San Jose leads all North Division clubs and ranks third in the California League with 93 home runs this season. The Giants have hit 42 home runs in 40 second half games. Conversely, San Jose has allowed 51 home runs in the second half after giving up just 36 homers throughout the entire first half.

Month-By-Month... The Giants' month-by-month records: April 15-10, May 14-15, June 10-16, July 8-21, August 1-0. San Jose had the worst record in the league in both June and July. The Giants were last in the league in team batting average (.233) and team ERA (6.22) in July while owning a -78 run differential (197-118).

Road Woes... The Giants are a league-worst 23-33 on the road this season, including losses in seven out of their last nine road games. San Jose hasn't won a road series since June 8-10 at Modesto (won two of three games). The Giants are 10-22 in their last 32 road games dating back to May 24 (after starting the season 13-11). San Jose's road ERA this season is 4.95 compared to a 3.90 ERA at home.

Late Innings... The Giants lead the league with seven victories this season when trailing after seven innings. However, San Jose has lost a league-high 12 games when leading after six innings and seven games when ahead after seven.

On Deck... The Giants return to Municipal Stadium tomorrow night for a six-game homestand against Lake Elsinore (three games) and Rancho Cucamonga (three games). San Jose is only 4-17 against South Division opponents in the second half (10-9 versus the North). The Giants have lost their last six games to the Storm and are only 3-12 versus the Quakes this season.

* Is in his fourth professional season ... Selected by the San Francisco Giants in the fourth round of the 2015 draft (126th overall pick).

* Tonight marks his 13th start and 14th appearance of the season ... Has struck out 36 batters in 31 2/3 innings ... Owns a .219 opponents batting average ... Has yet to pitch past the third inning in a start (on a season inning limit) ... Has not given up an earned run in eight out of his 12 starts.

* Has had three stints on the disabled list this season: April 14-22 (elbow), May 15-June 15 (elbow) and June 28-July 19 (hip).

* Most recent start came on July 28 against Inland Empire ... Surrendered a season-high six runs (all earned) over 2 2/3 innings ... Gave up five hits, including two home runs, walked two and struck out none ... Allowed a first-inning grand slam to Julian Leon ... Suffered the loss ... Had allowed a combined seven earned runs in his previous 11 starts this season (28 IP).

* Began his season with 14 2/3 consecutive scoreless innings spanning his first five starts.

* Limiting left-handed hitters to a .121 batting average this season (4-for-33) ... Right-handed batters are hitting at a .259 clip ... Opponents are batting .121 against him with runners in scoring position (4-for-33, 14 SO).

* Only previous start against Visalia came on June 16 at Municipal Stadium ... Pitched three scoreless innings (1 H, 1 BB, 4 SO).

* Prior to this season, hadn't made a start since September 3, 2016 (Salem-Keizer).

* Was limited to just two appearances in 2017 with the AZL Giants (Rookie) due to a left elbow injury ... Underwent nerve transposition surgery last year ... Pitched 1 2/3 scoreless innings after returning from injury ... Both of his outings came during the final week of the season.

* Pitched for Augusta (A) and Salem-Keizer (Short-Season) in 2016 ... Combined for a 1-6 record and a 4.70 ERA in 17 starts between the two teams (67 IP, 60 H, 65 BB, 68 SO) ... Pitched past the fifth inning only once in his 17 starts ... Pitched for the AZL Giants and Salem-Keizer during his debut professional season in 2015.

* Attended Chipola Junior College (Marianna, FL) ... Posted a 5-2 record and a 2.37 ERA over nine starts during his only season at Chipola in 2015 (30 IP, 13 BB, 44 SO).

* Originally a 21st round draft pick of the Houston Astros in 2014 out of high school, but did not sign ... Was rated the #66 player in the 2014 draft by *MLB.com* ... Was slated to attend LSU, but opted to remain eligible for the 2015 draft instead by enrolling at Chipola.

* Attended Parkview High School ... Had a 0.58 ERA with 86 strikeouts in 60 2/3 innings as a senior in 2014 ... Helped Parkview to the 2012 high school national championship as a sophomore.

* Pitched for the 18-and-under U.S. National Baseball Team in 2013 ... Won a gold medal in Taiwan.

- * Infielder is in his fifth professional season ... Signed as an international free agent in 2013 at age 16.
- * Joined San Jose from Extended Spring Training on June 7 ... Suffered fractured leg from a foul ball during spring training.
- * Spent the last two seasons with Augusta (A) ... Batted .253 with 6 HR, 37 RBI's and 15 SB in 118 games last year.
- * Was a second baseman last year after playing primarily third base in 2016 ... Began pro career as a shortstop.

#26 Gio Brusa (.248, 17 HR, 56 RBI, 4 SB)

- * First baseman is in his third professional season ... Selected in the 6th round of the 2016 draft.
- * Hit for the cycle on April 11 at Lancaster joining teammate Jalen Miller in accomplishing the feat that night.
