Pacific Northern Champions: The Reno Aces became champions of the Pacific North Division in the PCL for the fourth time in franchise history. The Aces clinched for the first time in 2011, 2012 and 2014.

Divisional Dominance: For a seventh consecutive season and eighth time in nine years, the Aces went .500 or better against their own division. They finished 26-21 (.553) against the Pacific Northern Division. In 2010, the Aces finished 22-26 in the Pacific Southern Division, their only losing campaign against their own division.

League Sweep: The Aces took the season series in each division throughout the 2017 campaign, highlighted by a 35-26 beatdown against Pacific Southern squads. In their own division, Reno went 26-21 followed by a 10-7 finish over American North contenders while squeaking by with a 9-8 record against American Southern teams.

68 Players: A total of 68 players suited up for the Aces this summer, just four shy of breaking a franchise-high. Out of the sum, 27 position players took the field while 41 pitchers worked on the bump at Greater Nevada Field. In addition, four position players worked in relief - Willians Astudillo, Kristopher Negron, Rudy Flores, and Kevin Medrano - resulting in a total of 45 pitchers this season.

Gross First Managerial Season: In his fifth season entering as hitting coach for the Aces, the former World Series champion took on more in 2017 than ever previously, taking over as interim manager due to newly-named manager Jerry Narron's substitution in Arizona. Gross led the Aces to a second franchise-best 80 wins while captaining the team to a 56-game first place streak. The 2017 season marked his first professional managing role of his career.

Pushing the barriers: In 2017, the Aces set a new team high in triples (70) while posting the second-best team home run count in nine years (158). Additionally, the team plated the second-highest run total (858), total bases (2,350), RBI (812), and slugging percentage (.472). The team's .290 average was their fourth-best in franchise history.

Franchise-High Transactions: The Reno Aces, in conjunction with the Arizona Diamondbacks, set a new franchise-high in total transactions in 2017 with 210. The previous high was tallied last season with 205 total.

Rehabbin': Of the 68 players on the Aces roster in 2017, five appeared on rehab assignments including: Socrates Brito, A.J. Pollock, Rubby De La Rosa, Rey Fuentes, and Nick Ahmed. Pollock, Fuentes and Ahmed combined for 20 games and went 16-for-67 (.239) with five doubles and five home runs.

Big League Call-Ups: Fourteen total Aces spent time with the Arizona Diamondbacks at some point in 2017, including four who made their Major League debuts: LHP Anthony Banda, RHP Jimmie Sherry, INF Ildemaro Vargas, and INF Jack Reinheimer. Six Aces names who have Major League experience made their Arizona debuts including: Rey Fuentes, John Ryan Murphy, Ketel Marte, Kristopher Negron, T.J. McFarland, and Christian Walker. Additional Aces called up were RHP Braden Shipley, RHP Silvino Bracho, RHP Rubby De La Rosa, and RHP J.J. Hoover.

Triple-A Firsts: Fourteen total Aces players made their Triple-A debuts this season including: C/INF Willians Astudillo, RHP Tyler Badamo, RHP Anfernee Benitez, RHP Taylor Clarke, RHP Connor Grey, RHP Keegan Long, RHP Joey Krehbiel, OF Stewart Ijames, INF Rudy Flores, RHP Joel Payamps, RHP Jake Winston, RHP Grant Sides, INF Kevin Cron, and INF Angel Perez.

Finishing on a High Note: For the eighth time in nine seasons, the Aces were victorious in the final game of the season and are now 8-1 in the category. The Aces played game 142 on September 4, beating Albuquerque 13-1 to salvage a series split. The Aces dropped their first final game ever in 2016 with a 5-3 loss at Tacoma.

Aces Weekly Honors: Three Aces players received PCL weekly honors in 2017. Christian Walker represented as the first "Player of the Week" of the season after his .348, four home run performance while Zack Godley nabbed the second "Pitcher of the Week" of 2017 following a seven-inning, one-hit shutout. Two weeks later, Ketel Marte became the fourth Player of the Week after going 13-for-26 (.500) with 10 RBI.

