## 2017 GWINNETT BRAVES FINAL REPORT

71-71, 2<sup>nd</sup> in IL South Division, 15.0 GB / T-6<sup>th</sup> Overall in International League

**2017 in Review:** Playing in their final season under the "Braves" moniker, the Gwinnett Braves went 71-71 (.500) to finish tied for sixth in the 14-team International League. Gwinnett finished second in the IL South Division, 15.0 games behind first-place Durham (86-56), 5.0 games ahead of third-place Norfolk (66-76) and 10.0 games ahead of fourth-place Charlotte (61-81). **Though the G-Braves won six more games than in 2016 (65-78), the club failed to repeat as IL South Division Champions** (Durham clinched on 8/24).

■ **Steady in Second:** The G-Braves spent 135 of 152 days in second place in the IL South Division (3 days from 4/13-4/15, 1 day on 4/18, 26 days from 4/25-5/20, 105 days from 5/23-9/4). The club also spent two stints with a share of first place (2 days from 4/16-4/17, 6 days from 4/19-4/24) and two stints with a share of third place (7 days from 4/6-4/12 and 2 days from 5/21-5/22), but never fell to sole possession of fourth place.

■ **Roster Makeup:** The Gwinnett roster featured 71 different players in 2017, six less than in 2016 (club record 77). That total included 33 position players, 38 pitchers, 24 players making their affiliated Triple-A debuts and one teenager (19-year-old **Ronald Acuña**). The G-Braves' roster underwent 230 transactions from 4/4-9/5, 49 less than the club record of 279 set last season.

**About the Staff:** The G-Braves were led by former Atlanta Braves catcher **Damon Berryhill** (1<sup>st</sup> season), the sixth manager in the club's nine-year history. In guiding Gwinnett to a 71-71 record, he now has a career managerial mark of 489-458 (.516) in 947 games across nine MiLB seasons. Berryhill's staff included pitching coach **Reid Cornelius** (1<sup>st</sup> season), hitting coach **John Moses** (3<sup>rd</sup> season), coach **Jose Mota** (3<sup>rd</sup> season), coach **Billy Nicholson** (8<sup>th</sup> season), certified athletic trainer **Nick Flynn** (1<sup>st</sup> season) and strength & conditioning coach **Jason Curry** (4<sup>th</sup> season).

**All Eyes on Acuña:** 19-year-old **Ronald Acuña** enjoyed a breakout season in 2017, combining to bat .325 (181-for-557, 31 2B, 8 3B, 21 HR, 88 R, 82 RBI, 44 SB) in 139 games between Advanced-A Florida, Double-A Mississippi and Triple-A Gwinnett. **He led Minor League Baseball in hits, at-bats and games**, ranked among MiLB leaders in total bases (3<sup>rd</sup>, 291) and steals (9<sup>th</sup>), and led the Atlanta Braves' farm system in batting, RBI, steals and home runs (T-1<sup>st</sup> alongside **Carlos Franco**).

■ **Dominant Debut:** After joining Gwinnett for his Triple-A debut on 7/13, **Acuña ranked third in the IL in batting** (.344, 76-for-221, 14 2B, 2 3B, 9 HR, 38 R, 33 RBI, 11 SB in 54G)...he led the league in games, at-bats, runs, hits, XBH (25), total bases (121) and SLG (.548) in that span.

■ **Highly Decorated:** In addition to being named the **Minor League Player of the Year** by both **USA Today** and **Baseball America**, **Acuña has received the following awards in 2017:** Southern League Player of the Week (2x, 5/14 and 5/28), SL Mid-Season All-Star, MLB All-Star Futures Game (World Team), IL Player of the Week (8/20), IL Player of the Month (August), MLB Pipeline.com Hitter of the Year, Double-A Mississippi Player of the Year, Atlanta Braves' MiLB Player of the Year.

**2017 Team Awards:** G-Braves' GM **North Johnson** and manager **Damon Berryhill** presented the Team Awards for 2017 prior to the game on 9/3. Winners included 2B **Ozzie Albies** and INF **Sean Kazmar Jr.** (Co-Most Valuable Players), LHP **Andrew Albers** (Most Outstanding Pitcher), RHP **Rhiner Cruz** (Most Outstanding Relief Pitcher), 3B **Rio Ruiz** (Most Competitive Player), OF **Xavier Avery** (Fan Favorite Award) and 1B **Matt Tuiasosopo** (Community Service Award).

