Saturday Recap: Squirrels snap RubberDucks' four-game winning streak (Richmond 6, Akron 3): Richmond scored four runs in the first two innings and held a lead the rest of the game in a 6-3 win over the RubberDucks that snapped Akron's four-game winning streak – which had matched a season long – in front of 4,726 at Canal Park Saturday night. Center fielder **Ka'ai Tom** had three hits, a home run and two RBI.

Stingy starters: Prior to **Jake Paulson** allowing four earned runs on Saturday, in the previous 16 games (since May 7), Akron's starting pitcher had allowed two earned runs or fewer. Included were eight quality starts (6+ IP, 3 ER or fewer). The RubberDucks went 10-6 in that span (5-3 in the quality starts). In 16 of the last 17 games, Akron's starter has pitched five or more innings (**Sam Hentges** went three innings Tuesday).

RubberDucks relief: RubberDucks relievers have allowed only three runs in the last nine games and the last 33 1/3 innings (0.81 ERA) going back to May 15, including five straight scoreless games May 16-21.

Ducks winning the home run margin: The RubberDucks have hit 36 home runs, ranking third in the Eastern League, while allowing only 20 home runs – the fewest of any EL club – for a league-best +16 home run differential. Akron had four straight multi-homer games May 9-13 and have eight such games overall. Of the RubberDucks' 35 home runs, 24 have come in eight games, including 13 in four games May 9-13. Akron's six home runs on May 11 were the most for the club since hitting seven on July 2, 2008, in a 10-6 win at Erie.

Naquin joins RubberDucks on rehab assignment: Cleveland Indians outfielder **Tyler Naquin** is joining the RubberDucks Sunday to begin a rehab assignment. He was placed on the 10-Day Injured List on May 14 with a left calf strain, after hitting .278 with one home run and 10 RBI in 30 games. Naquin played with Akron 2013-15 before joining the Indians in 2016. He played a rehab game with Akron last season and has appeared in 129 games with Akron (.307, six home runs, 46 RBI, 22 stolen bases).

Marabell is a mainstay: Third-year RubberDuck **Connor Marabell** has played in each of Akron's first 47 games (starting the last 43). He is tied for the team lead in hits (42) and is tied for third in runs (22). He has made four starts at first base, 14 in left field, five in center field, 19 in right field, and four as a DH.

Johnson's promotion: Outfielder **Daniel Johnson** was promoted on Saturday from Akron to Columbus for his first Triple-A promotion. He led the RubberDucks with a .253 average (tied for best among qualifying players), 10 home runs (tied for third in the Eastern League), 33 RBI (first), 78 total bases (tied for fourth), 25 runs, .337 OBP, .534 SLG, and .872 OPS. He surpassed his home run and RBI totals from his Eastern League time in 2018, when he played 89 games with the Harrisburg Senators, and hit .267 with six home runs and 31 RBI. Johnson is the Indians' No. 14 (BA)/No. 22 (MLB.com) prospect.

Ducks host Flying Squirrels: The RubberDucks and Flying Squirrels are playing the second of three scheduled intradivision four-game series this season, with eight games at Canal Park and four at The Diamond. Last season, Akron went 11-5 against Richmond, including 6-2 at Canal Park. In 2018, the Flying Squirrels finished in sixth place in the Western Division, at 62-76 overall. Since Richmond joined the league in 2010, Akron leads the series, 55-54.

Garcia finds a groove in Double-A: In his first season with the Indians organization and first in Double-A, first baseman **Wilson Garcia** is second in the Eastern League with 14 doubles. His 42 hits are tied for the club lead. He is second with five home runs, 29 RBI, 19 extra-base hits, 71 total bases, .410 SLG and .698 OPS. Garcia began the season with 28 straight error-free games at first base. In the first six games against one of his former organizations, the Philadelphia Phillies Double-A affiliate, Reading, Garcia was 8-for-23 (.348) with four runs, three home runs and six RBI. He homered on May 10th and 11th in Reading, joining **Daniel Johnson** as RubberDucks to homer in consecutive games this season.

N-Rod rejoins Akron: First baseman and designated hitter **Nellie Rodriguez** has hit safely in 10 of 13 games to begin his season, including an eight-game hitting streak May 11-19 (11-for-35, double, three home runs, seven RBI, eight runs, .314 AVG, .351 OBP). He joined Akron May 11 to begin his eighth season in the Indians organization (and fourth season he has played with Akron in five years). Rodriguez, 24, first reached Akron in August 2015, after having posted numbers that earned him Carolina League MVP honors. In 201 games with Akron (his most for any club), he has 38 home runs (his most at any level).