Walker Named League MVP: The Pacific Coast League announced Reno Aces first baseman Christian Walker as the 2017 PCL Most Valuable Player. Walker's MVP selection is the third in the history of the Aces franchise. Adam Eaton was the first to earn the award in 2012 while Chris Owings notched it one season later in 2013. The 26-year-old is the first PCL player to get to 30+ HR, 100+ RBI, 100+ runs in a season since Salt Lake's Mark Trumbo in 2010 (36 HR, 122 RBI, 103 R). He was just one of three players in professional baseball in 2017 with at least 30 home runs, 100 RBI and 100 runs. The other two players, Giancarlo Stanton and Paul Goldschmidt. He joins former named League MVP's including Joe DiMaggio (1935), Paul Konerko (1997), Bobby Valentine (1970), Sandy Alomar, Jr. (1988-89), Tino Martinez (1991), and Joc Pederson (2014).

Records Rewritten: Christian Walker became the new Reno Aces and Diamondbacks Triple-A single-season leader in home runs with his 32 total in the regular season, breaking Kyle Jensen's Reno franchise-high of 30 in 2016 and Kyle Jensen (2016)/Ernie Young's (1999) Triple-A single-season highs of 30. Walker finished just shy of breaking the RBI record of 120 set by Jensen last season as well - he finished at 114. In addition, Walker tied the record for most RBI pre-All-Star break with 88 (Ryan Wheeler, 2012) and was three home runs shy of setting a new pre-All-Star record, which stands at 24 set by Cody Ransom (2011).

All-PCL Squad: Christian Walker and Oswaldo Arcia were named to the All-PCL team. At the time of the award, Walker batted .312 (153-for-491) with 112 RBI, 101 runs scored, 32 home runs, 8 triples, 34 doubles, a .609 slugging percentage and a .993 OPS. Arcia, 26, was selected to the team as an outfielder. At the time of the announcement, Arcia batted .328 (110-335) with 85 RBI, 77 runs scored, 24 home runs, 5 triples, 25 doubles, a .648 slugging percentage and a 1.060 OPS. It is the ninth consecutive season the Aces had at least one player named to the postseason team.

D-Backs Player of the Month (May): Oswaldo Arcia earned the honor of D-Backs Player of the Month in May after going 29-for-79 (.367) with 12 doubles, six home runs and 29 RBI in 22 games.

Masa Named PCL Trainer of the Year: Reno Aces Athletic Trainer Masa Abe became Reno's first trainer to be honored as the 2017 Pacific Coast League Trainer of the Year, selected by the Professional Baseball Athletic Trainers Society (PBATS). During the season, Abe was responsible for the care of 68 different players, including four on Major League Baseball rehabilitation assignments.

80 Wins: The 80 total wins in the 2017 regular season marked the third time in Reno's history where the squad reached the feat. The franchise high for wins in a single season is 81, which was reached in each of the 2012 and 2014 seasons. The 80-62 record was the third best record in the PCL in 2017.

First Go With El Paso: The Aces faced off against the Chihuahuas for the first time ever in the 2017 postseason. In the regular season, El Paso squeaked by the Aces in the season series, taking it 8-7 after three consecutive wins to end the final regular season series. The playoff berth for El Paso is their third straight, coming fresh off of a PCL Championship in 2016. El Paso won three straight over Reno, marking the first time the Aces were swept in the postseason. The Chihuahuas would make it all the way to game five against the Memphis Redbirds, but ended up falling, giving the Redbirds their first PCL title since 2009.

Playoff Contenders: The playoff berth marked the first for the Aces since 2014 when they won the division over Sacramento with a two-game lead. Reno ended up losing in the PCL Championship series to Omaha 3-2. In 2012, the Aces won their first PCL and Triple-A championship in just their fourth season as a franchise. They finished the regular season six games up over Colorado Springs, defeated Sacramento 3-2 in the PCL semi-finals, beat Omaha 3-1 in the PCL championship series, and finally routed Pawtucket 10-3 in the Triple-A championship.

League Leaders: Aces players finished the regular season scattered all around the league leaderboard. Oswaldo Arcia finished among Top 10 batters in the league with his .326 average, .410 OBP and .639 slugging while southpaw Eric Jokisch finished fourth among pitchers with his 8-8 record and 4.21 ERA with 1.34 WHIP. Meanwhile, Christian Walker was atop the list in games (133), RBI (114), extra-base hits (75), runs scored (104), and total bases (307) and finished tied for second in home runs (32). Ildemaro Vargas finished first in doubles with 35 and Jimmie Sherfy was second in saves with 20 total.

