Last Game: The Jacksonville Suns (5-5) fell to the Pensacola Blue Wahoos (8-2) by a 3-0 score during the fifth and final game of the series at Blue Wahoos Stadium on Saturday night. Pensacola scored all of its runs in a three-run bottom of the fourth off Suns starter Tim Berry (0-1) who took the loss. The left-hander allowed three runs on five hits with three walks and four strikeouts during his five and two-thirds innings of work. Wahoos right-hander Rookie Davis (2-0) took the win, after pitching six scoreless innings where he gave up five hits with a walk and four strikeouts. Pensacola reliever Kyle McMyne earned his third save with a scoreless ninth. With the bases loaded in the bottom of the third, Davis brought home a run with a groundout to second to give the Wahoos a 1-0 lead. The next batter Beau Amaral delivered a two-RBI double that gave the Blue Wahoos a 3-0 lead, which would be the final score. Jacksonville's Peter Mooney shined at the plate, going 3-for-4 with a pair of doubles in the game. The second baseman's effort was the first three-hit performance the Suns have had in 2016. Following Berry's outing, Patrick Johnson and Blake Logan provided scoreless innings of relief pitching out of the Jacksonville bullpen. The Wahoos took four out of five games in the series, and the Suns have an even record of 5-5.

NEWS AND NOTES

Back at Home: The Suns are glad to be back at home following the 1-4 trip to Pensacola. In the first series of the year, the Suns went 4-1 against the Birmingham Barons on opening weekend at the Baseball Grounds. The Jacksonville Suns welcomed 26,336 fans to the Baseball Grounds of Jacksonville during the first homestand, for an average of 5,267 each night. Both the total attendance and average attendance are the best marks the Southern League, and the second-highest in all of Double-A baseball (Corpus Christi Hooks welcomed 27,510 fans in the Texas League). The Suns Thursday through Sunday were tops in Double-A Baseball with 24,508 fans. The Opening Night crowd of 8,367 fans was the highest the Suns have had for Opening Night since 2007, and this was the best opening series crowd since the 2011 season.

Life in the Fast Lane: The Suns lead the Southern League with 14 stolen bases through the first 10 games of the season. The top two hitters in Jacksonville's batting order are leading the way, with Yefri Perez and Jeremias Pineda both having six each, tied with Birmingham's Adam Engel for the league lead. Moises Sierra and Matt Juenget have a stolen base each, but 11 of the 13 Jacksonville stolen bases come from Pineda/Perez. Pineda had his best day on the basepaths on Sunday April 10 when he stole four bases as part of a team six steal day against the Birmingham Barons, the most the Suns have stolen in a game since 2008. Last season, the Suns were last in the league with 59 stolen bases, and Jacksonville's Kenny Wilson had 37, which was tied for second-best in the league.

Mooney Shines Bright in Pensacola: The best individual game for a Suns hitter came on Saturday night in Pensacola, as second baseman Peter Mooney went 3-for-4 with two doubles in Jacksonville's 3-0 loss to the Blue Wahoos. The three-hit day was the first for a Suns hitter in 2016, and finished a terrific series at the plat for Mooney. Against the Wahoos he was 7-for-15 with four doubles, with a run scored and an RBI. His seven hits against the Wahoos were more than any other Suns hitter in the series. Mooney was signed by the Marlins as a free agent after spending last season with the New Jersey Jackals in the Can-Am League.

Esch Hopes to Continue Success vs. BayBears: Today's Suns starter Jake Esch was dominant last year against Mobile, going 1-0 with a 0.71 ERA in two starts. He earned the win in his first start at Hank Aaron Stadium on May 6. In that outing he went seven scoreless innings scattering five hits, walking three batters and striking out eight as the Suns won 2-1. Esch took a no decision in his last start against the BayBears on July 11 at the Baseball Grounds. Esch worked five and two-third innings, allowing a run on two hits with a career-high seven walks and four strikeouts. The Suns would go on to win 4-3 in 14 innings in Jacksonville.