Clement's return: Prior to going 0-for-4 Saturday, infielder **Ernie Clement** had reached base in his last 14 games (tying the longest streak by a RubberDuck this season) since April 7 and had a season-long seven-game hitting streak. After he was on the Injured List with a right adductor strain April 16-May 8, Clement has played 11 games since coming off the IL, going 13-for-37 (.351) with five multi-hit games, a double, triple, home run, eight runs, five RBI, seven walks, a team-best .514 OBP and .982 OPS. In six games prior to going on the IL, the Indians No. 15 (MLB.com)/No. 18 (*Baseball America*) prospect was 3-for-25 (.120).

Ka'ai on the ball: After hitting .177 with one home run in 23 April games, outfielder **Ka'ai Tom** is hitting .320 (24-for-75) with four home runs in 20 May games. In 2018, he hit .286 in May (his highest monthly average) after hitting .183 in April. He has hit safely in 11 of his last 13 games (18-for-46, .391, 11 runs), raising his average from .191 to .250. He had a season-long seven-game hitting streak May 10-17, going 10-for-26 (.385) with two doubles, three home runs (two in Reading May 11 and one May 13 against Bowie), seven runs, four RBI and a .484 OBP. He is the third RubberDuck to homer in back-to-back games this season, joining **Daniel Johnson** (May 9-10) and **Wilson Garcia** (May 10-11).

LAST START (Tuesday, May 21, vs. Harrisburg, ND in 7-3 win)

Hentges gave up three singles and a walk in the opening frame but limited the Senators to just a run. He worked through a scoreless second, allowing just a single. In the third inning, a single, three walks and a passed ball scored two more runs. He was removed after three innings, and while the bullpen pitched six scoreless innings, the RubberDucks offense scored three in the third inning, and two each in the sixth and eighth innings for a 7-3 win.

Season Highlights

- Entered the season ranked as the No. 6 prospect in the Indians system by *Baseball America* and No. 10 by MLB.com (both as top left-handed pitcher).
- Added to the Indians 40-man roster Nov. 20, and made his first two career major league spring training appearances, with two scoreless, hitless starts for the Indians – Feb. 26 at Colorado (W, 1.0 IP, 0 BB, 0 K) and March 3 vs. Kansas City (2.0 IP, 1 BB, 3 K).

2018:

- Finished second in ERA (3.27) and third in strikeouts (122) in the Carolina League, Mid-Season Carolina League All-Star, *MiLB.com* organizational All-Star.
- Did not pitch after August 15 due to a left shoulder strain, but his final start was his best, Aug. 15 at Wilmington (6.1IP, 2H, 0R, 2BB, 7SO).
- Over his final 12 starts of the season he posted an ERA of 2.69 (19ER/63.2IP).
- Recorded four starts of at least 6.0 innings and zero runs allowed and fanned 10 on April 17 vs. Frederick.
- Allowed only four homers in 118.1 innings, while batters hit .230 (46-for-200) off him with runners on and .231 (27-for-117) with RISP.

2017:

- Season did not begin until 7/8 due to elbow surgery the previous July.
- Made six rehab starts in the Arizona League before being activated at Mahoning Valley on 8/9, finishing the season with five starts (2.04 ERA).

2016: Limited to 14 starts for Lake County (A) due to a left elbow strain, and did not pitch after June 23...had left elbow reconstruction in July.

2015: Led AZL Indians with 59 strikeouts, third-most in the league.

2019 RUBBERDUCKS FIELD STAFF

#24 Rouglas Odor, *Manager (First Season)* – Odor, 51, is the 18th manager in club history. He follows Tony Mansolino, who was promoted to Triple-A Columbus after guiding Akron to a 78-62 record and finish as runner-up in the 2018 Eastern League Championship Series against the New Hampshire Fisher Cats. Last season, Odor managed the Class-A Advanced Lynchburg Hillcats to their fourth consecutive postseason. After posting the Carolina League's worst first-half record of 29-38, the Hillcats rebounded to go 42-28 in the second half, claiming the Northern Division title. They fell to Potomac in the semifinals, three games to two. Odor has a 361-363 (.499) career managing record in 11 seasons.

When Odor was the RubberDucks hitting coach in 2014, he became the first person to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros, and Akron RubberDucks. He played 197 games for Canton-Akron during the 1991, 1993-94 seasons, and he was the hitting coach for the Aeros' 2012 Eastern League Championship squad.

