LAS VEGAS AVIATORS LEAD TRIPLE-A BASEBALL IN HOME ATTENDANCE:

The Aviators led Triple-A baseball (30 teams: 16 in PCL; 14 in International League) in total home attendance (**650,934**) and average (**9,299 in 70 dates**).

The Columbus Clippers, Triple-A affiliate of the Cleveland Indians, led the IL in total home attendance and average (**590,504 – 8,684 average in 68 dates**).

2019 LAS VEGAS BALLPARK ATTENDANCE: In **70** dates, Las Vegas total was **650,934** for an average of **9,299 (47 sellouts)**...season-high sellout crowd was **12,111** vs. Tacoma on May 14 (**Smokers Strike Out 16th Annual School Day Game**)...the Las Vegas franchise has reached the 300,000 plateau in "home" attendance in all **37** seasons (1983-2019)...the all-time attendance total now stands at **12,651,945**.

In 36 seasons at Cashman Field (1983-2016), the attendance total was 12,001,011.

LAS VEGAS BALLPARK WINNER OF 2019 MiLB TRIPLE-A BEST OF THE BALLPARKS FAN VOTE (JULY 1): Las Vegas Ballpark defeated Southwest University Park, home of the El Paso Chihuahuas, Triple-A affiliate of the San Diego Padres, to win this year's Triple-A Best of the Ballparks fan vote...Over 85,000 fans voted in all five rounds of the Triple-A Best of the Ballparks fan vote, with almost 500,000 fans voting to date in the overall competition...after several close votes in previous rounds, the final vote resulted in Las Vegas Ballpark with a 55.6% to 44.4% margin win over the El Paso Chihuahuas.

LAS VEGAS BALLPARK WINNER OF BASEBALLPARKS.COM ANNUAL BALLPARK OF THE YEAR AWARD: Las Vegas Ballpark® has a major national award to add to its accomplishments, as **BaseballParks.com** announced on July 31 that the new facility is the winner of its **20th Annual Ballpark of the Year Award**. Every year since 2000, *BaseballParks.com* has presented this honor to the new or remodeled baseball stadium with the best combination of site selection, exterior appearance, architectural design, and fan amenities. The selection is made by an advisory panel utilized by the 22-year-old website. The announcement of the award was made in the July 31 edition of *USA TODAY Sports Weekly* and at *BaseballParks.com*. **Joe Mock**, founder and webmaster of the website and a frequent contributor to *USA TODAY* publications, penned the article about this year's honor. The Howard Hughes Corporation®, owners of the Aviators and developers of Summerlin, covered the costs to design and build the park. Architecture firm HOK developed its design. The Las Vegas Convention and Visitors Authority (LVCVA) committed \$80 million over 20 years for a naming rights sponsorship.

LAS VEGAS BALLPARK®, LAS VEGAS AVIATORS® HONORED WITH MAJOR YEAR-END AWARDS (AUG. 30): Las Vegas Ballpark was Named Ballpark of the Year; Las Vegas Aviators Honored as Team of the Year by Ballpark Digest, the Industry Standard for the Business of Baseball...this year's selection of both Las Vegas Ballpark and the Las Vegas Aviators for major citations make history in the annual Ballpark Digest Awards: It's the first time an organization has snared both awards in a single year...the year-end Ballpark Digest awards annually honor the best of the baseball industry, covering MLB, MiLB, independent-baseball, and summer-collegiate programs in a wide range of categories...the Ballpark of the Year and Team of the Year announcements are the kickoff to awards season for Ballpark Digest, with announcements running through the fall and culminating in an awards reception at December's Baseball Winter Meetings.

Las Vegas Aviators/Oakland Athletics: The Aviators and Athletics, on September 17, 2018, announced a new Player Development Contract through the 2020 season...the Las Vegas Stars/51^s have captured the PCL Championship twice (1986 & 1988) and have appeared in the playoffs 11 times (21-32 record, .396) and clinched a playoff berth this season...Las Vegas was the 2013 & 2014 Pacific Southern Division Champions and advanced to the playoffs (2019) for the first time in five seasons.

