RAILRIDERS BREAKDOWN

HOME: 37-20 | AWAY: 39-22 | STREAK: W 1 | LAST 5: 4-1 | LAST 10: 7-3

LAST TIME OUT: The SWB RailRiders did a bit of everything in bouncing back for a 6-2 win over the host Durham Bulls on Friday night in a battle of the IL's two best teams. The RailRiders posted their seventh victory in eight games both overall and on the road while the Bulls fell for the fifth time in eight affairs.

SO YOU'RE SAYING THERE'S A CHANCE: **Chance Adams (9-3)** logged his fifth straight quality start and his 10th overall in 17 nods at Triple-A. He gave up two runs (one earned) on four hits and one walk over six frames.

BAM BAM RUMBELOW: **Nick Rumbelow** recorded three scoreless frames and his third save. He allowed two hits, walked none and whiffed four. He has yet to allow a run in 20.1 innings at Triple-A this season. Over that time he has walked five, struck out 20 and the IL has gone 11-for-70 (.157) against him.

MAC ATTACK: **Billy McKinney** posted a 2-for-5 night with a double, a homer and three RBIs. The homer was his 10th of the season, giving SWB six different players with double-digit homers on the season. **In 35 games as a RailRider he has gone 45-for-136 with 10 doubles, three triples, 10 homers and 29 RBIs, slashing .331/.366/.669/1.035.**

I'M JUST A CAVE MAN: **Jake Cave** went 1-for-4 with a ground-rule double. The IL's July Player of the Month, Cave owns the IL's longest hitting streaks of the season both overall (19, 440, July 15-Aug. 4) and at home (24, 429, June 19-Aug. 4). The MVP of last year's Governors' Cup Championship Series entered 2017 with 19 career round-trippers. He has 18 between Double-A Trenton (5) and SWB (13) this year, one off the pace of **Mike Ford (19)** for the lead on the Yankees' farm. Cave had a .399 career slugging percentage entering 2017. **Between Double-A and Triple-A this season, Cave's .588 slugging percentage stands seventh in all of full-season MiLB.**

CAN DO: **Miguel Andujar** finished 1-for-4 with an RBI, a walk and a run scored. **His 72 overall RBIs between Double-A and Triple-A trail only Ford (74) on the Yankees' farm.** His overall numbers also rank among the farm's best in AVG (2nd, .314) and HR (4th, 14).

BACK ON TRACK: Before the game, the New York Yankees returned **Tyler Austin** from his rehab assignment, reinstated him from the 10-day DL and optioned him to SWB. Over his seven-game rehab he posted five hits, hitting .217. In his first game with the rehab concluded, he went 3-for-5 with a homer, two RBIs and two runs scored.

A RUN AT HISTORY: **The RailRiders need to go 16-7 over their final 23 games to break the franchise's single-season wins record of 91** set by the 2002 Red Barons and tied by the 2016 RailRiders. If the club goes 14-9 to reach 90 victories, it would still break the single-season franchise record for winning percentage set by last year's team (91-52, .636).

OFF THE RAILS: SWB's offense ranks among the IL's best in: R/G (1st, 4.83), AVG (1st, .271), OBP (1st, .335), SLG (1st, .441), OPS (1st, .776), 2B (1st, 233), 3B (1st, 33), HR (3rd, 127) and SB (5th, 88)...SWB pitching ranks among the IL's best in ERA (2nd, 3.26), WHIP (1st, 1.17) and K/9IP (2nd, 9.2)...SWB has 10 walk-off wins this season including seven in extra innings...No IL team has more wins when trailing after seven innings than the RailRiders (7)...SWB is the IL's only team undefeated when leading after seven frames (61-0)...SWB stands an IL-best 39-22 (.639) away from PNC Field...SWB manager **Al Pedrique** celebrated his birthday on Friday with his 167th regular-season win in two seasons as the manager of the RailRiders (174th including postseason play)...**Mason Williams** went 2-for-5 with a run scored...Andujar's fourth error at Triple-A snapped the RailRiders' longest error-free run of the season at 10 games...The team had not been charged with a mistake in the field all month, last making a miscue in its July 30 win at Charlotte.