Walker's Cycle: Christian Walker hit for the cycle, reaching a feat no other Ace has since Colin Cowgill in 2011. On May 13 against New Orleans, the first baseman tripled in his first at bat, homered in his third at bat, singled in his fifth at bat, and, in extra innings, knocked a leadoff double to start the 11th. His cycle was the second of the season and was one of just four total in the PCL.

Sunday Funday: In 22 Sunday games, the Aces went an outstanding 16-7, despite losing three of their last six end-of-week matches. In 2016, the Aces posted a 15-6 record in Sunday affairs.

Clearing the Bases: Reno hit six grand slams in 2017, including two from Zach Borenstein. Carlos Rivero started the year off with the first slam on May 4 against Salt Lake to cap off of record-run scoring day while Christian Walker joined in four days later with a go-ahead ninth-inning slam at Sacramento on May 8. Oswaldo Arcia hit the third of 2017 in Tacoma on June 5 and Ildemaro Vargas collected his first career slam one day later in the second inning off of rehabbing "King" Felix Hernandez. Borenstein knocked the final two in the month of August with his first coming on August 10 at Las Vegas and second on August 30 at Albuquerque.

Hazelbaker's Inside-the-Parker: Coming off of a 2016 season where the Aces accomplished an ultra-rare feat where both Kyle Jensen and Sócrates Brito raced around for inside-the-park home runs, Jeremy Hazelbaker became the lone Ace to do it in 2017. He completed the feat on July 14 against El Paso at Greater Nevada Field, facing Dillon Overton in the fourth inning.

Last At-Bat Wins: The Aces won in their last at-bat five times in 2017 compared to 14 times in 2016. Ildemaro Vargas was clutch in two of the total coming in back-to-back walk-off win scenarios. On April 30, Vargas singled in the bottom of the ninth to plate the 11th and winning run over Fresno. On May 13, against New Orleans, Vargas came around to score the 11th and winning run in the 12th inning from second base on a wild pitch. The last one came on June 22 when Oswaldo Arcia scorched a one-out line drive to center field with the winning run in scoring position when it bounced off of the glove of Tacoma's Leonys Martin to end the game. Carlos Rivero (April 14 Game 2) and Ronnie Freeman (May 27) both collected walk-off singles.

Multi-Homer Mania: The Aces had 11 individual multi-homer games in 2017 led by three each from Zach Borenstein and Christian Walker. Walker collected the first of the season on April 12 against Albuquerque in the first and fourth innings. Oswaldo Arcia collected two total on the season coming in back-to-back games (4/17-18). On April 17, both Arcia and Borenstein collected multi-home run games. A.J. Pollock marked Reno's ninth player to do so in a rehab game on June 30. Kristopher Negron collected his first since 2009 on July 13 against El Paso while Ildemaro Vargas marked the first of his career on August 9 against Las Vegas.

One, Two-Run Games: The Aces finished with the second-best record in the Pacific Coast League in one-run games with a 20-13 (.606) record. Reno was on top of the league in two-run games with an 11-6 record (.647).

May Power Surge: After tying for the best record in April (14-10) to start the 2017 campaign, the Aces went on a tear in May, winning 19-of-29 games in the month while posting a league-high .313 team batting average, serving as the only squad above .300. The Aces bats combined for 34 home runs, 210 runs, 75 doubles, 14 triples, 196 RBI, and held a .376 OBP.

New Franchise Saves Leader: Former University of Oregon closer Jimmie Sherfy collected a franchise-high 32 saves in two seasons with Reno, breaking the previous franchise record that was held by Jake Barrett (31). He finished second in the PCL in saves with 20 in 2017 and was six shy of breaking the Aces single-season record.

Ejections: The 2017 season marked a franchise-low in ejections with only two total. Rey Fuentes was the only player ejected after arguing a called strike three while interim manager Greg Gross was ejected for the first time since 2013. The most ejections in a season came in 2014 (17 total).

5:07: On June 9 at Sacramento, the Aces played the longest nine-inning game (innings/time) in franchise history - a 17-inning marathon that last five hours and seven minutes. Each starter allowed four runs in their bids with the scoring ending in the seventh. The game remained tied until the 17th inning when Ketel Marte and Oswaldo Arcia knocked hits for extra bases to break open the game with two runs. Jake Barrett ended the contest quickly in the bottom half after striking out the side.