PCL PITCHER OF THE WEEK: Las Vegas right-hander **Parker Dunshee** was named the PCL Pitcher of the Week (August 19-25)...in two games, posted a 1-0 record with a 0.00 ERA in 11.2 innings pitched...vs. Reno on August 19 (6.0 IP/1 H/1 unearned run)...vs. Tacoma on August 24 (5.2 shutout innings/6 SO, defeated the Rainiers).

20-20-20-20: in 2019, four Aviators hit 20 or more home runs: **Seth Brown (37), Mark Payton (30), Sheldon Neuse (27), Dustin Fowler (25)**...marking the first time in franchise history (1983-2019) that four players have hit 20+ home runs in a single season...in 2018, three Las Vegas players hit 20 or more home runs: **Zach Borenstein (25), Pete Alonso (21), Patrick Kivlehan (20)**.

L.V. SINGLE SEASON HOME RUN RECORD: Las Vegas recorded **250** home runs, breaking the previous mark of 184 (2001, 2004).

100 RBI IN A SINGLE SEASON: The 1983 Las Vegas Stars had a team record three players drive in 100 or more runs: PCL MVP **Kevin McReynolds (116), Joe Lansford (116) and Jerry Davis (100)**...in 2019, the Aviators had two players reach the century mark in RBI: **Seth Brown (104), Sheldon Neuse (102)**.

37 SEASONS IN THE SILVER STATE – The Aviators concluded their 37th Pacific Coast League season in the Silver State (1983 – 2019)...the Las Vegas Aviators have the proud distinction of being the longest enduring franchise in the history of professional sports in the state of Nevada...Las Vegas Triple-A baseball was born on April 10, 1983 before a crowd of 10,622 at Cashman Field (Las Vegas defeated Salt Lake City, 11-8).

LAS VEGAS 80-WIN SEASONS – The Las Vegas franchise has won 80 or more games in a season six times: **85** (2002, franchise best 85-59 record (.590)); **83** (1983 inaugural season, 83-60 (.580)); **83** (83-57, .593 in 2019); **81** (81-63, .563 in 2013); **81** (81-63, .563 in 2014); **80** (1986 PCL champions with an 80-62 mark (.563))...Las Vegas recorded back-to-back 80-win seasons for the first time in franchise history (2013 & 2014).

Aviators on Radio in 2019: Russ Langer broadcast 140 games on **NBC Sports Radio AM 920 'The Game'** and on www.aviatorslv.com. Langer completed his 20th season behind the mike...he is a 10-time recipient of the Nevada Sportscaster of the Year award (2003, 2005, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2015) presented by the National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association...also worked a total of 30 Montreal Expos games during the 2003 and 2004 seasons...in 2006, Langer was hired for additional major league duty by the Baltimore Orioles and broadcast 10 games on a fill-in basis during the course of the season...has also broadcast selected Los Angeles Dodgers Spring Training games in March of 2006 and in Arizona in March of 2008 and with the Toronto Blue Jays in 2009 and 2010 and Chicago White Sox in 2012-19...also broadcast the action for the 2016 Triple-A All-Star Game Radio Network from Charlotte, North Carolina...in 2019, Langer is in his eighth season as the radio "play-by-play voice" for the UNLV Football team.

Aviators Manager Fran Riordan: *Named 2019 PCL Manager of the Year on August 27*****...was named the 25th manager (November 8, 2018) in the history of the Las Vegas franchise (1983 - present, 37 seasons). **Career Summary:** He has recorded 19 seasons overall in professional baseball and has been a member of the Oakland Athletics organization for the past four seasons (2015-19).

Riordan has compiled an overall managerial record over 19 regular seasons (**current**) of 1,024-982 (.510)...in 2019, he led Triple-A Las Vegas to the second-best record in the 16-team PCL (83-57, .593) and the Aviators captured the Pacific Southern Division Championship...in 2018, he made his Triple-A debut as manager with the Nashville Sounds of the Pacific Coast League and compiled an overall record of 72-68 (.514) and finished in second place in the American Southern Division to the PCL and Triple-A National Champion, the Memphis Redbirds...Nashville compiled a PCL-best 15-game winning streak from July 29 – August 14.

