**Las Vegas 51<sup>s</sup>/New York Mets Affiliation:** The 51<sup>s</sup> and Mets, on August 28, 2014, announced the renewal of their Player Development Contract through the 2016 season...the PDC, on August 30, 2016, was then extended for two more seasons through 2018\*...the Las Vegas Stars/51<sup>s</sup> have captured the PCL Championship twice (1986 & 1988) and appeared in the playoffs 10 times (19-29 record, .396), last appeared in 2014...Las Vegas was the 2013 & 2014 Pacific Southern Division Champions.

**\*NOTE:** The Mets purchased the franchise rights to Triple-A Syracuse of the International League on October 10, 2017 (sale was approved on November 17, 2017)...beginning in the 2019 season, the Syracuse Chiefs will be the Triple-A affiliate of the New York Mets...Las Vegas, in September of 2018, will announce their "new" Major League affiliate: team is TBA.

**2018 PCL PITCHER OF THE WEEK “TWICE”** – Right-hander **Drew Gagnon** (August 6-12) was named the PCL Pitcher of the Week on August 13...made two quality starts (2-0 record) and struck out 19 batters in 13.0 innings (vs. Iowa & Reno)...posted a complete-game victory (7 innings/10 SO) against Reno on August 12...Gagnon was named Most Valuable Pitcher by the coaching staff on August 31...then named PCL Pitcher of the Week on September 4...over two starts, allowed only one run in 16.2 innings pitched, struck out 12 and allowed one walk...on August 28 vs. Tacoma, tossed the PCL's fifth 9-inning complete-game shutout of the season, allowed two hits, walked 1, faced one over the minimum and retired the final 14 batters...Gagnon was named the Sterling Awards Winner for Triple-A Las Vegas on September 12...led the PCL in strikeouts (167), innings pitched (157.2) and tied for 1<sup>st</sup> in starts (27).

**2018 PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** Infielder/outfielder **Patrick Kivlehan** (August 27 – September 3) was named the PCL Player of the Week on September 4...in eight games, he topped all players in professional baseball (Minor and Major League players) with 10 extra-base hits and a 1.074 slugging percentage...four home runs, tied for the PCL-high, while his 29 total bases placed second...batted .407 (11-for-27).

**36 SEASONS IN THE SILVER STATE** - The 51<sup>s</sup> concluded their 36<sup>th</sup> Pacific Coast League season in the Silver State on September 3 in the final game for Triple-A professional baseball in the history of Cashman Field!...the Las Vegas 51<sup>s</sup> have the proud distinction of being the longest enduring franchise in the history of professional sports in the state of Nevada...Las Vegas Triple-A baseball was born on April 10, 1983 before a crowd of 10,622 at Cashman Field (Las Vegas defeated Salt Lake City, 11-8).

**51<sup>s</sup> BRIEFINGS** – Las Vegas was 43-27 (.614) over the last 70 games of the season (28-42 record on June 17)...the 51<sup>s</sup> were 29-21 (.580) after the all-star break.

**3 “20’s” IN HOME RUNS:** Las Vegas had three players that have hit 20 or more home runs in a season for the first time since the 2005 season (Triple-A affiliate of Los Angeles Dodgers)...in 2018, **Zach Borenstein (25)**, **Peter Alonso (21)**, **Patrick Kivlehan (20)**...in 2005, **Brian Myrow**, **Norihiro Nakamura** and **Cody Ross** all hit 22 home runs.

**LAS VEGAS BALLPARK:** The Howard Hughes Corporation® (NYSE: HHC) announced on October 10, 2017 its plans to develop and construct a baseball stadium in Downtown Summerlin® on approximately eight acres just south of City National Arena, the National Hockey League practice facility for the Vegas Golden Knights. The announcement on October 10, followed a vote by the Las Vegas Convention and Visitors Authority Board of Directors approving a marketing partnership that gives **LVCVA** naming rights to the stadium. The Las Vegas Ballpark is being designed by HOK, a global architecture firm with an expertise in stadium design. The 10,000-fan-capacity stadium blends the distinct architectural style of the Summerlin® community with the aviation legacy of Howard Hughes. The ballpark will provide a wide range of seating options including 22 suites, club seats, berm seating, party zones and decks, picnic tables, kids' zone, bars and even a pool beyond the outfield wall. Designed to create a festival-like atmosphere in Downtown Summerlin, the site will be landscaped to complement the master planned community. Parking will be conveniently located on adjacent sites.

“The 51s baseball team has been a staple in the Las Vegas community for over three decades,” said **Don Logan**, President/COO, Las Vegas 51s. “With a new home in Downtown Summerlin, the future of professional baseball in Southern Nevada looks exceptionally bright. We are confident this location, which is easily accessed from all regions of the valley via the 215 Beltway, will help grow our fan base and introduce new generations to America’s favorite past time. We can’t wait to put down roots in Downtown Summerlin, a destination that already has a reputation for best in fun, family-oriented entertainment.”

