51^s vs. Aces: The Las Vegas 51^s professional baseball team, Triple-A affiliate of the New York Mets, will face intrastate rival, the Reno Aces, Triple-A affiliate of the Arizona Diamondbacks, this afternoon in game two of the four-game series in Pacific Coast League action at Greater Nevada Field (9,100)...Las Vegas dropped the series opener, 8-0, last night...the brief four-game road trip to Northern Nevada will conclude on Tuesday afternoon...the next scheduled off day for the PCL is Wednesday, June 21...the 51^s will then open a brief four-game homestand on Thursday, June 22 against the Salt Lake Bees, Triple-A affiliate of the L.A. Angels.

Reno defeats Las Vegas 8-0 in series opener: The Aces defeated the 51^s 8-0 last night in the opener of the brief four-game road trip before a crowd of 8,282 at Greater Nevada Field.

Las Vegas offense: The 51^s recorded 5 hits and were shutout for the fourth time this season (all four times on the road). Second baseman **Phillip Evans** was 1-for-3, double; first baseman **Dominic Smith** was 1-for-3, walk and third baseman **Jio Mier** was 1-for-3.

Reno offense: The Aces recorded 11 hits and built an 8-0 lead after seven innings. First baseman **Christian Walker** was 3-for-5, double, triple, two runs scored; catcher **Hank Conger** was 2-for-4, double, HR (two-run in 7th), 4 RBI and second baseman **Jack Reinheimer** was 2-for-4, double, 2 RBI, two runs scored.

Las Vegas pitching: Right-hander **Logan Taylor** pitched 2 shutout innings in the no decision. He allowed 1 hit and walked 1 on 29 pitches (15 strikes).

51^s Bullpen: Left-hander **Kyle Regnault** pitched 2.2 shutout innings and allowed 2 hits and walked 1. Right-hander **Ben Rowen** pitched 0.2 innings and allowed 3 hits, 3 runs and struck out 1. Las Vegas defeats Sacramento 13-2 in series opener (Tuesday, June 13): The 51^s defeated the River Cats 13-2 in the opener of the brief four-game homestand before a crowd of 3,707 at Cashman Field.

Las Vegas offense: The 51^s recorded 11 hits and built a 7-2 lead after five innings. Catcher **Kevin Plawecki** was 3-for-5, three runs scored, double, two home runs (solo in 3rd; 2-run in 5th), 5 RBI. Shortstop **Amed Rosario** was 2-for-5, two runs scored, stolen base, two-run homer in the third inning and third baseman **Matt Reynolds** was 1-for-3, two walks, three runs scored, solo homer in the sixth inning.

51^s BRIEFINGS – Las Vegas dropped the series opener, 8-0, to Reno last night...the brief four-game road trip in Northern Nevada against intrastate rival, the Aces, Triple-A affiliate of the Arizona Diamondbacks, will conclude on Tuesday afternoon...Reno has the best record in the 16-team PCL (43-26, .623)...the next scheduled off day for the PCL is Wednesday, June 21...Las Vegas will then return to Cashman Field and host the Salt Lake Bees, Triple-A affiliate of the Los Angeles Angels, in a brief four-game homestand from Thursday-Sunday, June 22-25.

JUNE ON THE ROAD: Las Vegas will play 20 of the scheduled 28 games on the road.

SILVER STATE DIAMOND CHALLENGE: In 2009, Las Vegas and Reno developed the **Silver State Diamond Challenge** and the “**Silver Plate Trophy**” to add to the excitement to the rivalry for the two PCL teams that represent the state of Nevada...Reno defeated Las Vegas, 3-games-to-1, in the 2015 PCL Conference Championship Series. **The 2017 campaign will mark the ninth season of the S.S.D.C.**

35 SEASONS IN THE SILVER STATE - The 51^s are playing in their 35th Pacific Coast League season in the Silver State...the Las Vegas 51^s have the proud distinction of being the longest enduring franchise in the history of professional sports in the state of Nevada...Las Vegas Triple-A baseball was born on April 10, 1983 before a crowd of 10,622 at Cashman Field (Las Vegas defeated Salt Lake City, 11-8).

1-2-3! – Ah 1, Ah 2, Ah 3...Las Vegas boasted the **TOP 3** hitters in the PCL (2016) for the second time in the 34-year franchise history (1983-2016): **T.J. Rivera** (.353, batting champion), **Brandon Nimmo** (.352), **Gavin Cecchini** (.325)...the 1985 Las Vegas Stars also recorded the **TOP 3** hitters in the PCL: **John Kruk** (.351, batting champion), **Rusty Tillman** (.337), **Ray Smith** (.325).