Hello BayBears: Today starts the first series of the year between the Jacksonville Suns and the Mobile BayBears. The Suns and BayBears will play each other in four different series this year, with the next two meetings coming in Mobile from June 10-14 and July 20-24 at Hank Aaron Stadium. The BayBears will not return to the Baseball Grounds until the final series of the season from September 1-5. Last year the Suns won the season series with the BayBears, with Jacksonville going 12-8 against Mobile, going 5-5 in Mobile and 7-3 at the Baseball Grounds.

LAST START: Esch took the loss in his first road start of the year at Pensacola on Tuesday April 12. Esch pitched four and two third innings where he allowed four runs (all earned) on five hits with two walks and three strikeouts. Esch also hit a solo home run as the Suns fell 4-3.

BARONS START: Esch earned the win in his 2016 debut against the Barons at the Baseball Grounds on Opening Night, Thursday April 7. Esch pitched six innings, allowing one run on three hits, with a walk and six strikeouts. Esch allowed a solo homer to Jake Peter in the top of the second before settling in, and he would retire the last 12 batters he faced. Esch was the only Suns starting pitcher to earn a victory during Jacksonville's series with Birmingham.

BASEBALL AMERICA #13 MARLINS PROSPECT: *Baseball America* listed Esch as Miami's No. 13 prospect entering the 2016 season. Esch is listed as the organization's fourth best right-handed starting pitcher behind Tyler Kolek (1), Kendry Flores (5), and Jordan Holloway (10). MLB.com lists Esch as the No. 9 prospect entering 2016. Esch did not appear in the Baseball America Top 30 prospect rankings in 2015.

AGAINST THE BAYBEARS IN 2015: Last year Esch was dominant against Mobile, going 1-0 with a 0.71 ERA in two starts. He earned the win in his first start at Hank Aaron Stadium on May 6. In that outing he went seven scoreless innings scattering five hits, walking three batters and striking out eight as the Suns won 2-1. Esch took a no decision in his last start against the BayBears on July 11 at the Baseball Grounds. Esch worked five and two-third innings, allowing a run on two hits with a career-high seven walks and four strikeouts. The Suns would go on to win 4-3 in 14 innings in Jacksonville.

2015 ARIZONA FALL LEAGUE: Following the season, made six starts for the Mesa Solar Sox of the Arizona Fall League, going 1-1 with a 4.58 ERA. Esch was joined by fellow Marlins farmhands and former Suns Austin Brice, Tyler Kinley, Trevor Williams, plus position players Elliot Soto, J.T. Riddle, and Austin Dean on the Solar Sox.

2015 IN JACKSONVILLE: With the Suns Esch was a Southern League Midseason All-Star, going 6-5 with a 3.48 ERA in his 15 starts. Esch held opponents scoreless in three of his first four Suns starts, going 3-1 with a 1.93 ERA in that stretch. Esch also lasted six innings or longer in nine of his 15 Suns starts, collecting seven quality starts. He remained in the Suns rotation through mid-July before he was sent to the disabled list with a left oblique injury.

YELLOW JACKET: Spent three years at Georgia Tech as a pitcher and infielder. Posted a 4.13 ERA (24.0 IP/11 ER) with two saves in 20 career appearances. Had a career .304 batting average with 29 doubles, nine home runs, and 79 RBI. Named to the 2010 NCAA Atlanta All-Regional Team as a sophomore. Teammates at Georgia Tech with current Marlins utilityman and 2013 Jacksonville Sun Derek Dietrich. He carried a .974 fielding percentage making just seven errors defensively. Esch was awarded as a member of the 2010 NCAA Atlanta All-Regional Team, 2010 All-ACC Academic Team, and also a member of the 2009 and '10 ACC Honor Roll.

Selected by the Marlins in the 11th round of the 2011 Draft out of Georgia Tech.

