Las Vegas 51^s/New York Mets Affiliation: The 51^s and Mets, on August 28, 2014, announced the renewal of their Player Development Contract through the 2016 season...the PDC, on August 30, 2016, was then extended for two more seasons through 2018...the Las Vegas Stars/51^s have captured the PCL Championship twice (1986 & 1988) and appeared in the playoffs 10 times (19-29 record, .396), last appeared in 2014. Las Vegas was the 2013 & 2014 Pacific Southern Division Champions.

2016 PCL PITCHER OF THE WEEK – Right-hander **Rafael Montero** (May 9-15) was named the PCL Pitcher of the Week on May 16...made two road starts and didn't allow a run in 11.2 innings pitched vs. Sacramento (May 9) and Oklahoma City (May 14).

FOUR STRAIGHT "WINNING SEASONS" – Las Vegas recorded a franchise record four straight seasons over the .500 mark: 2012 (79-64, .552); 2013 (81-63, .563); 2014 (81-63, .563); 2015 (77-67, .535)...the streak was snapped in 2016 (70-74, .486).

LAS VEGAS 80-WIN SEASONS – The Las Vegas franchise has won 80 or more games in a season five times: **85** (2002, franchise best 85-59 record (.590); **83** (1983 inaugural season, 83-60 (.580); **81** (81-63, .563 in 2013); **81** (81-63, .563 in 2014); **80** (1986 PCL champions with an 80-62 mark (.563)...Las Vegas recorded back-to-back 80-win seasons for the first time in franchise history (2013 & 2014).

NEW YORK METS NICKNAME: The "**METS**" Nickname: The name Mets was judged by club owner Mrs. Joan Payson as the one that best met five basic criteria: 1. It met public and press acceptance; 2. It was closely related to the team's corporate name (Metropolitan Baseball Club, Inc.); 3. It was descriptive of the Metropolitan area; 4. It had a brevity that delighted copy readers everywhere; 5. It had historical background, referring to the Metropolitans of the 19th century American Association....other names considered included: Rebels, Skyliners, NYBs, Burros (for the five boroughs), Continentals, Avengers...as well as Jets and Islanders, names that would eventually find their way into the New York sports scene...the Mets inaugural season was in 1962.

51^s on Radio in 2016: **Russ Langer** broadcast all 144 games on **NBC Sports Radio AM 920 'The Game'** and on www.LV51.com. Langer completed his 17th season behind the mike...he is a 10-time recipient of the Nevada Sportscaster of the Year award (2003, 2005, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2015) presented by the National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association...also worked a total of 30 Montreal Expos games during the 2003 and 2004 seasons...in 2006, Langer was hired for additional major league duty by the Baltimore Orioles and broadcast 10 games on a fill-in basis during the course of the season...has also broadcast selected Los Angeles Dodgers Spring Training games in March of 2006 and in Arizona in March of 2008 and with the Toronto Blue Jays in 2009 and 2010 and Chicago White Sox in 2012-16...also broadcast the action for the 2016 Triple-A All-Star Game Radio Network from Charlotte on July 13...in 2015, Langer also completed his fourth season as the radio "play-by-play voice" for the UNLV Football team on the UNLV/IMG Sports Network.

ROBERT J. BLUM BROADCAST BOOTH AT CASHMAN FIELD:

The "51s Home Radio Booth" was renamed the "**Robert J. Blum Broadcast Booth**" prior to the 2013 season to honor the 51s Special Assistant to the General Manager..."The Blummer" passed away on July 22, 2012 at the age of 91...also served as the play-by-play voice for Stars/51^s baseball in selected seasons from 1985-2005 & 2008-10...his company, Robert J. Blum Productions, also produced Las Vegas Triple-A professional baseball games broadcast on radio and television for several seasons.

51^s Manager Wally Backman: He was named the 22nd manager (January 7, 2013) in the history of the Las Vegas franchise (1983 - present, 33 seasons). **Career Summary:** He completed his fifth season as manager on the Triple-A level and his seventh season with the Mets organization since his playing days...career minor league managerial record in 14 seasons is 910-831 (.523)...led the Lancaster Jethawks (Single-A) of the California League to a 86-54 record during the 2004 campaign and was named Minor League Manager of the Year by *The Sporting News*.

Named (on June 16) manager of the PCL All-Star Team for the 29th Annual Triple-A All-Star Game on July 13, 2016

Minor League Coaching Career: Compiled a 910-831 (.523) record in 14 seasons as a minor league manager in the Chicago White Sox, Arizona and New York Mets organizations from 2001-04 & 2010-16 and three seasons in the

