Tonight's Game... The San Jose Giants begin their final road trip of the season tonight with the opener of a three-game series at Visalia. DJ Myers (5-3, 5.26 ERA) is slated to make the start on the mound for the Giants.

The Giants... San Jose is 6-5 in their last 11 games following a 4-16 stretch. A victory tonight would give the Giants their first three-game winning streak since July 13-15. San Jose is 15-31 (.326) since July 1 and 25-47 (.347) since the beginning of June.

Clutch Hits... The Giants went 14-for-32 (.438 AVG) with runners in scoring position during their three-game series against Lancaster last weekend (won two of three). San Jose was only 11-for-65 (.169 AVG) w/RISP in their previous six games. The Giants are batting a league-worst .236 with runners in scoring position this season.

Three Straight Losing Seasons... The Giants (54-72) have clinched a sub-.500 overall record this year. It marks the first time in team history (1988-2018) that the San Jose Giants have posted three straight losing seasons (62-78 in 2017, 68-72 in 2016). The Giants had 12 consecutive winning seasons from 2004-2015.

Standings Update... The Giants (20-36) are six games behind first-place Stockton (26-30) and Visalia (26-30) in the second half North Division standings with 14 to play in the regular season. San Jose is in danger of missing the playoffs in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 2002-03.

League Leaderboard... Several Giants hitters currently rank among the California League leaders. Wander Franco is leading the league in doubles (36) and tied for fourth in hits (127). Jalen Miller is third in hits (131) and tied for fourth in doubles (33). Heath Quinn is fifth in the league in batting average (.310) and fifth in OPS (.897). Gio Brusa is tied for fifth in home runs (18). Johneshwy Fargas leads the league in stolen bases (40) while Bryce Johnson is tied for fourth (26).

Rec Park Series Win Drought... The Giants haven't won a series at Visalia's Recreation Park since the opening weekend of the 2013 season (won three of four games April 4-7, 2013). Since that series victory, San Jose is 21-49 (.300) at Rec Park during the regular season with 16 series losses and four series splits.

The Long Ball... San Jose leads all North Division clubs and ranks third in the California League with 107 home runs this season. The Giants have hit 56 home runs in 56 second half games. Conversely, San Jose has already allowed 74 home runs in the second half – more than twice as many as their 36 homers surrendered in the first half.

Brusa Bash... Gio Brusa has hit 35 career home runs with the San Jose Giants, which is sixth in team-history and the most ever by a switch hitter. His 35 homers have come over 210 games with San Jose the last two seasons (17 HR in 2017, 18 HR in 2018). Next on the SJ Giants career home run list is Travis Ishikawa and Angel Villalona tied for fourth with 36 HR each.

Road Woes... The Giants haven't won a road series in the second half. Their last road series win was June 8-10 at Modesto (won two of three games). San Jose has lost 12 out of their last 16 road games and is 12-27 in their last 39 away from home dating back to May 24. The Giants' road ERA this season is 4.93 compared to 3.97 at home.

Odds And Ends... San Jose is 40-25 (.615) when scoring first compared to 14-47 (.230) when their opponent scores first ... The Giants have played in a league-high 41 one-run games (18-23 record) ... San Jose is seventh in the league in team batting average (.250) and last in on-base percentage (.314), have issued the most walks in the league (513, 4.1 per game), lead the league in blown saves (23) and have committed the most errors (145).

* Is in his third professional season ... Selected by the San Francisco Giants in the 15th round of the 2016 draft.

* Scheduled to make his seventh start and 22nd overall appearance with San Jose this season in evening's game ... Has struck out 79 batters with just 20 walks in 78 2/3 innings pitched this year ... Owns a .292 opponents batting average.

* Since moving back into the rotation, is 2-0 with a 2.65 ERA over three starts ... Has struck out 15 and walked only one in 17 innings ... Has won his last two starts.

* Most recent start came on August 14 at Inland Empire ... Pitched a season-high tying six innings and allowed only one run ... Surrendered five hits, walked one and struck out four ... Took a shutout into the sixth inning ... Threw a season-high 92 pitches ... Giants won the game 8-1.

* Is 2-1 with a 6.33 ERA as a starter (6 GS) ... Has compiled a 4.70 ERA as a reliever (15 G) ... Has pitched at least four innings in nine out of his 15 relief appearances this season.

* Has fared considerably better against left-handed hitters (.217 AVG) compared to versus right-handed batters (.333 AVG) this season.

* Won the California League Pitcher of the Week award May 7-13 ... Tossed 11 scoreless innings over two relief appearances during the week ... Allowed just two hits, walked one and struck out 14 (1-0 record) ... Struck out a career-high 10 batters over five shutout innings on May 8 at Modesto ... Pitched six innings with no runs and one hit allowed on May 13 versus Lancaster (four strikeouts).

* Was placed on the disabled list (elbow) after leaving his May 18 outing in Stockton ... Was on the DL from May 19-June 15 ... Returned to the mound on June 16.

* Has a 4.42 ERA and .255 opponents batting average at home compared to a 6.00 ERA and .322 average on the road.

* Spent the entire 2017 season with Augusta working as both a starter and a reliever ... Was 3-8 with a 4.37 ERA in 22 games (12 starts) ... Pitched for the AZL Giants (Rookie) in 2016 ... Fashioned a 1.70 ERA in 14 games (nine starts) ... Had a 3-2 record ... Ranked second in the Arizona Rookie League in ERA and tied for fifth in strikeouts ... Did not allow a run over his final 21 innings of the season.

* Attended College of Southern Nevada and UNLV ... Pitched his freshman season at College of Southern Nevada (2014) before spending two years at UNLV (2015-16) ... Earned First Team All-Mountain West Conference honors in 2016 (6-4, 5.23 ERA in 15 starts).

- * Infielder is in his fifth professional season ... Signed as an international free agent in 2013 at age 16.
- * Joined San Jose from Extended Spring Training on June 7 ... Suffered fractured leg from a foul ball during spring training.
- * Entered the 2018 season ranked as the #21 prospect in the San Francisco organization by *MLB.com*.
- * Spent the last two seasons with Augusta (A) ... Batted .253 with 6 HR, 37 RBI's and 15 SB in 118 games last year.
- * Was a second baseman last year after playing primarily third base in 2016 ... Began pro career as a shortstop.
