RAILRIDERS BREAKDOWN

HOME: 4-3 AWAY: 2-3 STREAK: W 3 LAST 5: 3-2 LAST 10: 6-4

ABOUT LAST NIGHT: The RailRiders leapt out to a 9-0 lead early and cruised to a 10-3 thumping of the Louisville Bats (Cincinnati Reds) on Wednesday night at Louisville Slugger Field. SWB secured a series victory while Louisville lost its fifth straight home game.

LOVE POTION NO. 9: Ruben Tejada made it 3-0 in the second with a bases-loaded double. Rob Refsnyder's two-run homer expanded the advantage to 5-0 with his two-run homer in the third and a four-spot in the fourth rounded out the gaudy 9-0 advantage, highlighted by a two-run single from Ji-Man Choi.

PITCHING LINES: Louisville starter Jackson Stephens (1-1) allowed all nine runs (six earned) over 3.2 innings on 105 pitches (65 strikes). His counterpart, Caleb Smith, gave up just one run on two hits and three walks over 4.1 innings, striking out five. Four SWB relievers carried the baton from there with Tyler Jones (1-1) earning the victory after two scoreless frames.

BEAU KNOWS PITCHING: Usual outfielder Beau Amaral made his pro pitching debut in the ninth for the home club as the sixth different hurler used by the Bats on the night.

T-WADE: Tyler Wade walked, scored and stole a base. He has reached base safely in 10 of his first 11 games played at Triple-A, going 17-for-44 (.386). Wade owns an IL-high-tying six steals and has scored seven runs.

YOUNG GUNS: Wade, Clint Frazier and Dustin Fowler, the RailRiders' usual 1-2-3 hitters early this season, are all 22 years old. The IL's mean-average age for position players early this season stands a shade under 27.

BROOMS READY: Tonight, the RailRiders seek SWB's first series sweep victory at Louisville as the Yankees' top farm club (2007-Present). SWB already has its fifth straight series victory win at Louisville Slugger Field. The franchise won three of four each year from 2013-16 and has not lost a series at Louisville since it was swept over four games in 2012.

LOOK OUT BELOW: The Double-A Trenton Thunder (7-5, 2nd, -0.5) fell in 11 innings to the New Hampshire Fisher Cats (Toronto Blue Jays) last night, 4-2... Mike Ford extended his hitting streak to 11 games and prospect starter Chance Adams (2-0), the reigning EL Pitcher of the Week, gave up one run on six hits and a walk over five frames, whiffing five...Through three starts he has a 1.10 ERA, 1.04 WHIP and .169 BAA...Earlier today, the Thunder took advantage of three New Hampshire errors and Cale Coshow earned his fourth save of the season as the Thunder won 5-4...With the victory, the Thunder finished its homestand 5-2, winning series against both Portland and New Hampshire...Billy McKinney led the Thunder offense with a 3-for-3 effort plus a walk...NEPA's own Matt Wotherspoon added two shutout innings of relief in the victory...Ford went 0-for-3 with a walk, an RBI and a run scored to end the EL's top hitting streak of the year...Advanced-A Tampa (8-6, 2nd, -2.0) was held to two hits, both by Nick Solak, in a 7-0 loss to the host Palm Beach Cardinals...Starter Domingo Acevedo (0-2) gave up five runs (two earned) on eight hits and no walks over six innings, striking out six...Through three starts he owns a 5.51 ERA, 1.53 WHIP and .292 BAA...Low-A Charleston (8-6, 3rd, -1.0) saw first baseman Brandon Wagner go 2-for-4 with an RBI, but the RiverDogs dropped their second in a row by a 5-3 final to Augusta (San Francisco Giants) to end their first road trip of the season.

The RailRiders claimed the franchise's second-ever Governors' Cup as IL champs and the team's first-ever Triple-A national title with a win over El Paso in 2016.

OFF THE RAILS: With a win tonight, the RailRiders would have a winning record for the first time this season...Three of the IL's top seven batting averages belong to SWB players (Wade, 4th, .386; Choi, 6th, .375; Tejada, 7th, .370)...Tejada has been on base in all nine of his games played and also ranks among the IL's best in on-base percentage (T-1st, .500) and slugging percentage (5th, .630).

