Dayton Dragons (13-14, 41-56) at Kane County Cougars (18-9, 53-43)

LH Andy Fisher (no record) vs. RH Jackson Goddard (5-3, 2.76)

Today's Game: The Dayton Dragons (affiliate of the Cincinnati Reds) meet the Kane County Cougars (affiliate of the Arizona Diamondbacks) in the first game of a three-game series. **2019 Season Series between Dayton and Kane County:** First meeting tonight.

Last Game: Friday: Dayton 7, Quad Cities 1. Miguel Hernandez blasted a three-run home run, Mariel Bautista hit a solo homer, and Cameron Warren reached base in all four plate appearances in his Dragons debut. Dragons pitchers Adrian Rodriguez (5 IP) and Jerry D'Andrea (4 IP) combined to allow only two hits, matching the fewest total for a Dayton opponent this season. Jay Schuyler and Randy Ventura each added two hits and an RBI.

Team Notes

- The Dragons have won five of their last six games. During this six-game period starting July 13, the Dragons are batting .290 (2nd in the MWL), scoring 38 runs (3rd) with a 3.23 ERA (5th).
- The Dragons have scored at least seven runs and collected at least 10 hits in four of their last five games.
- The Dragons are 6-3 in vs. West Division teams in the second half. They went 4-8 against the West in the first half.
- Dragons relievers have allowed five earned runs in 41.2 innings (1.08 ERA) in the last nine games.
- Dragons hitters have the fewest strikeouts in the MWL in the month of July with 114 in 17 games, 16 fewer than Fort Wayne.
- The Dragons in the month of July are 3rd in the MWL in team batting at .266, and 7th in runs scored with 76 in 17 games. They are tied for 11th in home runs (9) and tied for 9th in stolen bases (11). They rank 6th in July in ERA at 3.10.
- The Dragons in the Second Half rank tied for 5th in the MWL in team batting at .253, and 13th in runs scored with 104 in 27 games. They rank tied for 14th in home runs (12) and tied for 11th in stolen bases (15). They rank 10th in the half in ERA at 3.66.
- The Dragons finished the first half with a 28-42 record. In the half, they finished 13th in Team Batting (.225); 14th in Runs; 16th in Team Pitching (4.51 ERA); and 14th in Team Fielding Percentage (95 errors in 70 games).
- The Dragons have lost 14 games in which they held a lead of at least two runs at some point during the game, and they have lost seven games after leading by at least three runs. They have lost two games in which they led by four runs, and one game after a five-run lead.

Individual Notes

- **Pabel Manzanero** is batting .355 (22 for 62) over his last 15 games. In the Second Half, Manzanero leads the league in extra base hits (17) and is tied for 1st in doubles (12), tied for 5th in RBI (17), tied for 3rd in hits (33), tied for 4th in home runs (4), and tied for 3rd in slugging percentage (.562).
- **Michael Siani** is batting .400 (18 for 45) with six stolen bases over his last 12 games. He has a seven-game hitting streak, going 14 for 31 (.452). Siani's .352 batting average in July ranks seventh in the MWL.
- Since May 24, Siani has played in 44 games and is batting .316 (54 for 171) with 19 stolen bases in 22 tries. Since May 24, he ranks first in the MWL in runs scored, tied for first in hits, third in batting average, and first in stolen bases.
- The Dragons top hitters in the Second Half (27 G) are **Pabel Manzanero** (.314, 12 doubles, 4 HR, 17 RBI, .562 slg. pct.); **Bren Spillane** (.344, 5 doubles, 1 HR, 10 RBI); **Michael Siani** (.286, 7 SB).
- Dragons top hitters in July are Manzanero (.314 with a .557 slg. pct., 13 RBI); Spillane (.357/.524), and Siani (.352, 6 SB).
- **Matt Pidich** over his last 18 games: 1.09 ERA, 33 IP, 19 H, 9 R, 4 ER, 10 BB, 32 SO.

*The Dragons enjoyed a 10-game winning streak from June 2-12. This winning streak tied for the second longest in franchise history and was the longest since 2007. The club record is 13 straight wins in 2002. During the winning streak, the Dragons outscored their opponents 55-30. During the streak, they led the league in team batting (.276) and team ERA (2.10). They were tied for third in runs scored (55). They were second in the league in stolen bases (21). They were third in in doubles (16). They ranked first in both holds (7), and saves (7).

*On Monday, July 8, the Dragons trailed South Bend 4-1 with two outs in the bottom of the ninth inning before rallying to score four runs and win, 5-4. It marked the first time since July 18, 2013 that the Dragons won a game in the bottom of the ninth inning despite trailing by at least three runs to start the half-inning. On July 18, 2013, they trailed Beloit 6-3 going to the bottom of the ninth and won on Seth Mejias-Brean's walk-off grand slam with one out, 7-6.