**Ozz-Feast:** **Ozzie Albies** was selected as the **second baseman on the International League's 2017 Post-Season All-Star Team**. The 20-year-old Albies batted .285 (117-for-411, 21 2B, 8 3B, 9 HR, 67 R, 41 RBI, 21 SB) over 97 games in his second season with Gwinnett, ranking among IL leaders in triples (T-1<sup>st</sup>), batting (7<sup>th</sup>) and stolen bases (T-7<sup>th</sup>) despite being called up by Atlanta on 8/1. He was also named an IL Mid-Season All-Star, and was the league's starting second baseman and leadoff hitter for the 2017 Triple-A All-Star Game on 7/12 in Tacoma, WA (2-for-5, 2B, R).

■ **Joining G-Braves' Greats:** Albies is the 10<sup>th</sup> player to be named an IL Post-Season All-Star in Gwinnett's nine-year history, joining DH **Barbaro Canizares** (2009, 2010), RP **Jairo Asencio** (2009), 1B **Freddie Freeman** (2010), OF **Stefan Gartrell** (2011), SP **Julio Teheran** (2011), 1B **Ernesto Mejia** (2012), OF **Joey Terdoslavich** (2013) and UTIL **Phil Gosselin** (2014).

**Albies, Sims Claim Atlanta Awards:** On 9/15, the Atlanta Braves honored 2B **Ozzie Albies** and RHP **Lucas Sims** as Gwinnett's Player of the Year and Pitcher of the Year for 2017. Albies ranked ninth in the Braves' system in batting (.285), while Sims ranked ninth in the system in ERA (3.75).

■ **Local Ace:** Sims, a Lawrenceville, GA native, went 7-4 with a 3.75 ERA (48 ER in 115.1 IP), a .224 BAA and a team-high 10 quality starts in 20 games (19 starts) with Gwinnett...he ranked among IL leaders in lowest BAA (4<sup>th</sup>), strikeouts (5<sup>th</sup>, 132) and WHIP (5<sup>th</sup>, 1.14). His stellar season included the IL Pitcher of the Week award for 4/17-4/23 (1-0, 0.00 ERA in 1 start), Gwinnett's Pitcher of the Month award for April (2-0, 2.66 ERA in 4 starts) and **selection alongside Albies to the IL's Mid-Season All-Star Team** (1.0 IP, 2 H, 1 R, 1 ER, 0 BB, 0 SO in Triple-A All-Star Game on 7/12).

**Amazing Albers:** **Andrew Albers** went 12-3 with a 2.61 ERA (35 ER in 120.2 IP) and 10 quality starts in 26 games (17 starts) for Gwinnett, racking up the most single-season wins by a G-Braves' pitcher since **Julio Teheran** went 15-3 in 2011. The 31-year-old left-hander was traded to the Seattle Mariners in exchange for cash considerations on 8/12. **Over his final eight starts with GWN from 7/1-8/10, Albers went 6-0 with a 0.98 ERA (2<sup>nd</sup> in IL, 6 ER in 55.1 IP) a .222 BAA (45-for-203, 1 HR, 9 BB, 49 SO) and seven quality starts.** At the time of the trade, he ranked among IL pitching leaders in wins (T-1<sup>st</sup>), ERA (3<sup>rd</sup>), WHIP (6<sup>th</sup>, 1.15), strikeouts (7<sup>th</sup>, 115) and innings (8<sup>th</sup>), as well as lowest BB/9.0 IP ratio for starters (1<sup>st</sup>, 1.38) and fewest baserunners/9.0 IP ratio for starters (2<sup>nd</sup>, 9.95).

**Kazmar Climbs Gwinnett Career Lists:** Sean Kazmar Jr. completed his fifth season with the G-Braves in 2017, **earning Co-MVP honors** after hitting .284 (103-for-363, 15 2B, 11 HR, 41 R, 45 RBI, 5 SB) in 99 games. Since joining the team in 2013, he's batting .271 (431-for-1591, 91 2B, 9 3B, 24 HR, 189 R, 183 RBI, 19 SB) in a Gwinnett-record 460 games.

**X-Factor:** Xavier Avery batted .259 (96-for-371, 21 2B, 5 3B, 14 HR, 65 R, 52 RBI, 21 SB) over 121 games in his Gwinnett debut in 2017, **finishing the season among IL offensive leaders in OPS (5<sup>th</sup>, .816), triples (T-6<sup>th</sup>), on-base percentage (7<sup>th</sup>, .361), steals (T-7<sup>th</sup>), slugging percentage (9<sup>th</sup>, .456) and walks (10<sup>th</sup>, 59).** His season highlights included the second and third multi-homer games of his career (3-for-3, 2 HR, 4 RBI on 6/24 vs. Norfolk, 2-for-5, 2 HR, 4 RBI on 8/21 at Durham) and a game-tying grand slam (off RHP Jimmy Herget) in the ninth inning on 8/13 vs. Louisville (GWN's first regular-season slam since Donnie Murphy on 8/20/14 vs. Charlotte).