The 2019 season is Odor's 32nd in the Cleveland organization as a player or coach (19th as a coach). The former shortstop was a 32nd-round draft pick by the Indians in 1988 and played in the minor leagues for the Indians from 1988-94 and for the Milwaukee Brewers organization in 1995. Last season was Odor's first as a manager since 2008. He managed San Felipe in the Venezuelan Summer League for two seasons in 1999-2000, the Burlington Indians for four seasons from 2001-04, the Mahoning Valley Scrappers for two seasons in 2005-06, and the Gulf Coast League Indians for two seasons in 2007-08. Since then, Odor has moved up the ranks as a hitting coach, starting with Class-A Kinston in 2009-10, Akron in 2011-12 and 2014, the High-A Carolina Mudcats in 2013, and Triple-A Columbus in 2015-17.

The Maracaibo, Venezuela, native resides in Winter Haven, Florida, with his wife, Milagros. He has three sons and is the uncle of Texas Rangers infielder Rougned Odor.

#27 Tony Arnold, *Pitching Coach (10th Season, not consecutive)* — Arnold, 59, rejoins the RubberDucks for his fifth time in Akron after spending last season with Lynchburg. In 2018, the Hillcats pitching staff finished fifth in the Carolina League with a 3.76 ERA, ranked second with 1,190 strikeouts and the 12 team shutouts ranked fourth. Arnold last was with the RubberDucks in 2016-17, helping lead the 2016 team to an Eastern League championship. He previously served in the same capacity in Akron from 1996-99, 2008, and 2011-12. Arnold's 2012 Akron Aeros staff crafted a franchise-record 3.03 ERA and went on to claim the EL championship. In 2016, Arnold became the second man to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros and Akron RubberDucks, joining Rouglas Odor in that exclusive group.

In 2015, Arnold began as the pitching coach at Lynchburg and finished at Triple-A Columbus, helping the Clippers to the International League title. A former All-American at the University of Texas, Arnold pitched in the major leagues with the Baltimore Orioles in 1986 and 1987.

#2 Justin Toole, *Hitting Coach (First Season)* — Toole, 32, spent the 2018 season as Lynchburg's hitting coach. This is fourth season coaching in the Indians' organization, serving as the hitting coach for Mahoning Valley in 2016, Lake County in 2017, and Lynchburg. Toole was signed as a minor league free agent by the Indians in 2009 and spent parts of seven seasons with Cleveland from 2009-15. He spent parts of 2010, 2012-15 with Akron, hitting .259 in 180 games, including .275 in 77 games under Odor's hitting-coach tutelage in 2014. The Council Bluffs, Iowa, native played at the University of Iowa and has authored a children's book called "9 in 9," chronicling the lessons he learned while playing all nine positions in a game for the Carolina Mudcats on Aug. 25, 2012. **Twitter: @Tooleyj24, Instagram: @tooleyj24**

#28 Juan De La Cruz, *Bench Coach (First Season)* — De La Cruz, 25, is in his second season coaching with the Indians after serving as the hitting coach for the rookie-level Arizona League Indians in 2018. Primarily a catcher in his playing days, De La Cruz was signed as a free agent by the Indians in 2009 and spent eight seasons in the system, reaching as high as Akron in 2017, when he played 12 games as a catcher and first baseman. He was a .216 career hitter in 281 games.

Bobby Ruiz, *Athletic Trainer (First Season)* — Ruiz spent the past four seasons (2015-18) with Lynchburg. This is his ninth with the Indians.

Paul Synenkyj, *Strength and Conditioning Coach (Third Season)* — Synenkyj is the lone returning field staff member from 2018. He is in his ninth season in the Indians organization. He holds degrees in physical education from Cleveland State and the University of Akron. **Twitter: @PaulSynenkyj**

We Are the RubberDucks

On October 29, 2013, team owner **Ken Bobby** stood before a capacity audience at the Akron Civic Theater and announced that the team would be known henceforth as the **Akron RubberDucks**. In addition to being symbolic of the fun, family-friendly brand of entertainment offered by minor league baseball, the name also honors Akron's long history as the "**Rubber Capital of the World.**" Brandiose Marketing of San Diego, California designed the team logo, colors, and various marks and insignias. Please note that for print coverage, *RubberDucks* is spelled as one word with a capital "D." In broadcast coverage, referring to the team as "*the Ducks*" is an acceptable variation of the team's nickname.
