RubberDucks halt first-place Rumble Ponies: After allowing 27 runs on 33 hits in two losses to begin the series, the RubberDucks pitched a combined two-hit shutout of Binghamton for a 2-0 win, snapping the Rumble Ponies' five-game winning streak, in the series finale in front of 2,538 at Canal Park Wednesday night. Right-hander **Matt Solter** went a season-long seven scoreless innings, allowing one hit, and left-hander **David Speer** (2-1) and right-hander **James Karinchak** (4th save) each pitched a scoreless inning. Two eighth-inning runs scored on a wild pitch and center fielder **Daniel Johnson's** popup infield single.

RubberDucks spin shutouts: The RubberDucks' combined shutout on Wednesday was the fourth shutout the club has pitched, tied for most in the Eastern League, and accounting for half the team's wins. Akron pitchers combined to shut out the Bowie Baysox for the final 17 innings of their three-game series, including both games of Saturday's doubleheader. After a scoreless first inning Monday, the streak ended at 18 innings, as Binghamton scored twice in the second inning.

Unhittable Karinchak: RubberDucks right-hander **James Karinchak** recorded his first 12 outs this season via strikeout in five outings. Through eight appearances (8 IP), he has allowed four baserunners via two walks, one catcher's interference, and a wild-pitch strikeout. He has thrown three total wild pitches. He has twice had six consecutive strikeouts and has 19 total this season. In his first 10 Double-A appearances last season, he struck out 16 and walked 12 in 10.1 innings for the RubberDucks. Karinchak is ranked as the Indians' No. 30 prospect by MLB.com and has made MLB.com's first two Prospect Teams of the Week (April 15 and April 22).

Johnson delivering: Outfielder **Daniel Johnson** leads Akron with three home runs and 14 RBI. In his last nine games, Johnson is 12-for-35 with three doubles, two homers and 13 RBI, including back-to-back four-RBI games April 13 and April 15. In 2018, Johnson played 89 games with the Washington Nationals' Eastern League affiliate, Harrisburg. He was on the injured list June 6-July 23, due to a broken right hamate bone that required surgery. Part of the Nov. 30 trade (along with IF **Andruw Monasterio** and RHP **Jefry Rodriguez**) that sent Yan Gomes from Cleveland to Washington, Johnson is the Indians' No. 14 (*Baseball America*)/No. 22 (MLB.com) prospect.

Ducks face familiar foes: The RubberDucks' schedule has them playing the same four opponents for two series each in the month of April. After hosting Altoona and Trenton, Akron went to the same cities, and after going 4-2 against Bowie and Binghamton, its seven-game road trip April 25-May 1 visits the same clubs. Akron was 40-30 on the road in the 2018 regular season and 78-62 overall.

Ducks All Over the Pond: Of the 12 position players who began the season with Akron, nine have started games at multiple positions. Only catchers **Li-Jen Chu** and **Logan Ice**, and first baseman **Wilson Garcia**, have played exclusively at one position.

Ducks visit Baysox: The RubberDucks and Baysox are playing the second of six scheduled series this season, with 10 games scheduled at Canal Park and 11 at Prince George's Stadium. Last season, Akron went 13-8 against Bowie, including 8-3 at Prince George's Stadium. Bowie finished fourth in the Western Division, at 67-71. Notable current RubberDucks last season against Bowie include:
Tyler Krieger 18 games, 25-for-81 (.309) 1 HR, 9 RBI
Ka'ai Tom 18 games, 19-for-68 (.279) 2 HR, 17 RBI
Connor Marabell 14 games, 17-for-54 (.315) 1 HR, 9 RBI

Ducks' Double-A Debuts: The three RubberDucks position players who had no Double-A experience before this season have found early success with Akron this season.

- First baseman **Wilson Garcia** has 16 hits and nine RBI (both third on the team), with five doubles (tied for the lead) and a home run. He has reached base in seven straight games.
- A Mayfield High School and Ohio University alumnus, outfielder **Mitch Longo**, homered on the first Double-A pitch he saw April 5. His two triples lead Akron, his 10 RBI rank second, his seven walks are tied for third, and his 14 hits and seven runs are tied for fourth. He has played seven games in left, three in right and four as DH.
- Infielder **Andruw Monasterio** leads the team with 19 hits in 15 games, playing error-free defense at second base, third base and shortstop. After going hitless on Opening Night, he has reached base safely in 14 straight games. He was placed on the IL April 23.

Strong starters: Over a season-long four-game winning streak April 17-20, RubberDucks starting pitchers combined to work 23 innings, allowing three earned runs (1.17 ERA) on 14 hits with six walks and 21 strikeouts. Those four starts:

Homers in bunches: The RubberDucks hit their first four home runs of the season on April 5 in a 7-6 home loss to Altoona, then went homerless for seven straight games, before hitting three in Altoona in Game 2 of an April 13 doubleheader. Both **Daniel Johnson** and **Tyler Krieger** hit home runs in each of those games. Akron has five solo home runs and five two-run homers in 2019 but did not hit one in either of two three-game series with Trenton.

Plesac allowed a baserunner in four of his five innings on the mound, but he only allowed one to reach third base. Opposed by Bowie's Alex Wells, he departed with a scoreless tie. Nick Sandlin pitched a scoreless sixth inning, and left-hander David Speer pitched two scoreless innings, earning the win when Akron's Ka'ai Tom hit a walk-off single in the bottom of the eighth inning for a 1-0 win.

