on their seven-game road trip. Gabriel Cancel and Nick Heath each paced the offense with three hits.
VITAL ROAD TRIP: After Tuesday night's thrilling come-from-behind win, the Blue Rocks have two more games left in the four-game series against the Northern Division leading Potomac Nationals.
-The Blue Crew are currently 6.5 games behind the P-Nats in the Northern Division and have 26 games left to play in the first half to try and make a run at a postseason berth.
-Wilmington currently trails Potomac in the head-to-head matchup 9-6.
-Tuesday night's win snapped the Blue Rocks' three-game losing streak to the P-Nats, but they have dropped five of the last eight to the P-Nats.
AGAINST THE ODDS: Prior to the final inning Tuesday night, the Wilmington Blue Rocks were $0-22$ on the season when trailing after eight innings.
-Conversely, the Blue Rocks are a perfect $16-0$ when leading after the eighth inning.
--The four runs scored were the most in a ninth inning by the Blue Rocks this season.
-Last season, Wilmington was 4-51 when trailing after the eighth inning.
LONG BALL FUN: With Gabriel Cancel's two-run homer in the second inning on Tuesday, the Rocks have clubbed a home run in 22 of 44 games this season.
-The Blue Rocks now have seven players with multiple home runs his season.
-Chase Vallot leads the team with five, Kort Peterson is second with four, Emmanuel Rivera follows with three, Khalil Lee, Xavier Fernandez, Brandon Downes and Cancel each have hit two with Wilmington. -From April 9-14, the Rocks hit a home run in six consecutive games.
-Wilmington went 2-4 during that span and are 12-10 overall when they hit a home run this season.
-The Rocks are tied for sixth in the Carolina League with 25 home runs.
-Last season, the Rocks hit 78 total home runs.
HEATH IS HOT: Outfielder Nick Heath has been scorching since his return from the disabled list on Thursday. -The second-year Blue Rock is hitting a robust . 556 (10-for-18) in his first five games back from the injury with four RBI, three runs scored and has swiped three bases.
-Tuesday night, he turned in his third, three-hit game of the week.
-He drove in the lone run for the Rocks in Monday's loss to Potomac.
-Saturday at Salem, he collected three hits, stole two bases, drove in a run and scored a run.

-It was the first inside-the-parker for a Blue Rock since 2016 when Ryan O'Hearn hit two in a span of six days
-It was Heath's first home run in 59 games. His last homer came back on July 6, 2017 against Lynchburg.
PETERSON HOLDING KORT: Kort Peterson remains one of the hottest hitters in the Blue Rocks' lineup. -He has picked up a hit in five straight games and had a pair of hits and drove in two runs Tuesday night. -In the month of May, he has an impressive slash line of .348/.430/.507 in 20 games.
-Ranking: Second in the Royals' system in batting average (.301) behind 201 FBlue Rock Nicky Lopez and tied for 9th in the Carolina League.
-He had a career-tying seven-game hit streak snapped in the first game of the doubleheader against Myrtle Beach last Wednesday: (Last time: May 12-20 with Low-A Lexington)
-During the hitting streak, he slashed $.500 / .548 / .786$, scored five runs and drove in three runs.
-He is tied for second on the team with 10 multi-hit games this season.
-Peterson is tied for first on the team in total bases (63), second in HR (4), hits (40) and doubles (9) and third in RBI (18).
-He has provided versatility in the Rocks' lineup hitting in the leadoff spot, third, fifth, eighth and ninth in the lineup this season.
ROLLING ON THE RIVERA: Third baseman Emmanuel Rivera has led the offense in multiple offensive categories all season long.
-He leads the team in hits (42), doubles (10), RBI (29) total bases (65) and tied for first in runs scored (20).
-CL Ranking: Rivera is the third-toughest batter to strikeout ( $1 \mathrm{SO} / 8.09 \mathrm{AB}$ )
-Organization Ranking: Tied for first in the system in RBI.
-The 21-year-old however finds himself in a 2-for-26 skid over his last seven games after he was hitting . 360 ( 9 -for-25) during a seven-game hitting streak.
-Rivera had an eight game hitting streak from April 14-22 and hit . 313 (10-for-32) during the stretch.
-It stands as the longest hitting streak by a Blue Rock this season.
-Coming off 2017 season in which he won the South Atlantic League batting title. ( .310 in 122 gms )
LEE THE ON-BASE MACHINE: After going through a 2 -for-26 skid in the final eight games of April, Khalil Lee is showing great patience at the plate this month.
-The 19-year-old is hitting . 265 ( 18 -for- 68 ) and has an $\mathrm{OBP} \%$ of .398 and has walked 12 times.
-He has drawn at least one walk in 8 of the 20 games played including three in the second game of the doubleheader Sunday at Salem.
-Has six multi-hit games this month.
-Has six multi-hit games this month. -Lee paces the Carolina League in walks (31), tied for seventh in all of MiLB and is second in on-base percentage (.406)

- Has not pitched since May 9 at Wilmington where he earned the win.
-Tossed five innings, allowed just one run on one hit, walked three and struck out five. -Last season he spent with the P-Nats and went 4-8 with a 3.87 ERA in 17 starts. -The biggest issue for the hard-throwing righty was his control.
-He walked 7.5 batters per nine innings during his first season in the Carolina League. -He finished with the fourth-most walks allowed last year with 66 in 79 innings of work last season.
-The 23-year-old features a fastball that hovers in the mid-90s, but can reach 96-97.m.p.h. to go along with a curveball that he is still developing and an improving changeup.

