**Giants In Visalia...** The San Jose Giants open a three-game series against the Visalia Rawhide this evening at Recreation Park. Tonight marks the 24th meeting of the season between San Jose and Visalia (Giants lead season series 12-11). San Jose's only series victory of the second half came against the Rawhide: July 13-16 at Municipal Stadium (won three of four games). Domenic Mazza (3-1, 3.49 ERA) is slated to make the start on the mound for the Giants this evening.

**Lost 10 Of 13...** The Giants enter tonight's contest with a 3-10 record in their last 13 games. San Jose went 2-4 during their most recent homestand (1-2 vs. Rancho Cucamonga, 1-2 vs. Inland Empire). The Giants have lost their last four series' and are a season-high 14 games below .500 overall this season (47-61).

**Tough Month...** The Giants are a league-worst 8-20 in July (5-10 at home, 3-10 on the road) – the most losses San Jose has had in a month since finishing 9-19 in August 2007. The Giants are last in the league in team batting average (.233) and team ERA (6.24) this month. San Jose has allowed 12 or more runs in a game five times in July. The Giants' month-by-month ERA's: April 3.34, May 3.60, June 4.37, July 6.24.

**30-Double Club...** Wander Franco and Jalen Miller both reached 30 doubles for the season last weekend. Franco is third in the California League with 31 doubles this year while Miller is fourth with 30 doubles. Only four players in the 31-year history of the San Jose Giants have hit 40 doubles in a season: Mark Leonard 50 doubles in 1988, Eddy Martinez-Esteve 44 doubles in 2005, Thomas Neal 41 doubles in 2009 and Devin Harris 40 doubles in 2013.

**The Long Ball...** San Jose leads all North Division clubs and ranks third in the California League with 92 home runs this season. The Giants have hit 41 home runs in 38 second half games. San Jose's 32 homers in July are third in the California League (Lancaster 41, Rancho Cucamonga 39). Conversely, the Giants have allowed 38 home runs this month – second-most in the league (Lancaster 40).

**Rec Park Series Win Drought...** The Giants haven't won a series at Visalia's Recreation Park since the opening weekend of the 2013 season (won three of four games April 4-7, 2013). Since that series victory, San Jose is 20-47 (.299) at Rec Park during the regular season with 15 series losses and four series splits. The Giants are 3-5 in Visalia this season.

**Webb Promoted...** Logan Webb was promoted to Double-A Richmond today. A midseason California League All-Star, Webb fashioned a 1.82 ERA over 21 appearances (20 starts) with the Giants this year. Webb struck out 74 batters in 74 innings and limited the opposition to a .207 batting average. The right-hander owned a 1.16 ERA (4 ER/31.0 IP) in seven starts since the All-Star break.

**Road Woes...** The Giants are 22-32 on the road this season – tied with Modesto for the worst road record in the league. San Jose hasn't won a road series since June 8-10 at Modesto (won two of three games). The Giants are 9-21 in their last 30 road games dating back to May 24. San Jose's road ERA this season is 4.93 compared to a 3.90 ERA at home.

**Close Calls...** The Giants lead the league with 37 one-run games (16-21 record) and 11 extra-inning games (6-5) this season.

\* Most recent start came on July 25 against Rancho Cucamonga ... Allowed a season-high five runs (all earned) over four-plus innings of work ... Surrendered seven hits, walked two and struck out one ... Gave up one home run (Cody Thomas 3-run HR in third inning) ... Did not receive a decision (Giants eventually won 8-7).

\* Has one previous start against Visalia on July 14 at Municipal Stadium ... Pitched 5 2/3 innings with two runs (one earned) allowed ... Scattered 10 hits, walked one and struck out two ... Picked-up the win ... Also faced the Rawhide in his 2018 San Jose debut on June 29 (4 IP, 1 R).

\* Joined San Jose on June 29 after a rehab stint in the Arizona Rookie League ... Made two relief appearances with the AZL Giants Orange (6 IP, 0 ER) ... Did not make his season debut until June 19 (back).

\* Spent the majority of the 2017 season with Augusta (A) ... Was 7-9 with a 3.01 ERA in 19 starts for the GreenJackets... Earned midseason South Atlantic League All-Star honors ... Struck out 97 and walked 20 over 119 2/3 innings ... Allowed two earned runs or fewer in 14 out of 19 starts ... Walked two or fewer batters in 18 out of 19 starts.

\* Threw the first nine-inning perfect game in South Atlantic League history on April 25, 2017 at Lexington ... Struck out nine batters ... Threw 85 pitches (60 strikes).

\* Made two starts with San Jose to finish last season ... Was 0-2 with a 7.71 ERA.

\* Also pitched for Augusta during the 2016 season ... Was 8-3 with a 3.93 ERA in 14 starts ... Pitched for the AZL Giants (Rookie) and Salem-Keizer (Short-Season) in 2015.

\* Attended UC Santa Barbara ... Owned a 3.61 ERA over 48 appearances (18 starts) during three-year collegiate career.

\* Attended Clayton Valley High School ... Posted a 1.60 ERA with 75 strikeouts during senior season ... Was a two-time All-League selection ... Also competed in golf.

\* Bay Area native ... Was born in Walnut Creek and resides in Concord ... Favorite team growing up was the San Francisco Giants ... Was in attendance at AT&T Park for Matt Cain's perfect game on June 13, 2012 (and then threw his own perfect game with Augusta five years later).

\* Finished in second place in the world in the Re/Max World Long Drive Championships when he was 16 years old.

### #39 Kelvin Beltre (.206, 3 HR, 9 RBI, 1 SB)

Current Hit Streak: 1 game

- \* Infielder is in his fifth professional season ... Signed as an international free agent in 2013 at age 16.
- \* Joined San Jose from Extended Spring Training on June 7 ... Suffered fractured leg from a foul ball during spring training.
- \* Spent the last two seasons with Augusta (A) ... Batted .253 with 6 HR, 37 RBI's and 15 SB in 118 games last year.
- \* Was a second baseman last year after playing primarily third base in 2016 ... Began pro career as a shortstop.

### #26 Gio Brusa (.248, 16 HR, 55 RBI, 4 SB)

Current Hit Streak: 0

- \* First baseman is in his third professional season ... Selected in the 6th round of the 2016 draft.
- \* Hit for the cycle on April 11 at Lancaster joining teammate Jalen Miller in accomplishing the feat that night.
- \* Was an outfielder in his first two pro seasons before transitioning to first base this year.
- \* Spent the entire 2017 season with San Jose ... Batted .237 with team-high tying 17 home runs and 55 RBI's in 113 games.
