RANCHO CUCAMONGA QUAKES (31-33) AT Lake Elsinore Storm (32-32)

RHP Tony Gonsolin (3-2, 3.12 ERA) vs. RHP Chris Paddack (3-1, 1.93 ERA)

TODAY'S GAME: The Quakes continue a four-game series in game two at The Diamond in Lake Elsinore taking on the Lake Elsinore Storm (San Diego Padres Affiliate). This is the second trip the Quakes have made to Lake Elsinore during the first-half schedule.

VS LAKE ELSINORE: This is the 16th of 31 overall meetings between the two clubs and the fifth of 14 games at The Diamond. The Quakes last met with the Storm in a four-game series at LoanMart Field 5/28-5/31 and won three-of-four against the South Division opponents. Starting pitchers Andrew Sopko, Dustin May and Tony Gonsolin all recorded wins as Rancho took the final three games of the set. This weeks series will mark the fifth and final time these two clubs meet over the course of the first-half schedule.

LAST TIME OUT: The Quakes pulled off a four-run comeback victory on Monday night, behind a season-high 18 hits, securing game one of the series over the Lake Elsinore Storm 8-7. Trailing 7-4 and down to their final three outs of the night, Rancho used four consecutive RBI-hits to spark a ninth inning rally and jump ahead for the second time in the game. Logan Landon and Omar Estevez reached safely to begin the ninth on an infield error and a single, respectively. Following a Connor Wong strikeout, the bottom third of the order would tie the game against incoming Storm reliever Colby Blueberg. Cody Thomas, Hamlet Marte and Saige Jenco smacked three straight RBI-singles to even the game back at 7-7. Leadoff man Gavin Lux capped the comeback with the go-ahead single, scoring Marte and vaulting Rancho to the 8-7 advantage. Lake Elsinore managed to put two men in scoring position with just one out in the bottom of the ninth, but closer Zach Pop locked in to retire Luis Torrens and Hudson Potts for the save. Stetson Allie (2-1) tossed a scoreless eighth inning and was positioned for this second win of the season

STORM CHASERS: On the offensive end, Cristian Santana and Jeren Kendall have shown the most success against Lake Elsinore pitching this season. Santana is batting .320 (16-for-50) with three doubles, two home runs and nine RBI's to go along with a team-high on-base percentage of .414. Kendall, is batting .277 (13-for-47), has a team-high eleven runs driven in and a slugging percentage of .532. Kendall hit a grand-slam against the Storm his last time out at The Diamond on 5/10.

ALL-STAR QUAKES: The Rancho Cucamonga Quakes will be represented quite well in this year's edition of the All-Star Game, as six players will head to Lancaster for the annual event. Of the six players, four of them will be in the starting lineup, as Gavin Lux will start at shortstop, Rylan Bannon will start at third base, Connor Wong will be the starting catcher and Logan Landon will man one of the starting outfield spots. In addition, pitchers Dean Kremer and Tony Gonsolin have also been named to the South Division squad.

ONE RUN NO FUN: Rancho has struggled in one-run games this season, going 6-14 in closely contested matchups. Rancho managed to come out on top in an 8-7 in the series opener on Monday, but of recent is 2-7 over the last nine games decided by a run.

CHASING THE TOP: The Quakes are rumbling at the right time, winners of nine of their last 13 games, while taking the upper hand in four of the last five series played. With six games left to play in the first-half schedule, Rancho is currently in a tie with Inland Empire for second place in the California League South Division, one games back of first-place Lake Elsinore.

RECENT ROSTER MOVES: Today, RHP Parker Curry has been activated from the temporarily inactive list. LHP Jason Richman has been transferred from triple-A Oklahoma City to Rancho Cucamonga. Richman pitched an inning for OKC on Saturday, allowing a run on three hits against Fresno. LHP Michael Boyle has been transferred from double-A Tulsa to Rancho Cucamonga. RHP Evy Ruibal and C Steve Berman have been transferred from Rancho Cucamonga to Extended Spring Training. RHP Andrew Istler has been transferred to double-A Tulsa of the Texas League.

GONSOLIN GOES: Tony Gonsolin (3-2) takes the ball in game one of the series for Rancho, making his 13th start on the season and fourth against Lake Elsinore. Gonsolin last faced the 66ers on 5/31 at LoanMart Field and tossed 6.1 shutout innings while allowing just two hits and striking out four in his third win of the season. In three prior outings against Lake Elsinore, Storm hitters are batting just .167 against Gonsolin with a lone triple being the only extra base hit against the right-hander. A Vacaville, CA native, Gonsolin was drafted in the ninth round of the 2016 draft out of the University of Saint Mary's in the West Coast Conference.

