Jumbo Shrimp Announce Opening Day Roster: 17 of the 25 players on the roster have played for Jacksonville before, including three members of Jacksonville's starting rotation. Peters, listed by Baseball America as the No. 5 Marlins prospect, was 3-0 with a 1.99 ERA in four starts. Left-handed pitcher Matt Tomshaw and right-handed pitcher Chris Mazza return from Jacksonville's 2016 rotation, while the rotation is rounded out by Marlins organization newcomers in right-hander Omar Bencomo and left-handed pitcher Mike Kickham. The Jumbo Shrimp bullpen is highlighted by left-hander Jarlin Garcia, who is a member of the Marlins 40-man roster and the No. 6 Marlins prospect according to Baseball America. James Buckelew is the other left-handed pitching option for the Jumbo Shrimp out of the bullpen. Right-hander Tayron Guerrero returns for the bullpen, as he is also a member of the Marlins 40-man roster and the No. 16 Marlins prospect according to Baseball America. Other right-handed relievers include Jacksonville returners Hunter Adkins, 2016 Southern League All-Star Tyler Bremer, Tyler Higgins, and Tyler Kinley, with newcomer Victor Payano, who previously pitched in the Texas Rangers organization. Austin Nola returns to Jacksonville in 2017, however this time he will be primary catcher for the Jumbo Shrimp. Nola previously played in Jacksonville in 2014 and 2015 as a shortstop and helped lead Jacksonville to the 2014 Southern League championship. Cam Maron, who hit .302 with Jacksonville last year, also returns a catcher for the Jumbo Shrimp. The infield is led by Marlins No. 4 prospect Brian Anderson at third base. Anderson played in Jacksonville during the second half of last season, and was named the 2016 Marlins Minor League Player of the Year. Yefri Perez also returns to play some second base and shortstop, the speedster made his major league debut by playing in 12 games in Miami last year. Taylor Ard, K.C. Serna, Alex Yarbrough, and Southern League veteran David Vidal will all see playing time in the Shrimp infield to begin the season. In the outfield, 2016 All-Star Austin Dean returns to play in left. Jeremias Pineda and Alex Glenn while Marlins No. 29 prospect John Norwood makes his Jacksonville debut in 2017.

NEWS AND NOTES

First Game in Jumbo Shrimp History: Today is a historic day for the Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp, playing the first game of the inaugural season of Jumbo Shrimp baseball. Owner Ken Babby announced the name change from Jacksonville Suns to Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp on Nov. 2, 2016 at the Times-Union Center for the Performing arts in downtown Jacksonville. The new Jumbo Shrimp name celebrates Jacksonville as a big small town - Florida's largest city, yet in many ways a richly connected and close-knit community. Embodying the city's determination and resilience, the centerpiece of the new identity is a tenacious Jumbo Shrimp in the shape of a "J" amid the water that is the natural geography of the River City on the First Coast. A Jumbo Shrimp holding the state of Florida is a secondary mark. A third logo is the Shrimp Boil mark celebrating affordable family fun with the resilient Jumbo Shrimp fighting his way out of a caldron. St. Johns Navy, Patriotic Blue, American Red and Shrimp make up the team's new official colors, paying tribute to Jacksonville's rich military heritage.

Ready to Manage: Randy Ready is in his first season as the Jumbo Shrimp manager in 2017. Last year was Ready's first in the Miami Marlins organization, and he led High-A Jupiter to a 68-69 record overall and a 37-32 mark in the second half of the Florida State League season. Ready's field staff features all newcomers to Jacksonville in hitting coach Jesus Merchan, pitching coach Storm Davis, and coach Jose Ceballos. A sixth-round draft pick in 1980 by the Milwaukee Brewers, Ready appeared in 777 big league games over parts of 13 Major League seasons with Milwaukee (1983-86), San Diego (1986-89), Philadelphia (1989-91, 1994-95), Oakland (1992) and Montreal (1993) while batting .259 with 40 home runs and 239 RBI.

Shrimp Have Prospects: On the Opening Day roster, the Jumbo Shrimp have seven players that are considered among the Top 30 Marlins prospects for this season according to both Baseball America and MLB.com. Top 30 Marlins Prospects include: third baseman Brian Anderson (No. 3 MLB, No. 4 BA), left-handed pitcher Jarlin Garcia (No. 4 MLB, No. 6 BA), left-handed pitcher Dillon Peters (No. 5 MLB, No. 5 BA), left fielder Austin Dean (No. 13 MLB, No. 8 BA), right-handed pitcher Tayron Guerrero (No. 19 MLB, No. 16 BA), outfielder John Norwood (No. 27 MLB, No. 29 BA), and infielder Yefri Perez (No. 30 both MLB & BA). Additionally, Baseball America regards Anderson as being the "Best Hitter for Average, Best Strike-Zone Discipline, Best Defensive Infielder, Best Infield Arm," in the organization, while Garcia has the "Best Changeup," Perez is the "Fastest Baserunner," and Peters has the "Best Control."