ON THE BUMP: A '12 18th-rd'er from Bingham HS (Utah), **Brady Lail** won A+ Opening Day '15 before AA promo. After 4GS AA: 0-2, 5.19, .282 BAA, 1.62 WHIP. Next 16G/15GS: 6-2, 1.92, .216, 1.00. He left the EL ranked in ERA (6th, 2.45), WHIP (5th, 1.10) and BAA (1st starters, .225). He finished '15 w/SWB (7GS, 3-2, 4.62, .313, 1.70). He began '16 back AA (5GS, 1-2, 4.23, .278, 1.52) before early May AAA return (8GS, 3-2, 3.86, .269, 1.26). That run ended w/QS in 5 of 7, but after June 14 win at TOL DL. Back AAA late July: 9GS, 4-4, 6.19, 8HR, 19BB, 48.0IP. Began '17 AAA (6GS, 1-2, 5.88, .275, 1.46), then 2GS AA (1-0, 2.13, .267, 1.26). Back at AAA since late May, over his last 4GS: 0-2, 8.53, .354, 1.79.

An LAA 9th-rd'er in '12 out of South Carolina, **Michael Roth** made MLB in '13 (15G/1GS, 1-1, 7.20, .300, 1.50). He never hurled AAA until he signed w/CLE and spent '15 w/Columbus (31G/19GS, 9-9, 4.85, .290, 1.49). He spent '16 w/TEX, mostly AAA w/Round Rock (28G/23GS, 11-5, 2.97, .252, 1.22, PCL AS). His lone MLB outing w/TEX came in relief July 4, '16 at BOS (3.2IP, 10H, 6R, 1BB, 3K, 3HR, 11R/1S). He began '17 w/SF AAA Sacramento (15G/11GS, 4-4, 1/1SV, 4.69, .317, 1.59). His last outing came June 29 at El Paso (6IP, 11H, 8R/7ER, 0BB, 5K, 3HR). W/DUR since early July, he comes off a Mon. loss vs. LOU (3.1IP, 6H, 5R/4ER, 2BB, 2K, 3HR).

The Church of Baseball

AFFILIATION HISTORY: The Bulls have been a Triple-A squad since 1998. The entirety of their time at the highest minor league level has been spent as a Tampa Bay affiliate. Durham had been the top draw in the Advanced-A Carolina League before that. It was an affiliate of the Atlanta Braves for the entirety of that A-ball run from 1980-97. The team was founded in 1902 as the Durham Tobaccoconists. Through the years it has been an affiliate at many levels for each of the following big league teams as well: the Philadelphia Phillies, New York Mets, Houston Astros, Detroit Tigers, Boston Red Sox, Brooklyn Dodgers, Cincinnati Reds and New York Yankees in 1933.

WE ARE THE CHAMPIONS: Since making the move to Triple-A in 1998, the Bulls have won the International League's Governors' Cup four times (2002-03, 2009, 2013) and have played in the championship series 10 times with the losses coming in 1998, 1999, 2007, 2008, 2010 and 2014. The 2008 squad fell to SWB's lone champion.

BULL DURHAM: The Durham Bulls enjoyed tremendous exposure thanks to the iconic 1988 romantic comedy starring Kevin Costner as "Crash" Davis, Tim Robbins as Ebby Calvin "Nuke" LaLoosh and Susan Sarandon as Annie Savoy. The film's name was not a flip of the script on the minor league team it chronicled. Instead, the town of Durham, N.C. had been called "Bull Durham" since the 1800s when the Blackwell Tobacco Company first sold "Bull" Durham tobacco. There really was a Lawrence "Crash" Davis who played for the Bulls. He got the nickname for colliding with a teammate for a fly ball. The film's writer/director, Ron Shelton, played five minor league baseball seasons for the Orioles including time with the IL's Rochester Red Wings from 1970-71.

DAP TO DBAP: The franchise spent most of its existence playing at the Durham Athletic Park or DAP before shifting to its current home, the 10,000-seat Durham Bulls Athletic Park, or DBAP, in 1995. The current digs hosted the Triple-A National Championship Game in 2012 and the Triple-A All-Star Game in 2014. The DAP and DBAP sit less than a mile away from each other.