All Stars: For the second consecutive season and fourth time in franchise history, four Aces were named to the PCL All-Star Team, including infielders Ildemaro Vargas and Christian Walker, outfielder Oswaldo Arcia and right-hander Jimmie Sherfy. The four All-Star bids matched the 2011, 2012 and 2016 Aces teams for most All-Star selections.

Six Ain't Nothin': Reno completed the near-improbable twice in 2017 - two six-run, ninth-inning comebacks within days of each other. On May 8 in Sacramento, the Aces entered the ninth with three outs to work with and down 6-1 with just five hits on the board. Reno collected three consecutive one-out hits and two walks followed by a two-out, two-strike grand slam by Christian Walker to seal the 7-6 victory. Five days later, on May 13 at home against New Orleans, the Aces put up six runs on four walks, two hits and a sacrifice fly to come back from a 10-4 deficit in the bottom of the ninth. Reno eventually won the game after Vargas scored from second base in the 11th on a wild pitch.

Sweeps & Shutouts: The Aces swept two series in 2017: Salt Lake at home (5/2-5) and on the road in Las Vegas (8/24-27), marking the first time ever Reno has swept the 51s. As a team, the Aces combined for four shutouts over opponents and were shutout by opponents a total of six times in 2017.

Longest Streaks: Ketel Marte marked the Aces longest hit-streak of the season with 22 consecutive games overall from April 29 to May 22, while Oswaldo Arcia had the Aces longest overall on-base streak (39) in 2017 (5/28-8/6). The longest all-time overall hit streak in franchise history is 31 set by Jake Elmore in 2012. He also set the longest overall Aces on-base streak in 2012 with 46 games.

62-Day First-Place Run: The Aces sat on top of the Pacific North division of the Pacific Coast League from May 26 to July 26. The largest division lead Reno held within the streak was nine games. During the reign of first place, Anthony Banda recorded 600th MiLB strikeout, Jimmie Sherfy tallied his 50th MiLB save, and Oswaldo Arcia slugged in 100th MiLB home run. Greater Nevada Field also saw its largest attendance during this first place bid at 10,506 on July 4, 2017.

Pinch-Hit Homers: The Aces collected three pinch-hit home runs during 2017, tying for most in a single-season (2010, 2012). Sócrates Brito slugged the first pinch-hit home run on July 22 in the eighth inning at Colorado Springs, marking the first Aces player to do so since Trayvon Robinson in 2015. Three days after Brito's, Rudy Flores knocked the second of the year in the ninth inning at Oklahoma City. Kristopher Negron collected the third and final on August 15 in Sacramento.

Leadoff Dinger: Ildemaro Vargas was the only Aces player in 2017 to leadoff a game with a home run (8/9/2017 @ Las Vegas). He also hit it two years to the date since Nick Buss did it in Tacoma on August 9, 2015.

The 10-Run Frame: The Aces put up 10 runs in the second inning in the last game of the 2017 regular season (Sep. 4) against Albuquerque at Greater Nevada Field. It marked just the fifth time the Aces reached the feat and was the first time since July 7, 2014 when the Aces played against Las Vegas.

22 Runs on 26 Hits: On May 4 against the Salt Lake Bees, the Aces pounded out a franchise-high 26 hits and tied for a franchise record in runs (22). The previous high in hits for the Aces franchise was 25, recorded on June 24, 2014 against Colorado Springs. The last time Reno put up 22 runs was on August 10, 2012 against Albuquerque. The Aces 19 run margin of victory also set a new franchise high; the previous record was 16, which happened in Reno's inaugural season on June 5, 2009 at Tacoma.

50 for Vargas: Ildemaro Vargas led the way for Aces hitters in multi-hit games with 50 total on the season. The total comprised of 39 two-hit bouts, seven three-hit, and a team-leading four four-hit games.

Multi-Negron: Veteran utility man Kristopher Negron was the only Aces member who played every role on the team except for Catcher and Designated Hitter (1B, 2B, 3B, SS, LF, RF, CF, P, PH).

The Bat heard 'round baseball: From the start of season to a day before his call-up (June 27), Ketel Marte led all of professional baseball at any level, Minors and Majors, with his 105 hits. On June 28, after recalled by Arizona, Albuquerque's Ryan McMahon took over as the Minor League leader in the hit category as he surpassed Marte's total by two.