**His Name is Rio:** In his second season with Gwinnett, Rio Ruiz batted .247 (96-for-388, 25 2B, 2 3B, 16 HR, 56 RBI, SB) in 103 games. He led the club in doubles, home runs (new career high, 5<sup>th</sup>-most in Braves' system) and RBI, and ranked second in both total bases (173) and slugging percentage (.446). Ruiz's homer highlights included the team's lone walk-off blast of the season on 4/29 vs. Pawtucket (2-run, off RHP Chandler Shepherd for 3-1 win playing as home team in G2 of DH at McCoy Stadium) and a pair of two-homer games on 7/9 vs. Indianapolis (2-for-5, 4 RBI) and 8/17 at Scranton/WB (2-for-4, 2 RBI).

**Power Restored:** The G-Braves topped the 100-homer mark for just the third time in nine years in 2017, ranking seventh in the 14-team International League with 117 clouts...that's second-most all-time by a Gwinnett team, trailing only the 2011 club (123 HR) and ranking ahead of the 2010 club (111 HR). The G-Braves had finished at or near the bottom of the IL in homers in each of the previous five seasons: 2016 (79 HR, 13<sup>th</sup>), 2015 (RICH/GWN franchise-low 50 HR, 14<sup>th</sup>), 2014 (88 HR, 12<sup>th</sup>), 2013 (89 HR, T-12<sup>th</sup>) and 2012 (89 HR, 13<sup>th</sup>).

**Strikeout Artists:** Gwinnett pitchers combined to strike out 1,184 batters in 2017, third-most in the IL behind only Durham (1<sup>st</sup>, MiLB-record 1,421 SO) and Scranton/WB (2<sup>nd</sup>, 1,249 SO). That strikeout total ranks second in G-Braves' history, trailing only the 2011 club (IL-best 1,223 SO).

- **Triple-Digit Trio:** Lucas Sims (132 SO), Andrew Albers (115 SO) and Aaron Blair (104 SO) all topped the 100-strikeout mark, the second time three Gwinnett pitchers have done so in a single season...Todd Redmond (142 SO), Julio Teheran (122 SO) and Yohan Flande (104 SO) did it first in 2011.

**Rotation Recap:** Gwinnett utilized 19 different starting pitchers in 2017 (full list on Page 4), five less than the previous season (team-record 24 starters in 2016). The rotation combined to go 45-42 with a 3.97 ERA (336 ER in 762.2 IP) and 56 quality starts in 142 outings, including five complete games (T-3<sup>rd</sup> in IL). G-Braves' starters claimed IL Pitcher of the Week honors three times: Lucas Sims for 4/17-4/23 (1-0, 0.00 ERA in 1 start), Andrew Albers for 7/13-7/16 (1-0, 0.00 ERA in 1 start) and Manny Barreda for 8/28-9/4 (1-1, 0.00 ERA in 2 starts).

- **IL Leaderboard:** Albers ranked among IL pitching leaders in winning percentage (1<sup>st</sup>, .800), ERA (3<sup>rd</sup>, 2.61), wins (T-3<sup>rd</sup>, 12) and WHIP (6<sup>th</sup>, 1.15). Aaron Blair ranked in complete games (T-3<sup>rd</sup>, 2) and starts (T-4<sup>th</sup>, 25). Sims ranked in lowest BAA (4<sup>th</sup>, .224), strikeouts (5<sup>th</sup>, 132) and WHIP (5<sup>th</sup>, 1.14). Matt Wisler and Kris Medlen were each tied for third in shutouts (1).

**Young Guns:** Six members of MLB.com's Pre-Season Atlanta Braves Top 30 Prospects list went on to make starts for the G-Braves in 2017: No. 6 Sean Newcomb (3-3, 2.97 ERA in 11 starts), No. 9 Max Fried (0-0, 0.00 ERA in 2 starts), No. 11 Luiz Gohara (2-2, 3.31 ERA in 7 starts), No. 16 Patrick Weigel (3-2, 5.27 ERA in 8 starts), No. 19 Lucas Sims (7-4, 3.70 ERA in 19 starts) and No. 27 Luke Jackson (0-3, 7.36 ERA in 4 starts). All but Weigel (season-ending Tommy John surgery on 6/27) went on to pitch for Atlanta, with Fried (1-1, 3.81 ERA in 9 games, 4 starts), Gohara (1-3, 4.91 ERA in 5 starts), Newcomb (4-9, 4.32 ERA in 19 starts) and Sims (3-6, 5.62 ERA in 14 games, 10 starts) all making their MLB debuts and Jackson logging 43 relief outings (2-0, 4.62 ERA).
