# Dayton Dragons (14-27) at South Bend Cubs (23-17)

RH Ricky Salinas (1-0, 3.63) vs. LH Brailyn Marquez (1-0, 2.52)

Today's Game: The Dayton Dragons (affiliate of the Cincinnati Reds) meet the South Bend Cubs (affiliate of the Chicago Cubs) in the last game of a fourgame series. This is also the wrap-up to a seven-game road trip for Dayton. The Dragons are 1-2 in the series and 2-4 on the road trip. Streaks: The Dragons snapped a three-game losing streak last night. They have lost seven of their last nine after winning four of the previous six.

Last Game: <u>Saturday</u>: Dayton 4, South Bend 1. Shard Munroe hit a three-run home run and Brian Rey added a solo shot while four Dayton pitchers combined to allow just five hits and strikeout 14. The Cubs did not advance a runner past second base after the first inning. Munroe's home run broke a 1-1 tie in the fourth. Dayton finished with eight hits. Rey and Mariel Bautista each had two. The Dragons held an opponent to less than two runs for the first time since they shutout Fort Wayne on April 15. The Dayton bullpen trio of Carlos Machorro, Adrian Rodriguez, and Connor Bennett combined for 4.2 shutout innings.

#### Team Notes

- During this road trip (6 games, Monday-Saturday), the Dragons are batting .238 with a team ERA of 3.78. For the week, the team batting average ranks 10th in the league and the team ERA ranks tied for 6th. The team is 15th in the league in runs scored during this period.
- The Dragons team ERA in the current series with South Bend is 3.60. They have posted an ERA of under 4.00 in three of the previous four sets.
- The Dragons are 9-2 when holding the opponent to three runs or less.
- The Dragons are 0-7 in day games in 2019 and have been outscored 62-17, an average score of 8.9 to 2.4 per game.
- The Dragons are batting .192 in the month of May (18 games) with a .269 on-base percentage, a .286 slugging percentage, and an OPS of .555. They are averaging 5.9 hits and 2.8 runs per game. In the month, they rank 16th (last) in the league in runs scored, batting average, hits, doubles, total bases, on-base percentage, and slugging percentage. They are 15th in stolen bases (7 for 16) in May. They are fifth in home runs with 11. The team ERA in May is 4.47 (14th in the league during the month). The team record in May is 6-12.
- The Dragons have held the lead in 30 of their 41 games this season (and 16 of their 27 losses). They have lost 11 games in which they held a lead of at least two runs at some point during the game, and they have lost six games after leading by at least three runs. They have lost two games in which they led by four runs.
- In the six games when the Dragons lost despite leading by at least three runs, they scored a combined total of one run in 36 innings after reaching their largest lead.
- The Dragons have led in 11 of their 17 road losses and have led by multiple runs in nine.
- Dragons relievers have successfully converted 10 save opportunities this season and have been charged with eight blown saves. The Dragons have lost two road games in which they took a lead to the bottom of the ninth inning.

#### Individual Notes

- Shard Munroe has a seven-game hitting streak, going 7 for 25, .280.
- Juan Martinez is 7 for 22 (.318) with five walks over his last seven games. He has hit safely in four straight games.
- Pabel Manzanero on the current road trip: 6 for 17 (.353), 1 HR, 5 RBI in five games.
- Mariel Bautista has hit safely in four straight games, going 6 for 16 (.375).
- Ricky Salinas has made three starts in May, going 1-0 with a 2.70 ERA. He has struck out 22 in 13.1 innings.
- Reliever Connor Bennett in May: 2.00 ERA, 2 saves (9 IP, 2 ER, 15 SO).

\*Pabel Manzanero hit three home runs in a game on April 23 to become the fourth player in Dragons history to do so. He joins Wily Mo Pena (2001), Juan Francisco (2007), and Byron Wiley (2009).

\*Five members of the Dragons are rated among the Reds top 30 prospects (*Baseball America*). They are OF Michael Siani (#8); OF Mariel Bautista (#16); RHP Lyon Richardson (#17); RHP James Marinan (#19); and 3B Juan Martinez (#22). Additionally, SS Miguel Hernandez is ranked #25 by *Fangraphs.com*.

\*The Dragons roster includes the following players drafted within the first four rounds of the 40-round amateur draft: RHP Lyon Richardson, #2, 2018; OF Michael Siani, #4, 2018; and RHP James Marinan, #4, 2017 (by the Dodgers).

\*Three Dragons players were selected to play in the 2018 Pioneer League All-Star Game with Billings. They included RHP Jared Solomon, RHP Eddy Demurias, and C Pabel Manzanero. Solomon and OF Mariel Bautista were selected as Pioneer League Full-Season All-Stars.

\*The Dragons roster includes players from seven countries. It includes 12 players who make their home within the continental United States, one player from a U.S. territory (Puerto Rico), five players from Venezuela, two players from the Dominican Republic, two players from Mexico, one player from Canada, one player from the Bahamas, and one player from the island of Curacao.

### **Dragons Manager/Coaches:**

Luis Bolívar returns for his third season as Dragons manager after serving as the Dayton hitting coach in 2014-16. Bolívar played for the Dragons in 2003-'04, representing the club in the Midwest League All-Star Game in 2004. Bolívar played professionally for nine seasons from 2002-2010, spending all but the final year of his career in the Reds organization. He spent all or parts of four seasons at the Triple-A level, but never played in the big leagues. Bolívar resides in the Dayton suburb of Vandalia with his wife and four children. Following his playing career, he served as a coach at Vandalia-Butler High School. Bolívar was selected as the "Best Manager Prospect" in *Baseball America*'s 2017 Best Tools survey of Midwest League managers.

Pitching coach <u>Seth Etherton</u> returns to the Dragons for his second season in 2019, his fourth year as a coach in the Reds organization. Etherton spent the 2016-17 seasons with the Billings Mustangs. Etherton pitched in the Major Leagues in parts of four seasons with the Angels, Reds, A's, and Royals. He was the Angels first round draft pick in 1998 out of the University of Southern California. Etherton pitched in one game for the Dragons on a Major League rehab assignment in 2002.

Hitting coach <u>Mike Devereaux</u> joins the Dragons in 2019, his second year as a coach in the Reds organization. He served as the hitting coach for Double-A Pensacola in 2018. Previously, he was a coach for six years in the Rockies organization after two years in the Orioles system. Devereaux spent 12 years in the Major Leagues with the Orioles, Dodgers, Braves, White Sox, and Rangers. He was the MVP of the 1995 NLCS with Atlanta. In 1992 with Baltimore, he hit 24 home runs and drove in 107 runs, finishing seventh in the AL MVP voting.

Bench coach <u>Kevin Mahar</u> returns to the Dragons for his third season and sixth year as a coach in the Reds organization. He spent the 2013-14 seasons at Billings and 2015 at Advanced-A Daytona. He worked in private business in 2016. Mahar played college baseball at Indiana University and reached the Major Leagues with the Texas Rangers in 2007.
