

WILMINGTON'S OFFENSE SILENT IN LOSS: A game that started out as another pitching duel turned into a lopsided affair as the Wilmington Blue Rocks fell 10-0 in the second game of the series against the Potomac Nationals Friday night at Northwest Federal Field. Blue Rocks' starter Gerson Garabito allowed three earned runs and struck out six batters in six innings of work, but the Blue Rocks were held to just four hits in the setback as the series evened at one game apiece.

ROCKS OFF AND RUNNING: The Blue Rocks have wasted no time getting back into base stealing mode as they have stolen seven bags against Potomac through the first two games of the series

-Friday, the Rocks stole two bases with **Khalil Lee** and **Gabriel Cancel** each swiping a bag. -In the series opener on Thursday, the Rocks stole five bases which matched a franchise-record as **Nick Heath** stole two and **Blake Perkins**, **Travis Jones** and Lee each stole a bag.

-It marked the third time this season the Blue Rocks stolen five bases in a game. -The first was also against Potomac back on April 7 and then again a week later against Lynchburg -The Blue Rocks are the only team in the Carolina League to steal 20 or more bases in each of the first three months of the season.

-On the season, the Rocks are second in the Carolina League with 83 stolen bases trailing Buies Creek. (92 SB) -They also have an impressive 73% success rate stealing bases this season (83 out of 113).

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Wilmington Blue Rocks have been away from their friendly confines of Frawley Stadium for quite some time with the last home game for the Blue Rocks coming on June 10 against Frederick in a rain-shortened game.

-However, the Blue Rocks have won three of their last four road games, including back-to-back wins against the Winston-Salem Dash, who won the Southern Division First Half title, to earn a series split to close out the first half of the season.

-Wilmington's three-game road winning streak was snapped on Friday, but did match the longest win streak on the road for the Blue Crew this season.

-They also won three in a row from April 19-21 when they took three of the first four games from the Keys.

<u>NEW HALF, NEW FACES</u>: With the start of the second half of the Carolina League season underway, the Wilmington Blue Rocks have a handful of new players on the roster. -Arguably the most intriguing new addition to the Rocks is switch-hitting outfielder **Blake Perkins**, who spent the first half of the season with Potomac. -Originally a second round pick by Washington in 2015, Perkins was one of three players dealt to Kansas City from Washington as the Nationals acquired former Blue Rock and All-Star reliever **Kelvin Herrera** on June 18 and is rated as the 15th-best prospect in the Royals' system according to MI Beineline com

to MLBPipeline.com -RHP Nolan Watson joins the Blue Rocks roster after starting the year in Low-A Lexington. -The former first round pick by the Royals in 2015 out of Lawrence North High School will make his

Carolina League debut tonight..

-Infielder **Travis Jones** was also promoted from Low-A Lexington and put together solid numbers. -The 29th round pick by Kansas City in 2017 led the Legends in batting average (.285), hits (65), doubles (13), stolen bases (14), second in runs scored (41) and tied for second in RBI (32).

All-Stars Kort Peterson and Bryan Brickhouse were promoted to Double-A Northwest Arkansas after putting together strong first halves of the season.

LEE THE ON-BASE MACHINE: Blue Rocks' outfielder Khalil Lee has been solid at the plate since the month of May

-The Carolina League All-Star is slashing .274/.396/.396 with 25 RBI, 28 walks and 28 runs scored in 47 games.

-On the season, he paces the league with 47 walks and is eighth in all of MiLB with that mark. -He is also second in the CL in on-base percentage (.401) -Has hit safely in 13 of 19 contests in the month of June and has picked up a hit in each of his last two games to snap an 0-for-20 skid at the plate. -He leads the team with 17 multi-hit games and 36 RBI.

BURT PROVIDING THE HURT: Second-year Blue Rock D.J. Burt is not suffering from a sophomore slump in the Carolina League.

-He was named to the Carolina League All-Star Classic this season and has been one of the best table setters in the league.

-Burt closed out the first half with a pair of hits, including a double and drove in two runs. -He has a hit in 35 of his 51 games played and has picked up a hit in 19 of his last 26 games. -Burt has served as the Rocks' utility man this season, making 17 starts at third base, 11 at second base, 10 at shortstop and seven in left field.

-Made his first-career start at the hot corner coming on May 26 at home against Salem. -This the first season in his professional career that he has played in the outfield.

CANCEL CLEANING UP NICELY: Blue Rock's infielder Gabriel Cancel continues to produce as the cleanup hitter this season.

-The 21-year-old has hit six different spots in the lineup for the Blue Crew this season, but he has thrived batting fourth.

-In 12 games as the cleanup man, Cancel is hitting .350 (14-for-40) with four doubles, a home run and 12 RBI. -He also has an on-base percentage of .435 and slugging percentage of .525

-On the season, when Cancel has not hit in the cleanup spot, he is hitting .244 (40-164).

Right-hander Nolan Watson makes his Carolina League debut tonight for the Blue Rocks and will piggyback with fellow righty Arnaldo Hernandez The 21-year-old was the 33rd overall pick in the 2015 Draft by the Royals out of

Was committed to play at Vanderbilt University before signing with the Royals. Started the season with Low- Lexington.

Furned in his best start of his career in his last outing on June 15. Watson tossed his first-career, complete-game shutout against the Rome Braves.

He scattered six hits, did not walk a batter and struck out seven. He needed just 89 pitches to navigate through the nine innings of masterful work.

Was named the Opening Day starter for the Legends and went 4-6 with a 5.81 ERA in 13 starts.

Logged 66.2 innings, allowed 94 hits, 55R/43ER, walked 21, and struck out 63. At time of promotion he was first on the team in starts made (13) and second on the team in innings pitched (66.2) and strikeouts (63).

Allowed three earned runs or less in 9 of his 13 starts with the Legends and over his final five starts, posted a 3.77 ERA.

Also spent last season with Low-A Lexington and dealt with a shoulder injury and missed a few weeks of the season.

Made rehab appearances with the AZL Royals and Burlington Royals

Went a composite 1-12 with a 7.87 ERA in 22 outings including 18 starts. With the Legends, went 1-10 with a 6.78 ERA in 15 appearances including 13 starts.