FOUR STRAIGHT “WINNING SEASONS” SNAPPED – Las Vegas recorded a franchise record four straight seasons over the .500 mark: 2012 (79-64, .552); 2013 (81-63, .563); 2014 (81-63, .563); 2015 (77-67, .535)...the streak was snapped in 2016 with a record of 70-74 (.486) and a third place finish in the Pacific Southern Division.

LAS VEGAS 80-WIN SEASONS – The Las Vegas franchise has won 80 or more games in a season five times: **85** (2002, franchise best 85-59 record (.590); **83** (1983 inaugural season, 83-60 (.580); **81** (81-63, .563 in 2013); **81** (81-63, .563 in 2014); **80** (1986 PCL champions with an 80-62 mark (.563)...Las Vegas recorded back-to-back 80-win seasons for the first time in franchise history (2013 & 2014).

NEW YORK METS NICKNAME: The “**METS**” Nickname: The name Mets was judged by club owner Mrs. Joan Payson as the one that best met five basic criteria: 1. It met public and press acceptance; 2. It was closely related to the team’s corporate name (Metropolitan Baseball Club, Inc.); 3. It was descriptive of the Metropolitan area; 4. It had a brevity that delighted copy readers everywhere; 5. It had historical background, referring to the Metropolitans of the 19th century American Association....other names considered included: Rebels, Skyliners, NYBs, Burros (for the five boroughs), Continentals, Avengers...as well as Jets and Islanders, names that would eventually find their way into the New York sports scene...the Mets inaugural season was in 1962.

51^s on Radio in 2017: Russ Langer will broadcast all 142, games on **NBC Sports Radio AM 920 'The Game'** and on www.LV51.com. Langer is in his 18th season behind the mike...he is a 10-time recipient of the Nevada Sportscaster of the Year award (2003, 2005, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2015) presented by the National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association...also worked a total of 30 Montreal Expos games during the 2003 and 2004 seasons...in 2006, Langer was hired for additional major league duty by the Baltimore Orioles and broadcast 10 games on a fill-in basis during the course of the season...has also broadcast selected Los Angeles Dodgers Spring Training games in March of 2006 and in Arizona in March of 2008 and with the Toronto Blue Jays in 2009 and 2010 and Chicago White Sox in 2012-17...also broadcast the action for the 2016 Triple-A All-Star Game Radio Network from Charlotte, North Carolina...in 2016, Langer also completed his fifth season as the radio "play-by-play voice" for the UNLV Football team on the UNLV/IMG Sports Network.

ROBERT J. BLUM BROADCAST BOOTH AT CASHMAN FIELD:

The "51s Home Radio Booth" was renamed the "**Robert J. Blum Broadcast Booth**" prior to the 2013 season to honor the 51s Special Assistant to the General Manager..."The Blummer" passed away on July 22, 2012 at the age of 91...also served as the play-by-play voice for Stars/51^s baseball in selected seasons from 1985-2005 & 2008-10...his company, Robert J. Blum Productions, also produced Las Vegas Triple-A professional baseball games broadcast on radio and television for several seasons.

51^s Manager Pedro Lopez: He was named the 23rd manager (December 5, 2016) in the history of the Las Vegas franchise (1983 - present, 34 seasons). **Career Summary:** Enters his first season as manager on the Triple-A level and his 10th season with the Mets organization (2008-17)...career minor league managerial record in 16 seasons (**current**) is 836-782 (.517)...spent the previous five seasons as manager of Double-A Binghamton of the Eastern League (2012-16)...compiled a five-year regular season record of 377-329 (.534)...Lopez was inducted into the Binghamton Baseball Shrine on September 6, 2015 after becoming the all-time winningest manager in team history with then-320 (regular season and postseason) victories as skipper of the BMets (now the Rumble Ponies)...became the first active manager or player to be inducted into Binghamton's Baseball Shrine...was named the 2013 Eastern League Manager of the Year after leading Binghamton to a franchise record 86-55 record (.610) and a trip to the postseason...then spent the final three weeks of September serving as coach for the Mets...in 2014, he guided Binghamton to an 83-59 record (.585) and the BMets captured the EL Championship with a three-game sweep of Richmond...guided Binghamton to three straight EL playoff appearances (2013-15) for the first time in franchise history.

Minor League Coaching Career: Compiled an 836-782 (.517) record (**current**) in 16 seasons in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, '07) and New York Mets organizations (2008-17)...has spent the previous five seasons as manager of Double-A Binghamton of the Eastern League and compiled a five-year regular season record of 377-329 (.534)...began his career with the Mets as a coach/manager with Single-A Kingsport of the Appalachian League in 2008...then was the manager of Single-A Brooklyn of the New York-Penn League in 2009 and compiled a 45-30 record (.600) and led the Cyclones to the playoffs...held the same position with Single-A Savannah in 2010 (75-64, .540, playoff appearance) and served as manager of Single-A St. Lucie of the Florida State League in 2011 (72-68, .514, South Division Champions)...prior to joining the Mets organization, he managed and coached in the Texas Rangers' farm system from 2000-07...in 2007, he was the manager of the Rangers Arizona League (Rookie) team, after serving in the same role from 2003-05...in 2006, he was the hitting coach for Single-A Bakersfield of the California League...in 2002, he managed Single-A Pulaski of the Appalachian League and in 2001 with Single-A Savannah.