## Pitch Repertoire: Fastball, Curveball, Changeup

THE BOOK ON OFREIDY GOMEZ: Ofreidy Gomez was signed by the Kansas City Royals as an international free agent on May 10, 2012. The 22-year-old native of the Dominican Republic spent last season in Low-A Lexington where he pitched in full-season baseball for the first time in his career. With the Legends, he went $7-12$ with a 5.18 ERA in 28 games pitched including 22 starts. He set career-highs in games pitched starts, innings pitched (137.1) and strikeouts (108). He paced the Legends' pitching staff in starts, innings pitched and strikeouts and tied for second in games pitched and was tied for the most losses in the South Atlantic League. Gomez made his stateside debut in 2016 when he pitched for the Burlington Royals, who made it to the Appalachian League Championship Series that season. With Burlington, the righty went 5-4 with a 5.20 ERA in 12 starts and also tossed a complete game. He worked 55.1 innings and allowed 32 earned runs on 46 hits. He struck out 44 batters and walked 27 while holding opponents to a .236 batting average. The righty spent his first three seasons in the Dominican Summer League with the DSL Royals. He made a good first impression in his professional debut season, going 3-0 with a solid 2.35 ERA in 10 relief appearances. He held opponents to a .192 contact clip and struck out 17 men and walked 14 . However, his next two seasons were more of a struggle as he made the transition into a starter. In 2014-15, Gomez went a combined $0-8$ with a 4.32 ERA in 26 appearances including 15 starts.

LAST TIME OUT: Gomez is coming off a no-decision in his last time on the mound on May 17 against Myrtle Beach. He worked five innings, allowed one earned run, four hits, walked three and struck out six. The righty is looking for his first win since April 29 against Winston-Salem when him and Anthony Bender combined to throw a shutout.

STARTING VS. RELIEVING THIS SEASON: Gomez started the season piggybacking with Bender before the weather has shifted the rotation slightly for the Blue Rocks. The rghty has pitched slightly better when starting a game. As a starter, Gomez is 1-2 with a 4.03 ERA in five starts. He has logged 22.1 innings, allowed 22 hits, $11 \mathrm{R} / 10 \mathrm{ER}$, walked 14 and struck out 24 and opposing hitters are hitting .259 against him. Coming out of the bullpen, the 22 -year-old has a 7.04 ERA in three relief appearances. ( $7.2 \mathrm{IP}, 7 \mathrm{H}, 6 \mathrm{ER}, 11 \mathrm{BB}, 12 \mathrm{~K}, .233$ BAA)

FIRST IMPRESSION OF FULL-SEASON BASEBALL: The 2017 season marked the first season in the right-handers career that he pitched in full-season baseball. Like all pitchers, Gomez found a what worked for him to contribute to his durability last year. "I think I worked on my routine and it helped me a lot. I worked hard every day and focused on what I needed to do. During the season, I continued to work on my pitches during my bullpens and it helped." Last season, Gomez pitched in 26.1 more innings with Lexington (137.1 IP) than he did in his entire career (163.2). "I think there wasn't a big adjustment, but I did only throw about 55 innings in short season the year before. So I just tried to be better every day. I kept working as much as I could to build up my arm strength."

MAKING IMPROVEMENTS IN THE OFFSEASON: Gomez continued to work on his arsenal this offseason to get ready for the increase in competition in the Carolina League. "I worked on all my pitches including my curveball and changeup to make them better pitches off of my fastball. I also focused on the command of my fastball because it's my best pitch. I can control it better than my other three pitches and I can throw it both inside and outside. Especially inside which helps me make it tough on right-handers."

IDOLIZING FORMER DOMINICAN REPUBLIC GREATS: Hailing from a hot bed for baseball talent, Gomez grew up idolizing a trio of former MLB greats that lived two hours east of Gomez in Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic. "I actually have three favorite players. Pedro Martinez, Manny Ramirez and David Ortiz. They were my favorites growing up as a child. I liked when Pedro would pitch aggressively and wanted to be the best every day. He had really good command of his pitches and that's what I want to have. Especially with his fastball, he was able to throw it up and in and I can throw mine in on hitters." The fandom for David Ortiz and Manny Ramirez comes from Gomez being a two-way player when he was younger. "I liked Ortiz and Ramirez because when I was a kid I loved to hit. I don't want to hit in the minor leagues, but with my friends back home I will."

GOALS FOR THE UPCOMING SEASON: Gomez has a few goals he wants to accomplish this season both individually and collectively with the pitching staff. "I want to continue my success from last season with Lexington and do well here (in Wilmington) I would like to continue working on my pitches and finish the year in Double-A. It makes me comfortable being able to pitch with (Gerson) Garabito and (Arnaldo) Hernandez. I think we will all do our best to help the team win."