2019 RUBBERDUCKS FIELD STAFF

#24 Rouglas Odor, Manager (First Season) – Odor, 51, is the 18th manager in club history. He follows Tony Mansolino, who was promoted to Triple-A Columbus after guiding Akron to a 78-62 record and finish as runner-up in the 2018 Eastern League Championship Series against the New Hampshire Fisher Cats. Last season, Odor managed the Class-A Advanced Lynchburg Hillcats to their fourth consecutive postseason. After posting the Carolina League's worst first-half record of 29-38, the Hillcats rebounded to go 42-28 in the second half, claiming the Northern Division title. They fell to Potomac in the semifinals, three games to two. Odor has a 361-363 (.499) career managing record in 11 seasons.

When Odor was the RubberDucks hitting coach in 2014, he became the first person to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros, and Akron RubberDucks. He played 197 games for Canton-Akron during the 1991, 1993-94 seasons, and he was the hitting coach for the Aeros' 2012 Eastern League Championship squad.

The 2019 season is Odor's 32nd in the Cleveland organization as a player or coach (19th as a coach). The former shortstop was a 32nd-round draft pick by the Indians in 1988 and played in the minor leagues for the Indians from 1988-94 and for the Milwaukee Brewers organization in 1995. Last season was Odor's first as a manager since 2008. He managed San Felipe in the Venezuelan Summer League for two seasons in 1999-2000, the Burlington Indians for four seasons from 2001-04, the Mahoning Valley Scrappers for two seasons in 2005-06, and the Gulf Coast League Indians for two seasons in 2007-08. Since then, Odor has moved up the ranks as a hitting coach, starting with Class-A Kinston in 2009-10, Akron in 2011-12 and 2014, the High-A Carolina Mudcats in 2013, and Triple-A Columbus in 2015-17.

The Maracaibo, Venezuela, native resides in Winter Haven, Florida, with his wife, Milagros. He has three sons and is the uncle of Texas Rangers infielder Rougned Odor.

#27 Tony Arnold, Pitching Coach (10th Season, not consecutive) — Arnold, 59, rejoins the RubberDucks for his fifth time in Akron after spending last season with Lynchburg. In 2018, the Hillcats pitching staff finished fifth in the Carolina League with a 3.76 ERA, ranked second with 1,190 strikeouts and the 12 team shutouts ranked fourth. Arnold last was with the RubberDucks in 2016-17, helping lead the 2016 team to an Eastern League championship. He previously served in the same capacity in Akron from 1996-99, 2008, and 2011-12. Arnold's 2012 Akron Aeros staff crafted a franchise-record 3.03 ERA and went on to claim the EL championship. In 2016, Arnold became the second man to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros and Akron RubberDucks, joining Rouglas Odor in that exclusive group.

In 2015, Arnold began as the pitching coach at Lynchburg and finished at Triple-A Columbus, helping the Clippers to the International League title. A former All-American at the University of Texas, Arnold pitched in the major leagues with the Baltimore Orioles in 1986 and 1987.

#2 Justin Toole, Hitting Coach (First Season) — Toole, 32, spent the 2018 season as Lynchburg's hitting coach. This is fourth season coaching in the Indians' organization, serving as the hitting coach for Mahoning Valley in 2016, Lake County in 2017, and Lynchburg. Toole was signed as a minor league free agent by the Indians in 2009 and spent parts of seven seasons with Cleveland from 2009-15. He spent parts of 2010, 2012-15 with Akron, hitting .259 in 180 games, including .275 in 77 games under Odor's hitting-coach tutelage in 2014. The Council Bluffs, Iowa, native played at the University of Iowa and has authored a children's book called "9 in 9," chronicling the lessons he learned while playing all nine positions in a game for the Carolina Mudcats on Aug. 25, 2012. **Twitter: @Tooleyj24, Instagram: @tooleyj24**

#28 Juan De La Cruz, Bench Coach (First Season) — De La Cruz, 25, is in his second season coaching with the Indians after serving as the hitting coach for the rookie-level Arizona League Indians in 2018. Primarily a catcher in his playing days, De La Cruz was signed as a free agent by the Indians in 2009 and spent eight seasons in the system, reaching as high as Akron in 2017, when he played 12 games as a catcher and first baseman. He was a .216 career hitter in 281 games.

Bobby Ruiz, Athletic Trainer (First Season) — Ruiz spent the past four seasons (2015-18) with Lynchburg. This is his ninth with the Indians..

Paul Synenkyj, Strength and Conditioning Coach (Third Season) — Synenkyj is the lone returning field staff member from 2018. He is in his ninth season in the Indians organization. He holds degrees in physical education from Cleveland State and the University of Akron.

We Are the RubberDucks

On October 29, 2013, team owner **Ken Bobby** stood before a capacity audience at the Akron Civic Theater and announced that the team would be known henceforth as the **Akron RubberDucks**. In addition to being symbolic of the fun, family-friendly brand of entertainment offered by minor league baseball, the name also honors Akron's long history as the "**Rubber Capital of the World.**" Brandiose Marketing of San Diego, California designed the team logo, colors, and various marks and insignias. Please note that for print coverage, *RubberDucks* is spelled as one word with a capital "D." In broadcast coverage, referring to the team as "*the Ducks*" is an acceptable variation of the team's nickname.