Independent League (2007-09)...in 2016, the 51^s compiled an overall record of 70-74 (.486) and finished in third place in the Pacific Southern Division... in 2015, Triple-A Las Vegas compiled an overall record of 77-67 (.535) and finished in second place in the Southern Division...in 2014, Backman was named the PCL Manager of the Year and guided Triple-A Las Vegas to a second straight PCL playoff appearance with an 81-63 record (.563)...in 2013, he guided Las Vegas to the second-best record in the 16-team PCL with an 81-63 (.563) mark...the 51^s advanced to the PCL Playoffs for the first time in 11 seasons (2002)...in 2012, Triple-A Buffalo, of the International League, compiled a 67-76 (.469) record in his inaugural season...in 2011, he led Double-A Binghamton of the Eastern League to a 65-76 (.461) mark and, in 2010, managed Single-A Brooklyn of the New York-Penn League to a 51-24 record (.680) and the Cyclones captured the McNamara Division title...managed the Joliet JackHammers of the Independent Northern League for two seasons (2008 & 2009)...returned to baseball in 2007 as skipper of the South Georgia Peanuts of the Independent South Coast League and led the team to the league title and was featured on a TV documentary called "Playing for Peanuts."...led the Lancaster Jethawks (Single-A) of the California League to a 86-54 record during the 2004 campaign and was named Minor League Manager of the Year by *The Sporting News*...began his managerial career in 2001 with the Chicago White Sox organization at the helm of Single-A Winston-Salem of the Carolina League...spent two seasons with Double-A Birmingham (2002-03) of the Southern League and led the team to the 2002 League Championship.

Playing Career: Played 14 seasons in the Major Leagues as an infielder (2B, SS, 3B) with the New York Mets (1980-88), Minnesota (1989), Pittsburgh (1990), Philadelphia (1991-92) and Seattle (1993)...appeared in 1,102 games and batted .275 (893-for-3,245) with 138 doubles, 19 triples, 10 home runs, 240 RBI and 117 stolen bases in 169 attempts...was a member of the 1986 Mets World Series championship team and hit a career-high .320 (124-for-387) during the season...recorded back-to-back seasons of 30 stolen bases or more in 1984 & 1985 (32 stolen bases in 41 attempts & 30 SB's in 42 attempts)...in 1990, as a member of Pittsburgh, he collected six hits in a game on April 27 vs. San Diego...was selected by the Mets in the first round (16th overall pick) of the 1977 Major League Baseball Draft out of Aloha High School in Hillsboro, Oregon.

Personal: Walter Wayne Backman...graduated from Aloha High School in Hillsboro, Oregon...was inducted into the Oregon Sports Hall of Fame in 2002.

51^s Coaching Staff: Jack Voigt completed his 11th season overall in the Mets organization and his second season as the hitting instructor for Triple-A Las Vegas...he served four seasons as the organization's outfield and baserunning coordinator (2011-14). **Minor League Coaching Career:** Spent the previous four seasons as the Mets organization's outfield and baserunning coordinator (2011-14)...served as hitting coach for Triple-A Buffalo of the International League in 2010 and served in the same role for Single-A Brooklyn of the New York-Penn League in 2009...in 2004, he was a minor league roving baserunning and bunting coach in the Atlanta organization and served as baserunning and outfield coordinator for Baltimore in 2003...also managed Baltimore's Single-A Frederick affiliate of the Carolina League in 2002 and was the hitting coach for Frederick in 2001...began his coaching career in 2000 as a player/coach with Triple-A Oklahoma City of the Pacific Coast League...served as hitting coach for Magallanes of the Venezuelan Winter League for two seasons (2012-13) and the team captured the championship and advanced to the Caribbean World Series.

Major League Coaching Career: Worked with the Washington Nationals in 2005 on manager Frank Robinson's coaching staff. He then joined the Mets organization in 2006 as a major league advance scout. **Major League Playing Career:** Was selected by Baltimore in the ninth round of the 1987 Amateur Draft...played six seasons in the Major Leagues with Baltimore (1993-95), Texas (1995-96), Milwaukee (1997) and Oakland (1998)...appeared in 294 career games and batted .235 (138-for-588) with 20 home runs and 83 RBI...attended Louisiana State University (Baton Rouge) for three years (1985-87) and played in the 1987 College World Series and was named to the All-CWS Team.

Frank Viola completed his third season as the pitching coach at Triple-A Las Vegas and also his sixth season overall with the Mets organization. **Minor League Coaching Career:** Spent two seasons as the pitching coach at Single-A Savannah of the South Atlantic League (2012-13)...in 2013, the Sand Gnats compiled an overall record of 77-61 (.558) and defeated Hagerstown (3-games-to-1) to capture the SAL Championship...began his coaching career in 2011 with the Mets as the pitching coach with Single-A Brooklyn of the New York-Penn League. **Major League Playing Career:** Enjoyed an outstanding 15-year Major League career with Minnesota (1982-89), New York Mets (1989-91), Boston (1992-94), Cincinnati (1995) and Toronto (1996)...the left-hander appeared in 421 career games and posted a 176-150 record with a 3.73 ERA...struck out 1,844 batters in 2,836.1 innings pitched...the three-time All-Star went 20-12 with a 2.67 ERA in 249.2 innings pitched for the Mets in 1990...was a member of the 1987 World Series Champion Minnesota Twins and the World Series MVP that same season (2-1, 3.72 ERA vs. St. Louis)...won the Cy Young Award in 1988 with a career-best 24-7 record and a 2.64 ERA in 255.1 innings pitched...also posted 18 wins in a season twice in 1984 (18-12) and 1985 (18-14)...was selected by Minnesota in the second round of the 1981 Major League Baseball Draft...attended St. John's University...will be inducted into the 2015 National College Baseball Hall of Fame, eight-man Class, on June 28-29.