***Pabel Manzanero**, the Dragons lone all-star selection, hit three home runs in a game on April 23 to become the fourth player in Dragons history to do so. He joins Wily Mo Pena (2001), Juan Francisco (2007), and Byron Wiley (2009).

*Six members of the Dragons are rated among the Reds top 30 prospects (*Baseball America*). They are OF **Michael Siani** (#8); OF **Mariel Bautista** (#16); RHP **Lyon Richardson** (#17); RHP **James Marinan** (#19); 3B **Juan Martinez** (#22); and 1B **Bren Spillane** (#30). Additionally, SS **Miguel Hernandez** is ranked #25 by *Fangraphs.com*...Spillane was the 2018 Collegiate Baseball Magazine Player of the Year, the Big Ten Conference Player of the Year, and a Triple Crown winner in the Big Ten with the University of Illinois. He batted .407 with 22 home runs in 50 games and produced a .944 slugging percentage that led the nation.

DRAGONS WON-LOSS BREAKDOWN

Dragons Manager/Coaches:

Luis Bolívar returns for his third season as Dragons manager after serving as the Dayton hitting coach in 2014-16. Bolívar played for the Dragons in 2003-'04, representing the club in the Midwest League All-Star Game in 2004. Bolívar played professionally for nine seasons from 2002-2010, spending all but the final year of his career in the Reds organization. He spent all or parts of four seasons at the Triple-A level, but never played in the big leagues. Bolívar resides in the Dayton suburb of Vandalia with his wife and four children. Following his playing career, he served as a coach at Vandalia-Butler High School. Bolívar was selected as the "Best Manager Prospect" in *Baseball America's* 2017 Best Tools survey of Midwest League managers.

Pitching coach **Seth Etherton** returns to the Dragons for his second season in 2019, his fourth year as a coach in the Reds organization. Etherton spent the 2016-17 seasons with the Billings Mustangs. Etherton pitched in the Major Leagues in parts of four seasons with the Angels, Reds, A's, and Royals. He was the Angels first round draft pick in 1998 out of the University of Southern California. Etherton pitched in one game for the Dragons on a Major League rehab assignment in 2002.

Hitting coach **Mike Devereaux** joins the Dragons in 2019, his second year as a coach in the Reds organization. He served as the hitting coach for Double-A Pensacola in 2018. Previously, he was a coach for six years in the Rockies organization after two years in the Orioles system. Devereaux spent 12 years in the Major Leagues with the Orioles, Dodgers, Braves, White Sox, and Rangers. He was the MVP of the 1995 NLCS with Atlanta. In 1992 with Baltimore, he hit 24 home runs and drove in 107 runs, finishing seventh in the AL MVP voting.

Bench coach **Kevin Mahar** returns to the Dragons for his third season and sixth year as a coach in the Reds organization. He spent the 2013-14 seasons at Billings and 2015 at Advanced-A Daytona. He worked in private business in 2016. Mahar played college baseball at Indiana University and reached the Major Leagues with the Texas Rangers in 2007.

DRAGONS 2019 HIGHLIGHTS

The Comebacks: On July 8, the Dragons trailed South Bend 4-1 with two outs in the bottom of the ninth inning. Dayton rallied to win the game, getting an RBI single from Michael Siani to make it 4-2, a two-run single by Bren Spillane to tie the score, and an RBI single by Pabel Manzanero to win it. The hits by both Spillane and Manzanero came with two strikes. The game marked the first time since July 18, 2013 that the Dragons won a game in the bottom of the ninth inning despite trailing by at least three runs to start the half-inning. On July 18, 2013, they trailed Beloit 6-3 going to the bottom of the ninth and won on Seth Mejias-Brean's walk-off grand slam with one out, 7-6.

On July 14, the Dragons trailed Beloit 5-0 after one-half inning. They eventually rallied to win the game 8-6, taking the lead in the bottom of the sixth on a three-run triple by Pabel Manzanero. It was the first time the Dragons came back to win a game that they had trailed by as many as five runs since July 27, 2018 when they erased a five-run deficit to defeat Fort Wayne.

Manzanero Trio: On April 23 at Lake County, Pabel Manzanero became the fourth player in Dragons history to hit three home runs in one game, and the first to do it in 10 years. Manzanero's three-homer matched the feats of Wily Mo Pena (2001), Juan Francisco (2007) and Byron Wiley (2009). Manzanero hit a two-run home run in the first inning and added solo homers in the fifth and seventh, going 3 for 5.

Team Cycle: The Dragons hit for the cycle as a team in the sixth inning vs. Great Lakes at Fifth Third Field on April 25. The inning included home runs by Jonathan Willems and Shard Munroe, a single by Morgan Lofstrom, a double by Reniel Ozuna, and a triple by Jay Schuyler, the final hit of the inning. The Dragons scored four runs in the inning and won the game, 8-3.
