Giants Continue Road Trip In Stockton... The San Jose Giants begin a four-game series against the Stockton Ports this evening at Banner Island Ballpark. Connor Menez (2-4, 4.76 ERA) is slated to start on the mound for the Giants tonight.

Series Win... The Giants opened their road trip by winning two out of three games at Modesto in a series that concluded yesterday. San Jose earned a 6-4 victory in the series opener on Friday before the Nuts bounced back with a 4-3 win on Saturday. The Giants then pounded out 21 hits in a 16-5 triumph yesterday to take the series. The 16 runs scored were the second-most in a game this season by San Jose (18 runs on April 11 at Lancaster).

Brusa Bash... Gio Brusa matched a San Jose Giants single-game record with three home runs in yesterday's blowout win in Modesto. Brusa connected for a solo home run in the top of the second, a two-run homer in the eighth and a three-run shot in the ninth. He became the fourth player in the 31-year history of the San Jose Giants to hit three home runs in a game (Adam Witter 2007, Hector Sanchez 2011, Dillon Dobson 2017). Brusa finished the contest with five runs scored and six RBI's. Since coming off the disabled list on June 3 (concussion), Brusa is batting .407 (11-for-27) in seven games with five home runs and 11 RBI's. His 10 homers this season lead the Giants and rank tied for sixth in the California League. Other highlights of Brusa's 2018 season in San Jose include hitting for the cycle on April 11 at Lancaster and belting an 11th inning walk-off home run on April 15 vs. Stockton.

In The Standings... Following their May 23 win in Modesto, the Giants sat just one game behind Stockton for first-place in the North Division standings. Since, San Jose has posted just a 6-11 record while the Ports have gone 12-5 during the same stretch to build a seven-game lead over the Giants in the standings. Including tonight, seven games remain in the first half.

Quinn Returns... Outfielder Heath Quinn (hamstring) was activated from the disabled list yesterday. Quinn went 2-for-4 with a pair of singles yesterday in Modesto – his first game since May 8. Quinn enters today's contest riding a nine-game hitting streak. In 29 games this season, Quinn is batting .321 with 10 doubles, three home runs and 15 RBI's.

Top Prospects... The Giants currently feature six of the top 30 prospects in the system according to *MLB.com*: Sandro Fabian #6, Heath Quinn #12, Melvin Adon #18, Kelvin Beltre #21, Bryce Johnson #28 and Jalen Miller #30.

Jalen Miller... Jalen Miller knocked out four more hits in yesterday's win and currently ranks fourth in the California League in batting average (.311). Miller is also first in the league in runs scored (44) and second in hits (76). Miller hit his seventh home run of the season on Saturday (59 games played) to surpass his 2017 home run total with the SJ Giants (6 HR in 117 games). The former third round draft pick also has a batting average 84 points higher than his final mark last year in the California League (.227).

Bullpen Woes... The Giants bullpen has 11 blown saves this season – tied for second-most in the California League (Modesto leads with 13). Eight of San Jose's 11 blown saves have come since May 12. The Giants have had the lead in the sixth inning or later in 10 out of their last 17 losses. Twice this month San Jose has lost when leading after eight innings (June 2 vs. Modesto and June 7 vs. Stockton). Prior to the June 2 loss, the Giants had won 78 straight games when leading after eight innings dating back to August 30, 2016.

Inside The Season Series... The Giants are 5-5 against Stockton this season (3-4 at Municipal Stadium, 2-1 at Banner Island Ballpark). San Jose is batting just .224 versus Ports pitching this year. In the previous meeting between the teams, Stockton swept a three-game series at Municipal Stadium last week (June 5-7).

* Faced Stockton in his most recent start on June 6 at Municipal Stadium ... Lasted just 2/3 of an inning with six runs (five earned) and five hits allowed ... Walked two and struck out one ... Retired just two out of the ten batters he faced ... Threw 31 pitches ... Was the shortest start by a San Jose pitcher this season ... Suffered the loss (Stockton won 11-1).

* Previous start came with Sacramento (AAA) on May 31 at El Paso ... Was his second spot-start with the River Cats this season (April 12 vs. Reno) ... Fired seven shutout innings with only one hit allowed ... Walked one, hit two batters and struck out eight ... Picked-up the win ... Was honored as Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Week last Monday.

* 77 strikeouts (in 56 1/3 IP) this season leads the SF Giants minor league system.

* Struck out a career-high tying 10 batters over 5 1/3 innings on May 3 against Visalia (3 R).

* Has struck out at least seven in seven out of ten California League starts ... Has given up just two home runs in 45 1/3 innings with San Jose.

* Owns a .257 opponents batting average with the Giants (.254 vs. right, .263 vs. left).

* Spent the entire 2017 season in the San Jose starting rotation ... Was 7-7 with a 4.41 ERA in 23 games (22 starts) ... Was named to the midseason California League All-Star team ... Led last year's Giants staff in wins, starts, innings pitched (114 1/3) and was second in strikeouts (99) ... Won San Jose's Pitcher of the Year award ... Month-by-month ERA's: April (2.78), May (3.62), June (3.99), July (7.56) and August (8.03).

* Also pitched for San Jose in 2016 ... Was 2-0 with a 4.94 ERA in six games (five starts) ... Was the first player from the 2016 San Francisco Giants draft class to reach the Class-A Advanced level.

* Attended The Master's University (NAIA school in Santa Clarita, CA) ... Had a 2.47 ERA in 102 innings during his final season at The Master's in 2016 ... Pitched in the 2016 NAIA World Series in Lewiston, Idaho.

* Rated the top prospect in the Alaska Baseball League (collegiate summer league) in 2015.

* Attended San Benito High School in Hollister, CA (one hour south of San Jose) ... Pitched at Municipal Stadium while in high school during the Central Coast Section playoffs.

* Grandfather, Bill Plummer, played 10 years in the major leagues with the Cincinnati Reds, Chicago Cubs and Seattle Mariners ... Was a catcher with Cincinnati from 1970-77 ... Plummer previously managed the California League's San Jose Missions in 1980 and is currently the minor league catching coordinator for the Arizona Diamondbacks.
