NINTH INNING RALLY FALLS SHORT IN SERIES OPENER: A ninth inning rally fell just short as the Wilmington Blue Rocks scored a run in the ninth and loaded the bases before the rally and game came to an end as the Rocks fell by the score of 6-5 to the Myrtle Beach Pelicans Friday night at TicketReturn.com Field. **Meibrys Viloria** turned in a big night at the plate and drove in four runs with a two-run homer and two-run double to pace the offense. Wilmington maintains a 1.5 score a double out a score of double turned in the plate and drove in four runs with a two-run homer and two-run biotection. game lead over second play Lynchburg in the Northern Division.

CHICKS DIG THE LONG BALL: The Blue Rocks and Pelicans each flexed their muscle in the series opener Friday night as the teams combined for five home runs. -Wilmington hit two of them with **Meibrys Viloria** hitting a two-run home run for his sixth long ball of the season while **Brewer Hicklen** launched his first-career Advanced-A home run. -The Pelicans hit three in the third inning, the most home runs allowed by the Blue Rocks in a single inning with all three coming in the bottom of the third. The back to back home runs with Advanced Yang and Advanced Advanced the first time since July.

-The back-to-back home runs hit by Jared Young and Andruw Monasterio marked the first time since July 8, 2013 against the Frederick Keys that the Rocks allowed two consecutive home runs.

A QUICK TRIP TO THE BEACH: The Blue Crew wrap up their longest remaining road trip of the season with a three-game series against Myrtle Beach. -It is the first and only time the Blue Rocks visit the Pelicans as the two teams, who are separated the most

in the league in terms of distance (542 miles), finish up their head-to-head matchup. -The Pelicans traveled north to visit the Blue Rocks back in mid-May to play a three-game set in two days

as it was shortened due to rain. -The Blue Rocks took two of three in the series, with a pair of bookend 3-1 wins while dropping to the

Pelicans 10-1 in the middle game. -The Rocks earned the win in the series finale thanks to an inside-the-park home run hit by Nick Heath.

HATE TO SEE JULY GO: The Blue Rocks continue to play some of their best baseball in the second half -Wilmington closed out the month of July with a 19-9 record which was the best record of any team in the

CL during the month. -The Rocks as a team hit .277, the highest batting average of any month this season and also scored more runs (155) then they did in any previous month.

ROCK SOLID IN THE SECOND HALF: The Blue Rocks have the second-best winning percentage in the Carolina League in the second half at .609 (Winston-Salem 1st, .636) - With the win in the middle game of the series Wednesday night at Salem, the Rocks once again avoided losing three straight games in the second half for the first time. (Lost three or more in a row six times in the first half.) -Wilmington has either been atop of the division or out of the top spot by just one game since July 11 and have led to division reasonable and the division or out of the division or

have led the division since July 18 and hold a 1.5 game lead over second place Lynchburg. -The Blue Rocks also have not been below .500 at any point this half. (Have been at .500 mark four times) -The Rocks are currently 24-12 against Northern Division foes in the second half which is the best mark in the division.

WALK OR RUN THIS WAY: The Blue Rocks have led the Carolina League in walks for the majority of the season and also lead the league in stolen bases. -Wilmington has racked up 456 walks this season. -The Rocks have swiped 147 bags through 116 games this year, which paces the league. -The Blue Crew also have been stealing bases at a rapid clip in the second half and have stolen 70 bases through 46 games of the second half

through 46 games of the second half.

-Wilmington has four different active players with double-digit stolen bases including **D.J. Burt** who is the active team-leader and third in the CL with 27, **Blake Perkins** ranks fourth in the CL with 24 between Potomac and Wilmington, **Rudy Martin** has 21 stolen bases on the year and **Travis Jones** has 14. -The Blue Crew have stolen five bases in six different games this season.

-Wilmington is the only team in the Carolina League to steal 20 or more bases in each of the first four months of the season. (37 in April, 20 in May, 37 in June, 38 in July and have 14 in August) -They also have an impressive 74% success rate stealing bases this season (147 out of 200).

CAN COUNT ON CANCEL: Infielder Gabriel Cancel has been a major run producer for the Blue Rocks, especially in the second half. -Cancel has driven in 50 runs over his last 52 games and has also put together 14 multi-RBI games during the stretch and leads the team with 18 games driving in multiple runs. -He currently is the team leader, second amongst Royals' farmhands and has the most RBI amongst active players in the Carolina League with 70. -Cancel drove in 26 runs in 27 games in the month of July. -When batting third, the infielder is hitting .272 (34-for-125) with 29 RBI in 32 games. -When he bats cleanup, Cancel is a .333 hitter (28-for-84) with 22 RBI in 22 games.

BURT PROVIDING THE HURT: Second-year Blue Rock D.J. Burt is not suffering from a sophomore

Sector Recy IDING THE HURL: Second-year Blue Rock **D.J. Burt** is not suffering from a sophomore slump in the Carolina League and was named a Carolina League All-Star. -He is tied for second n the CL in on-base percentage (.386), third in the Carolina League in stolen bases (27), and sixth in batting average (.300) -He picked up a hit in 20 of 24 games in July to help him post a .330 batting average (31-for-94) with two homers, 18 RBI and a .404 OBP.