2015 Highlights: Split the year between Jacksonville, New Orleans, and also made two rehab starts with the GCL Marlins. Began the season in the Suns rotation (also was the Suns starter in their exhibition with the Miami Marlins on April 4 at the Baseball Grounds), making just one start before his first call-up to Triple-A New Orleans. After making two starts with the Zephyrs, Esch returned to the Suns in late April. He remained in the Suns rotation through mid-July before he was sent to the disabled list with a left oblique injury. After his two GCL Marlins rehab starts in mid-August, Esch finished the season in New Orleans. With the Suns Esch was a Southern League Midseason All-Star, going 6-5 with a 3.48 ERA in his 15 starts. Esch held opponents scoreless in three of his first four Suns starts, going 3-1 with a 1.93 ERA in that stretch. Esch also lasted six innings or longer in nine of his 15 Suns starts, collecting seven quality starts. With New Orleans, Esch was 1-3 with a 5.40 ERA in his six starts. Among Marlins minor leaguers, he tied for third with eight wins and ranked fifth in ERA (3.72). Following the season, made six starts for the Mesa Solar Sox of the Arizona Fall League, going 1-1 with a 4.58 ERA.

2014 Highlights: Esch spent all of 2014 with High-A Jupiter where he was 6-6 with a 4.05 ERA in 25 games and 24 starts. He set career highs in innings pitched (145.2) and strikeouts (104). His 4.05 ERA was eighth lowest among Marlins farmhands. Esch missed time from April 21-28 with a right middle finger infection.

2013 Highlights: Esch spent all of 2013 with High-A Jupiter, where he was 2-10 with a 4.69 ERA in 23 games and 19 starts. Esch was on the disabled list from April 23-May 17 with right biceps tendinitis.

2012 Highlights: Esch split the 2012 season between Low-A Jamestown and Single-A Greensboro, going a combined 4-3 with a 3.15 ERA and one save. With the Jammers he was 3-0 with a 3.16 ERA in 10 appearances and two starts, while going 1-3 with a 3.13 ERA in six appearances and four starts with the Grasshoppers.

2011 Highlights: Esch began his first professional season with the GCL Marlins, going 2-0 with a 1.29 ERA in four relief appearances. Esch finished the season in Jamestown, going 1-1 with a 4.63 ERA in eight relief appearances.

College: Spent three years at Georgia Tech as a pitcher and infielder. Posted a 4.13 ERA (24.0 IP/11 ER) with two saves in 20 career appearances. Had a career .304 batting average with 29 doubles, nine home runs, and 79 RBI. Named to the 2010 NCAA Atlanta All-Regional Team as a sophomore. Teammates at Georgia Tech with current Marlins utilityman and 2013 Jacksonville Sun Derek Dietrich. The current Suns right-hander totaled 17 multi-hit games, to go along with seven multi-RBI contests, thanks in part to his .342 average with runners in scoring position. He carried a .974 fielding percentage making just seven errors defensively. Esch was awarded as a member of the 2010 NCAA Atlanta All-Regional Team, 2010 All-ACC Academic Team, and also a member of the 2009 and '10 ACC Honor Roll. **Personal:** Full name is Jacob Otto Esch. Prior to time at Georgia Tech, he attended Cretin-Derham Hall H.S. (St. Paul, MN), which includes notable alumni such as: Paul Molitor (Baseball Hall of Famer and Twins manager), Matt Birk, Steve Walsh, Chris Weinke (2000 Heisman Trophy Winner and former FSU quarterback), and Joe Mauer. Esch was a three-sport athlete who earned three varsity letters in baseball and football and two in basketball. The Minnesota native was elected as the Pioneer Press Player of the Year in 2007, and tabbed as an All-State performer following his junior and senior seasons. He led Cretin-Derham Hall to the state title in 2007 following a runner-up finish in 2006. In H.S., he posted a record of 16-1 with a 1.50 ERA and 125 strikeouts in 121 innings of work over a three-year span. He managed to hit .445 with 13 HR, 21 doubles and 92 RBI in his high school career. **BASEBALL**

Began the season in the Suns rotation (also was the Suns starter in their exhibition with the Miami Marlins on April 4 at the Baseball Grounds), making just one start before his first call-up to Triple-A New Orleans. After making two starts with the Zephyrs, Esch returned to the Suns in late April. He remained in the Suns rotation through mid-July before he was sent to the disabled list with a left oblique injury. After his two GCL Marlins rehab starts in mid-August, Esch finished the season in New Orleans. With the Suns Esch was a Southern League Midseason All-Star, going 6-5 with a 3.48 ERA in his 15 starts.