Professional Playing Career: He was selected by the San Diego Padres in the 21st round of the 1988 Major League Baseball Draft out of Arizona Western College in Yuma, Arizona...played in a total of 13 seasons in the minor leagues, six of those seasons in the Padres organization as a catcher and was a member of the Triple-A Las Vegas Stars in 1994...won a Texas League championship under manager and former Stars player **Bruce Bochy** with Double-A Wichita in 1992...then joined the Milwaukee organization as a minor league free agent in 1995, spending parts of two seasons at Triple-A before eventually ending his playing career with Houston (Triple-A New Orleans) in 2000...appeared in 909 career games and batted .247 (690-for-2,796) with 134 doubles, 16 triples, 49 home runs and 338 RBI.

51^s Coaching Staff: Jack Voigt is in his 12th season overall in the Mets organization and his third season as the hitting instructor for Triple-A Las Vegas...named to the PCL coaching staff (on June 14) for the 2017 Triple-A All-Star Game...in 2016, Las Vegas boasted the **TOP 3** hitters in the PCL for the second time in the 34-year franchise history (1983-2016): **T.J. Rivera** (.353, batting champion), **Brandon Nimmo** (.352), **Gavin Cecchini** (.325)...he served four seasons as the organization's outfield and baserunning coordinator (2011-14). **Minor League Coaching Career:** Spent four seasons as the Mets organization's outfield and baserunning coordinator (2011-14)...served as hitting coach

for Triple-A Buffalo of the International League in 2010 and served in the same role for Single-A Brooklyn of the New York-Penn League in 2009...in 2004, he was a minor league roving baserunning and bunting coach in the Atlanta organization and served as baserunning and outfield coordinator for Baltimore in 2003...also managed Baltimore's Single-A Frederick affiliate of the Carolina League in 2002 and was the hitting coach for Frederick in 2001...began his coaching career in 2000 as a player/coach with Triple-A Oklahoma City of the Pacific Coast League...served as hitting coach for Magallanes of the Venezuelan Winter League for two seasons (2012-13) and the team captured the championship and advanced to the Caribbean World Series.

Major League Coaching Career: Worked with the Washington Nationals in 2005 on manager Frank Robinson's coaching staff. He then joined the Mets organization in 2006 as a major league advance scout. **Major League Playing Career:** Was selected by Baltimore in the ninth round of the 1987 Amateur Draft...played six seasons in the Major Leagues with Baltimore (1993-95), Texas (1995-96), Milwaukee (1997) and Oakland (1998)...appeared in 294 career games and batted .235 (138-for-588) with 20 home runs and 83 RBI...attended Louisiana State University (Baton Rouge) for three years (1985-87) and played in the 1987 College World Series and was named to the All-CWS Team.

Frank Viola is in his fourth season as the pitching coach at Triple-A Las Vegas and his seventh season overall with the Mets organization. In 2014, the 51^s pitching staff established a franchise record with 1,172 strikeouts.

Minor League Coaching Career: Spent two seasons as the pitching coach at Single-A Savannah of the South Atlantic League (2012-13)...in 2013, the Sand Gnats compiled an overall record of 77-61 (.558) and defeated Hagerstown (3-games-to-1) to capture the SAL Championship...began his coaching career in 2011 with the Mets as the pitching coach with Single-A Brooklyn of the New York-Penn League. **Major League Playing Career:** Enjoyed an outstanding 15-year Major League career with Minnesota (1982-89), New York Mets (1989-91), Boston (1992-94), Cincinnati (1995) and Toronto (1996)...the left-hander appeared in 421 career games and posted a 176-150 record with a 3.73 ERA...struck out 1,844 batters in 2,836.1 innings pitched...the three-time All-Star went 20-12 with a 2.67 ERA in 249.2 innings pitched for the Mets in 1990...was a member of the 1987 World Series Champion Minnesota Twins and the World Series MVP that same season (2-1, 3.72 ERA vs. St. Louis)...won the Cy Young Award in 1988 with a career-best 24-7 record and a 2.64 ERA in 255.1 innings pitched...also posted 18 wins in a season twice in 1984 (18-12) and 1985 (18-14)...was selected by Minnesota in the second round of the 1981 Major League Baseball Draft...attended St. John's University...was inducted into the 2015 National College Baseball Hall of Fame, eight-man Class, on June 29.