-Tied for first on the team with 29 multi-hit games. (Had 20 all of last season) -The 22-year-old has served as the Rocks' utility man this season, making 31 starts at third base, 24 at second base, 10 at shortstop and 10 in left field.

Righty Andres Sotillet makes his sixth start with the Blue Rocks and first against Myrtle Beach.

He was signed by the Royals as a free agent on July 30, 2015.

-Coming off a loss in his last start on August 5 at home against Frederick -He worked five innings, allowed five runs (all earned) on nine hits, walked one and did not strikeout a batter.

It was his second straight setback as a Blue Rock and the second time in five starts he allowed more than four earned runs.

Earned his first-career, Advanced-A start in his second start with Wilmington on July 19 at Lynchburg.

Turned in a quality start and lasted 6.2 innings, allowed one run (earned) on six hits, walked three and struck out two.

The 21-year-old started the season with the Lexington Legends (Low-A/ South Atlantic League).

Overall with the Legends, he posted a 6-5 record with a 3.93 ERA in 16 outings including 13 starts with the Legends. He worked 89.1 innings, allowed 107 hits, 46R/39ER, walked 13 and struck

out 84 while opponents hit .296 against him. At the time of his promotion from Low-A, Sotillet led the Legends' pitching

staff in innings pitched (89.1), strikeouts (84), second in starts (13), and tied for fifth in games pitched (16).

He enters tonight's start third among Royals' farm hands with his 96 strikeouts and eighth in ERA (4.28)

-Spent last season between three different levels with the AZL Royals, Idaho Falls Chukars and Burlington Royals

Went a composite 3-4 with a 6.67 ERA in 13 appearances with 12 being starts.

-Features a fastball, curveball and changeup.

Left-hander Bryan Hudson makes his 20th start with the Pelicans tonight and second against Wilmington.

Drafted by the Chicago Cubs in the third round of the 2015 Draft out of Alton High School in Illinois.

In his last start on August 4 at Potomac he suffered the loss.

Tossed five innings, allowed two runs (both earned) on four hits, walked five and struck out four.

Over his last five starts, the southpaw is 2-2 with an impressive 1.84 ERA. He's allowed just six earned runs over 29.1 innings of work while holding

THE BOOK ON ANDRES SOTILLET: The right-hander was signed by the Kansas City Royals as an international free agent on July 30, 2015 out of Venezuela. Is in his third season in the organization. From Cumana, Venezuela which is the same city former big-league pitchers Rafael Betancourt and Armando Galarraga are from. Was named the Dominican Royals Pitcher of the Year in 2016 and led all Royals farmhands in ERA (1.52) in 65.0 innings.

LAST TIME OUT: Sotillet is coming off a loss in his last start on August 5 at home against Frederick. The righty worked five innings, allowed five runs (all earned) on nine hits, walked one and did not strikeout a batter. It marked the second straight loss for Sotilett with Wilmington and was also the second time in five starts Sotillet has allowed four earned runs or more since joining Wilmington.

ROAD WARRIOR: Although a small sample size, Sotillet has pitched better away from spacious Fralwey Stadium to start his Blue Rocks' career. In two starts on the road, the right-hander is 1-1 with a respectable 2.79 ERA, allowing three earned runs in 9.2 innings of work. At home, Sotillet has made three starts and is 0-2 with a 7.36 ERA (14.2 IP with 12 earned runs).

STRONG DEBUT: Despite suffering the loss in his Carolina League debut at home against Salem on July 13, Sotillet turned in a solid start. He worked five innings, allowed three runs (all earned) on five hits, walked one and struck out five. The three runs came on a soft RBI single and a two-run home run.

SOTILLET IMPRESSED THE COACHING STAFF: Following his debut, Sotillet earned the praise from first-year pitching coach and former big-league pitcher for 11 years **Doug Henry.** "It was my first time seeing him pitch and I was very impressed. He works fast and his ball to strike ratio was very good. (86 pitches, 62 for strikes) He has good stuff and the ball comes out of his hands very well. He stepped out on the mound and his presence just felt like he wasn't scared. He took it and went with it and it was really fun to watch."

WHAT SOTILLET CAN WORK ON: Along with all the positives that Henry took out of Sotillet's debut, he understands what the righty needs to do to be even better and succeed at this level. "Now, he has to learn how to throw quality strikes. Down in Low-A he got away with a lot of pitches I'm sure. Here in High-A, he won't be able to get away with as many pitches because this is a better hitting league. The hitters are stronger and they are more mature. So he is going to have to learn to locate the ball a little bit better and has to use his changeup a little more than he does."

COMING INTO WILMINGTON WITH A LOT OF CONFIDENCE: Prior to his Carolina League 2017/Ida debut, Sotillet tossed the best game of his career in his final start with Low-A Lexington on July 7 2017/AZ against the Greensboro Grasshoppers. He tossed a nine-inning, complete game shutout, scattered seven hits, did not walk a batter and set a career-high with 10 strikeouts.

AMONGST THE BEST IN LEXINGTON AND FARM SYSTEM At the time of his promotion 201 from Low-A, Sotillet led the Legends' pitching staff in innings pitched (89.1), strikeouts (84), second in starts (13), and tied for fifth in games pitched (16). He enters tonight's start third among Royals' farm hands with his 96 strikeouts and 8th in ERA (4.28)