**Groundbreaking Ceremony for Las Vegas Ballpark:** The Howard Hughes Corporation® (NYSE: HHC), the Las Vegas Convention and Visitors Authority (LVCVA), community leaders, Major League Baseball (MLB) executives, and hundreds of loyal fans broke ground on Friday, February 23 on Las Vegas Ballpark, a 10,000-person capacity baseball stadium that will be the future home of the Las Vegas 51s®, the city's professional baseball team. The team, a member of the Pacific Coast League (PCL) and a Triple-A affiliate of the New York Mets, is wholly owned by The Howard Hughes Corporation.

**51<sup>s</sup> on Radio in 2018:** Russ Langer broadcast 140 games on **NBC Sports Radio AM 920 'The Game'** and on [www.LV51.com](http://www.LV51.com). Langer completed his 19<sup>th</sup> season behind the mike...he is a 10-time recipient of the Nevada Sportscaster of the Year award (2003, 2005, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2015) presented by the National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association...also worked a total of 30 Montreal Expos games during the 2003 and 2004 seasons...in 2006, Langer was hired for additional major league duty by the Baltimore Orioles and broadcast 10 games on a fill-in basis during the course of the season...has also broadcast selected Los Angeles Dodgers Spring Training games in March of 2006 and in Arizona in March of 2008 and with the Toronto Blue Jays in 2009 and 2010 and Chicago White Sox in 2012-18...also broadcast the action for the 2016 Triple-A All-Star Game Radio Network from Charlotte, North Carolina...in 2018, Langer is in his seventh season as the radio "play-by-play voice" for the UNLV Football team.

#### **ROBERT J. BLUM BROADCAST BOOTH AT CASHMAN FIELD:**

The "51s Home Radio Booth" was renamed the "**Robert J. Blum Broadcast Booth**" prior to the 2013 season to honor the 51s Special Assistant to the General Manager... "The Blummer" passed away on July 22, 2012 at the age of 91...also served as the play-by-play voice for Stars/51<sup>s</sup> baseball in selected seasons from 1985-2005 & 2008-10...his company, Robert J. Blum Productions, also produced Las Vegas Triple-A professional baseball games broadcast on radio and television for several seasons.

**51<sup>s</sup> Manager Tony DeFrancesco:** He was named the 24<sup>th</sup> manager (January 9, 2018) in the history of the Las Vegas franchise (1983 - present, 36 seasons). **Career Summary:** He has compiled 34 seasons overall in professional baseball, including 24 seasons as manager (over .500 seasons in 19 of 24 years)...has compiled an overall managerial record over 24 seasons (**current**) of 1,668-1,460 (.533) in the Oakland A's (1994-2010), Houston Astros (2011-17) and New York Mets (2018) organizations...has also compiled an impressive Pacific Coast League managerial career record over 15 seasons (**current**) of 1,146-936 (.550) as a Triple-A skipper from 2003-07, 2009-18...was a member of the Houston Astros organization for seven seasons (2011-17) and was the manager for Triple-A Oklahoma City for four seasons (2011-14) and Triple-A Fresno for three seasons (2015-17)...was the manager of the PCL squad at the 2017 Triple-A All-Star Game...was also the manager for seven seasons at Triple-A Sacramento (Oakland A's) from 2003-07, 2009-10...the PCL tenure includes four championships (2003, 2004, 2007, 2015), two Triple-A National Championships (2007, 2015) and eight division titles...was named the 2003 PCL Manager of the Year and the 2015 Minor League Manager of the Year by *Baseball America*...the four PCL titles is tied with Hall of Famer **Del Crandall** for the most championships in league history. Crandall's championships with Albuquerque were in 1978, 1979, 1981, 1982...**in 2018, his first season in the New York Mets organization and first campaign as manager of Triple-A Las Vegas**...DeFrancesco first joined the Oakland A's organization as a minor league manager prior to the 1994 season...began his managerial career in '94 with Rookie-level Athletics of the Arizona League...then was manager for Single-A Southern Oregon of the Northwest League (1995-96); Single-A Visalia of the California League (1997-98) and Double-A Midland of the Texas League (1999-2002)...his nine-year record (1994-2002) was 522-524 (.499)...in 2003, he managed in his first season at Triple-A Sacramento and guided the River Cats to the PCL championship...in 2008, he earned his first full-time Major League coaching job, as third base coach for the A's, before returning to Sacramento to manage in 2009...then moved to the Astros organization following the 2010 campaign to manage Triple-A Oklahoma City in 2011...in 2012, he was elevated from Oklahoma City to Houston and was named the Astros interim manager on August 19, replacing **Brad Mills** who was fired...managed the final 41 games of the season and on August 24, he earned his first Major League victory, defeating the New York Mets, 3-1, at Citi Field. He compiled an overall record of 16-25 (.390) and with the Astros switching to the American League for 2013, DeFrancesco was the final manager to lead the Astros as a National League franchise.