ON THE BUMP: Signed by NYM as a 3B in '08, hitting woes shifted Luis Cessa to P. He rose as a DSL P in '11 to AAA in '15. He has since been traded 2x. First a July '15 deal from NYM to DET in a package for Yoenis Cespedes. That off-season DET added him to the 40, then traded him that Dec. to NYY w/RHP Chad Green for LHP Justin Wilson. He began '16 in NYY 'pen and bounced between SWB (15G/14GS, 6-3, 3.03, .235 BAA, 1.15 WHIP) and NYY (17G/9GS, 4-4, 4.35, .241, 1.11). He started SWB's '17 home opener vs. LHV (7IP, 6H, 0R, 2BB, 6K). His lone prior outing vs. LOU came w/TOL Aug. 31 '15 (7IP, 4H, 1R/0ER, 1BB, 7K).

A 16th-rd'er by CIN in '12 out of Miss. St., Nick Rount was a AA SL All-Star in '16 w/Pensacola (33G/0GS, 2-0, 0/1SV, 0.89, .166 BAA, 0.81 WHIP). He also had time w/LOU (17G/0GS, 0-1, 5.00, .314, 1.94). While he had never been above A+ before '15, he mostly started during his rise up the ranks inc. 14 of his 24 app. w/A+ Daytona in '15 (6-3, 3.47, .285, 1.37). RHP Lisalberto Bonilla was originally scheduled to start tonight, but was called up by CIN on Tue. Rount comes off a spot start at COL on Sat. (3IP, 2H, 1R, 2BB, 2K, 1HR, 62P/34S). AFFILIATION HISTORY: Louisville has hosted Triple-A baseball since 1982. During that time, the Louisville Redbirds (1982-1997), RiverBats (1998-2001) and Bats (2002-Present) have been affiliated with the St. Louis Cardinals (1982-1997), Milwaukee Brewers (1998-99) and Cincinnati Reds (2000-Present).

WE ARE THE CHAMPIONS: The club has won a league crown four times (1984, 1985, 1995, 2001). Jim Fregosi skippered the squad to the American Association title in 1984 and 1985, along with a runner-up finish in 1983. The franchise knew only the American Association from 1982 until it switched to the International League in 1998. Fregosi, a six-time big league All-Star, managed in the bigs for the Angels (1978-1981), Chicago White Sox (1986-1988), Philadelphia Phillies (1991-1996) and Toronto Blue Jays (1999-2000).

SHARED HISTORY: Louisville's Governors' Cup came in 2001 when it beat Marc Bombard's Red Barons in a one-game set shortened by the September 11 attacks. SWB would have to wait seven more seasons until it claimed its first Governors' Cup in 2008.

NEW SKIPPER: Delino DeShields is in his third season as the Louisville manager. The Seaford, Del. native spent the 2013-14 seasons mentoring Double-A Pensacola, going 119-159 (.428). He replaced Jim Rigglesman, who went 137-50 (.477) in two seasons with Louisville. Rigglesman departed to become the Reds' third-base coach and was promoted last season to bench coach. DeShields has also managed Low-A Dayton (2011-12) and Rookie Billings (2010) on the Reds' farm. His career with Cincy's minor leagues started as Billings' hitting coach in 2009. The 12th-overall pick by the Montreal Expos in 1987 out of Seaford H.S., DeShields turned down the chance to play point guard for Villanova University in favor of playing pro baseball. By 1990, he made his MLB debut en route to 13 seasons and 1,615 games along with 1,548 hits between the Expos, Dodgers, Cardinals, Orioles and Cubs. He was runner-up to Atlanta's David Justice for N.L. ROY honors and led the senior circuit with 14 triples in 1997 as a Cardinal. His son, Delino DeShields, Jr., was the eighth-overall pick in the 2010 draft by Houston. The Texas Rangers selected him in the Rule 5 draft in Dec. 2014 and he spent 121 games with the Rangers in the bigs during his 2015 debut season including a single in his MLB debut at Oakland on Apr. 8, 2015. He was voted the Rangers' ROY by his teammates/coaches.

 •Fifth-round pick by the Yankees (187th) in 2012
 •Has hit .262 with 2HR and 17RBI in 74 games with the Yankees

 •Was originally selected by the Reds in the 20th round of the 2006 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Miami
 •Eddy and his family (parents Edilio and Ylya, sister Yanisbet and cousin Carlos) defected from Cuba when he was seven years old...sailed to Florida on his father's fishing boat...the group was caught in a storm, but eventually rescued by the U.S. Coast Guard and settled in Miami
 •Made his Major League debut with the Padres...hit a home run in his first Major League at-bat off the Reds' Johnny Cueto
