Last Game: Chattanooga Lookouts catcher Jose Gonzalez homered and drove in four runs to help his team take its first lead in four games on the way to a 10-1 win over the Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp Saturday night in front of 8,821 – adding to the highest-attended opening series in the 15-year history of the Baseball Grounds of Jacksonville. Jumbo Shrimp left-hander Mike Kickham (0-1) was perfect through 10 batters and escaped a bases-loaded jam for a scoreless fourth inning. In the fifth inning, he began with a walk to Gonzalez and single by third baseman Ryan Walker to begin the inning. After a strikeout and a wild pitch put two runners in scoring position, Lookouts shortstop Nick Gordon hit a two-run single to center field. In his Baseball Grounds of Jacksonville debut, Kickham finished five innings, allowing two earned runs on four hits with one walk and six strikeouts. In the sixth inning, Jacksonville right-hander Hunter Adkins walked left fielder Travis Harrison and right fielder LaMonte Wade with two outs, before Gonzalez drove a three-run home run to the left-field berm for a 5-0 Chattanooga lead. Lookouts right-hander Felix Jorge (1-0) pitched 5 2/3 innings and struck out four batters while allowing three hits and three walks. He yielded an earned run in the sixth inning when Jacksonville center fielder Jeremias Pineda singled and came around to score on third baseman Brian Anderson's groundout. While Lookouts right-handers Luke Bard (2 1/3 innings) and Nick Burdi (one inning) combined for scoreless relief of Jorge, the Lookouts extended their lead in the final two innings against Jumbo Shrimp right-hander Ryan Beckman in his Jumbo Shrimp debut. Shortstop Engelb Vielma hit a two-run single in the eighth inning, and Gonzalez added an RBI single amid a three-run ninth inning that capped the 10-1 Lookouts win.

NEWS AND NOTES

Garcia to Miami Marlins: Left-handed relief pitcher Jarlin Garcia has been recalled to the major league Miami Marlins, announced on Friday. Garcia this season has made three relief outings for the Jumbo Shrimp, with no wins or losses and a 0.00 ERA in his three innings of work. This is the second big league call-up for Garcia, who was recalled by the Marlins on May 15 last season from Jacksonville. Garcia did not pitch for the Marlins in the big leagues last season despite being on their active roster for five days. Garcia made his big league debut Friday night, working a scoreless sixth inning of relief work against the New York Mets.

How's Business? Boomin': Through the first four games of the season, Jacksonville fans are making it well known that they support the Jumbo Shrimp. Saturday's crowd welcomed in 8,821 fans to the Baseball Grounds. Friday night the Baseball Grounds welcomed 10,023 fans to the ballpark, the second time this week that there has been over 10,000 fans in the stadium. Thursday's crowd saw 8,249 fans make it to the Baseball Grounds for Thirsty Thursday, one of the best Thursday crowds in years. Jacksonville leads the Southern League by averaging 9,583 fans, 2,207 more fans than the next closest club in the league, Birmingham. The inaugural Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp home opener played to a sellout crowd of 10,477 – the largest Opening Day crowd at the Baseball Grounds of Jacksonville since the stadium's record-setting opening in 2003. Wednesday's crowd was also the largest crowd at a Southern League game at the ballpark since July 3, 2012. The stadium record of 12,943 was set at the venue's first-ever game on April 11, 2003. The 37,570 fans through the gates the first four days is a Baseball Grounds record attendance for the first four games of any season in Jacksonville.

Starting Pitchers Are Consistent: Through the first nine games of the season, each Jacksonville starting pitcher has pitched at least five innings, and the Jumbo Shrimp have not had to over-extend the bullpen in any nine inning game. Friday Omar Bencomo turned in six scoreless innings, and he hasn't allowed a run through his first 11 innings on the mound in 2017. Also thanks to early run support the past three games, all of Jacksonville's starting pitchers have earned the victory, and in each of the five Jumbo Shrimp victories, the starting pitcher has earned the win.

Bye Bye Lookouts: Today marks the final game of the series between the Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp and the Chattanooga Lookouts at the Baseball Grounds. Chattanooga will not make a return trip to Jacksonville this season, but the Jumbo Shrimp will travel to Chattanooga, Tennessee from July 13-17 in the second half of the season.

Shrimp Have Prospects: On the Opening Day roster, the Jumbo Shrimp have seven players that are considered among the Top 30 Marlins prospects for this season according to both Baseball America and MLB.com. Top 30 Marlins Prospects include: third baseman Brian Anderson (No. 3 MLB, No. 4 BA), left-handed pitcher Jarlin Garcia (No. 4 MLB, No. 6 BA), left-handed pitcher Dillon Peters (No. 5 MLB, No. 5 BA), left fielder Austin Dean (No. 13 MLB, No. 8 BA), right-handed pitcher Tayron Guerrero (No. 19 MLB, No. 16 BA), outfielder John Norwood (No. 27 MLB, No. 29 BA), and infielder Yefri Perez (No. 30 both MLB & BA). Additionally, Baseball America regards Anderson as being the "Best Hitter for Average, Best Strike-Zone Discipline, Best Defensive Infielder, Best Infield Arm," in the organization, while Garcia has the "Best Changeup," Perez is the "Fastest Baserunner," and Peters has the "Best Control."