**Professional Playing Career:** He was selected by the Boston Red Sox in the ninth round of the June 1984 First-Year Player Draft...played in a total of nine seasons in the minor leagues as a catcher in the Boston and Cincinnati organizations...reached Triple-A with both organizations (Pawtucket in 1986 and Nashville in 1988, 1990-91)...appeared

in 567 career games and batted .232 (381-for-1,640) with 60 doubles, 17 home runs and 167 RBI...the Suffern, New York native attended Suffern High School and then played three seasons for Seton Hall University (1982-1984).

**51<sup>s</sup> Coaching Staff: Joel Chimelis** completed his 15th season overall as a coach in professional baseball and his first season in the Mets organization as the hitting coach for Triple-A Las Vegas. **Minor League Coaching Career:** He spent 12 seasons in the Houston Astros organization and was the hitting coach for Double-A Corpus Christi of the Texas League for two seasons (2012, 2017)...prior to 2017, he spent 11 years in Houston's system, starting at Single-A Tri-City of the New York-Penn League (2006-10) and working his way to Single-A Lexington of the South Atlantic League (2011) and Corpus Christi (2012) before spending four years at Single-A Quad Cities of the Midwest League (2013-16)...before joining the Astros, he spent two years (2004-05) on the coaching staff of the Single-A Savannah Sand Gnats of the South Atlantic League in the Montreal Expos/Washington Nationals organization...during the 2014 offseason, he served as hitting coach for the Puerto Rican Winter League champion Cangrejeros de Santurce. **Professional Playing Career:** He was selected by Oakland in the 11th round of June 1988 First-Year Player Draft...was traded to the San Francisco Giants in 1991 and spent the 1996 season in the New York Mets organization (Triple-A Norfolk)...reached the Triple-A level in the Giants system, playing for Phoenix from 1992-95, and was called up to the Majors during the '95 season...during his 14-year minor league career as an infielder (1988-96, 1999-2002), he also enjoyed stints in Mexico, Puerto Rico, Taiwan, Korea and Canada...attended Howard Junior College in Big Spring, Texas and played for the University of Texas in 1988...was named to the 1988 NCAA Central Region team with the Longhorns.

**Glenn Abbott** completed his eighth season overall in the Mets organization and his first season as the pitching coach at Triple-A Las Vegas. **Minor League Coaching Career:** He spent the previous six seasons as pitching coach for Double-A Binghamton of the Eastern League (2012-17)...in 2017, Binghamton compiled a record of 85-54 (.612) and advanced to the EL playoffs...also served as pitching coach for Single-A Savannah of the South Atlantic League in 2011...was a member of the San Diego Padres system before joining the Mets...served as pitching coach for Double-A San Antonio of the Texas League in 2007 and 2010...served in the same role with Triple-A Portland of the Pacific Coast League in 2008 and 2009 and with Double-A Mobile of the Southern League in 2006...was also pitching coach in the Texas Rangers system from 2003-05...spent a total of 13 seasons as a coach in Oakland's organization from 1990-2002...made his coaching debut with the Mets in 1985 with Single-A Little Falls of the New York-Penn League and stayed with the organization through the 1989 season. **Major League Playing Career:** Played 11 seasons in the Major Leagues with Oakland (1973-76), Seattle (1977-81, 1983) and Detroit (1983-84)...the right-hander appeared in 248 career games (206 starts and 37 complete games) and posted a 62-83 record with a 4.39 ERA...struck out 484 batters in 1,286.0 innings pitched...on September 28, 1975, he appeared in the first four-pitcher, no-hitter in major league history, combining with **Vida Blue, Paul Linblad** and **Rollie Fingers** against the California Angels on the final day of the regular season...was selected by Oakland in the eighth round of the June 1969 First-Year Player Draft...attended North Little Rock High School and the State College of Arkansas (Conway, AR).

**Jeremy Accardo** completed his second season in the New York Mets organization and his first season as the bullpen coach with Triple-A Las Vegas...in 2017, he served as the pitching coach for Rookie-level Gulf Coast League Mets...spent eight seasons in the Major Leagues with San Francisco (2005-06), Toronto (2006-10), Baltimore (2011), Cleveland (2012) and Oakland (2012)...appeared in 262 career games and posted a 10-20 record with a 4.30 ERA with 38 saves (285.0 IP/205 SO)...was originally signed by San Francisco as a non-drafted free agent in 2003 after playing college ball at Illinois State University and earned his degree in 2016...was a member of Triple-A Las Vegas for two seasons (Toronto, 2009-10) and is the franchise leader with 37 career saves...recipient of the 51<sup>s</sup> Community Service Award on August 31.