OPPOSING PITCHER: Chris Paddack (3-1) is scheduled to make his eighth start of the year for the Storm and third this season against Rancho. Paddack last faced the Quakes on 5/29 and allowed a season-high five runs over five total innings in his only loss of the season. Paddack has been masterful at limiting free baserunners this season with just two walks and 61 total strikeouts on the season. A Cedar Park, TX native, Paddack was drafted by the Marlins in the eighth round of the 2015 draft and was traded to the Padres in a one-for-one deal that sent Fernando Rodney to Miami.

REHABBERS: The Quakes have had three different Dodgers join the club as apart of major league rehab assignment this season. Dodgers INF Justin Turner joined the Quakes along with INF Logan Forsythe in a weekend series vs. Visalia. Turner was 0-for-6 at the plate while Forsythe finished 1-for-10 with a double during their time in Rancho. Yasiel Puig joined the club on rehab assignment Tuesday (5/8) in Lake Elsinore. Puig was 0-for-4 at the plate and was removed from the game in the seventh inning.

FAMILIAR FACES ON THE FARM: A total of 16 former Quakes returned to Rancho Cucamonga to start the 2018 campaign, including 12 of the 14 original pitchers on the roster. Jordan Sheffield and Tony Gonsolin, ranked 17th and 23rd in the Dodgers' system, by MLB Pipeline.com, return to the Quakes to help anchor the rotation. Former Quakes Dean Kremer, Issac Anderson and Andrew Sopko will also pitch out of the rotation. The bullpen began the year made up entirely of former Quakes, with Stetson Allie, Chris Matthewson, Parker Curry, Andrew Istler, Nolan Long, Ryan Moseley and Jason Richman making up the relief core. California League 2017 All-Star Ibandel Isabel, who mashed 28 home runs for last year's club, returned to the Quakes for a second year but was traded to the Cincinnati Reds. He was joined by returning infielder Omar Estevez and outfielder Logan Landon.

SAME SKIPPER, NEW STAFF: The skipper of the Quakes for a third consecutive year is Manager Drew Saylor, who has led the team to the Cal League Playoffs in each of the last two seasons. Saylor, whose team went 76-64 last season, is just the third manager in team history to lead the team for three seasons (Mike Basso 1996-1998, Bobby Meacham 2002-2004). The hitting coach is Justin Viele, a Fullerton native who enters his second year with the Dodgers. In 2017, the former Santa Clara Bronco was the hitting coach for the Ogden Raptors of the Pioneer League. Taking over pitching coach duties is Connor McGuiness who also enters his second year in the Dodgers' system. Last season, the Arlington, Virginia native worked in the same role for the Great Lakes Loons of the Midwest League, after spending three of the four previous years working for his alma mater, Emory University. The final member of Saylor's staff is assistant coach Petie Montero, another second-year member of the Dodgers' system, who coached in the DSL last year.

NINE & ON TIME: The Quakes are the only team in the California League that have yet to play an extra-inning game under the new MilB rules this season. As a result, Rancho has completed all games in under four hours with the longest contest clocking in at 3:49 vs. Inland Empire on April 14th. April 14th marked the closest the Quakes have come to playing extras, tied at 6-6 in the ninth inning, Rancho scored the game-winning run in the bottom half and secured their first walk-off win of the season.

BY THE NUMBERS

Gavin Lux's 12-game hitting streak was the longest by any Quake this season. Lux passed Rylan Bannon who held the previous season long streak of eleven games. Over the stretch (Apr 26-5/11), Lux was 23-for-51 at the plate with six-multi hit games during the streak.

Starting pitcher Dean Kremer currently leads the California League with 90 strikeouts over his first 13 starts of the season. Kremer set a career high with ten strikeouts in a start against Inland Empire on 5/27. The UNLV product totaled 46 strikeouts across 29.2 total innings pitched in the month of May.

The Quakes RBI-Leader Cristian Santana has been one of the most effective hitters with runner in scoring position this season. 28 of his 40 RBI's have come with RISP where he is batting at a .247 clip over those situations. With the bases loaded, Santana's average jumps to .300 where he is 3-for-10 with 9 RBI's.