LAST START: Mazza took the loss in his first start of the season on Monday April 10 against the Mississippi Braves at Trustmark Park. Mazza worked five innings, allowing five runs on seven hits with two walks and three strikeouts as he also allowed two homers. The M-Braves won the rubber match of the series by a 7-4 score.

2016 with JACKSONVILLE: Mazza spent most of 2016 in Jacksonville after starting the season with High-A Jupiter, and he was the first Hammerhead to be called up to Jacksonville that hadn't previously played at the Double-A level before. Mazza made his first professional start in an emergency start on May 15 when Jarlin Garcia was called up to the big leagues, and Mazza earned the victory with a five scoreless innings against the Montgomery Biscuits, and remained in the rotation until injury in mid-June.

INJURY AND GCL TIME: Following his win against the Shuckers on June 15, Mazza was placed on the disabled list on June 16 with right shoulder tendinitis. Mazza had a rehab assignment in early July with the GCL Marlins, where he was 1-1 with a 1.80 ERA in four appearances and three starts. Mazza returned to the Suns on July 23.

2016 with JUPITER: Mazza began the season in the bullpen for the High-A Jupiter Hammerheads in the Florida State League. Mazza was 1-0 with a 1.20 ERA in his seven relief outings, collecting eight strikeouts in his 15 innings of work. Mazza was called up to the Suns on May 1, and was the first player called up from High-A to Double-A for the Marlins in 2016.

2016 Highlights: Mazza began the season in the bullpen for the High-A Jupiter Hammerheads in the Florida State League. Mazza was 1-0 with a 1.20 ERA in his seven relief outings, collecting eight strikeouts in his 15 innings of work. Mazza was called up to the Suns on May 1, and was the first player called up from High-A to Double-A for the Marlins in 2016. Mazza spent most of 2016 in Jacksonville after starting the season with High-A Jupiter, and he was the first Hammerhead to be called up to Jacksonville that hadn't previously played at the Double-A level before. Mazza made his first professional start in an emergency start on May 15 when Jarlin Garcia was called up to the big leagues, and Mazza earned the victory with a five scoreless innings against the Montgomery Biscuits, and remained in the rotation until injury in mid-June. Following his win against the Shuckers on June 15, Mazza was placed on the disabled list on June 16 with right shoulder tendinitis. Mazza had a rehab assignment in early July with the GCL Marlins, where he was 1-1 with a 1.80 ERA in four appearances and three starts. Mazza returned to the Suns on July 23. All told, Mazza was 6-5 with a 4.16 ERA in 19 appearances and 14 starts with Jacksonville.

2015 Highlights: Split the season between the Twins and the Marlins organizations. Mazza had five relief appearances with the GCL Twins with no record and a 0.00 ERA in six innings pitched. With the Cedar Rapids Kernels in the Midwest League, Mazza had no wins or losses and a 9.00 ERA in two games in relief and three innings pitched. Mazza was released by the Twins organization on July 22, 2015. The Miami Marlins signed him as minor league free agent on August 4, 2015, and assigned him to High-A Jupiter. With the Hammerheads, Mazza went 0-1 with a 3.60 ERA in 11 games in relief, striking out 11 batters in 15 innings pitched.

2014 Highlights: Mazza spent all of 2014 with Single-A Cedar Rapids in the Midwest League. With the Kernels, Mazza was 4-4 with a 2.79 ERA in 25 games pitched, and struck out 62 batters compared to 11 walks in 48 and a third innings pitched.

2013 Highlights: Mazza spent all of 2013 with Single-A Cedar Rapids in the Midwest League. With the Kernels, Mazza had no wins or losses and a 6.23 ERA in seven games pitched in relief with a pair of saves.

2012 Highlights: After he was drafted by the Twins, Mazza was 2-1 with a 0.60 ERA in nine relief outings for the GCL Twins. In the Appalachian League with Elizabethton, Mazza was 3-1 with a 3.45 ERA in nine games in relief, striking out 15 batters in his 15 and a third innings pitched.

College: Mazza pitched collegiately at Menlo College. Mazza is the program's all-time record holder in triples, saves, and is tied for home runs with an astounding 19. During the 2011 campaign, Mazza helped lead the Oaks to their first ever Conference Title with an impressive team leading .337 batting average, five home runs, and 41 RBIs while accumulating equally imposing stats on the mound, with a team low 2.37 ERA and nine saves. He was the first player ever drafted out of Menlo, although Gino Cimoli (1956-1965, All Star in 1957 with the Brooklyn Dodgers), and Bill Renna (1953-59) have played in the majors.

Personal: Mazza was originally selected by the Minnesota Twins in the 27th round of the 2011 draft out of Menlo College in Atherton, California. Mazza attended Clayton Valley HS in Concord, California, same alma mater as former major leaguers Clyde Mashore and Damon Mashore.