In 2017, he compiled a record of 67-71 (.486) with Double-A Midland and his squad captured the Texas League Championship...the prior two seasons, he was the skipper of Single-A Beloit of the Midwest League (2015-16)...before joining the Oakland organization, Riordan spent four seasons as manager of the Florence Freedom of the Frontier League (2011-14)...led the team to two playoff berths and is the all-time Frontier League leader in wins with 625...was a 2014 Frontier League Hall of Fame inductee. Prior to his time with Florence, he managed the Northern League's Lake County Fielders (2010) and Kalamazoo Kings for six seasons (2004-09), leading the Kings to the 2005 Frontier League title...was

named the 2008 Frontier League Manager of the Year...also served as player-manager in the Frontier League from 2000-02, leading the Richmond Roosters to back-to-back-league championships in 2001 and 2002.

Professional Playing Career: The first baseman/outfielder played seven seasons of professional baseball in the Frontier League with Richmond (1997-98, 2001-02), Dubois County (1999-2000) and North Shore (2003)...appeared in 501 career games and batted .281 (525-for-1,869) with 95 doubles, 11 triples, 55 home runs and 349 RBI...was a three-time All-Star (first base) from 2000-02 and hit a career-high .314 with Dubois County (2000) and Richmond (2002)...established career-highs in home runs (14, 2001) and RBI (81, 2002).

Aviators Coaching Staff: Eric Martins completed his fifth season overall as a hitting coach in the Oakland Athletics organization...spent the previous three seasons as hitting coach for Triple-A Nashville (2016-18) of the Pacific Coast League. **Minor League Coaching Career:** He has spent four seasons in the A's organization as hitting coach (three seasons with Triple-A Nashville, 2016-18) and one season with Double-A Midland of the Texas League (2015).

A's Scout: From 2007-14, he served as an A's scout and was responsible for signing A.J. Griffin, Daniel Robertson and 2014 first-round selection Matt Chapman, among others.

Professional Playing Career: He was selected by Oakland in the 17th round of the June 1994 First-Year Player Draft...played professionally for 11 seasons, including parts of four seasons with the A's Triple-A affiliates...was a part of the 1997 Edmonton team that captured the Pacific Coast League Championship and the 1999 Vancouver team that won the Triple-A World Series in Las Vegas. **College:** He attended Long Beach State University for two seasons (1993-94).

Rick Rodriguez has enjoyed a long-time professional career and completed his 35th year in the Oakland Athletics organization (in 2019), including seven seasons as a player and 26 as a minor league coach...in 2019, he will also enter his fourth straight season as pitching coach for the A's Triple-A affiliate (Nashville, 2016-18)...served as the A's bullpen coach from 2011-12.

Minor League Coaching Career: He returns for his fourth season (2016 - present) of his fourth stint as pitching coach of the A's top affiliate after previously serving in that capacity from 2000-02, 2004-10 and 2013-14 (Triple-A Sacramento's pitching coach in 12 of the previous 19 seasons, 2000-18)...was a member of two Pacific Coast League championship teams in 2004 and 2007...also served as pitching coach for Single-A Stockton of the California League in 2015, as the A's bullpen coach from 2011-12 and as the manager of Single-A Modesto in 2003...prior to becoming pitching coach for Sacramento in 2000, he coached for rookie-level Arizona League A's (1992), Short-Season Southern Oregon (1993-94) and Single-A Modesto (1995-99).

Major League Playing Career: He was selected by Oakland in the second round of the June 1981 First-Year Player Draft...played four seasons in the Major Leagues with Oakland (1986-87), Cleveland (1988) and San Francisco (1990)...the right-hander appeared in 31 career games (started eight) and posted a 3-4 record with a 5.73 ERA...struck out 22 batters in 77.0 innings pitched...his playing career concluded in 1991 when he made three appearances for Triple-A Phoenix in the Giants organization.

Craig Conklin joins the Triple-A Las Vegas coaching staff after serving the Oakland A's organization as the Southern California area scout for the last four seasons. In four seasons with the A's, Conklin signed players **Kyle Friedrichs, Evan Manarino, Luke Persico** and **Sam Sheehan** while also serving as coach in the instructional league, extended spring training and with Single-A Beloit in 2016 and Single-A Stockton in 2018.

Prior to joining the A's, he worked for the MLB Scouting Bureau from 1999-2015...worked several roles with the bureau, serving as an area scout in Southern & Northern California, covering Mexico and Australia internationally and as an advanced scout for the World Baseball Classic.