Facing the Braves: Last season Jacksonville went 9-11 against the Mississippi Braves. The then-Suns were 5-5 against the M-Braves at Trustmark Park, where tonight's series begins. Jacksonville took the first series in Mississippi in late May, winning three out of five games, before a series loss to the M-Braves in late June, where Mississippi won three out of five games. In Jacksonville, the club had a losing mark against Mississippi, going 4-6 against the M-Braves. Yefri Perez was one of the best Jacksonville players against the M-Braves, hitting .294 with seven RBI and nine stolen bases in 14 games. Dillon Peters also won his start against the M-Braves last year, and Matt Tomshaw turned in six innings where he only allowed a run on three hits against Mississippi last season.

TONIGHT-OPENING NIGHT STARTER: Tonight Dillon Peters takes the mound for Jacksonville as the first Opening Night starter in the history of the Jumbo Shrimp. This marks the first time in Peters' career he has been an Opening Night starter, last season he made his debut on April 11 where he had a no decision for the High-A Jupiter Hammerheads at Lakeland. Peters in that outing worked three and two-third innings allowing three runs on five hits with a walk and two strikeouts in a game the Hammerheads won 6-4.

2016 VS. M-BRAVES: Peters won his only start against Mississippi last year on August 15 at the Baseball Grounds. Peters went six innings allowing a run on four hits with no walks and five strikeouts as Jacksonville won 5-1.

2017 MARLINS SPRING TRAINING: Dillon Peters was a non-roster invitee to Miami Marlins spring training in 2017. Peters made four appearances and one start, going 0-0 with a 2.00 ERA, striking out four batters in his nine innings of work. In his start on March 9 against the Washington Nationals and their regular lineup, Peters walked the leadoff batter (Trea Turner) before setting down the next nine batters (Adam Eaton, Bryce Harper, Anthony Rendon, Jayson Werth, Ryan Zimmerman, Jose Lobaton, Grant Green, Stephen Drew, then Turner to end his day.

DON MATTINGLY ON PETERS: "I think we see a guy that is confident," Marlins manager Don Mattingly said about Peters in spring training. "He's on the attack out there. He doesn't look like a guy that is afraid at all. I heard about him all last year. Our guys in development really like him. In camp, they're proven to be right. He's a guy that's aggressive. He has good stuff."

PROSPECT: Peters is listed by Baseball America as the Marlins No. 5 prospect for the 2017 season and MLB.com has him as Miami's No. 5 for this year. Additionally, Peters is regarded as having the "Best Control" of any Marlins farmhand. Peters is regarded as the second-best left-handed pitching prospect in the Marlins organization behind No. 1 prospect Braxton Garrett, whom was drafted just last season and has not pitched professionally.

2016 WITH JACKSONVILLE: Peters finished the 2016 season with Jacksonville where he went 3-0 with a 1.99 ERA in four starts. Peters earned wins in his first three Suns starts, with victories against Chattanooga, Mississippi, and Tennessee. Peters struck out 16 batters in his 22 and two-thirds innings of work with Jacksonville.

2016 WITH JUPITER: Peters with the High-A Jupiter Hammerheads was 11-6 with a 2.46 ERA in 20 starts. In the Florida State League, Peters was sixth in ERA (2.46), and tied for second in wins (11). Following the season, Peters was named a 2016 Florida State League Postseason All-Star.

2015 Highlights: Peters went 1-1 with a 0.68 ERA in four starts for the GCL Marlins. He also went 0-3 with a 4.83 ERA in seven starts with rookie level Batavia.

2014 Highlights: Did not pitch, injured.

Personal: Was selected by the Marlins after he already had missed time with an elbow injury and had to undergo Tommy John surgery following the 2014 Big XII Tournament. Agreed to a \$175,000 signing bonus with Marlins. Was 7-3 with a 2.31 ERA in final season with Texas Longhorns. Tossed seven innings in a combined no-hitter against Kansas State on May 16, 2014. Was Indiana All-State in 2009 and 2010, and was the 2010 Indiana Super Team Player of the Year. His grandfather pitched semipro ball, and his father Mark pitched in college and coached Peters in travel ball. Was originally drafted by the Cleveland Indians in the 20th round in 2011 before he signed with Texas.
